





#### CLASS HISTORY

September, 1939, marked the beginning of the second world war in Europe. But to over 400 freshmen it was the beginning of high school; and their choice was Benson Polytechnic.

Three and one-half years later, the 125 or more students still in Benson, after enlistments and enticing war jobs had taken their toll, were called together, and the advisers, Miss Ambler and Mr. Nielsen, were introduced by Mr. Cleveland. A nominating committee was elected, and authorized by the class to present nominations at the next meeting.

A party for the January '43 class was given on January 21, and was a success from the entertainment standpoint. The auditorium was well-filled on the occasion.

The senior assembly, presented each term by the graduating class, was given in the auditorium on Wednesday, May 12. The forthcoming class play, "Cappy Ricks," was advertised, as was the Poly Tech.

Senior pictures were taken by the Gladys Gilbert studio; Kline jewelers made the class pin, the design being one previously used, as the materials were not available to make a new design. Crown engravers were selected to make the personal cards and announcements, a memoir book being given with the personal cards.



Jackson Schenck played the chauffer, and was also the property manager. Eddie Cole was the play manager, and handled publicity.







































A president, vice-president, secretary and treasurer are the elected officers; an executive board consisting of 20 members, augmented by the two presidential candidates receiving the second and third highest number of votes, and the vice-presidential candidate receiving the second highest number of votes, are the "congress" of our student self-government.

Candidates for the officers' positions address the student body at an election assembly held near the end of the preceding semester. At this time the students desiring positions give a pledge as to the work they will perform if elected to office, and state their qualifications in view of previous experience with student clubs or outside organizations.

Those students who run for positions on the executive board do not give campaign speeches at the election assembly; rather they must submit to the office, as must the candidates for officers' positions, a nomination petition signed by not less than five per cent of the qualified student electors.

The executive board sanctions all school clubs,

which must have the board's approval of their constitution in order to function. The council ratifies all athletic awards, and may refuse an award to any athlete who is for any reason deemed ineligible.




A treasury Flag was obtained and flown with the Stars and Stripes during the month of May, as 90 per cent of the student body had purchased stamps and bonds in the month of April.

#### VARSITY BASKETBALL

Winning eleven out of fifteen games, Benson's fighting basketball five finished in third place at the close of the '43 season, under the direction of Coaches "Lefty" Marineau and Leonard Patterson. The Orangemen played the entire season with the lineup composed of Sophomores and Juniors, leaving the prospects bright for an excellent ball club next year.

With three of last season's regulars back to form the nucleus of this year's team, the Benson hoopsters displayed the best season the Orangemen have had since 1935 when Benson succeeded in taking the city crown.

Captain Bryce Hanning again placed as second highest scorer in the league and gained honors by making the All-city squad for his second straight year.

The guard positions were filled by Ed Paul and Jack Barger, both providing plenty of fight and spirit for the Tech five. This is Ed Paul's second year on the club and he still has two years left in which to play. Jack Barger, playing his first season for Benson, proved to be a worthy guard and won a starting position in most games.

Sophomore Ken Warren helped solve the worries of Coach Patterson by filling the vacancy at the center spot. This season was Ken's first on the varsity five and proved a great advantage by helping Benson place third in the prep league. At the close of this year's play Ken had chalked up one hundred points to his credit.

Captain Bryce Hanning and team mate Art "Rabbit" Shepherd were the main gears in the Tech machine, both playing a terrific season at the forward positions. Bryce proved to be one of the most valuable men in the prep league averaging  $12\frac{1}{2}$  points per game. At the close of the season he had rolled up 206 points. Art Shepherd was the most aggressive member of the Orange quintet, providing plenty of speed and excellent ball handling. Many of the games were highlighted by his sterling basketball performance. This is Art's first season on the squad and he still has two more years of competition.

With the material returning next year and under the expert guidance of "Pat" Patterson the Orangemen should end as the city title holders.










# "B" BASKETBALL



#### VARSITY BASEBALL

Coach Patterson's varsity baseball club opened the pre-season series in style by rolling up five wins, one loss, and two ties for their preseason average. The Orangemen were aided greatly by an airtight pitching staff consisting of four sophomores and one senior, who were the mainstays in the early season tilts.

Backed by a fiery infield and an all-around hard hitting ball club, the Tech nine should prove to be one of the league's top contenders for the city crown.

Benson's infield begins with Dick Bartle holding down the initial sack. This is Dick's fourth year on the squad and in seasons past he has proven to be one of the heavy hitters on the local nine. Ralph Stoltz, a regular on this year's pitching staff, holds down second base when not handling duties on the hill. Ralph has proven to be the heaviest hitter on this year's club, with a batting average of .481 in pre-season games. A regular from last season, Art Shepherd has proved to be as good on the diamond as he is on the basketball court. Art is handling duties at shortstop for his second year and provides plenty of power in the Tech infield. The "hot corner" is also held by a holdover from last season, Jack

Barger, who helps round out this year's infield with his two year's experience as a third baseman.

This year Benson is bolstered by the largest pitching staff in the school's history, with nine men having already handled duties on the mound in the early season practice games. Ken Warren, a regular from last year, will handle pitching duties along with Ralph Stoltz, Ed Steinmetz, Bob Palm, and Ed Paul. Other members of the pitching staff are, Fred LaMear, Bill Kingman, Vic Wilson, and Vince Rusetti.

Phil Gatto, a letterman from last year, along with Angus Morrison, will handle duties behind the plate and both players look to be potent for the current season.

Benson's outfield has also been reenforced this season with two lettermen back at left and center field. Pat Polich, a last season regular, is back in left field with Tony Fazzolari, also a hold-over from last year, back at center field. Both these players showed plenty of speed and talent in last season's play and should show considerable improvement this year. A newcomer to the squad is Bob Barger, who will handle duties in right field. Bob is a shifty fielder and should prove his abilities in the present season.

#### VARSITY TRACK

Under the leadership of Coach Gilbert Drynan, the '43 track squad was hit hard by graduation and had a difficult time placing in the upper bracket in the early season meets. With only two experienced lettermen returning from last season, along with a few inexperienced tracksters, the Orangemen have finished fairly well in the rapidly progressing season.

The first meet of the term was a triangular affair held at Jefferson between Benson, Roosevelt and Jefferson, with the final results: Jeff took first place honors with 24 points; Roosevelt landed in second place with 20 points; and Benson brought up the rear with a total of 10 points.

The Techmen won only one event, the 880 relay, in which Steve Wright, Dick Aaron, Don Hewitt

and Jim Boozier combined to give Benson all 10 points and third place in the first relay meet of the season.

April 9 marked the first all-city track and field meet of the year, with eight Portland high schools competing. The meet was held in the Jefferson High Bowl. Sickness and injuries plagued the Tech tracksters, and they were unable to place in the meet. Grant's Generals placed first, followed by Washington and Franklin in second and third place, respectively.

Mark Kelly and Ray Hoover, lettermen holdovers from last year's squad, are the mainstays of this year's team, with Steve Wright and Don Hewitt pacing the newcomers under Coach Drynan.






#### JUNIOR TRACK
