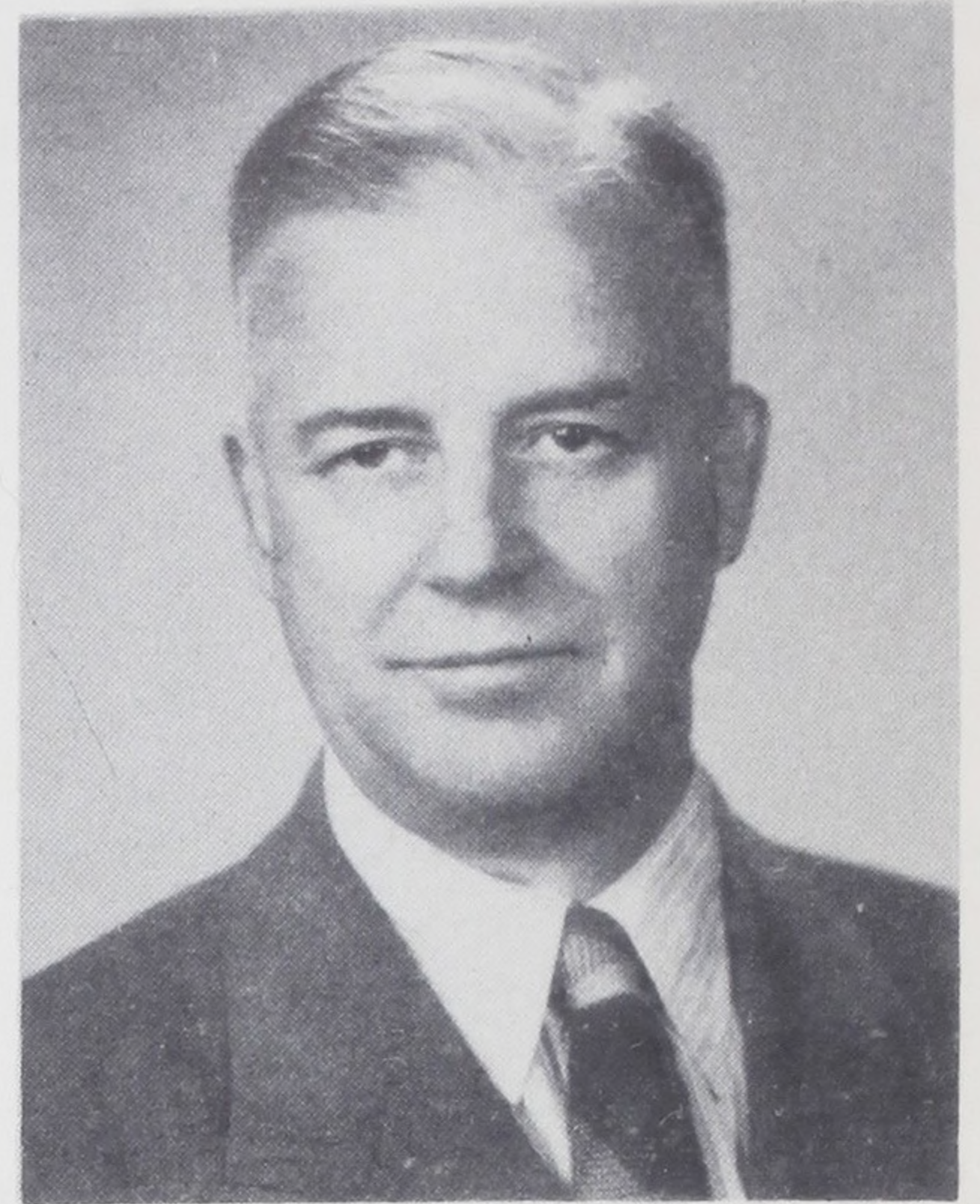

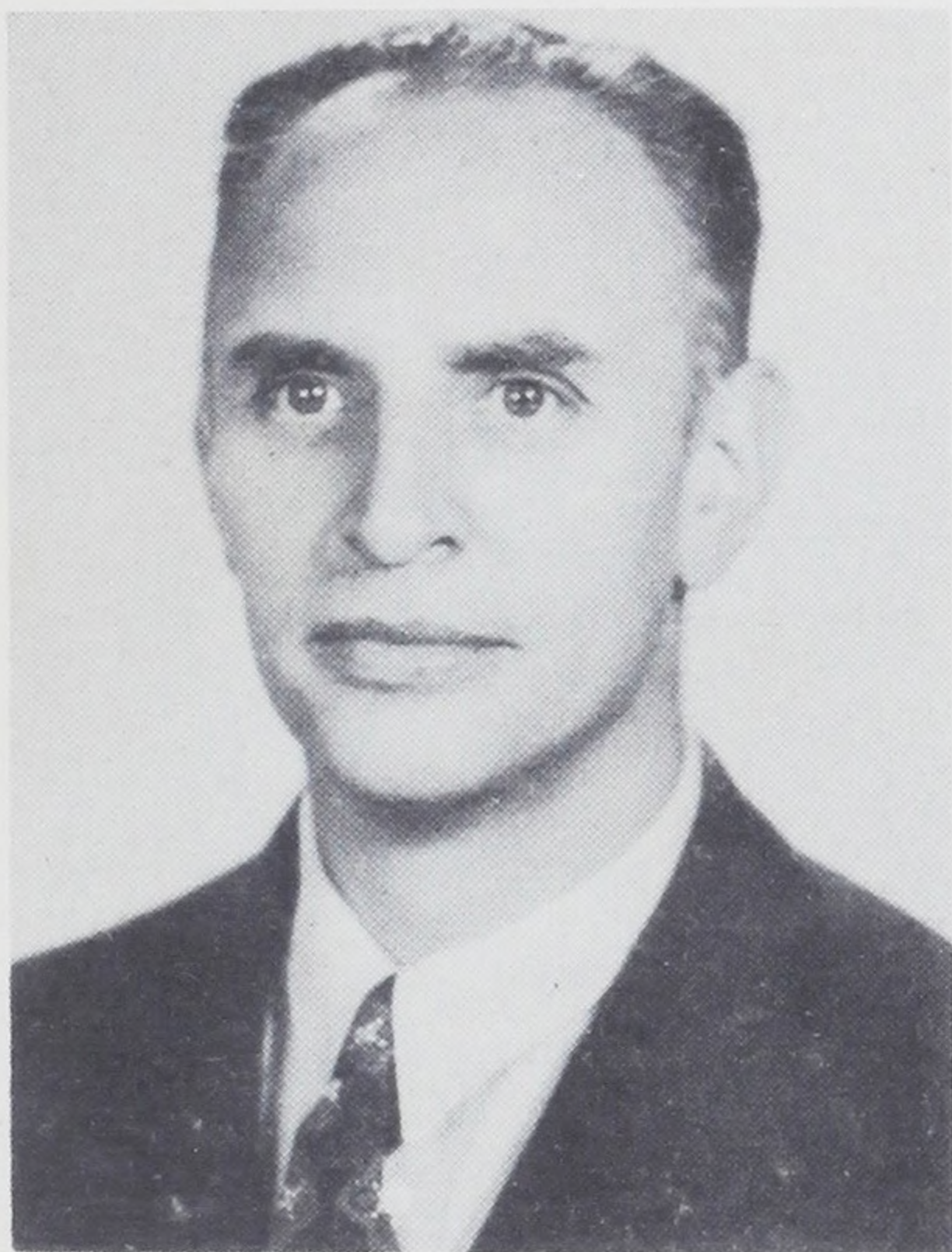


## VICE PRINCIPAL

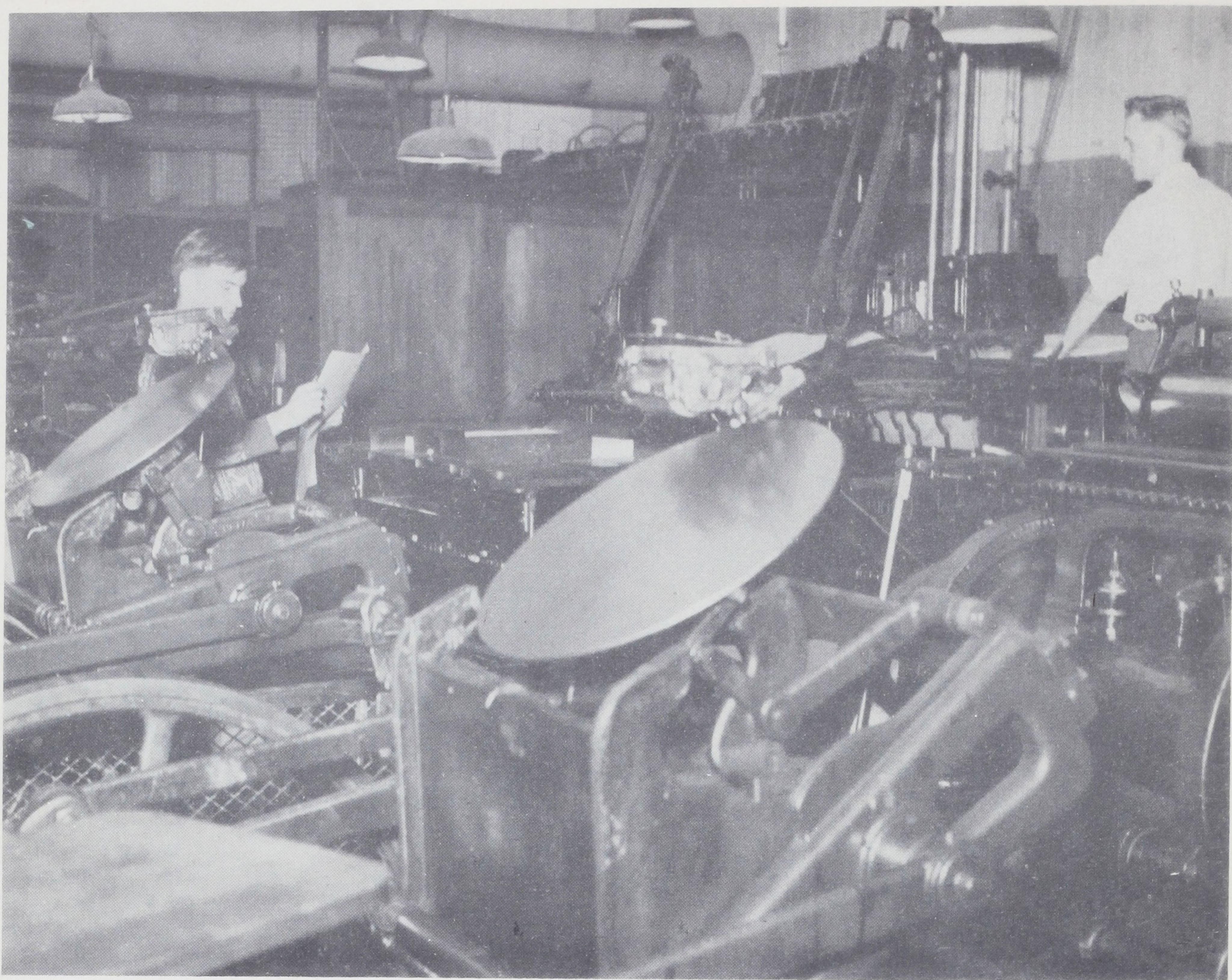

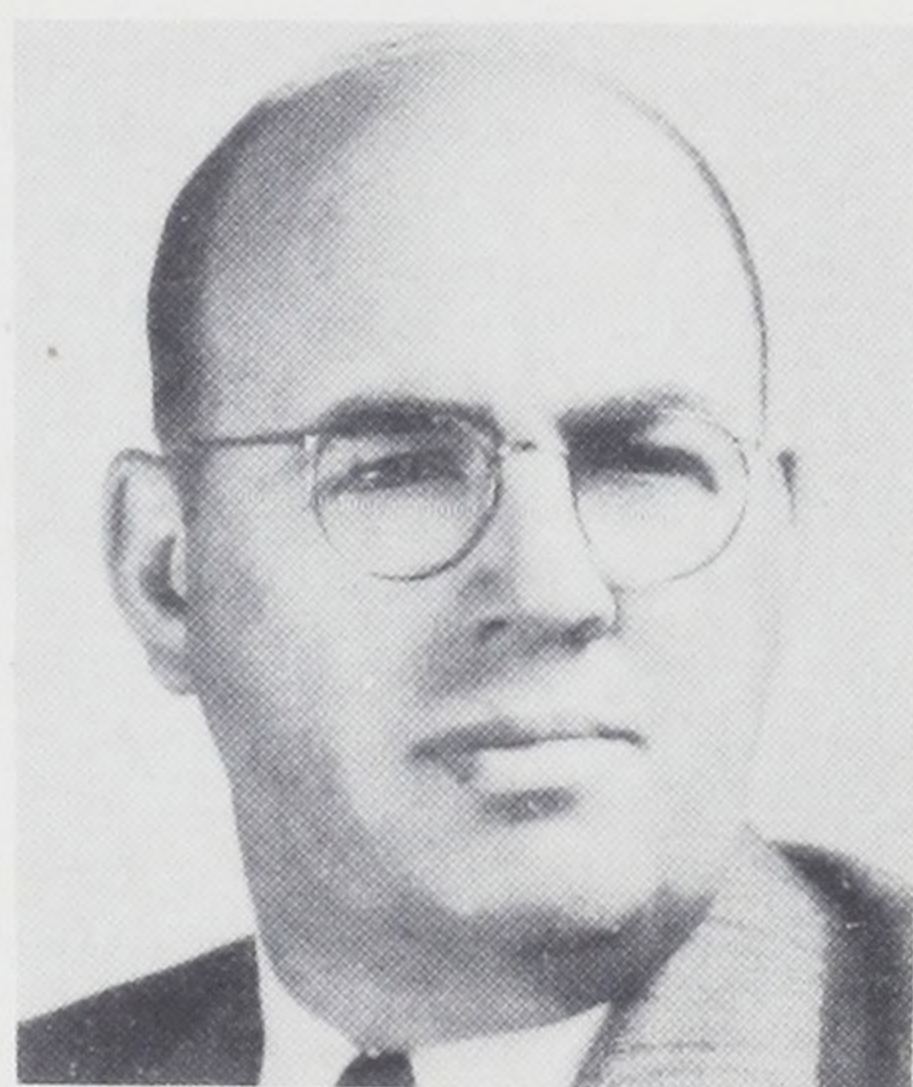

We of the June, 1947, class, wish to thank every counsellor for the great help that they have rendered unto us.



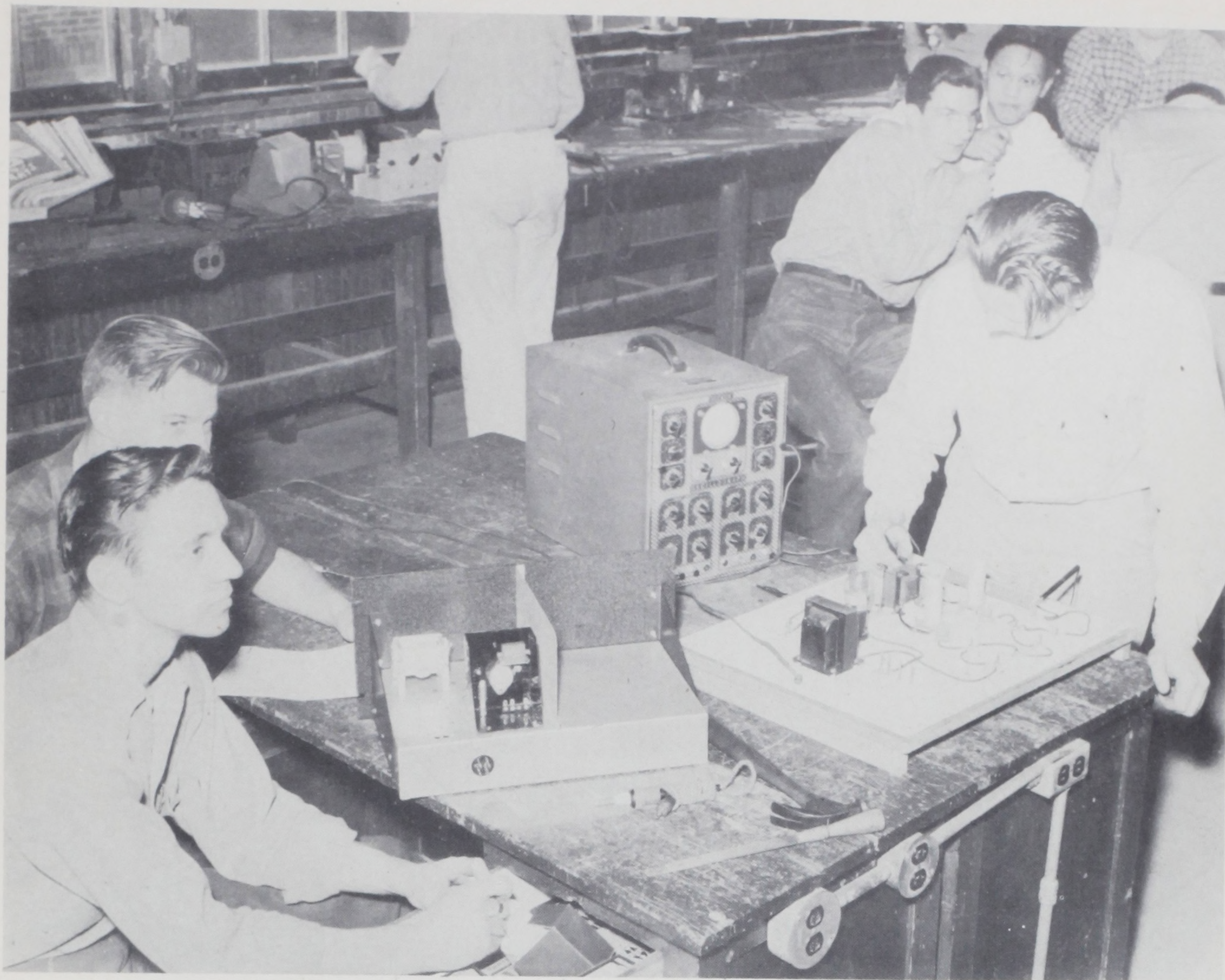

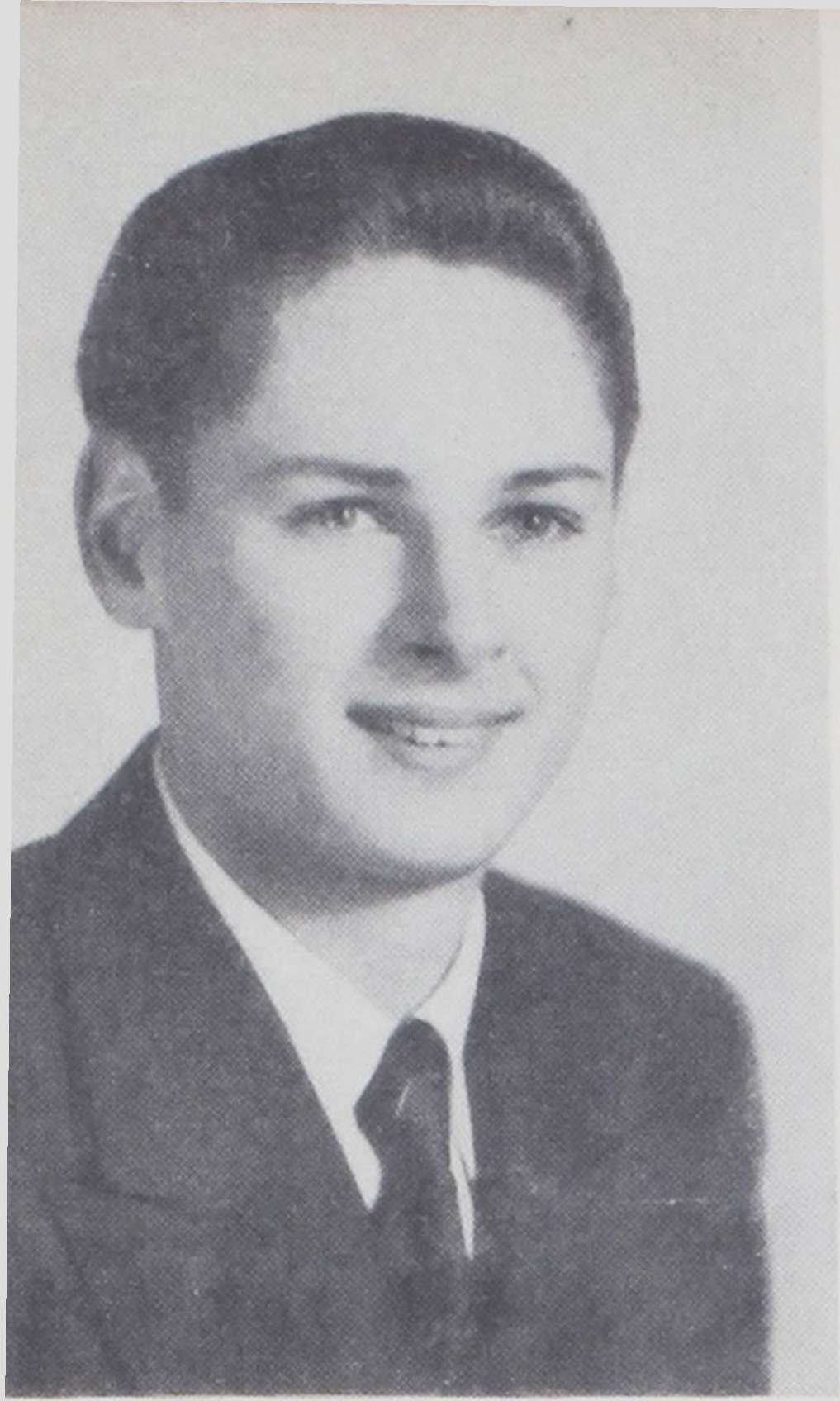
Miss Haight and Mr. Mee got down to work and planned the senior prom, the class play, and the many other duties of a graduating class.

## The Play in Brief

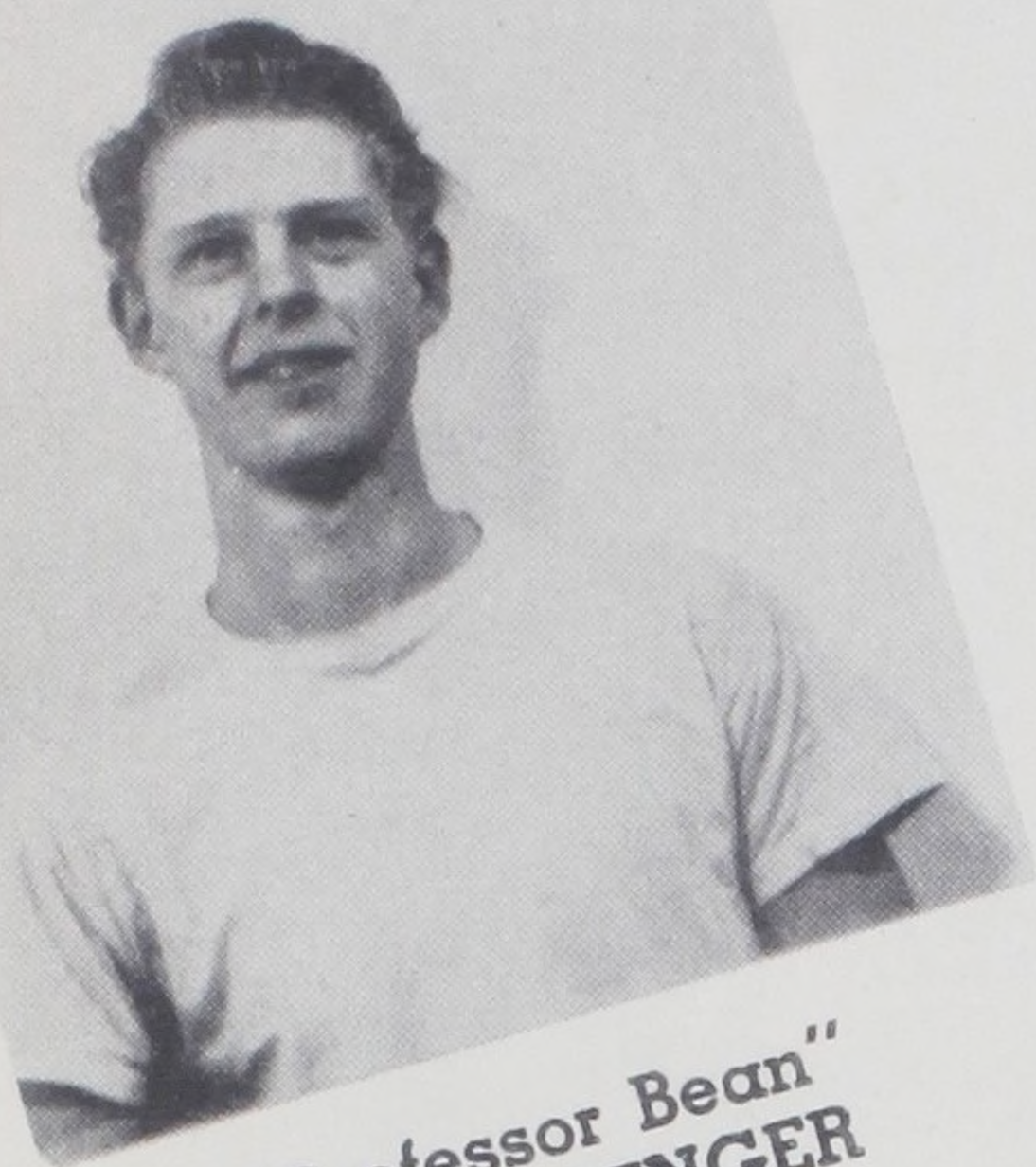

## TECH PEP STAFF

In the fall of 1920, a great project was launched here at Benson Tech. The first Tech Pep was delivered to the student body.

The paper has changed in size many times since this first, three column, four page, publication was begun. Once the Tech Pep was an eight column issue.

When the Tech Pep was started in 1920, the policy was, a high school paper should have plenty of pep and punch and be everything but weak. Hence the name Tech Pep was derived for the paper.

Only four issues of the first Tech Pep were published until the size was changed to a five column paper.

In September, 1940, a new thing was tried in high school newspapers. A daily paper was started. The Tech Pep continued being a daily publication until May, 1942. Then due to a decrease in enrollment in the print shop, the paper was changed back to a four column, four page issue.

The paper has many awards that everyone should be proud of. The Tech Pep set one record which is very unusual for any high school paper to ever attain. That was in 1935 when it won four ratings in one term. That unusual volume won All-American Honor Rating of the National Scholastic Press Association of the University of Minnesota, captured the Gold Medal given by Columbia Scholastic Press Association of New York, took the Whitman Plaque awarded by Whitman College of Walla Walla, Washington, for the best high school paper in Oregon, Washington, Idaho and Montana, and won the Arnold Bennet Hall Award, presented by the University of Oregon for having Oregon's best high school newspaper.

## OPTIMIST CLUB

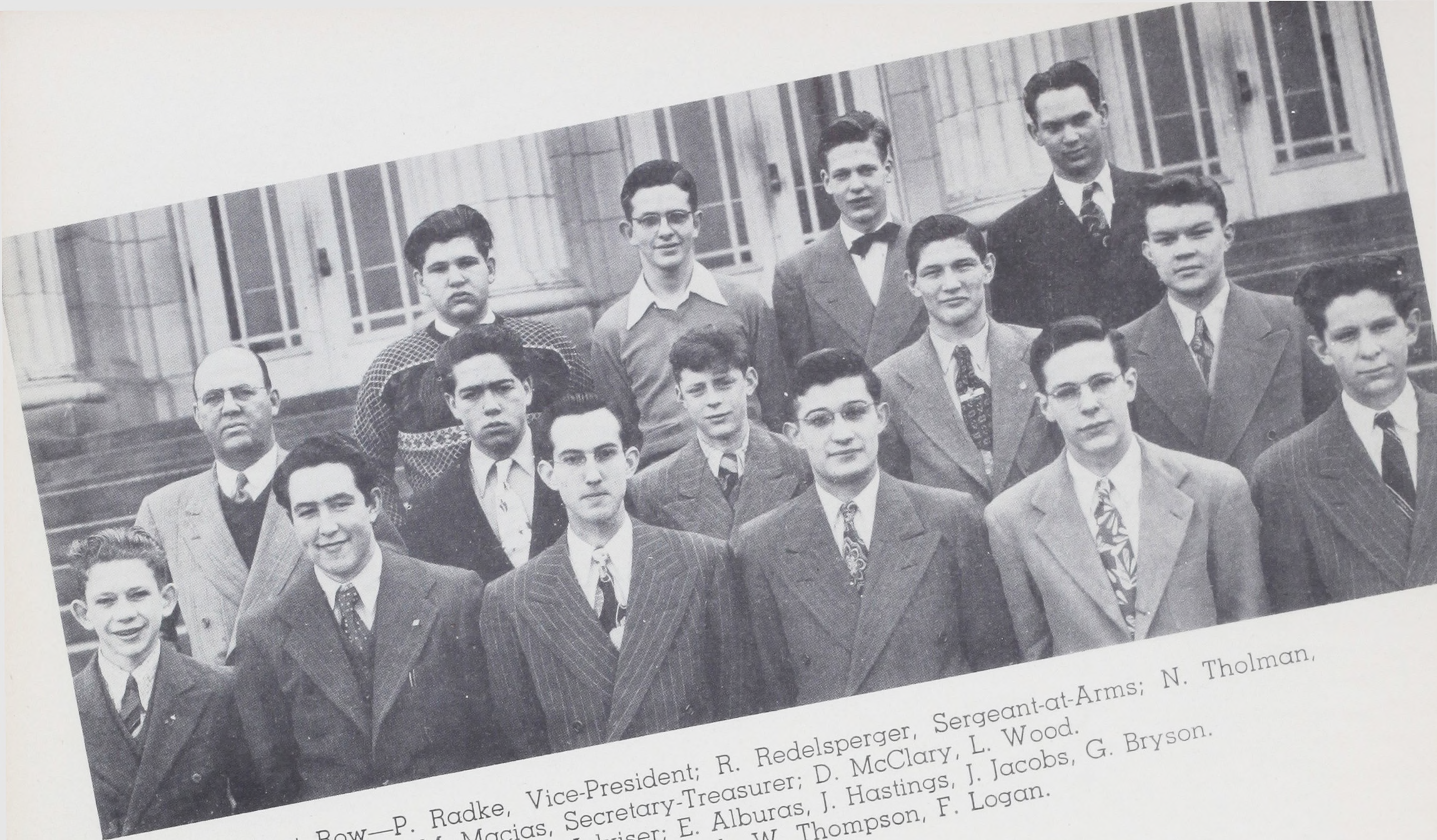

## ELECTRIC CLUB

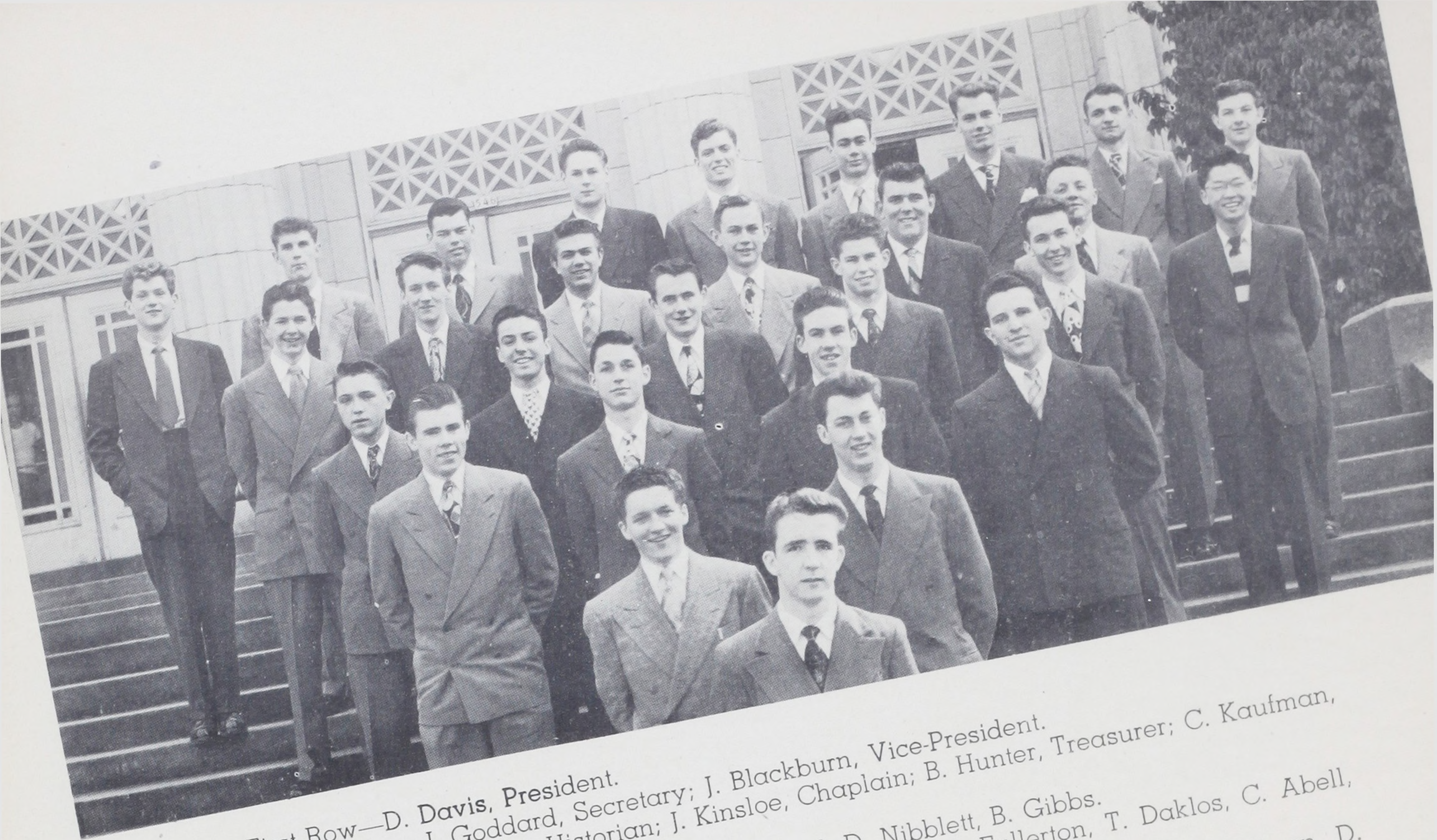

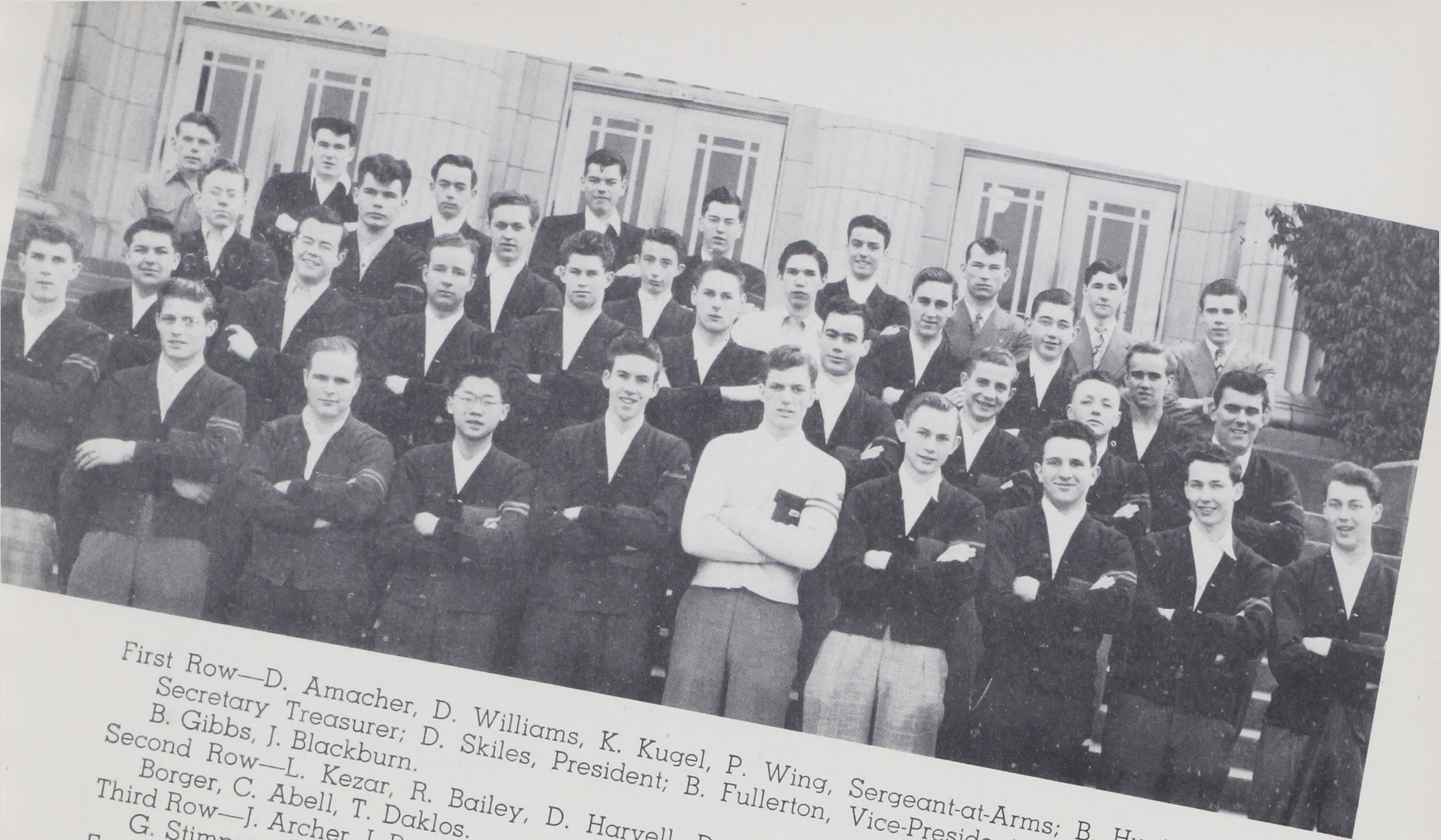

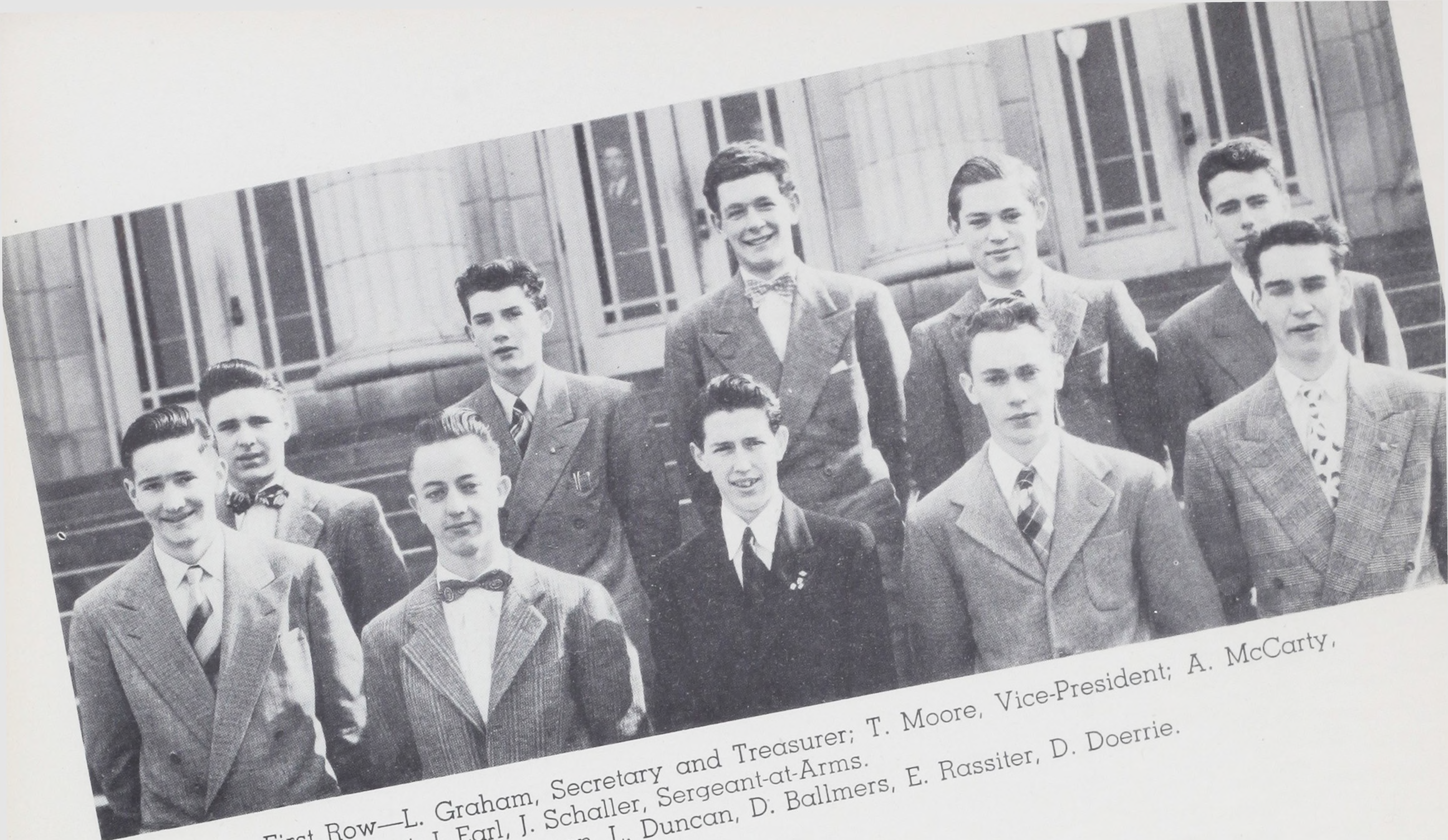

## CAFETERIA BOARD

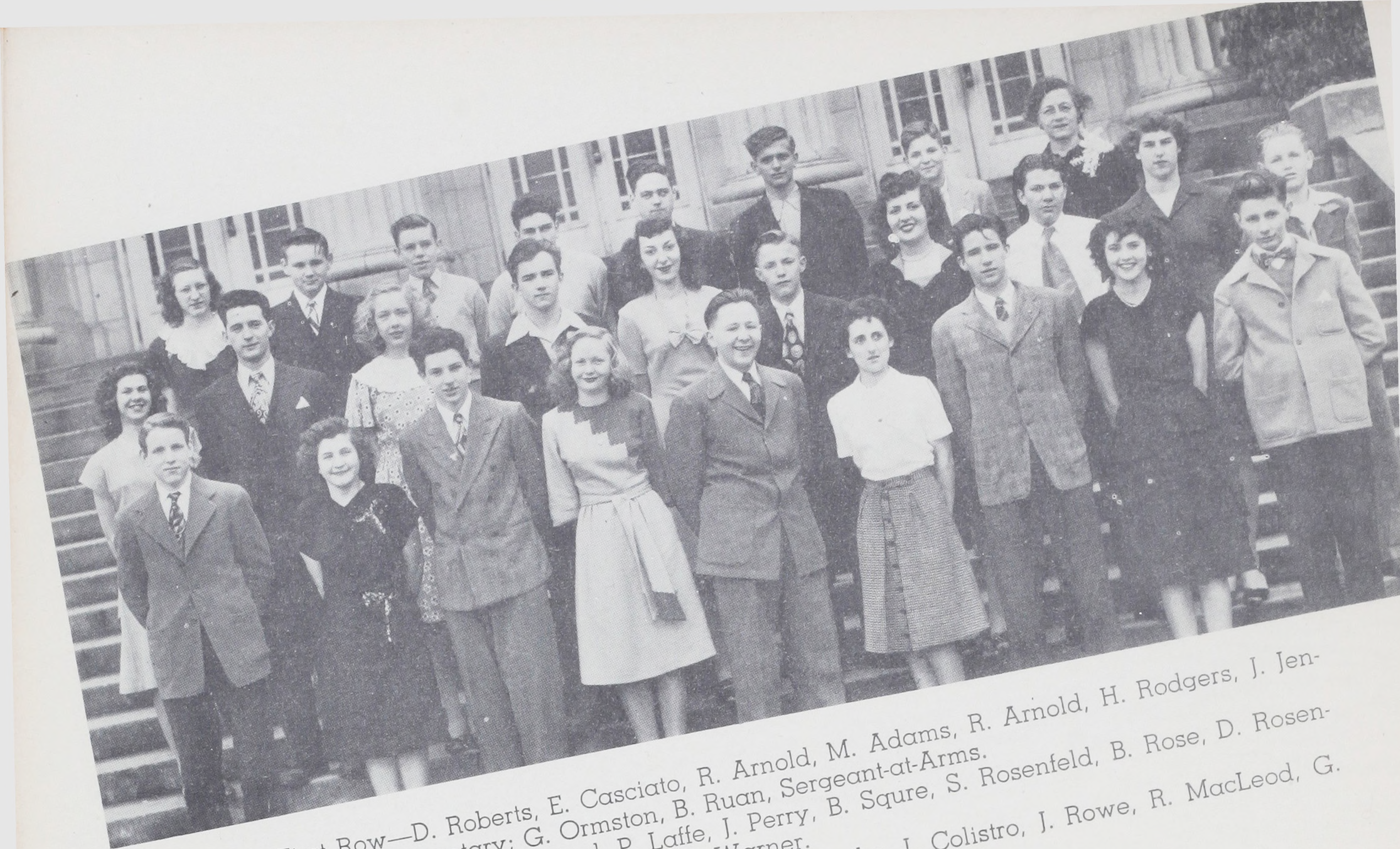

## FIRE SQUAD

The Fire Squad is the school's organization for managing and planning the fire drills, which is supplemented by their adviser, Mr. Haskell. The school is divided into seven zones with a captain and a lieutenant in each. For a fire drill the bell is rung in the main office by either the chief or the assistant chief. Then the captains and lieutenants take their posts with the firemen manning the zones where they happen to be. The firemen's job is to turn out all lights, shut the doors and windows, and to check to see that no students are left in the school. The lieutenants and captains see that all of these duties are accomplished in their zone and then report to the chief in the office. The average time for a fire drill is two minutes, which is largely made possible by the efficient cooperation of the faculty.

At the present time the office of fire chief is now in the capable hands of Brad Fullerton, who has been a member of the Fire Squad for several terms. Through the almost superhuman efforts of Mr. Haskell, the organization's very capable adviser, this squad was organized into the best shape it has ever been. Any member of this squad who has any problem, usually takes this problem to Mr. Haskell, who gives his wise counsel and thereby brings a satisfactory conclusion to all fire problems in the school.

The Fire Squad is one of the oldest active school organizations. The squad has taken the lead in fire drills among high schools as far back as 1923. 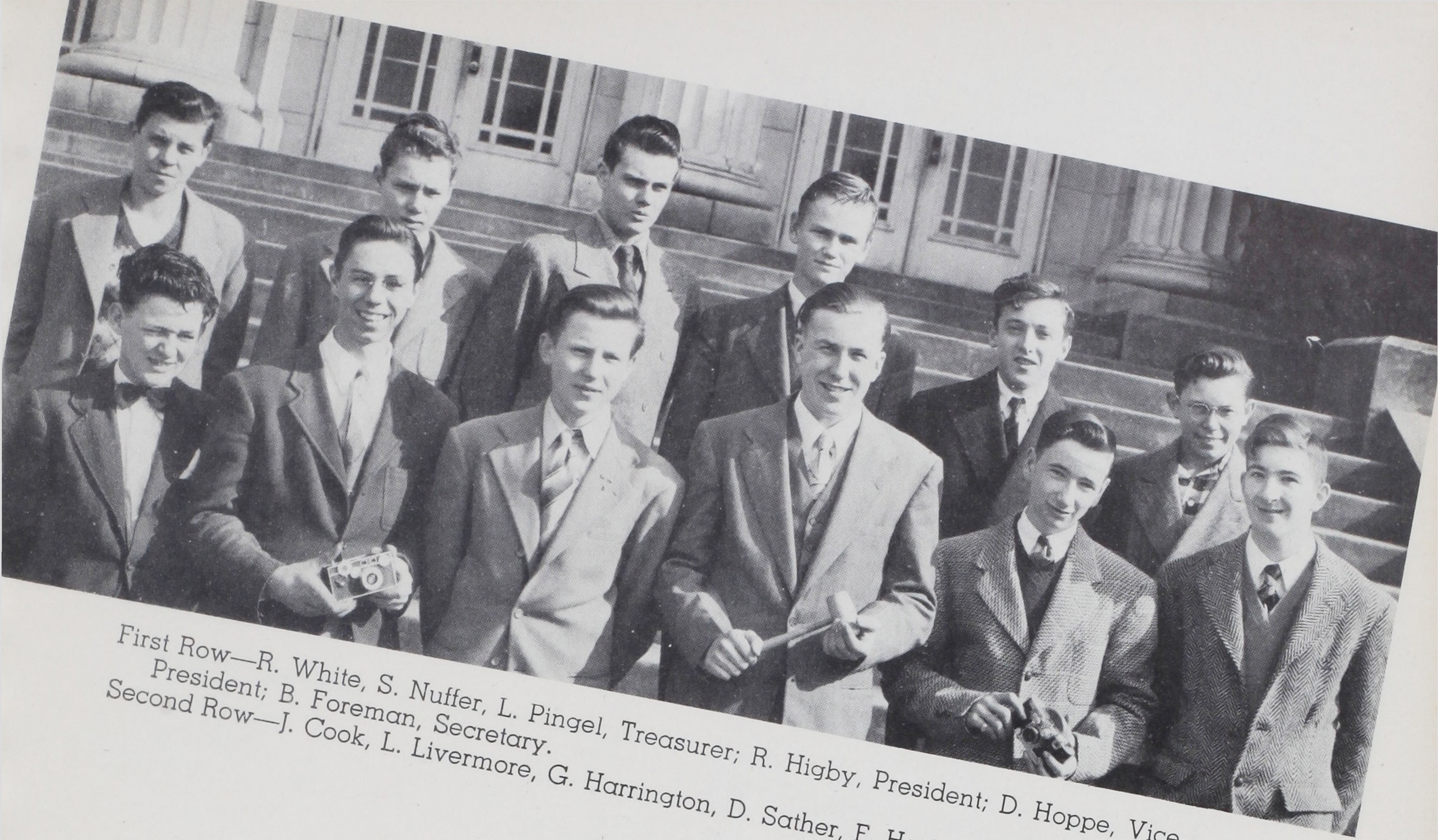

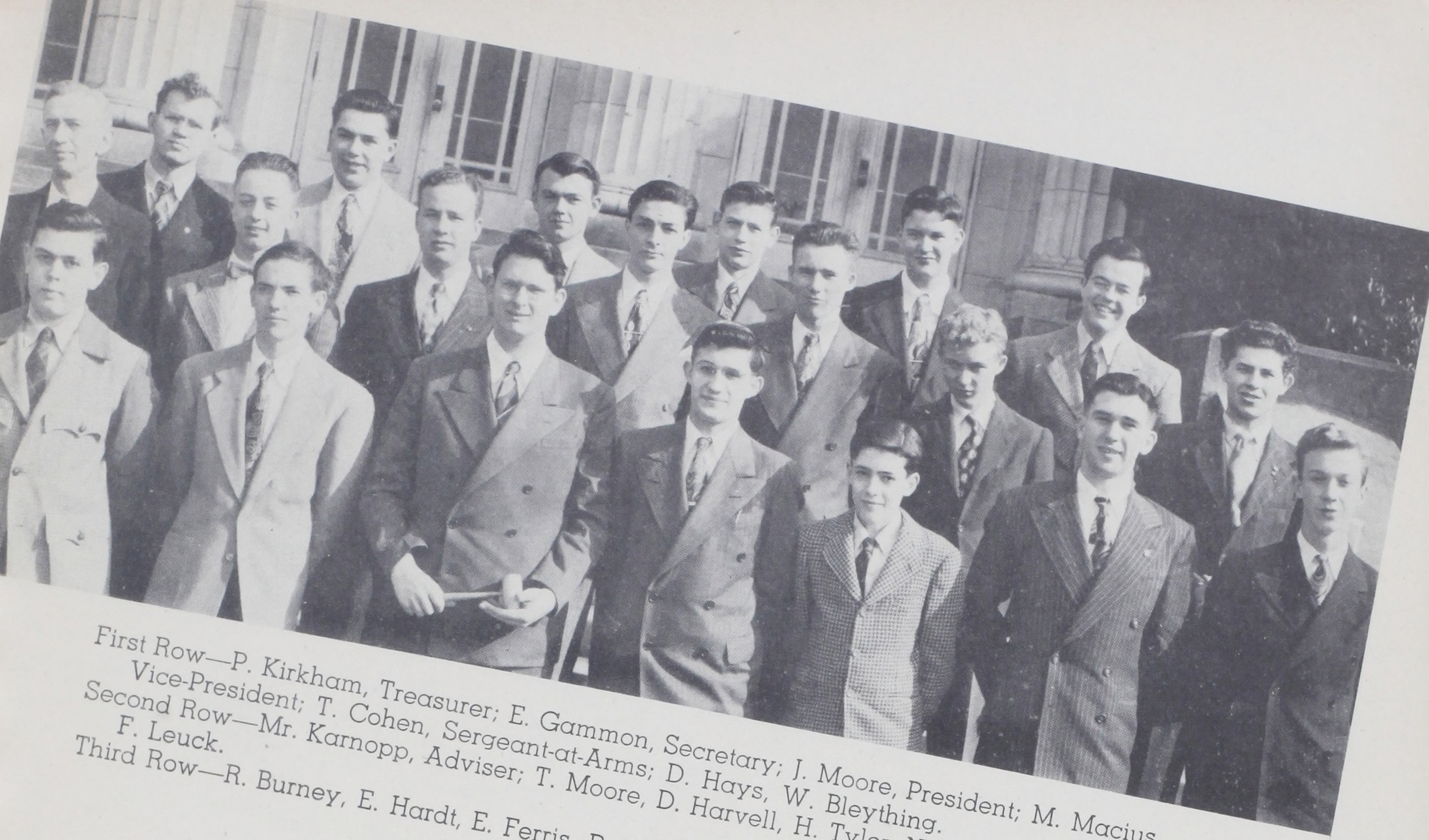

## ROLLER SKATING CLUB

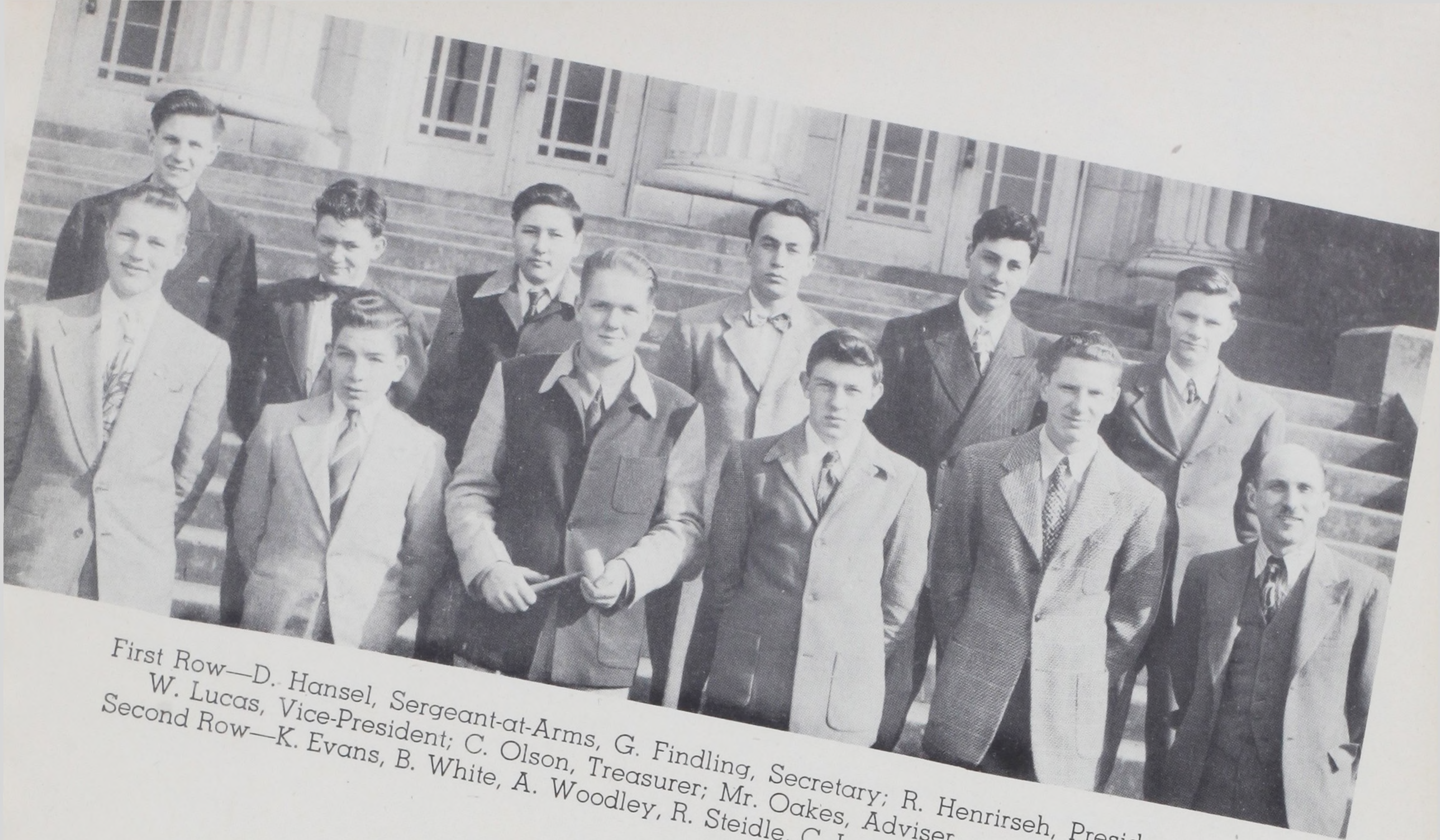

## SAILING CLUB

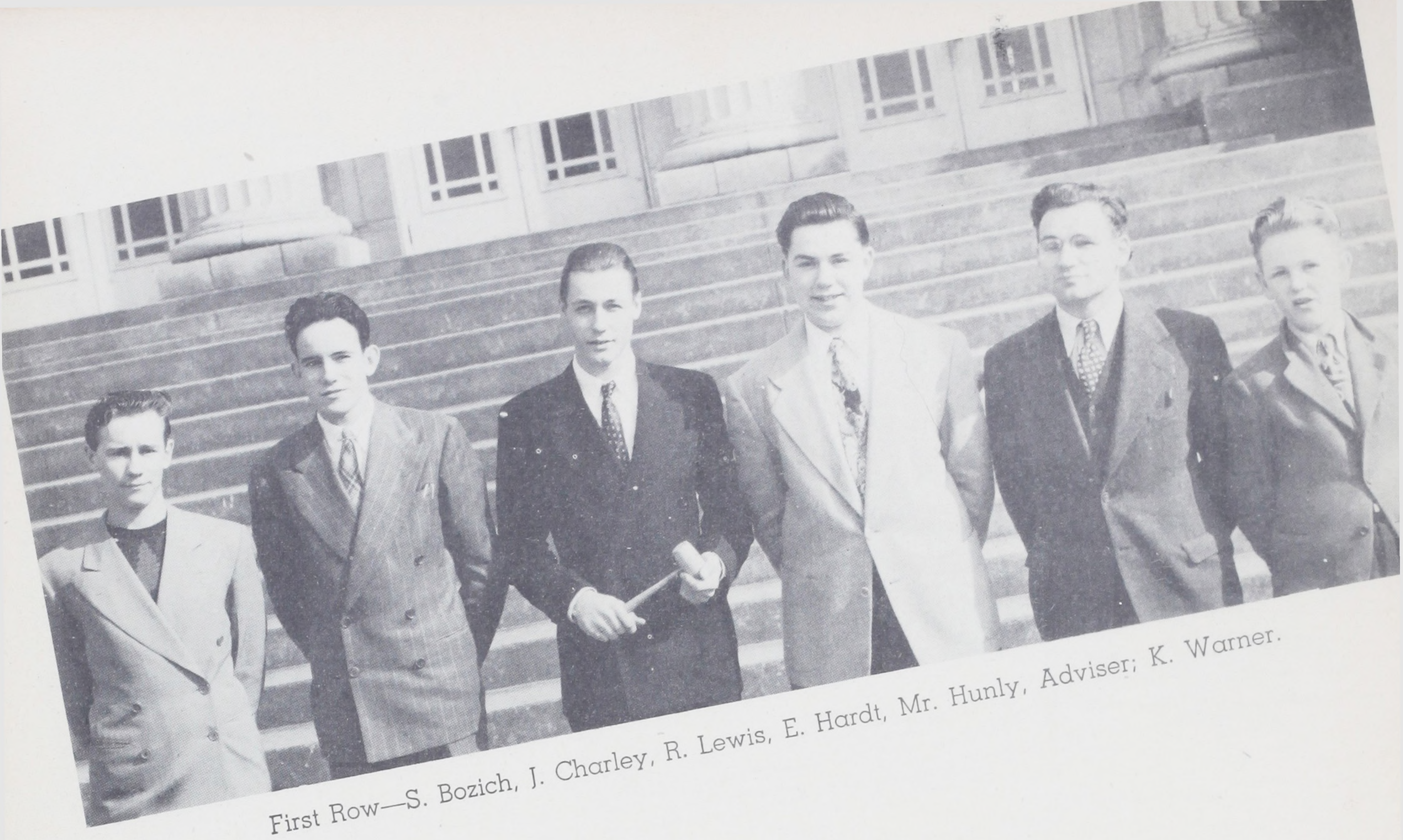

## PROJECTION BOOTH

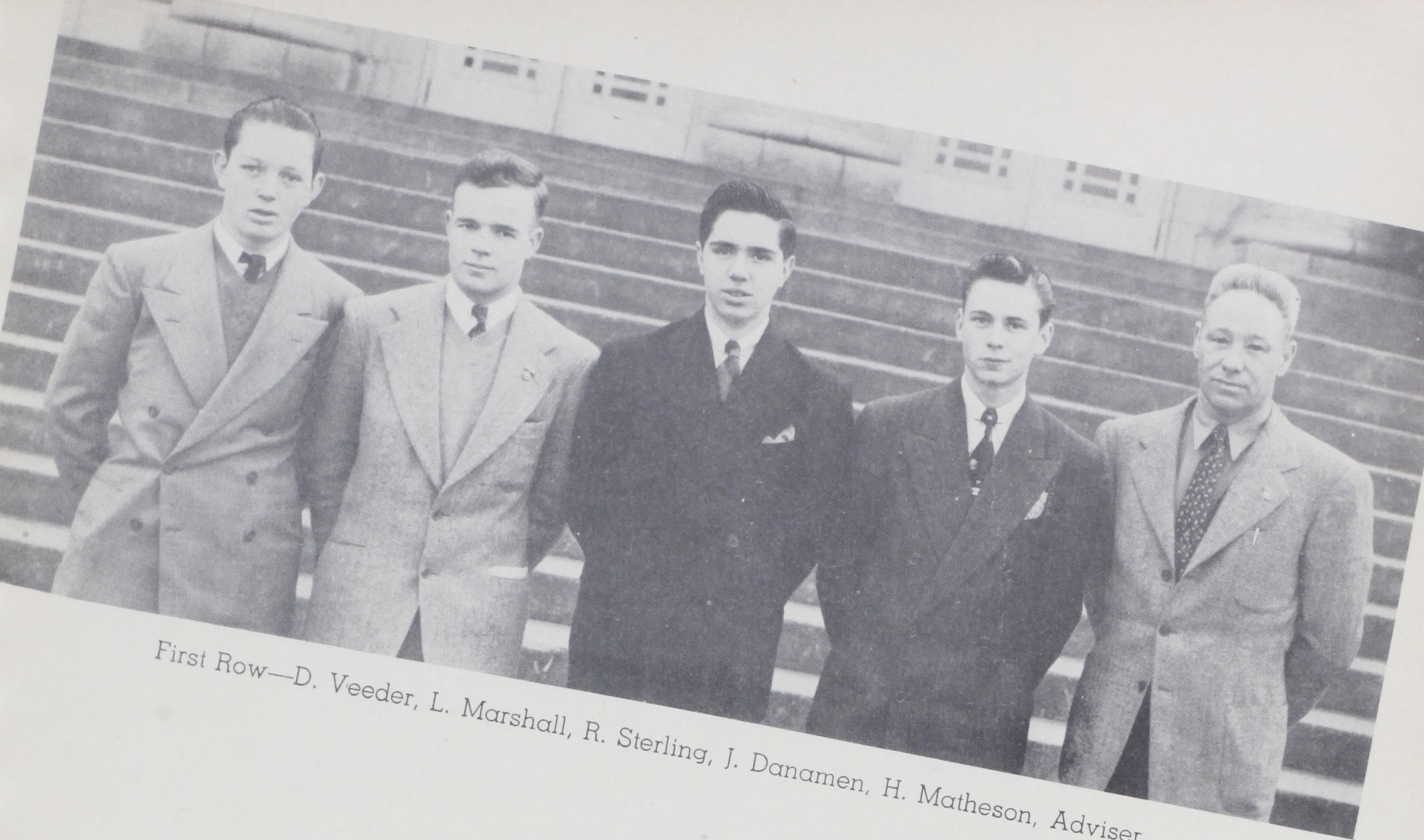
The projection booth crew consists of six boys who give up their lunch periods to run the noon shows for the entertainment of the students after the students have finished their lunches. The crew also operates the full length features that are shown to the students during the assemblies. They also operate the public address system of the auditorium, which is always being used by some student group, assemblies, or outside interests. They do this job out of a desire to serve their fellow students and an interest to learn this type of work on their own time. They receive no reward for their services except the many things they learn in this booth which will stand them in good stead later on in life.

The equipment that they operate consists of: two 35 millimeter projectors, one 16 millimeter projector, a stereopticon and a public address system. All of this equipment is owned by the student body and was originally purchased by the student body. The public address system was recently overhauled and is now in perfect condition. Most of the equipment was bought a number of years ago but it is kept in as good operating condition as possible.

## STUDENT STORE

After an absence of over five years (during the war), the Benson student body again has a store, but under the supervision of a new adviser, Mr. Matheson. The store, when first started, was a part of the candy stand, but when the candy stand was put in the newly built cafeteria, the student store was moved to the store room. At that time it was under the very capable guidance of Mr. Bittner, Benson's former vice-principal. In 1941, the War Production Board moved into Benson, taking all the space because it was needed for war purposes. The store was then moved to the book store room across from the main hall office, but the space allotted was not enough, and the store was running in the red, so Mr. Bittner was forced to close the store.

After the end of the war, the students and teachers started asking when the store would again return to Benson. Pressure was exerted and the Benson executive board voted to put up money for a new store. Room one was divided in half and the new store was built. Since Mr. Bittner was about to retire, another advisor had to take over and Mr. Matheson became the logical choice for he was already handling all monetary affairs for the student body.

The store is not only a store, but also a student exchange. Any student wishing to sell his last terms books, turns his books over to the store which sells them at a fair price and charges the students ten cents per book sold to take care of the handling. The store's supply is not limited to the sales of books, pencils and paper, but also sells shatter-proof goggles, pumice soap, small tools and other items required in a technical school.

He entered the armed services in 1942 and became athletic director for the European Theater. He returned to Benson last Spring and made Benson a State Title threat in track placing nine men in the finals.

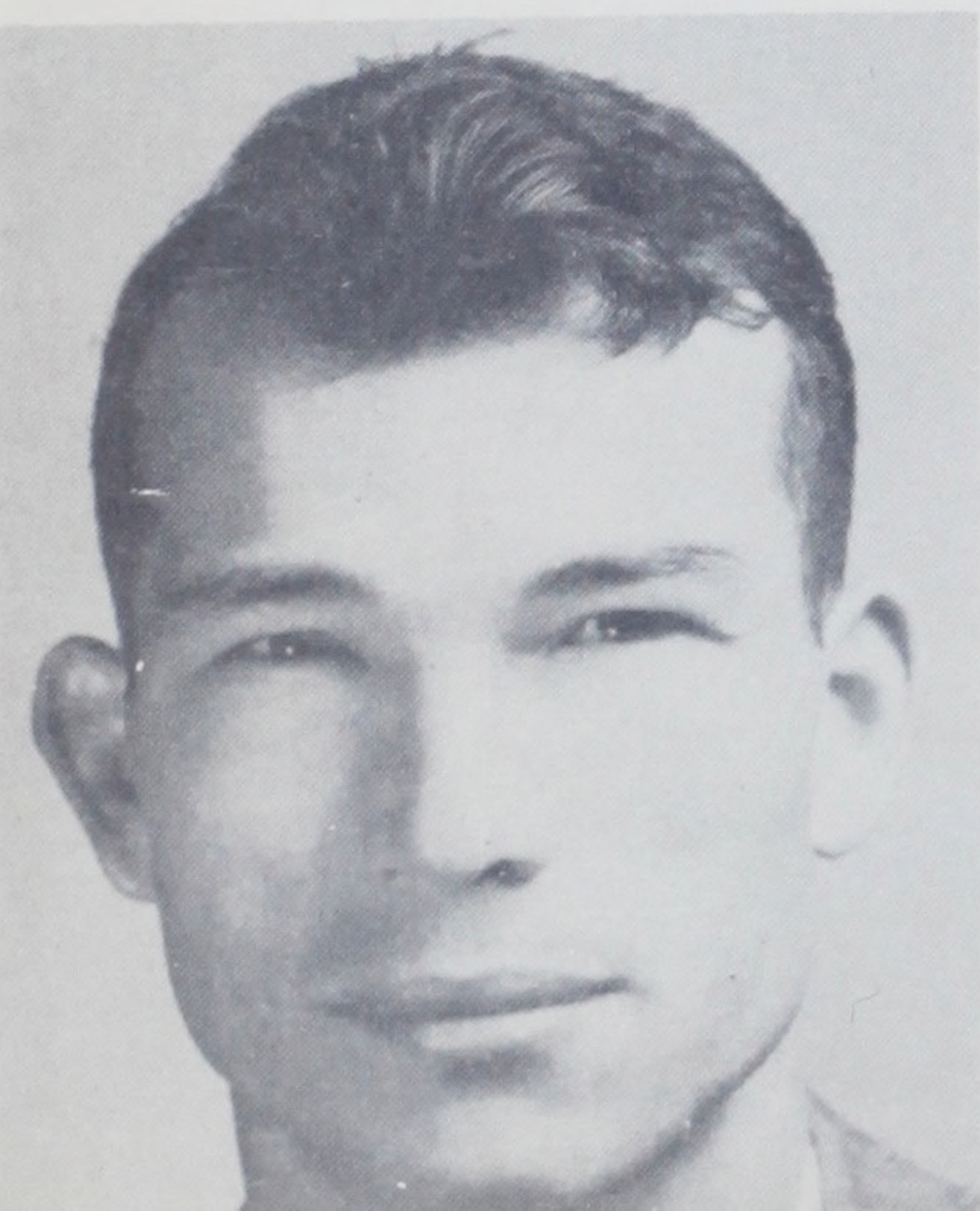
He coached an injury ridden gridiron squad into fifth place in the city standings.

The '46-'47 Basketball Team under the new leadership of Coach Jim McGregor, who came to Benson from the Marine Corps, started off the season with ten preseason contests. The Techmen won eight of their preseason fracasas while dropping two, making a very good showing and being slated as a tough contender for a top berth in the race. The Mechanics didn't live up to preseason expectations, losing all the contests except four out of the scheduled sixteen games, two from cellerite Sabin, one from Lincoln and one from Commerce.

Brad Fullerton, sharpshooting Benson forward, made news for the team as he continually played a sparkling game, and was selected on the All-City Team as a forward. Brad also set a new record for Benson with a high of 216 points, passing over the previous record made by Bruce Hanningan, 1940-41, of 207 points. Don Nibblett also was talked about for his brilliant playing on the maple and received Honorable Mention award during the All-City selections. These assets however were not enough to keep the hot and cold team going.

Benson split their double bill with the Lincoln "Cardinals" with Benson winning the first and the Cardinals capturing the second contest on a 61-47 upset. Previous to this game Lincoln had just beaten Sabin. This however must have touched them off as they also toppled the highly favored Washington "Colonials." Don Nibblett amassed 16 points in the later of the two games to lead the day's scoring.

Benson's ballhawks found the Commerce "Penpushers" no push over in either game, but were able to collect enough counters to post one more win in the last of the two games, 53-44. Brad Fullerton went wild in this game, collecting 20 points to lead the game's ball pushers. Nibblett accounted for 16 of the 53 winning points.

The second game with Franklin proved Benson had something left in them as they

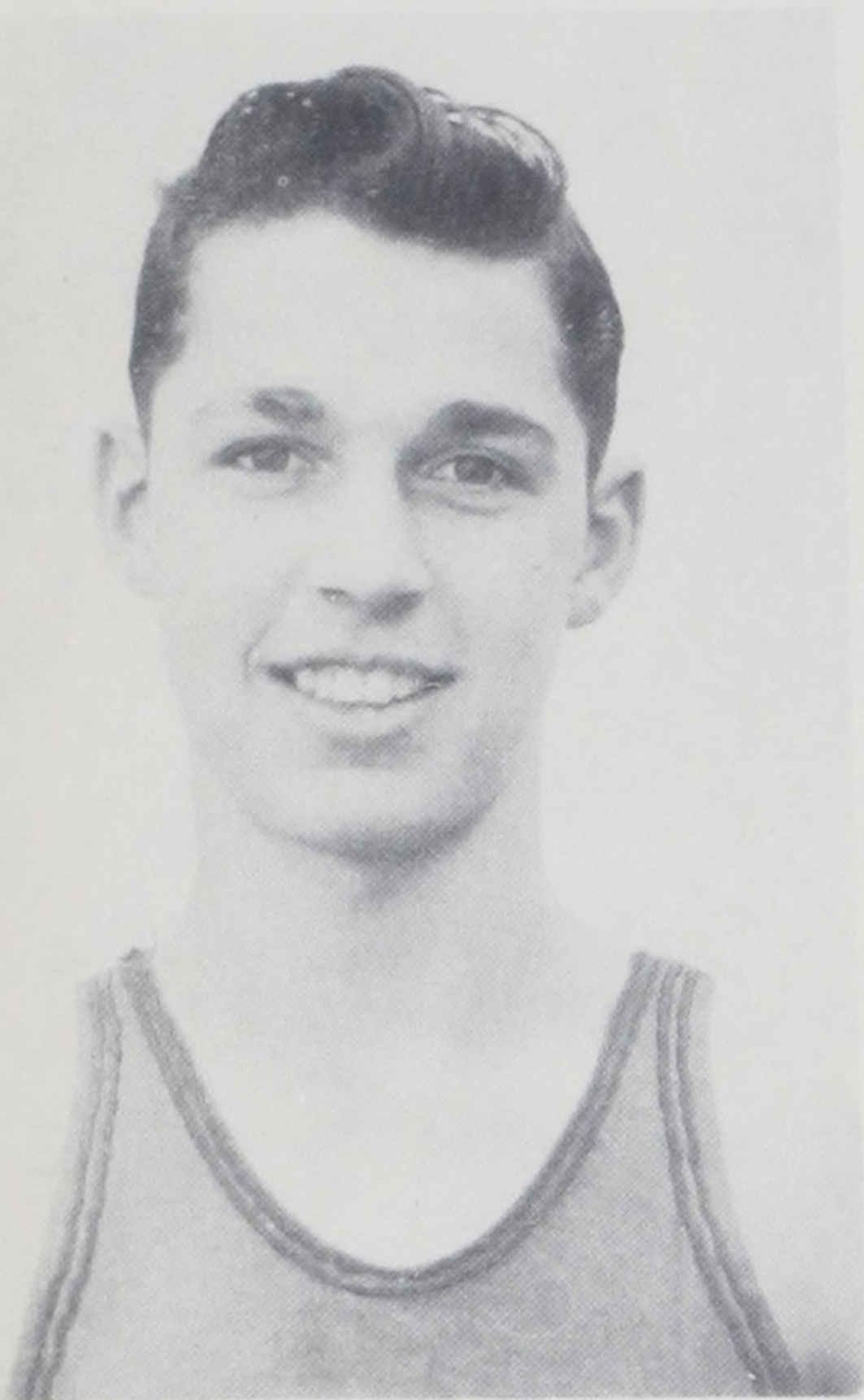


staged a nip and tuck battle with the Quakers, but a foul shot by Smith, Franklin center, gave the game to the opponents, 41-40. In the blazing contest two cagers were shown the exit for committing five fouls, Dwight Brown, center of Benson, and Bob Williams, flashy guard of Franklin. The game started slow but gained momentum throughout the game until the last half of the third, when both teams started to burn the floor. Both teams were recorded as making 15 field goals apiece.

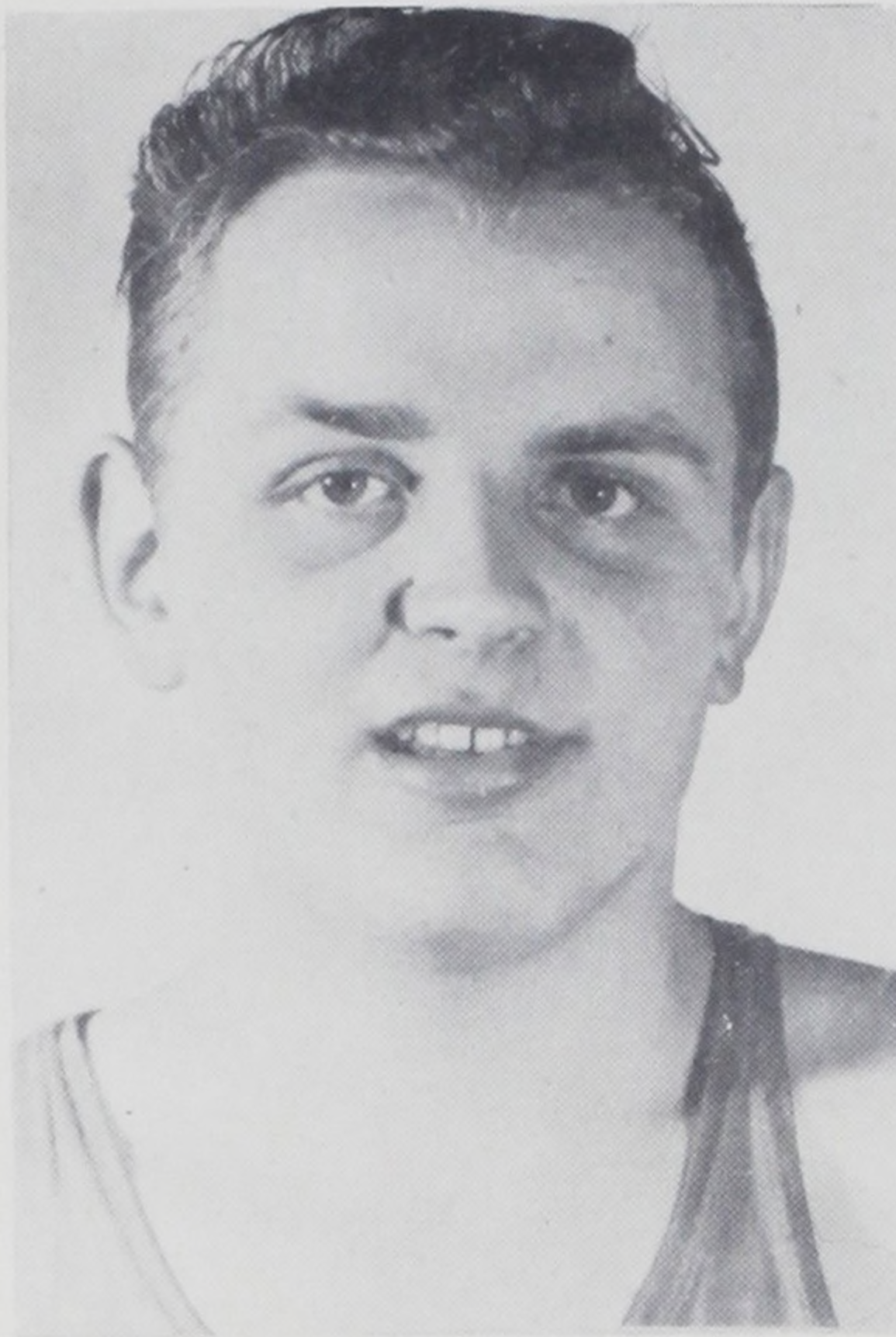

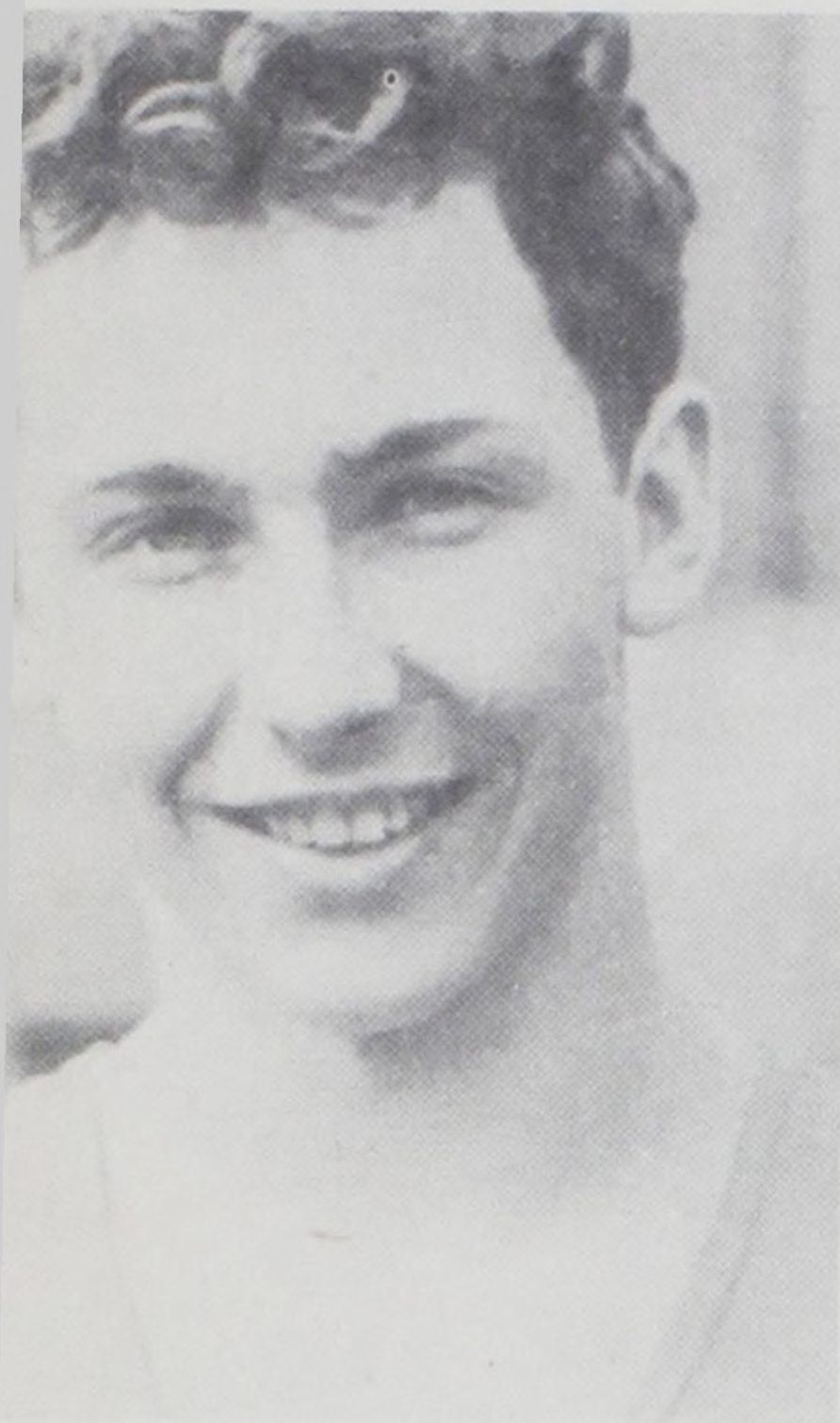

Coach Riney Cook's first Benson baseball team started the season by edging the Central Catholic Rams twice, taking the first game by a 5-2 score and the second game Benson captured by a 6-4 count. Benson also won two other games, one from Gresham and the other from St. Helens.

In league games Benson had a hard time, with Benson dropping the first contest to the Jeffmen, 7-2. Lack of hitting power proved fatal in this game as well as in the rest of the contests, while the Democrats hit off Benson quite often in timely places. This enabled the opponents to score time after time.

In the following game Benson met Lincoln, who was playing its first league game, and were able to place a 7-2 win on the four-hit pitching of Dan Stupur. The game was played on Lincoln's Kamm field, with Stupur striking out seven batsmen and Hamilton fanning out seven for the Cardinals.

Benson's next contest was a 19-8 slaughter at the hands of the Commerce "Pen-pushers." Benson used three pitchers in a final attempt to stop the onslaught. The Commerce pitcher did the unexpected for a pitcher, clouting out a home run his first time at bat and slugging one more in the seventh, leading the day's hitters. Commerce sent two men across home base in the first, one in the second, three in the third, four in the fourth, five in the fifth, one in the sixth and three more in the seventh for a total score of 19 runs. This just wasn't Benson's day, while the "Stenogs" seemed to be in tip top shape.

The Techmen played their best game of the season against Roosevelt, at that time top place team, and were defeated 6-5 in a ten-inning thriller. Merle O'Dell up from the Juniors of last year, pitched the entire game with Benson's fiery catcher, Dick Williams,



doing the catching. Benson collected five hits off Don Peterson, who was switched from third base, while the Teddies gathered up six off O'Dell. O'Dell fanned 11 while the Techmen were tagged with eight strike outs. The game was filled with excitement throughout with Benson leading the game up to the seventh inning.

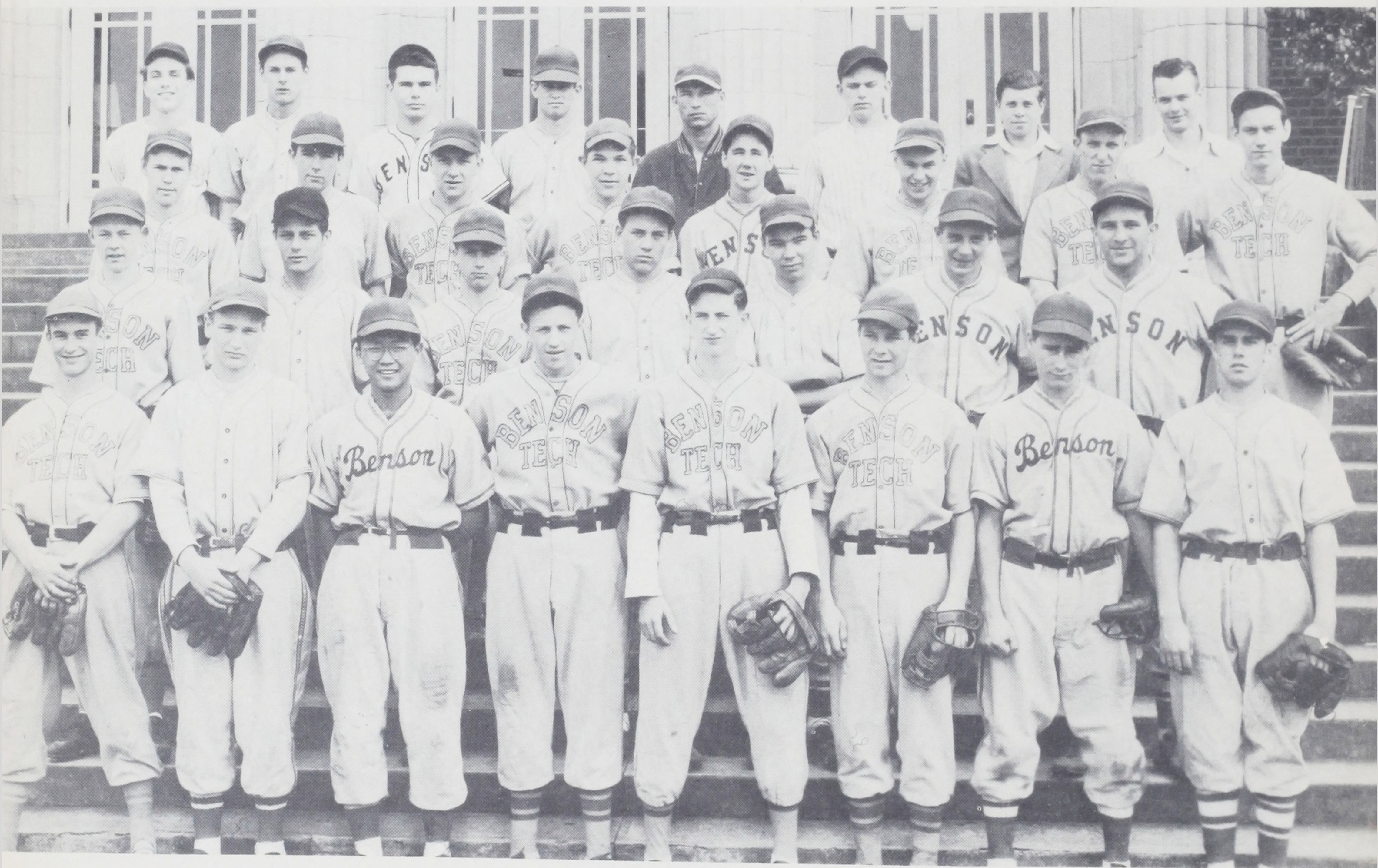
