
KEY CLUB

SENIOR CLASS PLAY

Annie Get Your Gun

On March 6 and 7, 1953, the Senior Class of Benson presented its annual Senior Class Play, Annie Get Your Gun, directed by May L. Heitkemper. Originally written as a musical play, with the book by Dorothy and Herbert Fields and the music and lyrics by Irving Berlin, and produced on Broadway by Richard Rodgers and Oscar Hammerstein, as a straight play without music Annie Get Your Gun proved to be a buoyant and exciting play, filled with lively action and amusing comedy.

The nine main male parts in the play were headed by the character of Frank Butler, an expert sharpshooter appearing in Buffalo Bill's Wild West Show, portrayed on Friday night's show by Carl Schnoor and on Saturday night by Donald Scott. Buffalo Bill Cody, the enterprising and genial showman, was enacted by Pete Cohn, while Foster Wilson, the irritable hotel proprietor, was played by Charles Brown. Jim Simpson appeared as Buffalo Bill's rival, Pawnee Bill, and Gene Baker played the comedy lead, Chief Sitting Bull, while the important role of Charlie Davenport, Buffalo Bill's manager, was ably filled by Roger Gill. Vincent Kraley played Tommy; Clyde Sparks, Little Jake; Bob Styles, Mac; Willie Sorg, the conductor; Richard Schultz, an Indian dancer, and Joe Sullivan, a boy.

The title role, played on Broadway by Ethel Merman and Mary Martin, and in the movie version by Betty Hutton, was double cast with two leading ladies from Girls Polytechnic High School. 
On March 23, 1953, Radio Station KBPS, the Voice of the Portland Public Schools, celebrated its 30th birthday. Its call letter, KBPS, show that the station is located in Benson. Those who know the story of its 30 years of educational broadcasting know that it was purchased by the Benson Student Body and operated by Benson faculty members until 1939, when the School District assumed its support and employed a station manager. Miss Patricia L. Green is the third manager of KBPS and in addition supervises radio in all of Portland schools. The station now also employs a Program Coordinator in charge of high school and adult program production.


KBPS is unique in that it is the only high school student-operated, school-district-owned, standard wave length broadcast station in existence. KBPS is the second oldest radio station in Portland. Original call letters were KFIF. At the time of its purchase, all stations in Portland operated on a wave length of 360 meters. Each station would take an allotment of time, be on the air for 13 minutes and then shut down for 2 minutes to listen for distress signals from ships at sea. Stations in those days had many changes in wave lengths and time on-the-air. KBPS has shared its spot on the dial with almost every station in Portland. It stopped sharing its wave length with station KXL in 1941 and went to 1450 on the dial, where it is now. Of the three men who pioneered the building and plans for KBPS only Mr. R. T. Stephens is still at Benson as a Physics instructor. Mr. Stephens now handles all legal matters for KBPS which concern the Federal Communications Commission.

KBPS is no wlicensed by the FCC to broadcast twelve hours a day. Programs are broadcast which supplement the work of the classroom, which give high school students opportunity to produce original radio programs, and the evening hours are filled with programs beamed to adults in the community.

Benson students learn the varied techniques of radio work through producing, announcing, sportscasting, and through the setting up and recording of all types of programs in their daily operation of a real broadcast station. Students become efficient combo-men from operating the KBPS control board, and many have earned their first class broadcast "ticket" which enabled them to join the staffs of commercial radio stations. Stations throughout the Northwest have former Benson, KBPS students on their staff.

Charles Weagant, KBPS Engineer, supervises the technical operation of KBPS and instructs staff members in transmitter operation. In 1950 KBPS erected a new 200 foot tower and installed a new transmitter, partly student-built under Mr. Weagant's direction, which boosted the station's power to 250 watts.





















Ed Grenier

First, he was big and rough, and played every minute of every game. Opposing teams just couldn't seem to find any way to stop Ed's 6 foot 4 inch, 215 pound frame. Ed played both offense and defense, called defensive charging signals, kicked conversions, and was co-captain of this year's fine football squad. It would be hard to pick a particular game in which he was outstanding because Ed was so outstanding in every game. 


Jimmy "Precious" Williams eats up yardage through the Cleveland defense.


Central 7...Benson 6



















VARSITY BASKETBALL






Bob Clark, Benson's All-City forward, in action against Jefferson in city playoff game. Photo by Edmond Lee, Oregon Journal.

Bob Clark

Bob Clark was picked as a forward on the All-City squad not because he piled up huge scoring records, not because he was six and a half or seven feet tall, but because when it came to hard-playing, board-clearing men there just weren't any better than Bob. He scored a total of 166 points in the regular season, and was one of the best, and most consistent rebounders in the city. Bob is 6 feet 2 inches tall, not exceptionally tall for a forward, but tall enough for a forward like Clark. 




SWIM TEAM
