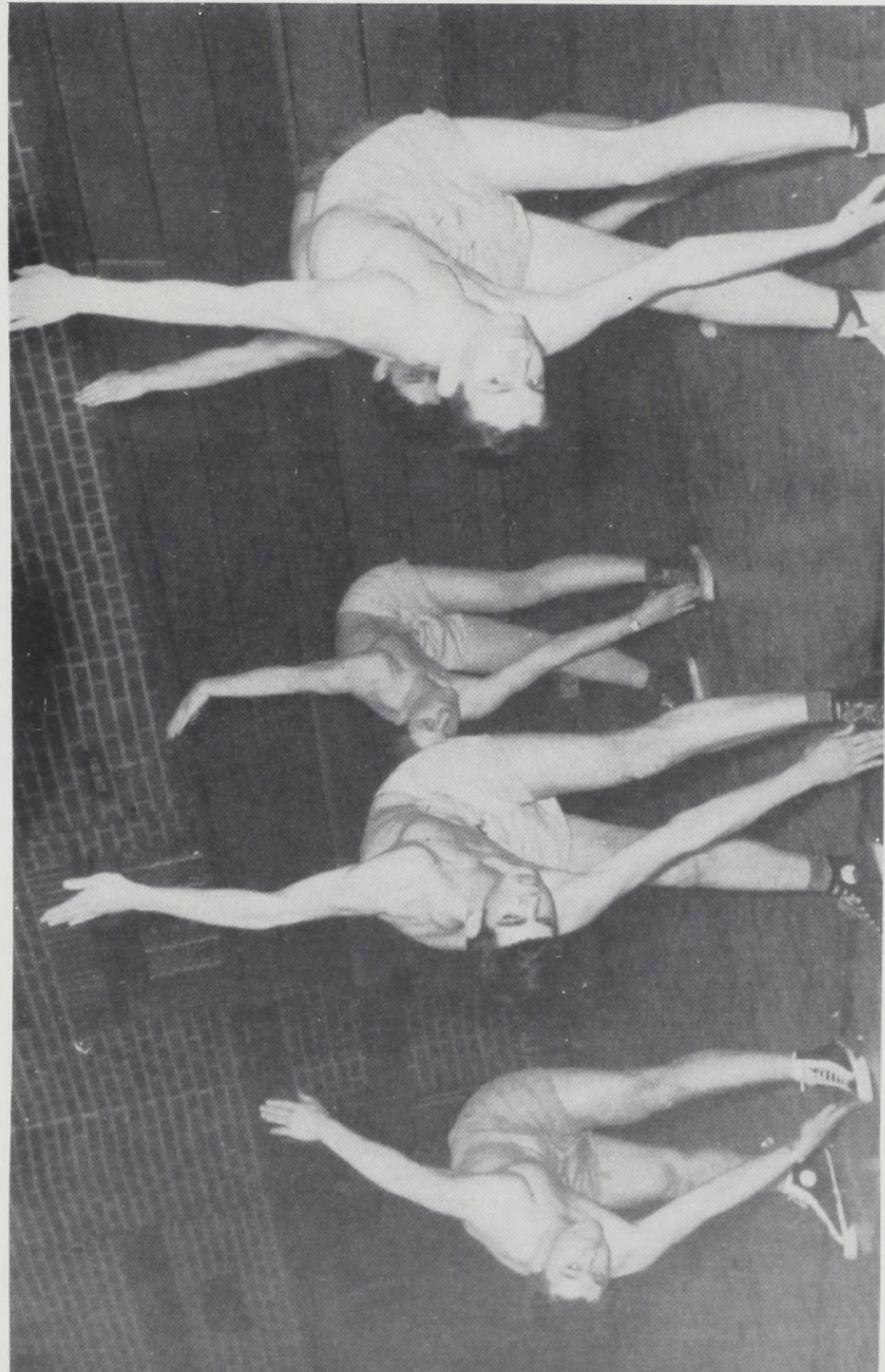

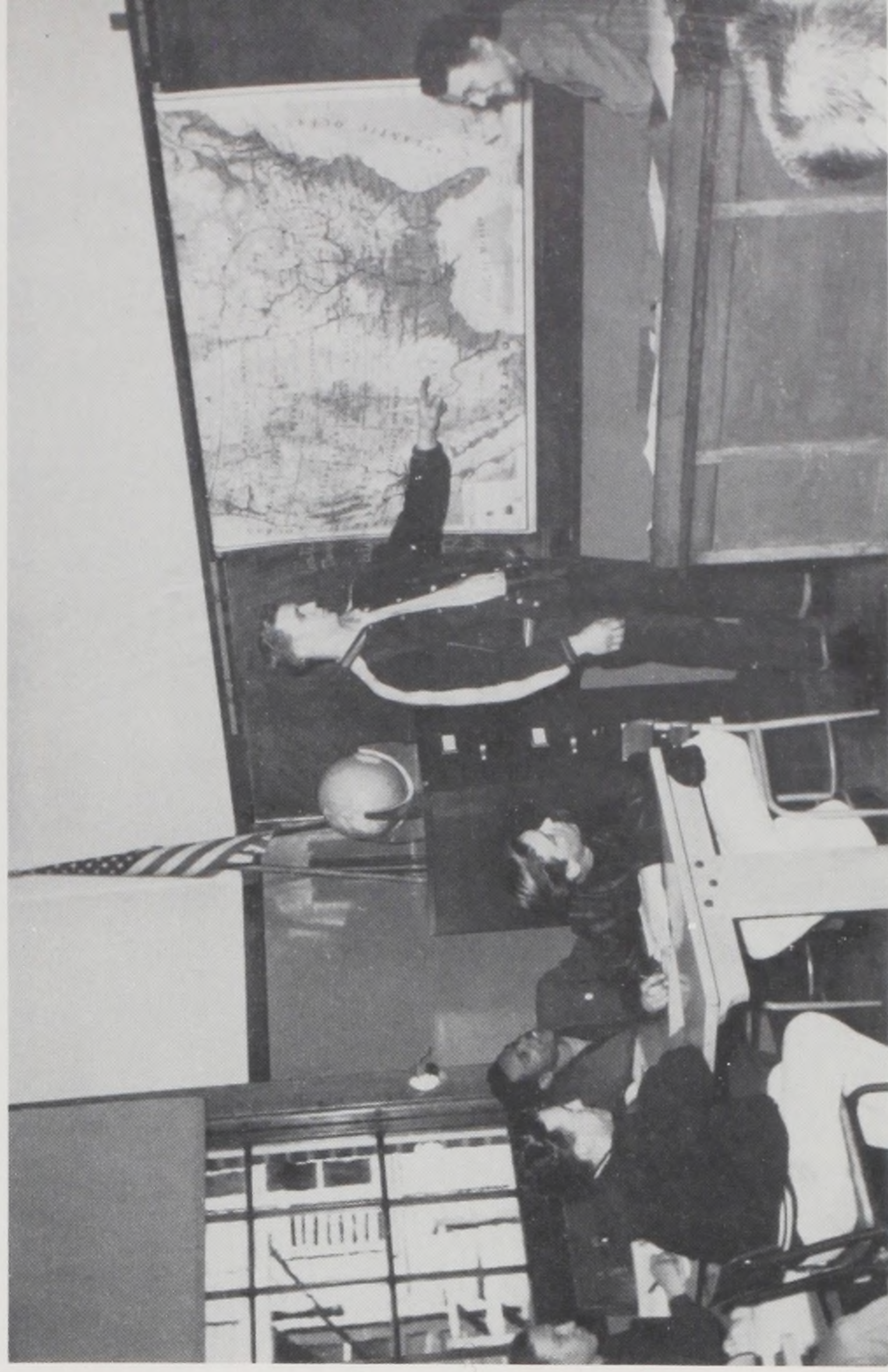

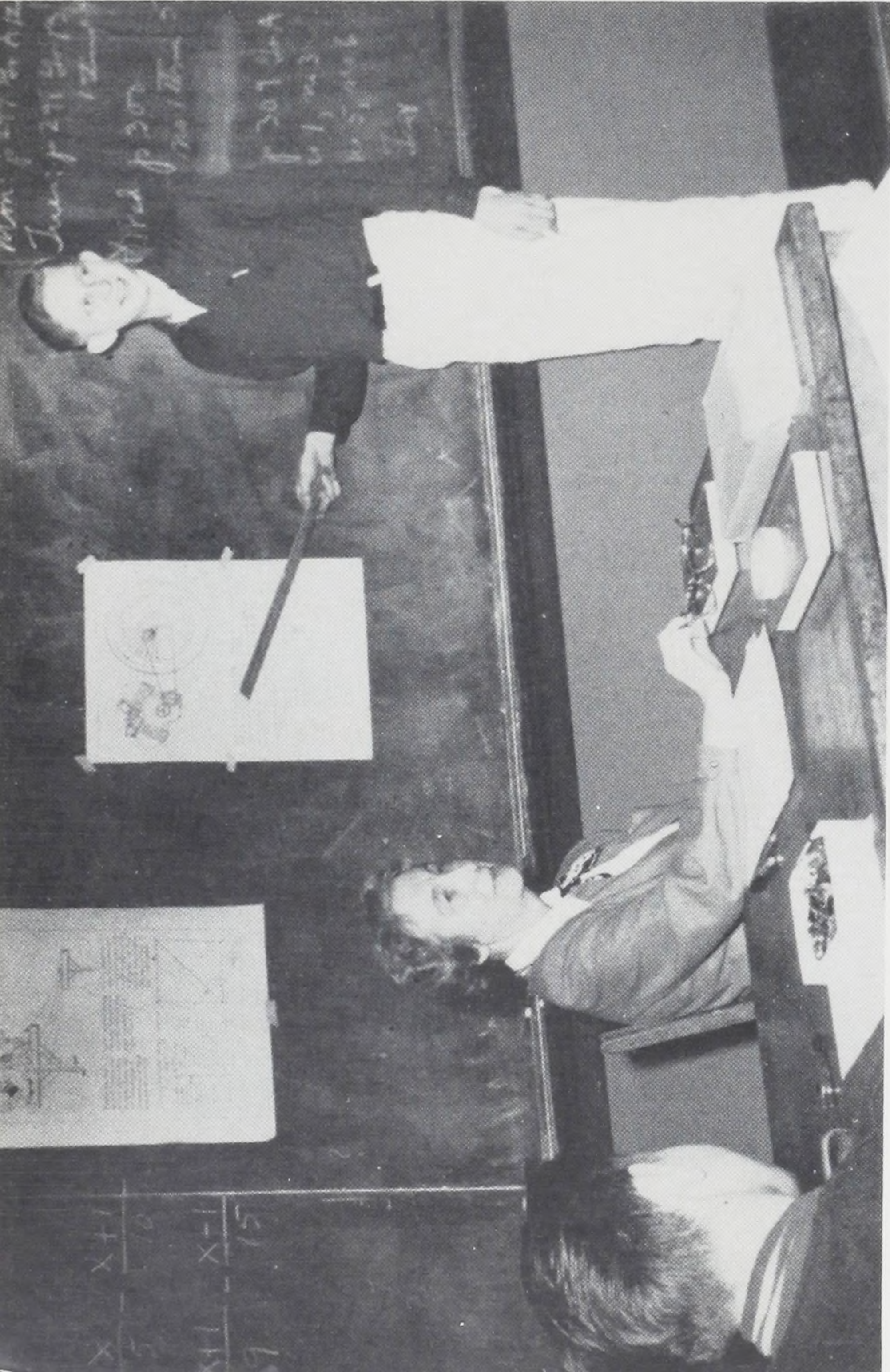

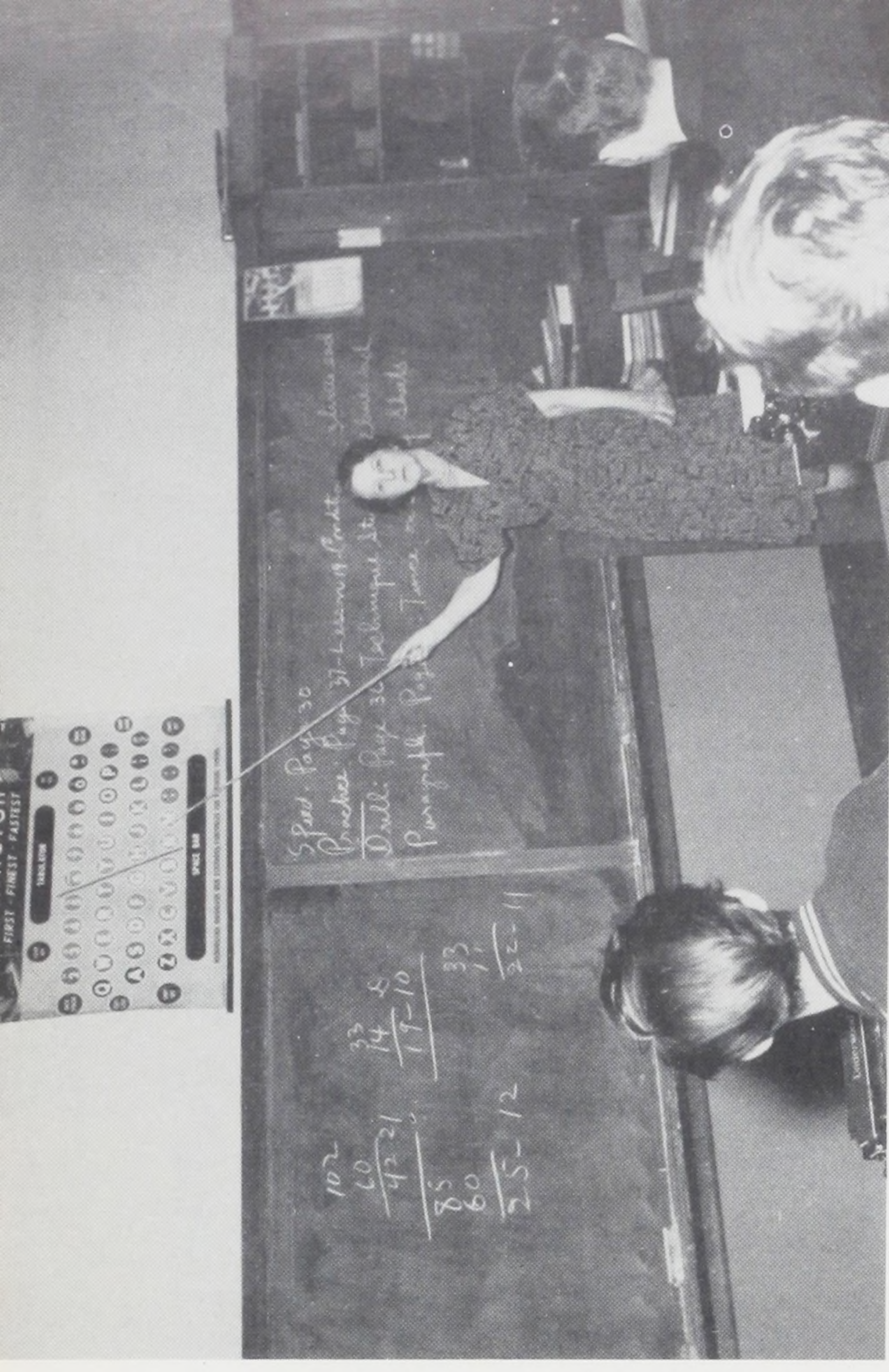

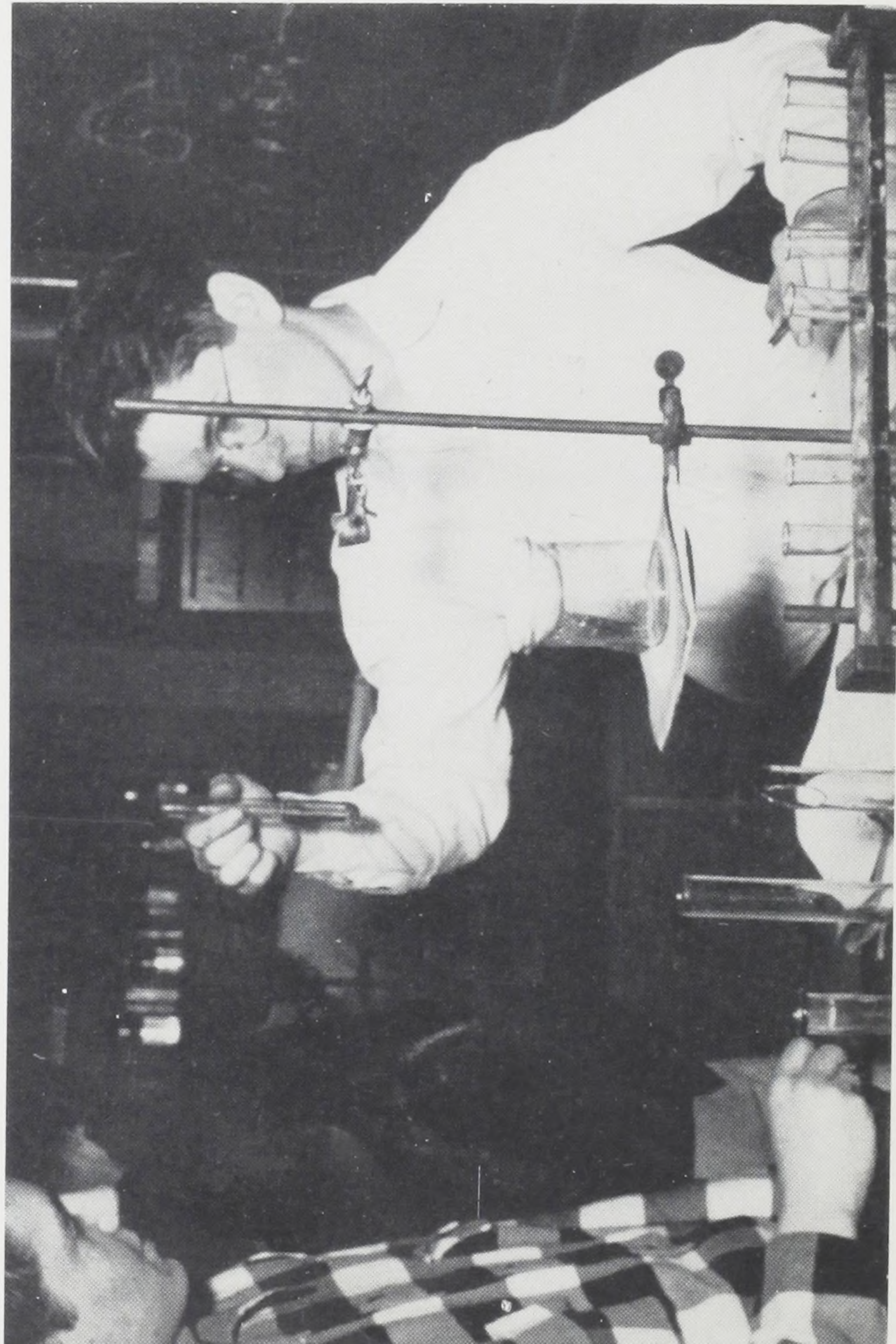

Mathematician explains solution of intricate plane geometry problem.



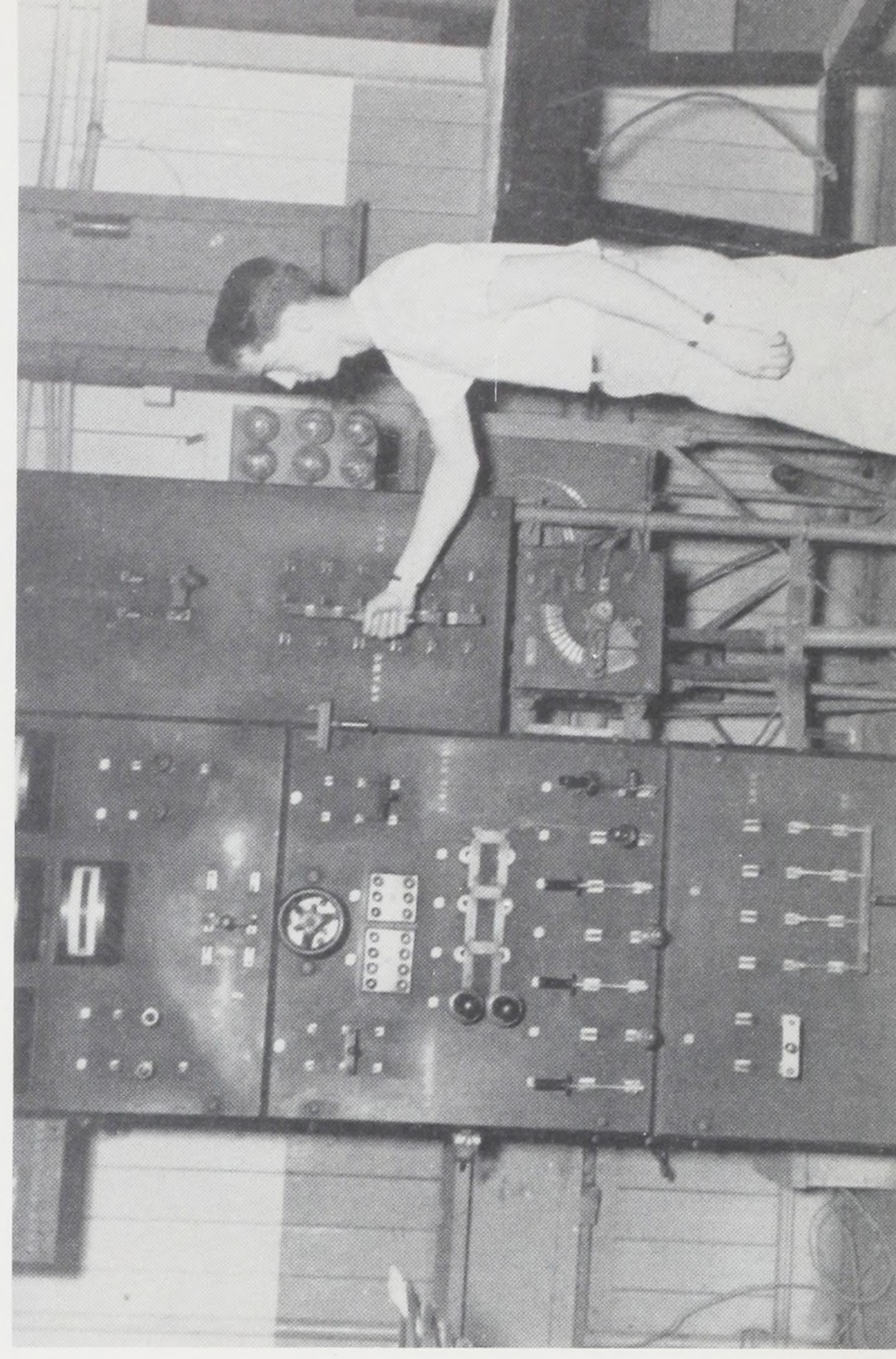

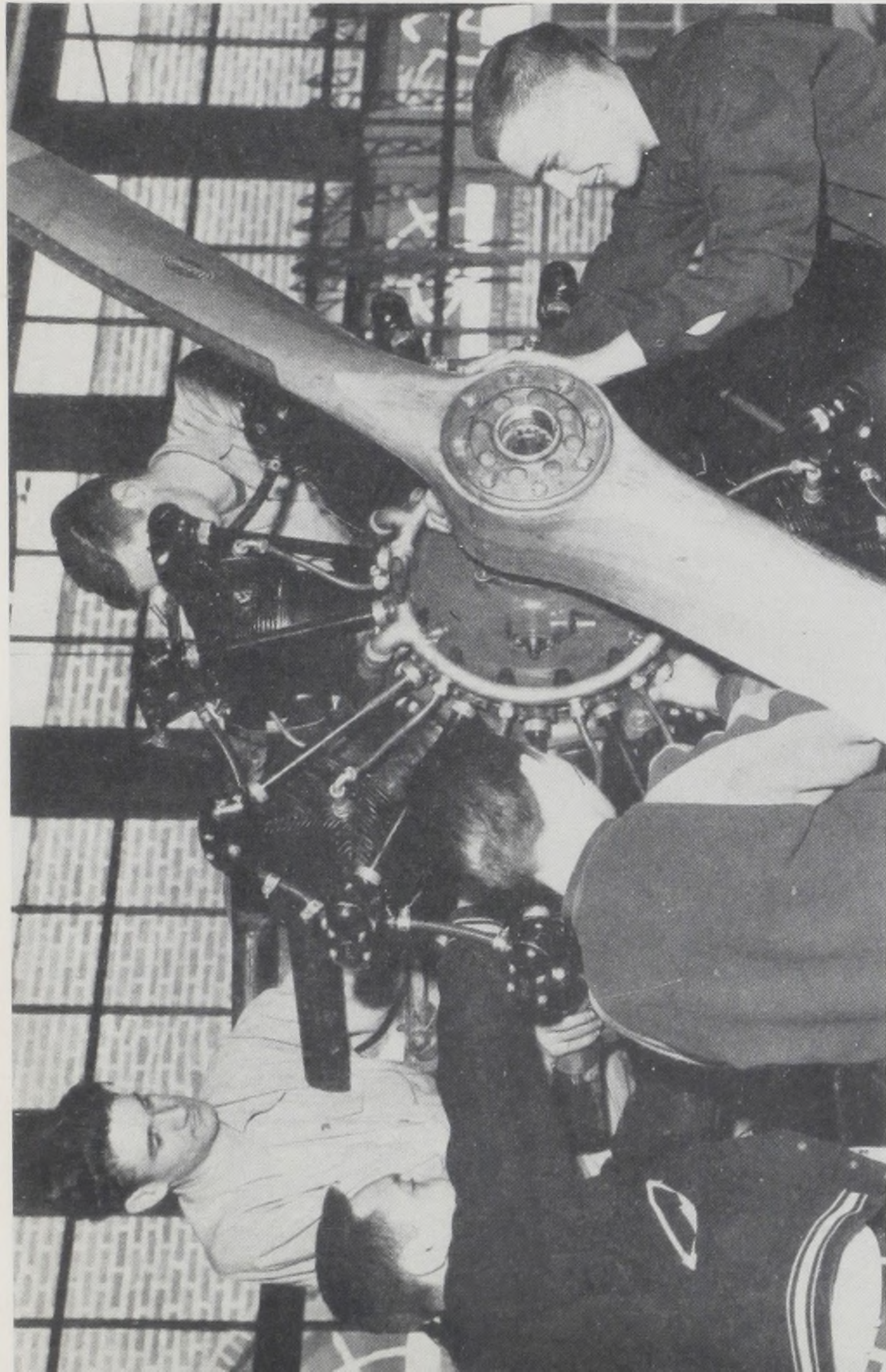

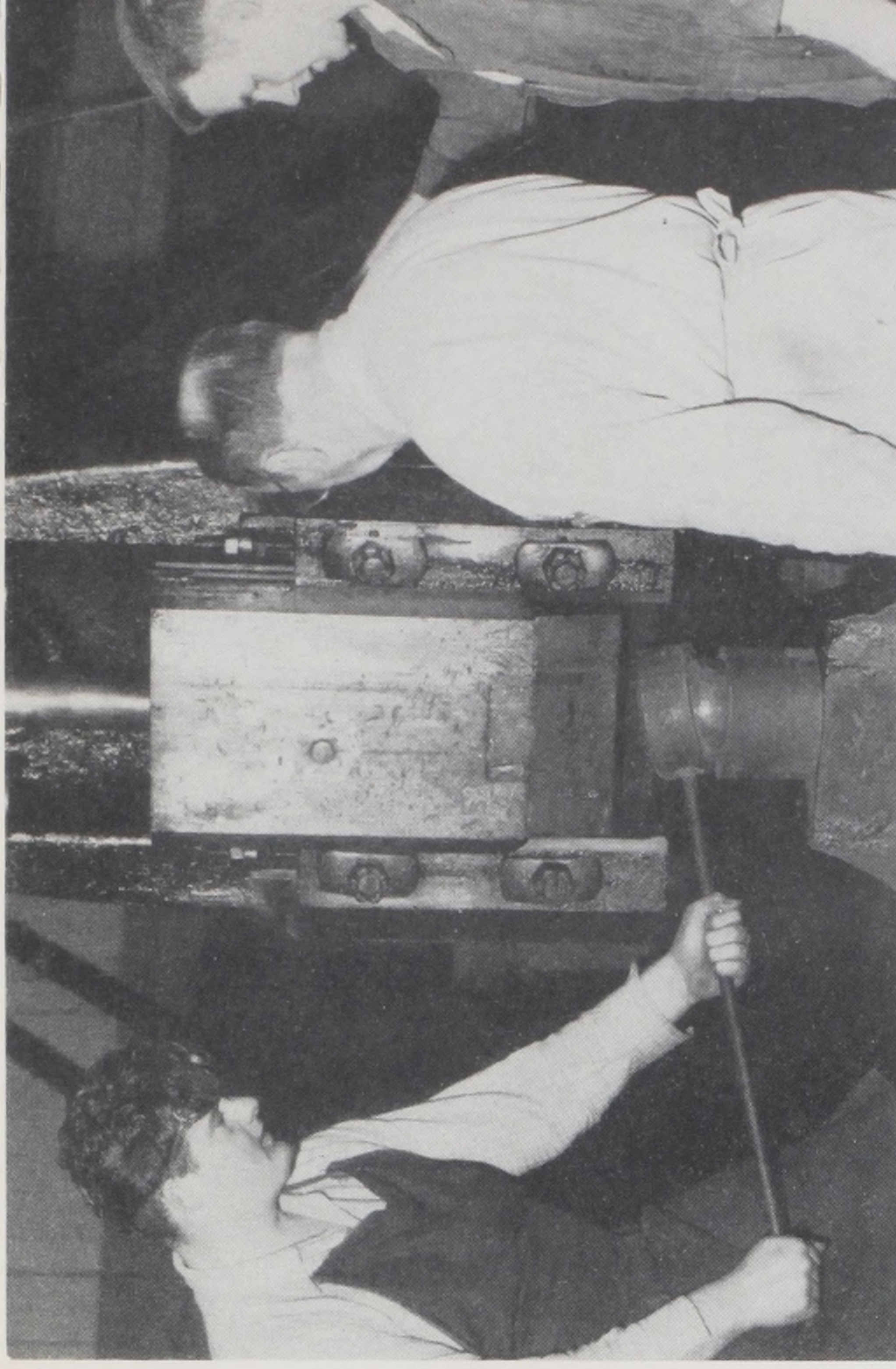

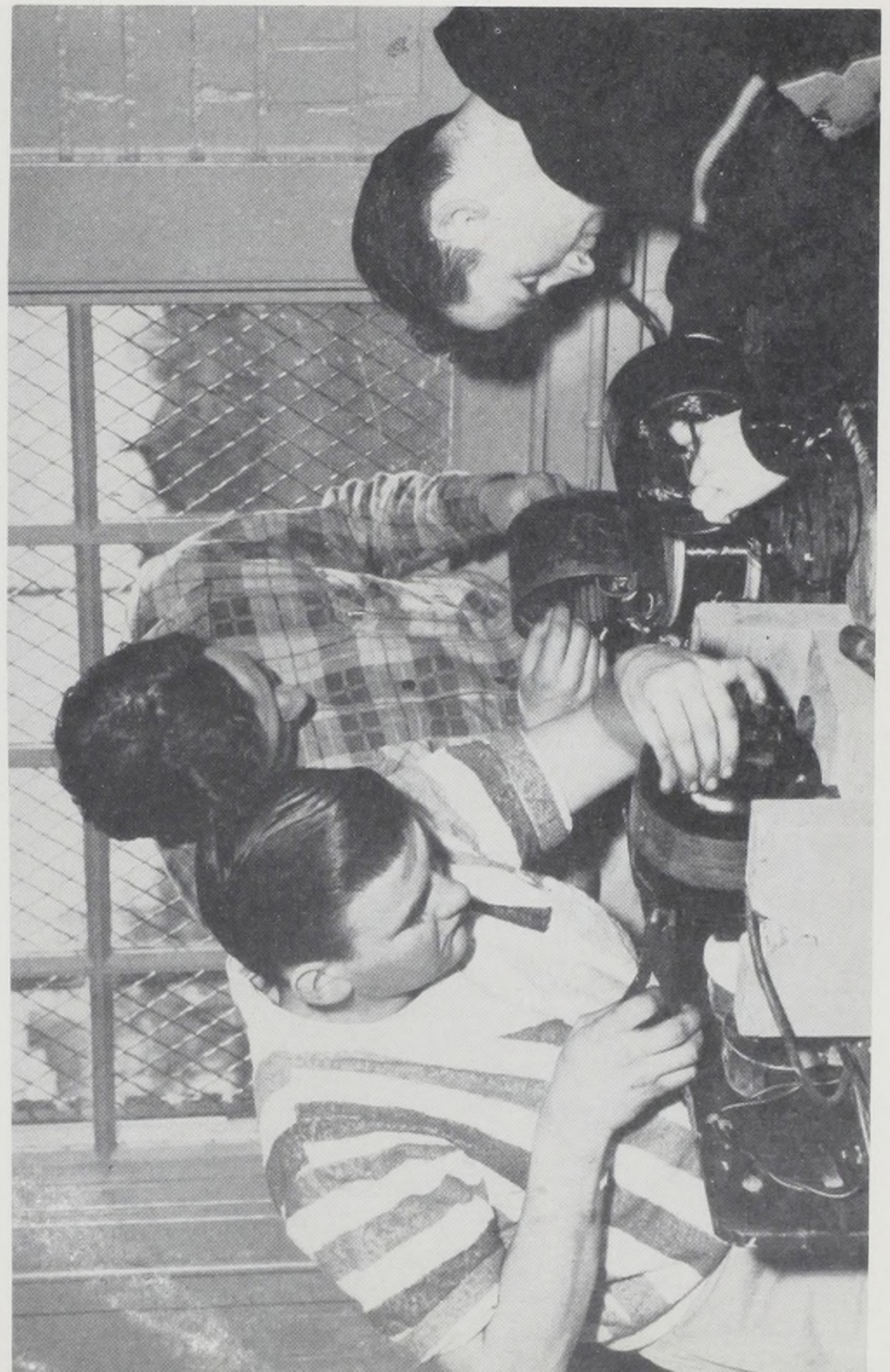

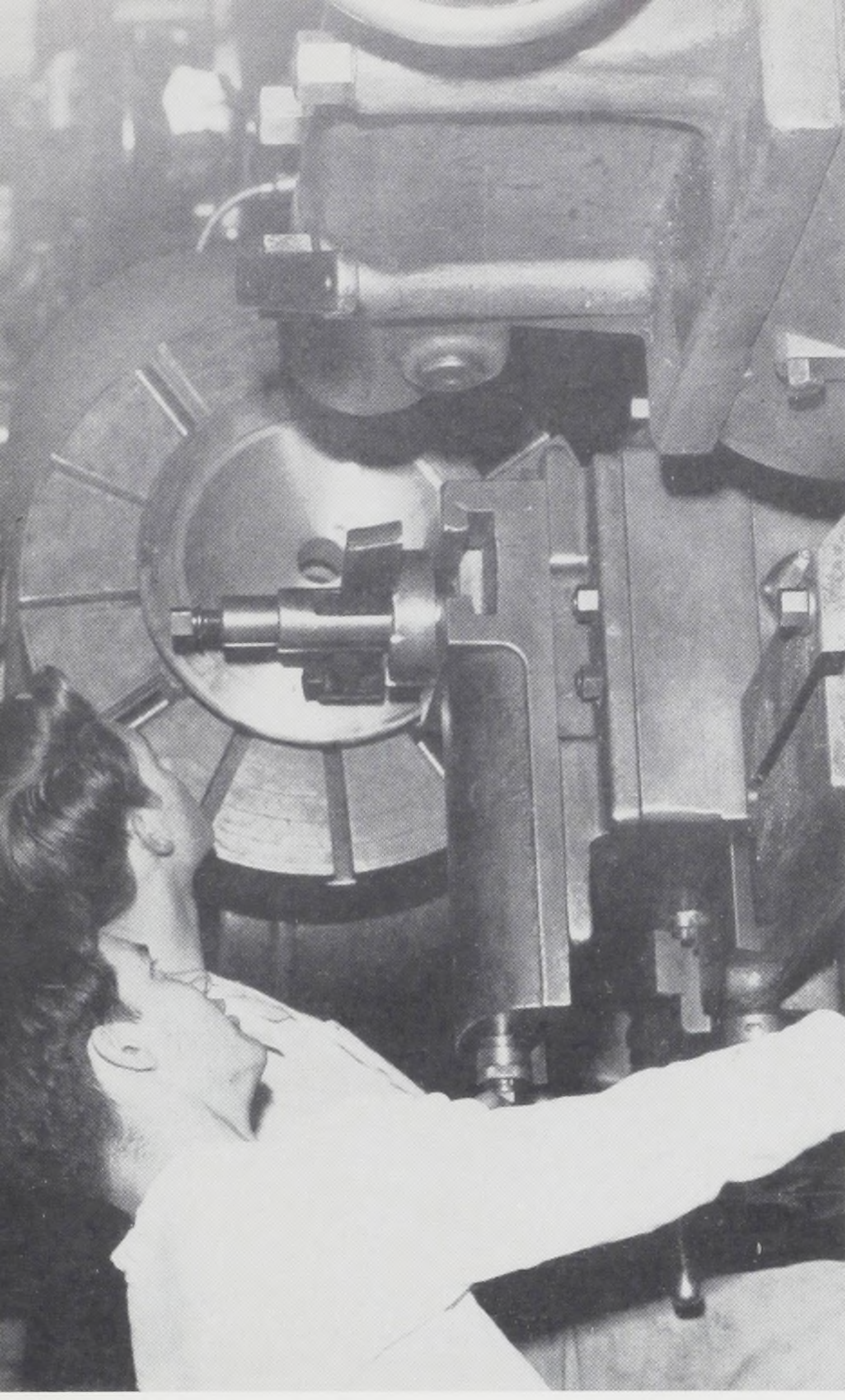

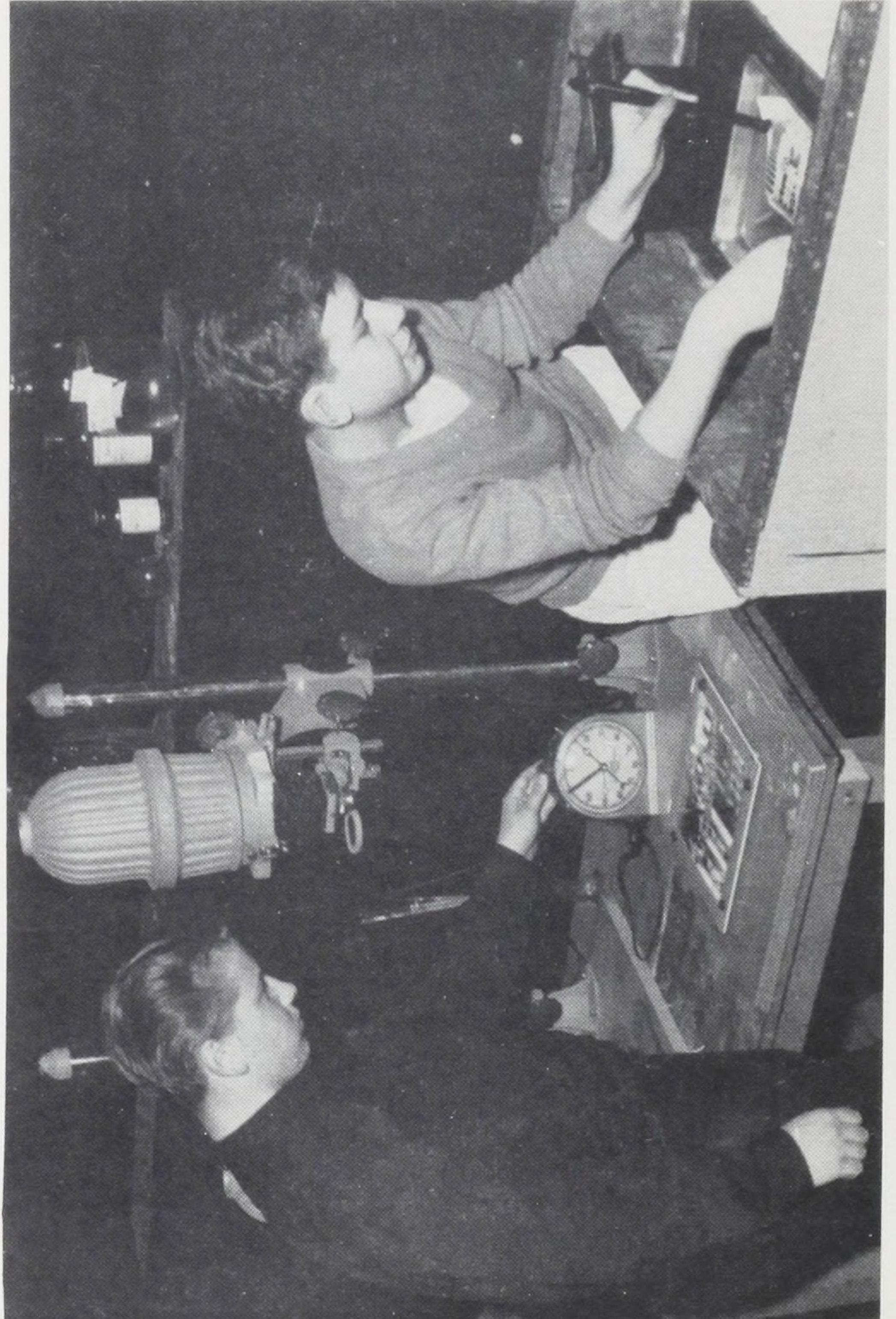

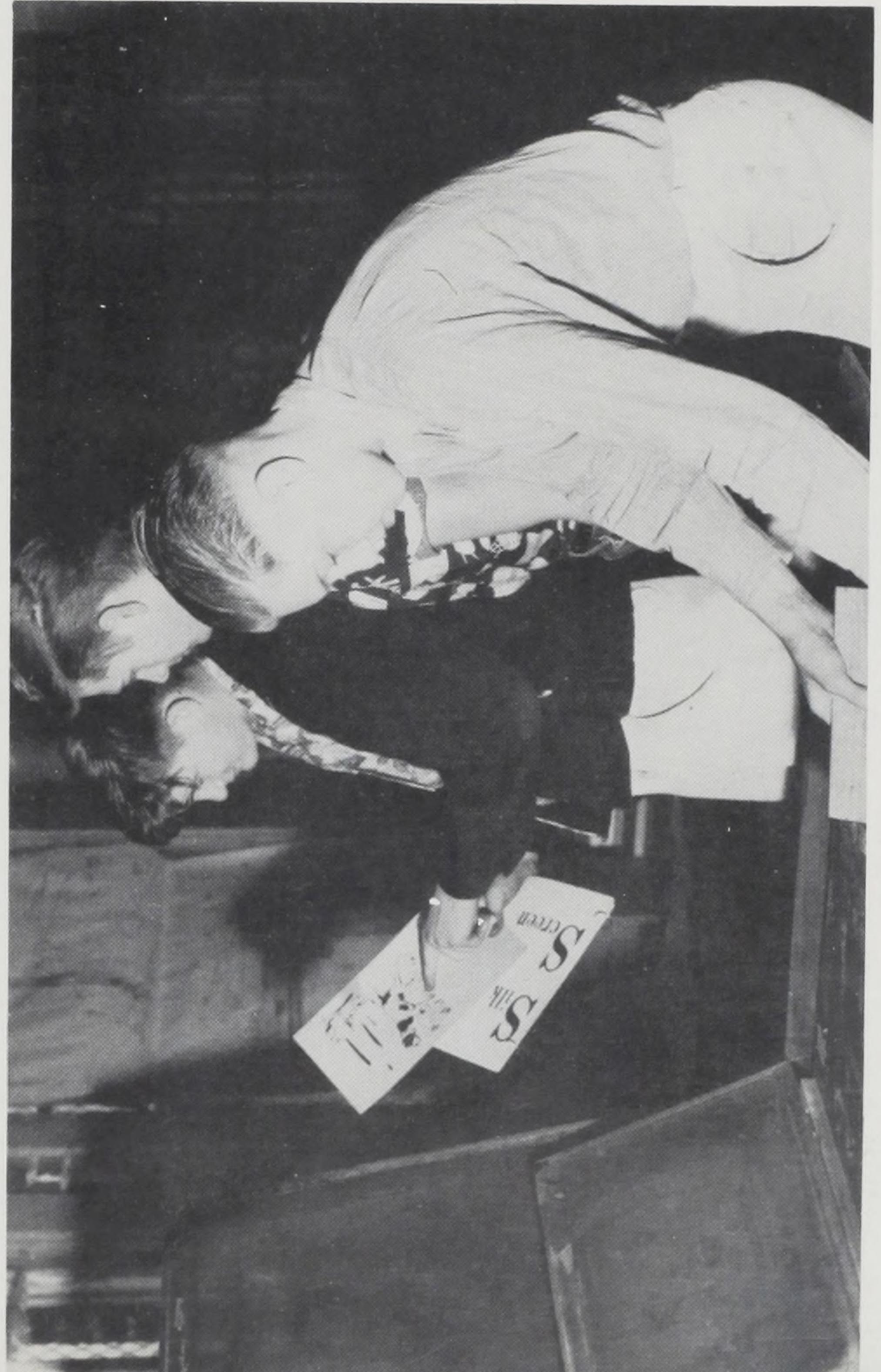

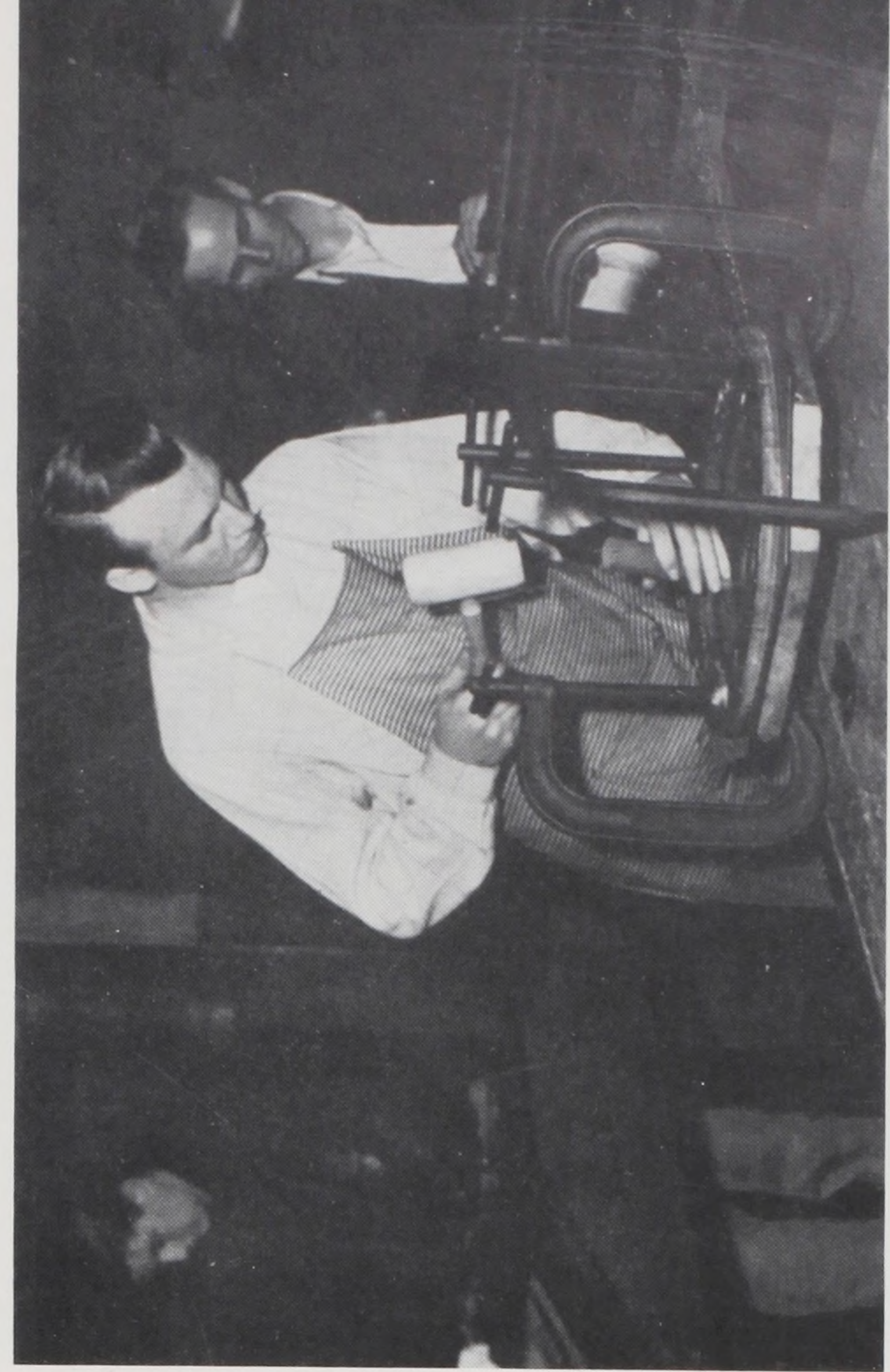

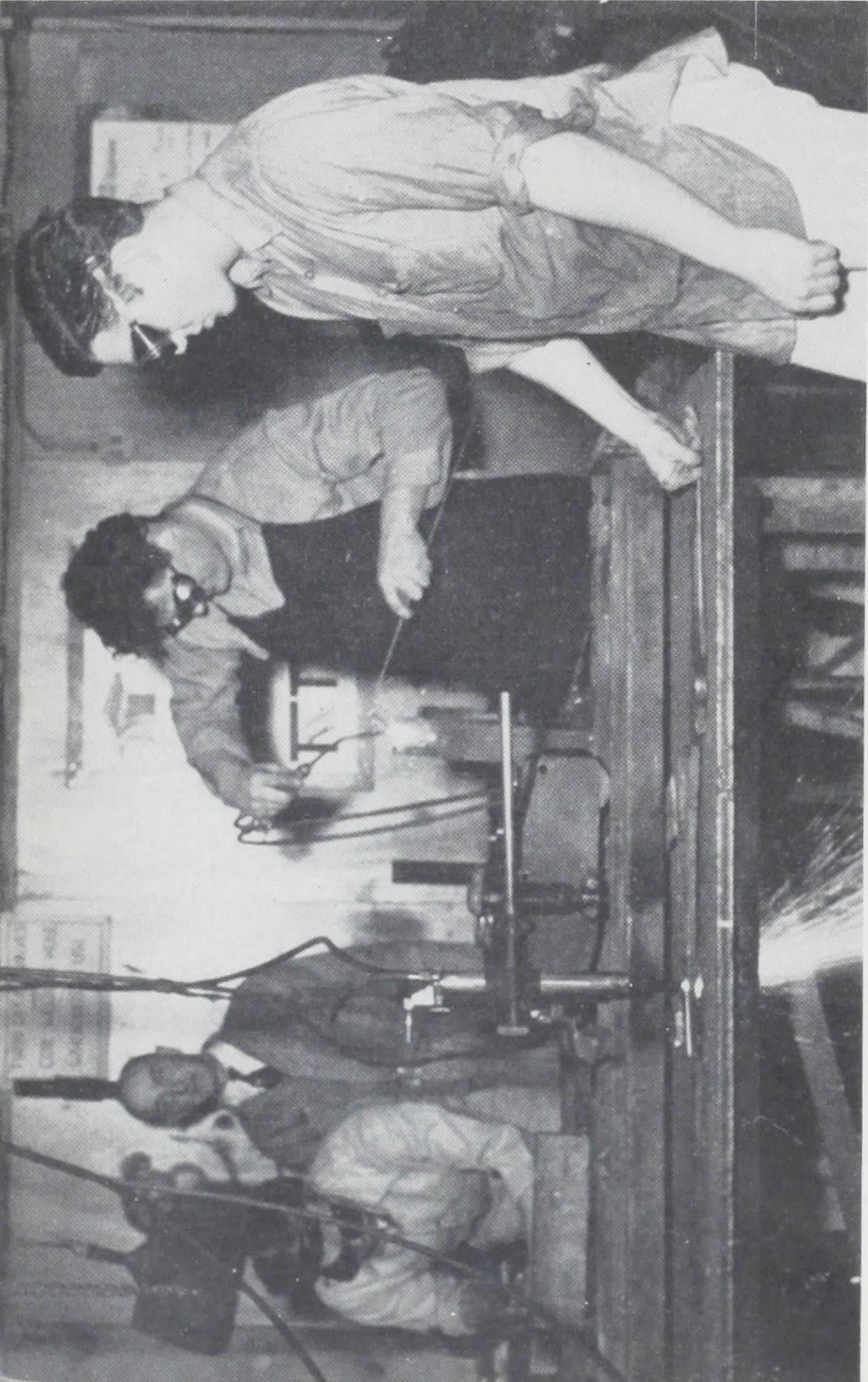

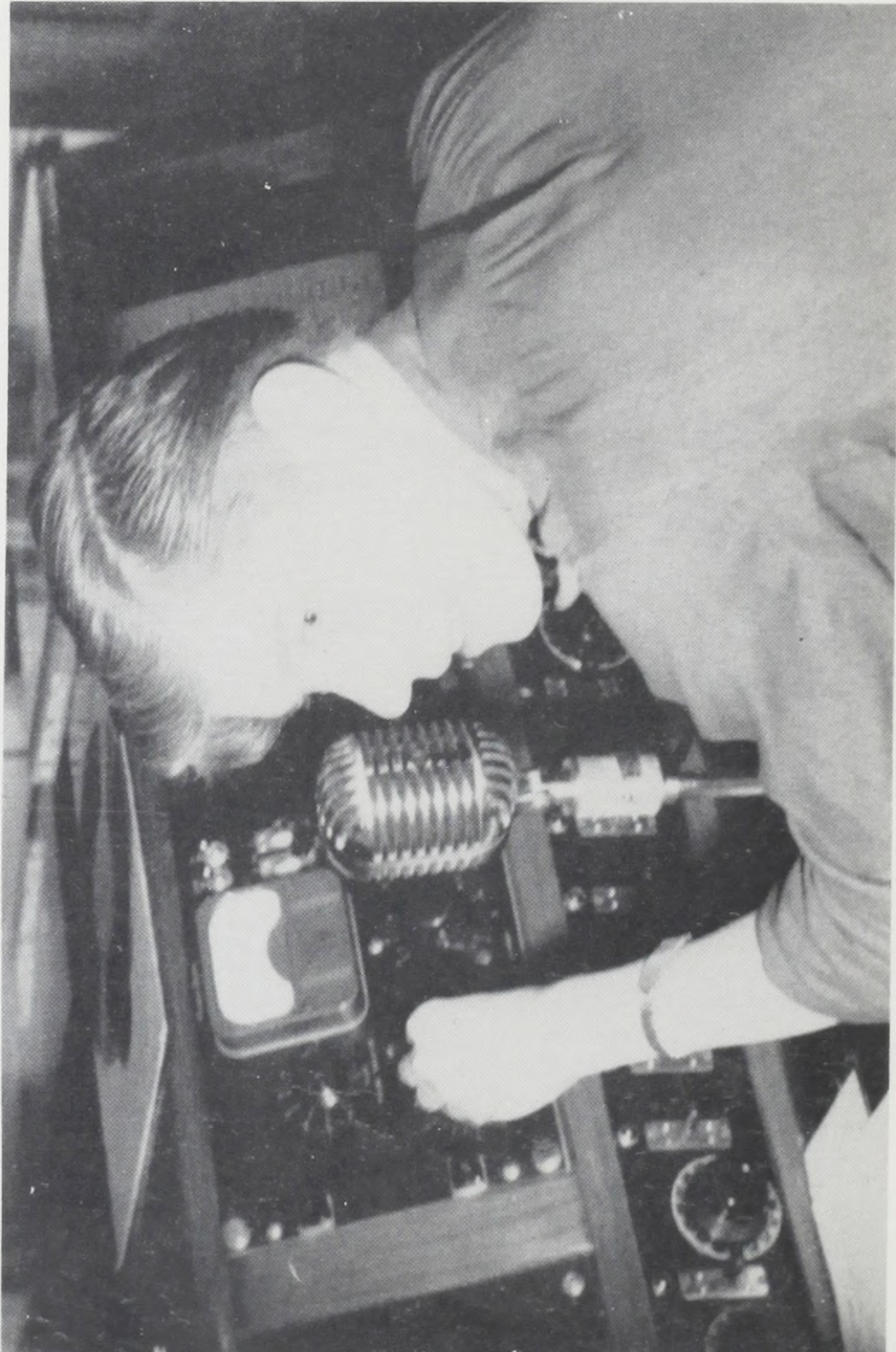

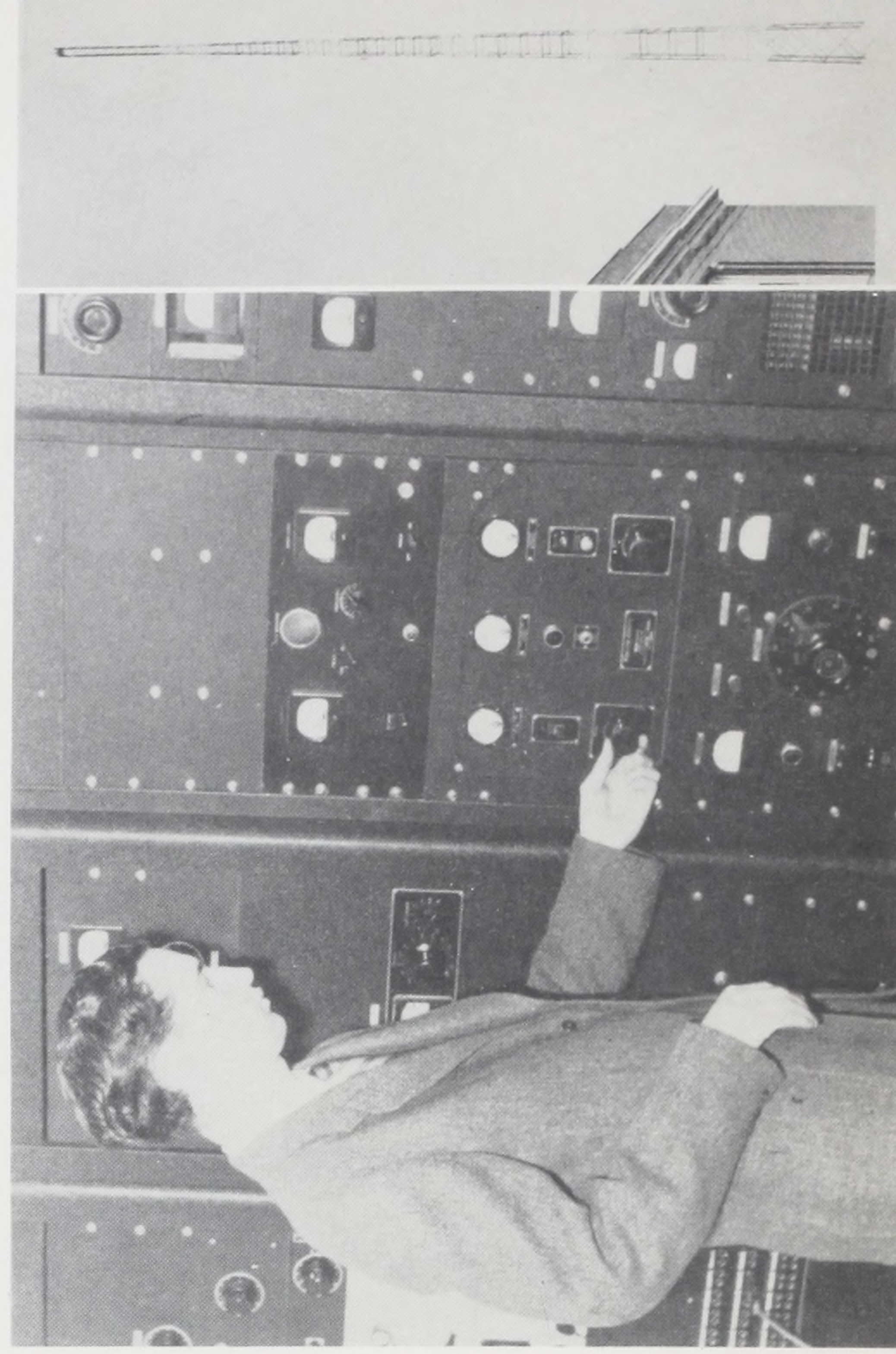

COACH RALPH HARPER

Coach Ralph Harper has temporarily left us, having been called to active duty with the Marines early in the spring semester. Coach Harper was probably the most popular member of the coaching staff, and did a great job this year.

Harper graduated from Oregon State College in 1946, where he played football under Lon Stiner. He is a Portland product, having played football at Franklin. He was all city guard in his senior year.

VARSIITY FOOTBALL

Under the able tutelage of Ralph Harper and assistant Cliff Wise, the Mechanics of 1950 finished in a third place tie in the Portland Interscholastic League grid standings. After losing two tough ones to Roosevelt and Grant, and then dropping a third one to Franklin, the Mechanics got into gear. They shut out Lincoln and Washington, and edged Jefferson, only to finish with a scoreless tie against Cleveland.

Benson lost the traditional pre-season game with Kelso by a 32-19 count. In a post season contest with McMinnville, Benson easily won 7-6.

The Team had two all city "dream team" selections in its ranks. Steve Bell, halfback, and Chuck Odor, center, were chosen on the first string all city team.



VARSITY FOOTBALL

BENSON 13 — ROOSEVELT 21

After a scoreless jamboree first quarter, a Benson-Roosevelt battle of offenses ended with the Mechanics on the short end of a 21 to 13 score. The Roughriders' speedy outfit traded touchdowns with the Mechanics for two quarters and then scored the clincher in the final period for a 21 to 13 victory.

BENSON 7 — GRANT 12

The Grant Generals got the scare of their young lives as they narrowly edged Benson. The Techmen held a 7 to 6 lead until late in the last quarter, when Grant's Don Holt capped a drive with a 2 yard smash for the final T. D.

BENSON 6 — FRANKLIN 13

The Mechanics made it three straight (losses) as they dropped a 13 to 6 decision to Franklin's surging Quakers. It was a battle royal all through the second half with the score deadlocked at 6—all, until Franklin slipped one across in the closing minutes of the game.

BENSON 16 — WASHINGTON 0

Two touchdowns and a safety, coupled with a strong defense, put the Techmen in the win column at last. Hard-working center Chuck Odor supplied the safety-producing tackle of Al Overton in the final quarter.

BENSON 12 — LINCOLN 0

Benson outmudded Lincoln's Cardinals for the second win of the season. George Crocker scored on a pass from Steve Bell for the first tally, and Lew Newman grabbed a blocked kick and ran 58 yards to score the second touchdown.



BENSON 18 — JEFFERSON 14

The Mechanics again made it three straight, this time three wins, to climb to third place in the red-hot Interscholastic League. It took two tallies in the final period, but they came through again.

BENSON 0 — CLEVELAND 0

The favored Benson squad could do no better than a scoreless tie against the presumably weakest team in the league, to finish out the season. Although Cleveland only played offensive ball on five plays in the first half, Benson still couldn't force across a touchdown.

COACH "SHARKEY" NELSON

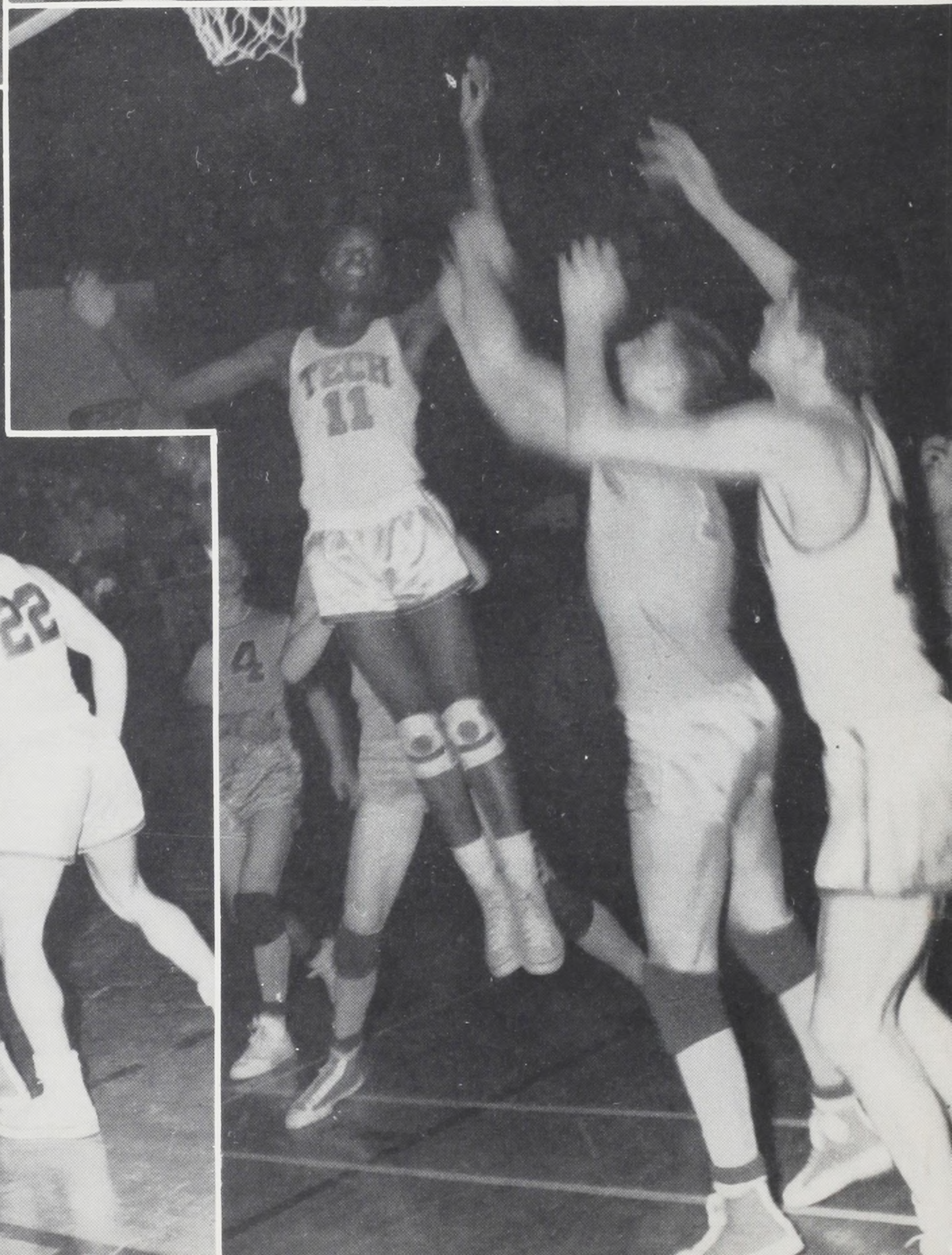
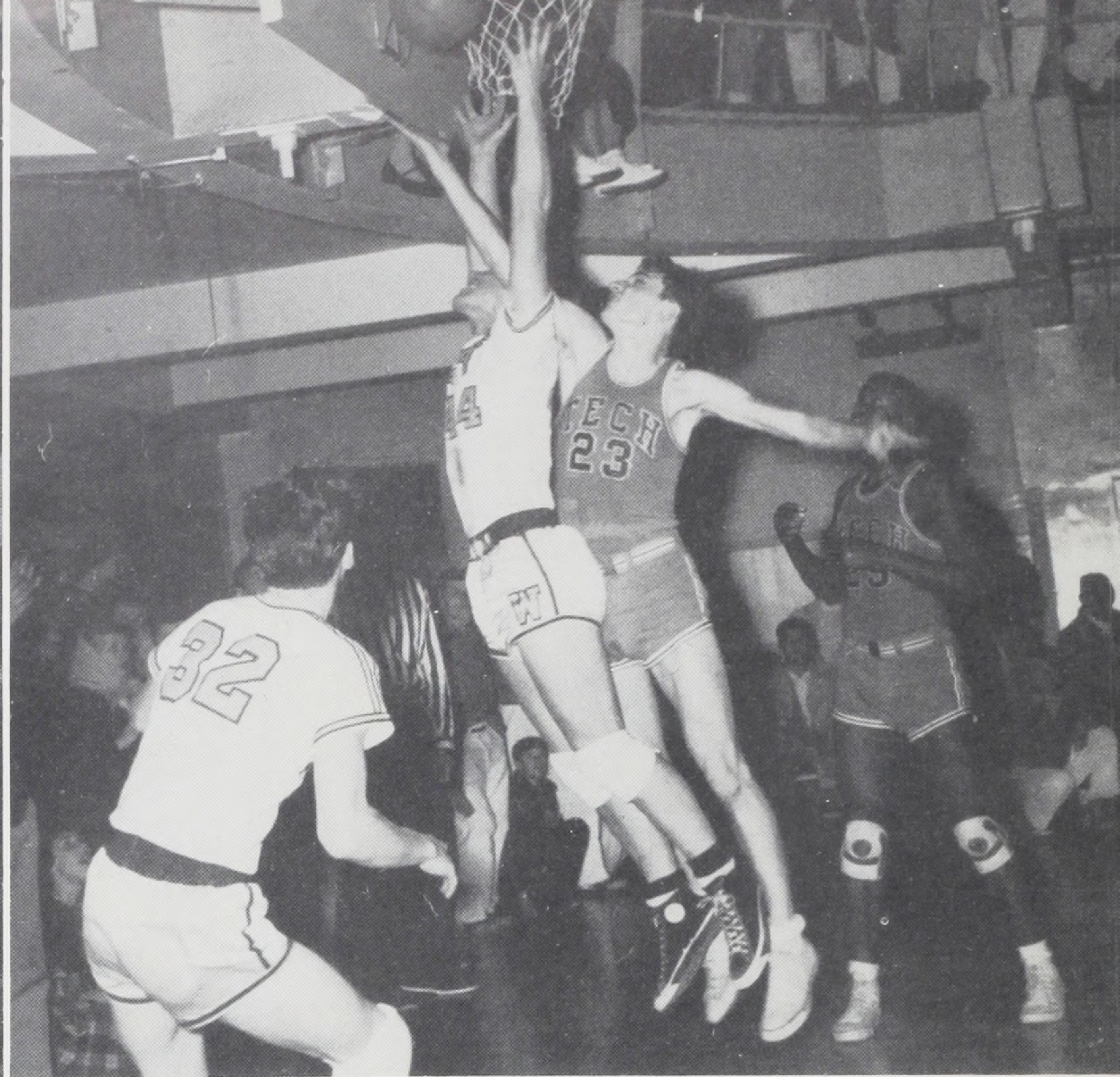
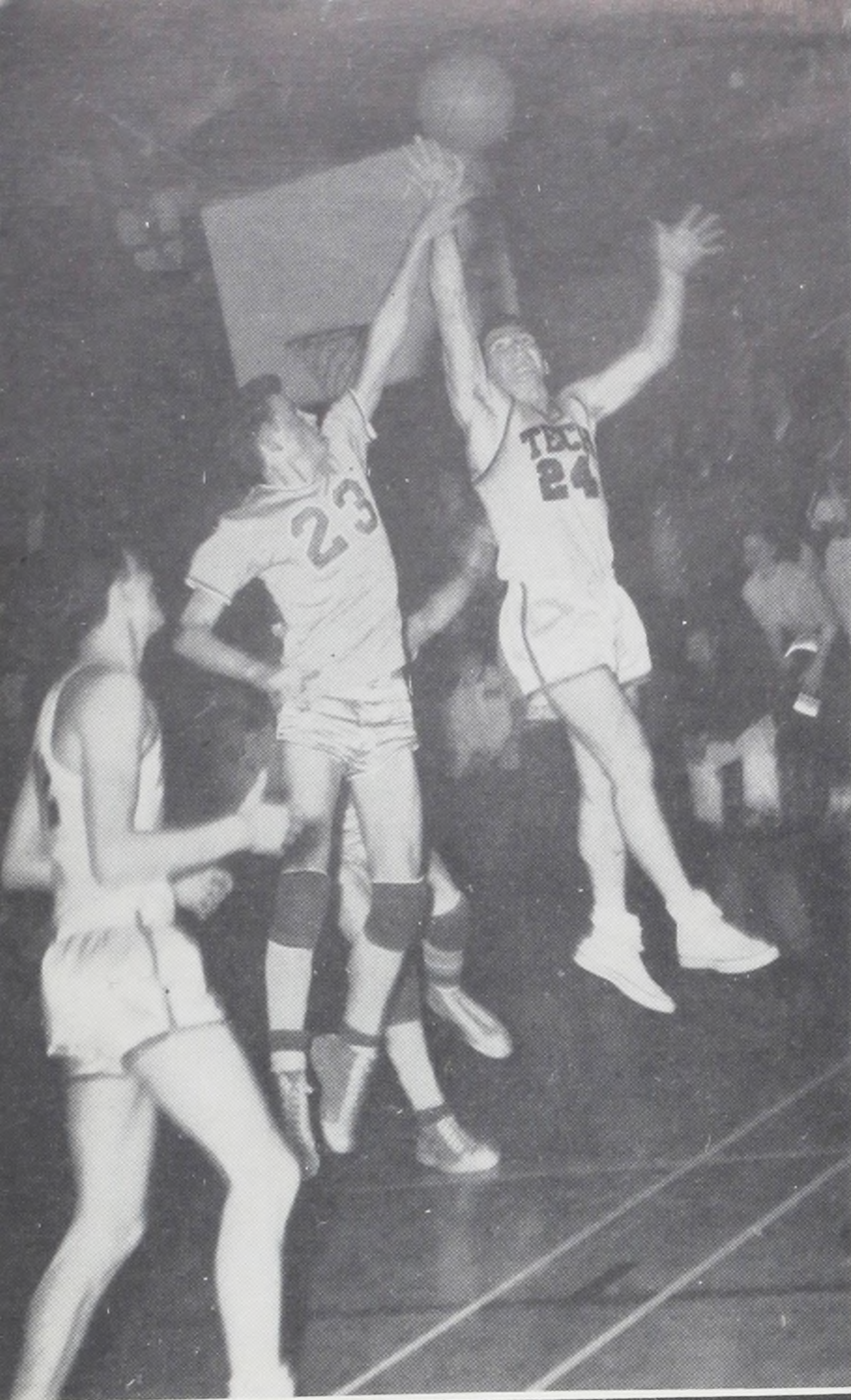
Coach Loyal D. (Sharkey) Nelson has earned a reputation around school as a swell guy and a good coach. He has just finished his third year as head basketball coach.

In his years at Benson "Lefty" has turned out many great runners and has a reputation around the Northwest for his winning track teams.

Varsity track at Benson was principally in a rebuilding state this season. Giving ground to such powers in track and field as Grant and Jefferson, Coach Marineau's thinclads still have managed to make a reasonably good showing.

Pat Trotti has been the leading point-getter all season, and has a good chance to break the city record in his specialty, the broad jump. Fred Parker and Bob Lee have been outstanding in the hurdle events, and Dave Powell has had a good year in the high jump. In the distance events, Bob Miller, miler, Joe Hendrix, half miler, and Wayne Sanders in the quarter have been consistent point-makers.

In the coming two years Benson should emerge as a real threat for the city title, since the majority of the boys are still in their sophomore or junior year.

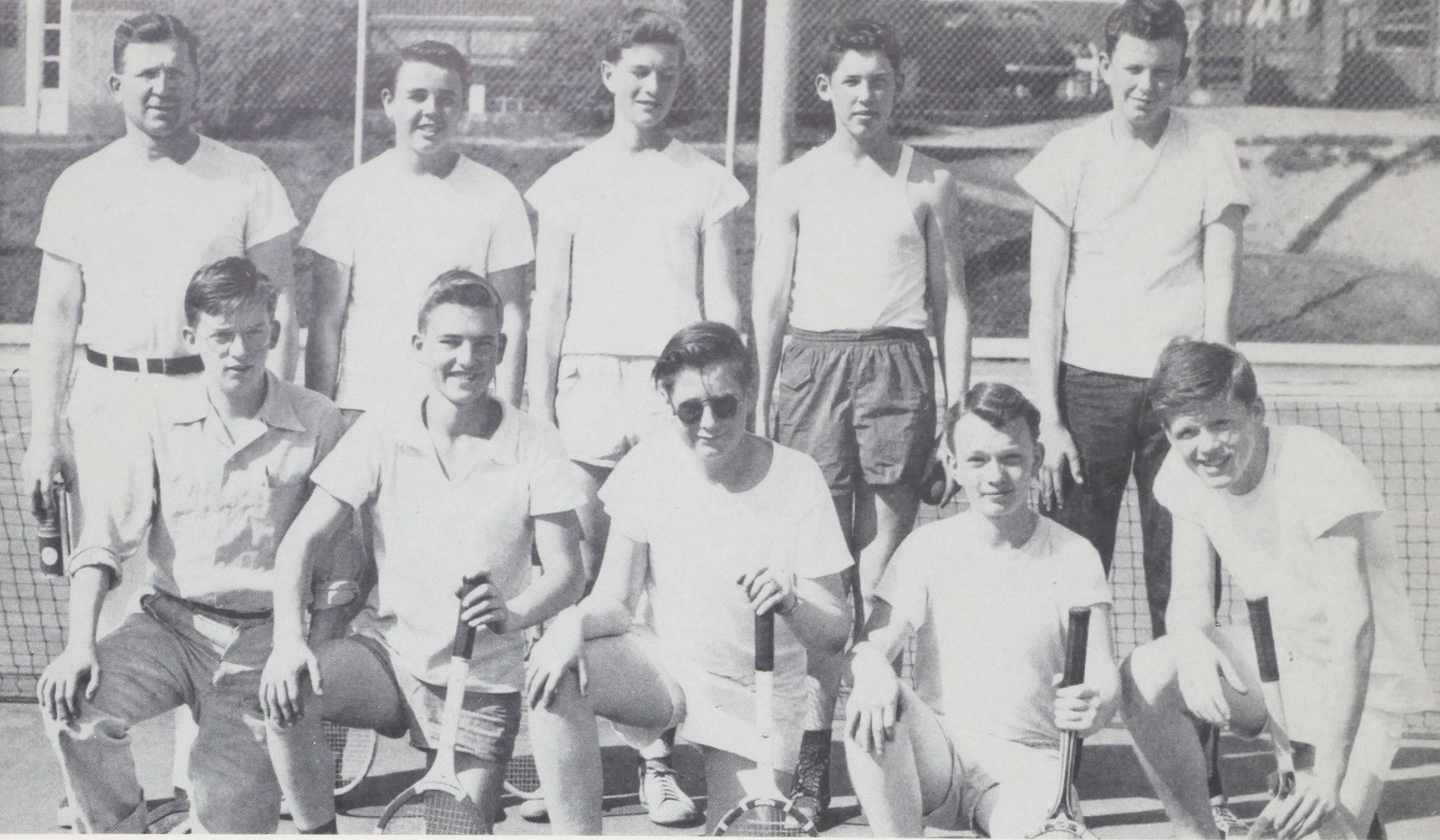

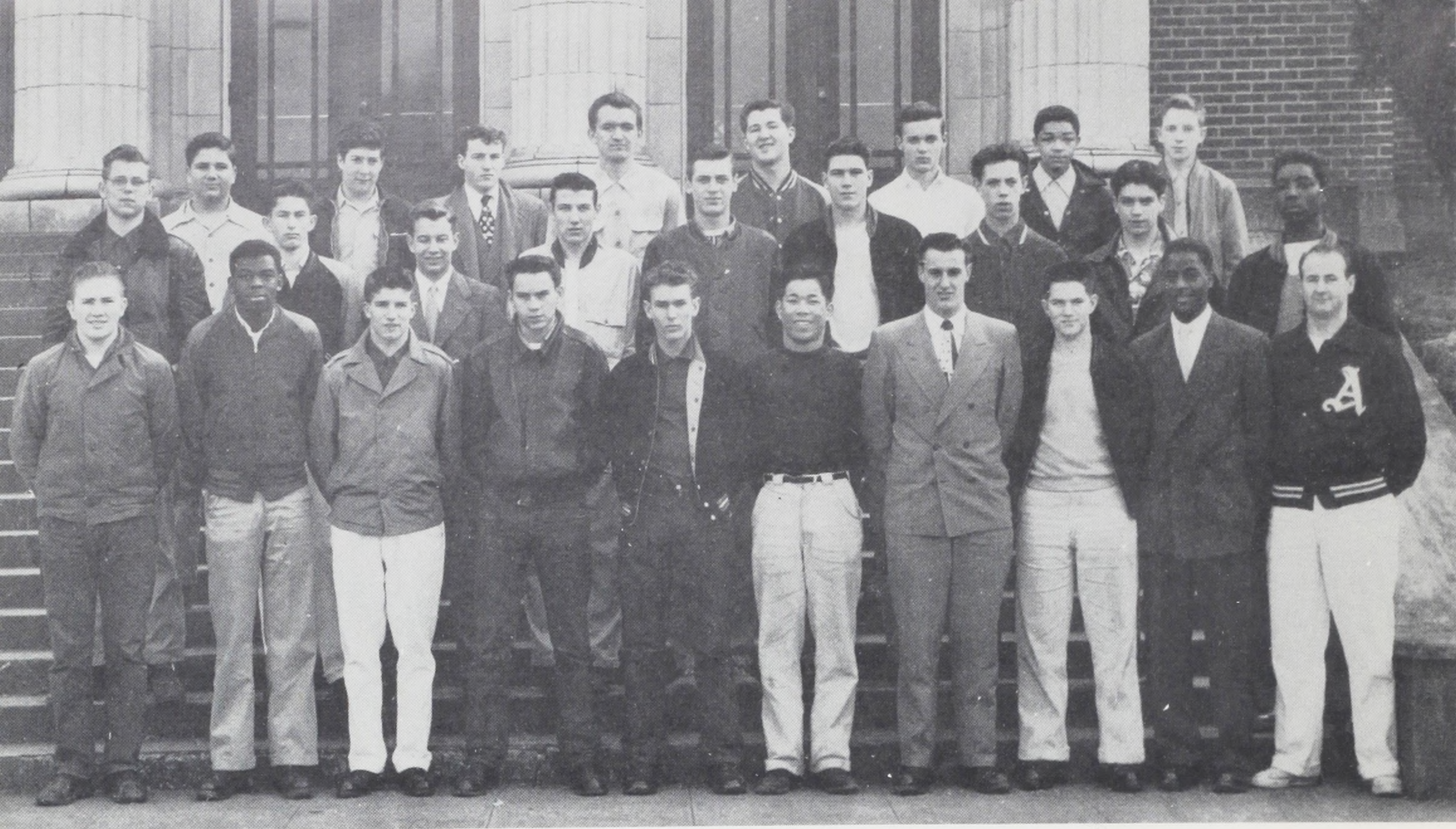
