
The president of the student body presides at all the meetings of the executive board. He is empowered to call a special meeting at any time desired.



















#### INTRAMURAL SPORTS

One year ago a new idea was conceived by Mr. Eldon Jenne, director of athletics for the Portland high schools. It was a program which would give every boy and girl in high school a chance to participate in the sport they like. Mr. Jenne's plan was "sports for all", and according to the coaches and physical education directors of the city high schools it has been a success and all of them want it back again next year.

As we all understand, many boys here at Benson want to go out for a sport but are unable to because of their weight, height or so pyemhlisoaccemfwmfwmfw but are unable to because of their weight, height or some physical condition which prohibits them doing so. Also many of the boys aren't capable of meeting the tough competition necessary to make a varsity squad and are dropped because of this. These are some reasons why the idea of intramural sports in the school among the different shops was very successful this year. The starting line-up for all games and in most cases were Rankin, Shepherd, Warren, Bear, and S. Mako.



No one player stood out in individual play, for they all played as one big organized team. The Benson Babes marked up an undefeated season by winning eight games, one by forfeit, and not losing any.




#### TENNIS TEAM
