A Tribute



Class Motto: "The higher you rise, the broader the view."


Class Flower: Maroon Carnation.



"Life Begins at Sixteen"



"Life Begins at Sixteen" was a very well received dramatic production and all persons connected with it are to be complimented on its success.





Since none of the matches have been played as this publication goes to press, we are unable to furnish you with the results of the season's challenges,




