Mr. Rowe has taught four years at Klamath County High School and at St. Helens High School for ten years. He has done a fine job this first year and we hope he will stay for many more.






Mr Riendeau, Social Director

To Bensons most succesful football coach, Coach Ralph Harper, we dedicate this page.



Coach Harper, known as the dean of Portland Interscholastic league football, resigned from coaching this year. Although we at Benson are very sorry to lose his talents as a coach, Mr. Harper leaves behind him a very successful career.

In 1949, Coach Harper became head coach at Benson after serving two years as assistant coach. A 4-2-1 win-loss record in 1952 gave the Techmen, guided by Mr. Harper, a birth in the state playoffs. That year Mr. Harper's young men advanced to the finals, only to bow to Central Catholic 7-6. This was the last time a Portland team accomplished this feat until this year. Then in 1953, Mr. Harper guided his gridders to the first of his two undefeated and untiled PIL championships. Three years later, in 1956, came his second undefeated-untiled seasons.

This season, Coach Harper finished his eight year at Benson with an impressive 6-3 record, giving a total record of 31 wins, 23 losses, and 4 ties.

Mr. Harper attended Franklin High Scool and lettered in football, basketball, and track. In 1940 he enrolled in Oregon State, but his education was interrupted in 1942 by World War II, where he saw duty in the South Pacific while in the Marine Corps. He then returned to Oregon State in 1946 and lettered in football, as a guard. After graduating in 1947 coach Harper came to Benson as assistant football coach. The Marine Corps recalled him in 1951 to serve in Korea. When he returned he began his successful stay at Benson.

Although we shall miss him as a coach, every young man who ever learned or played football for him will never forget him. Mr. Harper has that unexplainable understanding of youth which will never let us forget him.





Jechmen Scalp Indians

The Engineers, under the dean of coaches of the PIL Ralph Harper, were victorious in their initial game of the season, beating Cleveland 28-12.


league play since late in 1955.

The league leading Jefferson breezed by Benson 26-2 in a mud filled contest at Hopkins Jenkins field at Jeff.




In 1946 he won a football scholarship to Notre Dame. After three years of varsity football and track he graduated with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Physical Education.

In 1948, he played for the Chicago Rockets professional football team.




Engineers Stomp Senators



Engineers Crush Cards




The Cleveland Indians put on a determined effort in the last half to overtake and defeat the Engineers for the second time this year. The final tally was 71-59.




The Engineers won their third ball game of the year by soundly beating the Wilson Trojans 58-42. Benson led at the quarter stops in rolling to victory.



Bob Woodle closed out the season with 21 points to take high honors. Allan Brooks followed with 8. Jim Sandsness topped the General five with 13 points.



In 1948, he played for the Chicago Rockets professional football team.


