

Mrs. Cary has very efficiently handled all the secertarial work for a number of years.












## The Graduating Class


Late in the term we selected Gladys Gilbert as our photographer. We put in anxious days of waiting for our proofs and trying to decide on the right picture.


"Plane Crazy," a contemporary comedy, was presented by the Jan. '45 Senior Class in the Benson Auditorium on Friday evening, December 8.










# Coaching Staff

After the Highlander's touchdown the Tech line gained recognition, and clamped down to hold them scoreless until the final minutes of the game. With superior offensive and defensive playing the Orange clad marched to an easy victory.

The opening game of the Portland Prep season saw the Techman playing a high-spirited Commerce eleven. The team, playing with the same technique they adopted at Kelso, came out on the long end of a 26 to 6 score. Again Beth-

Grant had a very weak team and only one General managed to finish up among the Benson thinclads. Polits won the meet in one of his fastest times of the season, 10:15.

With Polits staging a remarkable finish and more smooth work by the team as a whole the squad was able to defeat the touted Rangers. It was in this meet that Polits cut his knee and darkened his chances of running in the all-city meet.

#### BENSON 22—Jefferson 43

A determined Jeff squad, not content with the first setback the Techmen handed them, asked for this meet as a warm-up for the all-city. Running without Polits the Blue and Orange displayed superiority by soundly out running the Democrats. Wetzler and Holstad featured Benson's attack.
