MINUTES:

- Minutes from September meeting accepted
- Introduction of Cathy and Fred.
 - Cathy is putting together a video of Benson alumni and how Benson helped them.
 - Tammy mentioned that Taylor Dixon's video is in the editing process and she is hoping to have it complete by the end of December.
- Membership count
 - 20—paid members, 4—2008 grads, 8—unpaid members, 1—retired teacher
- Treasury--\$230.00, but some bills have not yet been paid
- Benson Site Council Report
 - Dale is currently the representative from the alumni association
 - Other members include teachers, students, and the PTSA president
- Long Term Development Committee (LTD)—Dick Spies, Chair
 - Summary of Dick's work with Lincoln High School and how it can be applied to all the district high schools.
 - Building community and business partnerships that could be beneficial to both the school and industry.
 - Unions, OMSI, city government, local colleges and universities.
 - Possibility of increased density on campuses by creating multi-use sites.
 - Colleges and business partners could have offices or light industrial on site.
 - The site could be used for more than just "high school" classes.

- Potential building height for Benson is 100 feet. Part of site could be built up to house offices that could be leased or used by the district.
- Benson is uniquely sited in the heart of the city in an area with light industrial, residential and access to transit.
- The district likes the idea of the association working on the issue and is ready to start having discussions about the issue. Looks good politically.
- Dick will be meeting with city, business and district on October 29th to discuss Portland high school and what can be done. He has also spoken with Mayor-elect, Sam Adams, about Benson's potential.
- Benson could become a sustainability research center since the state and local governments are planning to use it to re-kindle industry in Oregon.
 - Use of sustainable technologies on site.
 - All majors incorporate into curriculum.
 - Could lead to grant money if it can be found.
- Need to develop a "big" picture and then find the support.
 - Benson has students that can think, invent, and envision.
 - It isn't the school we used to know...let's make it better than what we knew.
- Bob mentioned the Northwest High Performance Consort, Oregon Business Association, and Councilman Saltzman as possible contacts. David Mark with Manufacturing Union 21 is working on legislation for 2009.
- Dick will develop a graphic story board about Benson potential
- Dick plans to contact district administration to let them know our agenda.
 - We need to be considered an asset
- You can only meet with no more than 3-school board members at a time otherwise the meeting needs to be open to public.
- Cathy mentioned that she had seen Carole Smith's (PPS Superintendent) speech to the City Club where she mentioned that she "was committed to not closing buildings."
- Some concern about where you would house tech programs while Benson would undergo building renovations.
- Next steps:
 - The LTD committee will meet at least monthly to begin building vision.
 - Quarterly meetings of an advisory group that includes business, industry, education and other partners.
- Bob mentioned charter schools and if we should start talking about them. The group agrees that it should be considered. The money is out there for them.

• Membership Committee

- Dale, Paul, Bob and Don have all met with Debra at Classic Reunions (CR) to clarify the proposal she made to the scholarship committee last year to build a Benson database that we could have access to.
 - They would build the database as classes have their reunions, so if a class doesn't go through CR then they wouldn't have their info unless we want to pay them to find it.
 - They would charge the class to find people, then charge us per name to add it to our list.

- To access the data, we would have to make a request and then they would charge us \$1.00 per name given, but they would give us 3000 names for \$700.00 for the scholarship mailing.
- We would not have direct access to the electronic database.
- CR would need \$500.00 to start process.
- Jim Robb has given Josh a list of 1500 names, so we have a database with 2000 total.
- Chuck has a disk of the 2003 Benson Alumni Book. He will take a look at it to find out if it is searchable.
- Proposed to have Benson students help validate names. Money cannot be given directly to students, but funds can go to support a club.
- General agreement that we should own our database.
- Motion passed to not pursue offer with Classic Reunions at this time.
- Josh will print labels for the scholarship mailing in November. Jim Robb will be asked to write the letter.
- Oregonian Ad- cost will be around \$329 for a 2-column wide x 5" long ad that would be placed in the sports section of the Wednesday or Friday addition.
 - Fund donated by some board members towards cost.
 - Motion passed that association will cover the remaining cost of article.
 - Bob and Chuck proposed possible verbiage for article.
 - Bob to work with Cathy for ad content and graphics.

- Newsletter—Dale reminded everyone that we need to start thinking of possible articles and writers.
