





THE SHEET METAL SHOP




THE PRINT SHOP








THE FOUNDRY SHOP







Bonneville was selected as the site of the first of a series of dams which, it is expected, will be built along the lower Columbia River. A map of the site is on page 36, and will show the main dam on the Washington side of the river, while the power house is located on the Oregon side.

The dam itself is constructed of reinforced concrete, and the width of the base is 200 feet, while the height above the lowest foundation is 176 feet. There are eighteen gate openings of 50 feet in width each, making the length of the dam proper 1090 feet. The normal pool elevation of the water behind the dam is 72 feet above mean sea level. The spillway is designed to carry a greater volume of water than has ever been known to come down the Columbia. Pictures of the spillway may be found on page 63, along with a view of the practically completed project.

Commercial fishing on the Columbia River is a gigantic industry, so Our Uncle Sam took care of that matter while he was constructing the dam. On the next page you may see two views of the fish ladders, one showing the construction and the other with water flowing over them. The ladders consist of partitions each 40 feet wide by 16 feet long, and each partition is one foot higher than the one next below, until the water height behind the dam is reached. This system enables most fish to swim right up the dam in a sort of a circle from low to high water. There are also fish elevators in case the run gets too great for the ladders to handle.

There are navigation locks about 500 feet long by 74 feet wide capable of handling ocean liners.


As development of electric power is the principal reason for building of the Bonneville Dam, the power house was built to accommodate six large hydroelectric generating units. The lower bearings of the mighty turbines are fifty-eight feet below sea level, and these bearings are nine feet in diameter, built in sections which can be removed if any trouble develops. The turbines are driven by runners twenty-three feet in diameter, and will generate 60,000 horsepower each under a 50-foot head of water.

Two turbines have been installed at present, and installation work is being done so that the others will be in operation before many more months roll by.

A service roadway runs across the top of the dam, and gigantic cranes traverse the dam to raise any of the gates from their positions in case of trouble. If it becomes necessary to raise any of the main gates, there are auxiliary gates to lower on the upper side of the dam while repairs are being completed.

The whole project is an inspiring one, and well worth the time to visit. The United States Army Engineers have one more big job to their credit, and the big dam will add much to the resources of the Pacific Northwest.


Coach Marineau is justly proud of the 1939-40 Varsity Basketball team for their fighting spirit that lasted all through the season, although theirs was a losing fight.



Many of the boys turning out for track were members of the track team last year. Benson was the only school in Portland to win two races in The All-City Relay Meet held in April. 

The result of their fine playing placed them second in the city meet, but the last game with Commerce, resulting in a 0 to 0 tie, kept the Benson team out of the final play-off.


