### LIBRARY

Benson's library contains over 6000 technical, literary, historical, and economic books. In addition to many gifts of periodicals by publishing companies the library regularly subscribes to fifty-three magazines which are paid for by the library, the school district, and the student body. We also have a large selection of pamphlets and trade catalogues.

With exception to the main library of Portland, Benson maintains the largest and most complete technical selection in the city and it rates high in the Northwest. An outstanding feature of the technical department is the collection of trade catalogues which is said to be the largest of its kind for any high school in the United States.

Benson's library was started in 1917 when Simon Benson, the founder of our school, gave \$1000 towards the purchase of technical books. He also donated many books from his personal library. Its growth from then to its present size of over 6000 has been aided by donations and contributions from graduating classes, the student body, the Winch fund, and the English department. The History department has contributed a large number of historical books, outstanding of which are the "Chronicles of America."


Our librarian, Miss Morrison, has been at Benson since the fall of 1929 and has seen the library double in size during her period of service. Each term she instructs the English I classes in the use of the library catalogue, and, on request, she enlightens other classes in various subjects pertaining to the library.

The election of Student Body Officers is held as follows:

The President, Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasurer, as well as the Student Representatives shall be elected by the members of this organization in the manner hereinafter provided, and shall hold office for the school term following their election.


Not later than the first day of December and the first day of May of each term, the Executive Board shall appoint an Election Committee of five members and shall post the names and the departments of the same on the bulletin board. The nomination shall be made by petition presented to the Election Committee on or before the first school Friday in January and the third Friday in May, and the election Committee shall thereupon immediately post a list of nominees on the bulletin board. The nomination petition shall be signed by not less than five per cent of the qualified electors for the office and shall contain the written consent of the nominee to his nomination.

The election shall be held on the Friday before the fifteenth of January and on the fourth Friday of May of each term. The election shall be by ballot and shall be conducted by the Election Committee.

The candidates receiving the highest number of votes cast for an office shall be declared elected. If two candidates are to be elected, the two receiving the highest number of votes cast for the office shall be declared elected. In the case of a tie vote for an office, the Executive Board shall within one week after the election, elect to the office one of the candidates receiving the tie vote.

In the last election for the Spring term of 1944 Ted Keller was elected President; Richard Fletchell, Vice-President; Steve Gann, Secretary, and Howard Hamilton, Treasurer.

Even though the C's had an unsuccessful season, they nevertheless had a good club.


With a first string composed of Petrie, Gibbs, Murray, Clark, and Kaufman, they tallied a total of 107 points in eight games, one of which was a forfeit.

By converting Bob Barger, returning outfielder, into a catcher and with Ted Beckner also out for that position, he had a strong pair of ball-wise backstops. The foresight in changing pitcher Al Federici to an outfielder gave him a hard-hitting right fielder; and with Tony Fazzolari, Bob Devin, Jim Boland, and Ken Warren, who also plays outfield, he had an experienced outfield that with a little coaching could be made stronger.

Coach Patterson deserves much praise for developing such a well-rounded team. Previous to the season's opening he had drilled the squad in base running, fielding, sliding, and batting to be sure of having an alert and hustling team.

He had several skull practices at which he pointed out several player's faults, and what was necessary to correct them.



Other than in the three aforementioned events, he has no sure winners, but has several prospects in view. His team is weakened mostly by the loss of several good sprinters.




