TRACK



In the first important meet of the year, the Hill Relays held at the International Livestock Exposition pavilion, the highly rated Grant Generals walked off with everything in sight, and the Mechanics had to be content with a sixth place. The only event in which the Techs scored was the distance medley.

The second meet of the season, four way meet with Grant, Franklin and Lincoln, was a breeze for the Generals from Grant. The Mechanics managed to grab off a third place.

The next meet was the city relays, which was held on Commerce's new field. With seven high schools participating, the Orangemen were satisfied with a three-way tie for third place. In the next meet held with Grant and Jefferson, Benson again finished third.

Representing Benson in the field events this year are Joe Goehler, Caldwell, Hamill, and Jerry Coates in the high jump; Walter Thompson, the flying "Swede," broad jump; Walter Sinclair, javelin; Joe "Sleepy" Smith, Bob Elliot, and Searcie in the shot put; Bob Elliot, discus; Walt Sinclair, Thomas, and Jim Pettit in the 100-yard dash; Searcie, Walt Sinclair, Jim Pettit, Thomas, and Turner in the 220-yard dash; Ralph Rude, Gordon Petrie, and Walt Thompson in the 440-yard dash; Murphy and Joe Goehler, high hurdles; Searcie, low hurdles; Bob Swain and Caldwell Hamill, pole vault; Rice, half mile; Edward King, Kenneth Lissy, and Chuck Groshens, mile.

Not in the least awed by the showing of their "big brother tracksters", the Benson juniors enjoyed a fine year. The development of these successful junior stars makes prospects look unusually bright for next year's varsity squad. Jimmy Pettit, who is already a two-year man was perhaps the outstanding man of the entire varsity squad. Pettit will be eligible for two more years of track. Another outstanding trackster was Bob Elliot, president of the June graduating class, who starred in the shot put and discus events.





BASEBALL



Benson has Bob Kiesel, a two year veteran, and "Bud" Dappen, with one year of experience, to do its chucking. Bolstering this combination is Marquard, a converted first baseman who shows some pitching promise. Other veterans are Catcher Jack Warren, a two-year man; Joe Lominski at shortstop; and Jack Pendergrass, Val Fisher, Ed "Cuddles" Price, and Schaffer in the outfield.

Although they suffer from a consistent inability to hit in the pinches, they have a fighting spirit that is hard to conquer.

In the first league game Grant crossed bats with the Mechanics, and after a very close struggle emerged with a 7 to 6 victory. Benson collected 9 hits and 3 errors, while the highly rated Generals gathered in 10 hits and 2 errors. Commerce posted a win over Benson behind the effective pitching of Griffith, who allowed only three hits while his team mates collected 8 hits. Sapp for Commerce had a perfect day, getting three hits in as many times at bat. The Washington Colonials won the third straight game of the season from the Mechanics by a score 3 to 1. It was truly a pitcher's battle with Kiesel of Benson allowing only 6 hits while Eterno of Washington let down the Mechanics with 4 well scattered hits. The next game of the schedule saw Roosevelt swamp the Orangemen in a slugging mood 16 to 1. Marquard started for Benson while Maguigan, who allowed but 6 hits, pitched the entire game for the Teds. In the last game before the date of printing the *Poly Tech*, the Jefferson Democrats, league-leading team, blasted out a 4 to 1 victory over the Bensonites. It was the fifth victory for Jefferson, and the fifth defeat for the Benson diamond squad.

WRESTLING

As in the past Coach Al Gibson's wrestling team put on a very fine performance. This year's squad never lost a meet to any one team, which is quite a record for any team.

In the first important match of the season the Tech grapplers defeated the "Vikings" of Salem by a score of 73 to 33.

The Benson team then traveled to Sandy where they defeated a strong squad by another large margin of 41 to 25.

The Chemawa Indians traveled to Benson only to be defeated badly by the Orange squad 55 to 9.

In the next meet between Lincoln High, state champions from Washington, Hill Military Academy, and Benson, Lincoln of Tacoma won on points 40 to 37 to 13. Because the Benson grapplers defeated both teams individually they were in reality considered the victors.

Reed College met defeat twice at the hands of the Techmen by scores of 23 to 8 in the first and 48 to 19 in the second.

Benson's wrestling team returned home from the Oregon State wrestling meet at Salem again State title holders and also possessors of three individual championships. In the finals the Tech squad placed 6 men. The weights, and and final standings of the six Techmen who won awards are as follows: Barstad, 95 pounds, took first place; Hinatsu, 105 pounds, placed first; Shido, 105 pounds, won second; Okazaki, 115 pounds, placed second; Merrit, 155 pounds, also won a championship; Smith, heavyweight, took second.

The Techmen then entered the Oregon A.A.U. meet in which they placed third. Don Whitbeck, winner of the last year's 125 class, won the crown in the 134 pound class by defeating Eugene Wood, also of Benson to give Benson their only decisive win in the meet.

Rocco Accetura and Cecil Gregg, both lettermen, will be lost through graduation, but Coach "Lefty" Marineau will have good material in Ernest Zanni, Les Stephens, Bob Kiesel, Walt Nagel, Jack Jernander, "Slim" Sempert, Art McCullough, Ed Lee, and Leonard Barde upon which to build a strong team in 1940.

With these returning veterans and some good material coming up from the Juniors, prospects look unusually bright for next year's squad.

High point man for the Tech tossers was Zanni, one of the smoothest forwards in the league, with 78 points. He was closely followed by tall, rangy Les Stephens who tallied a total of 77 points. The bad man on the squad was Zanni who collected 41 personals. The team scored a total of 322 points for an average of exactly 23 points per game.
