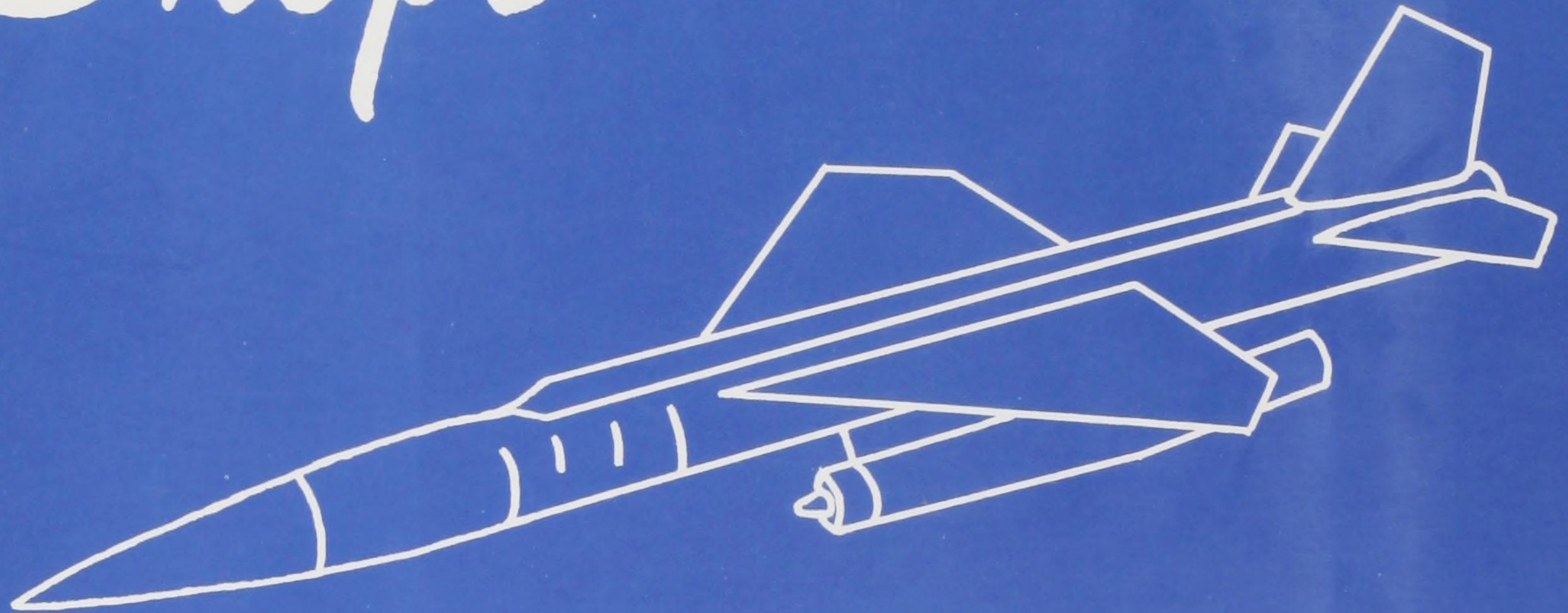
Benson's Retiring Teachers

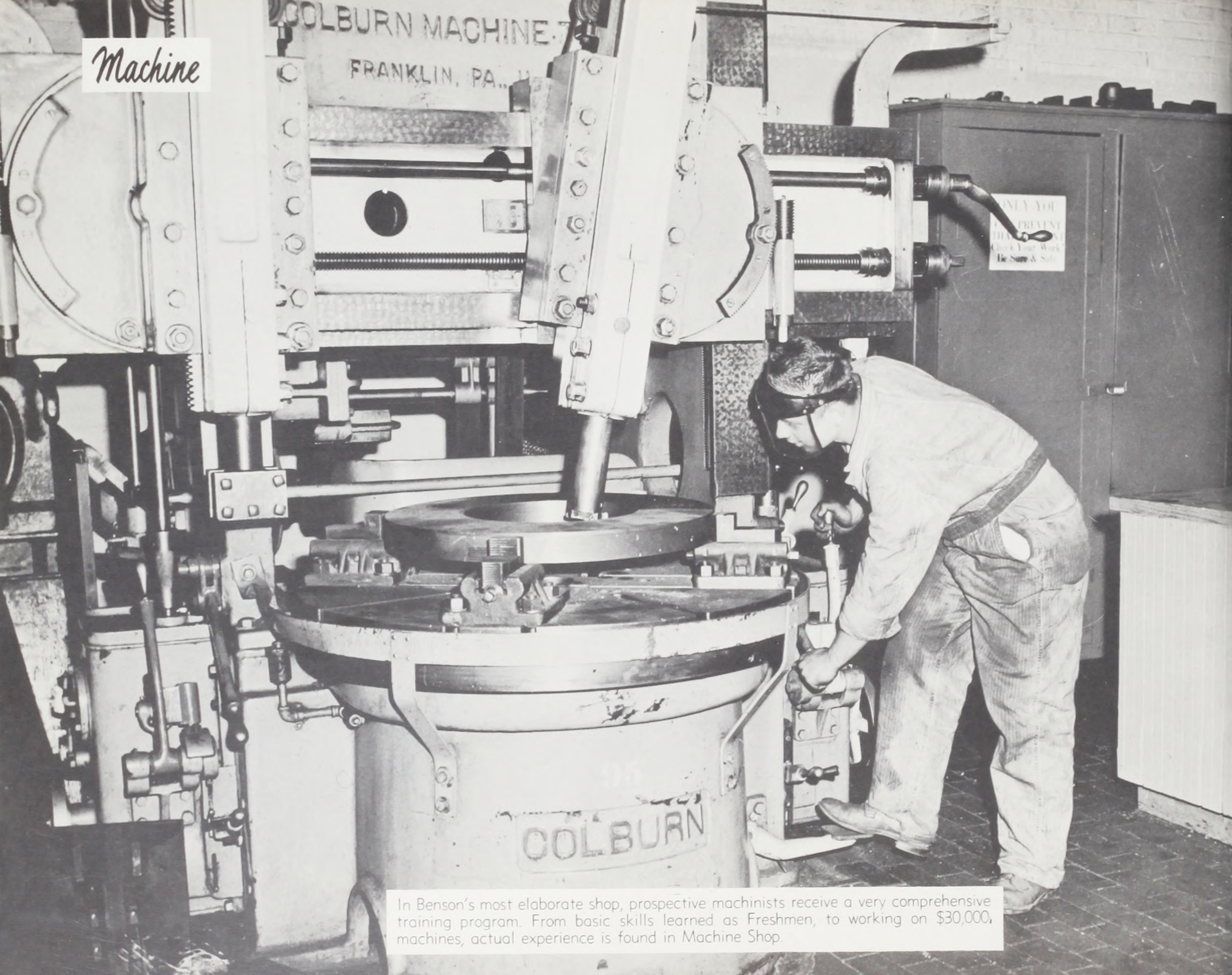

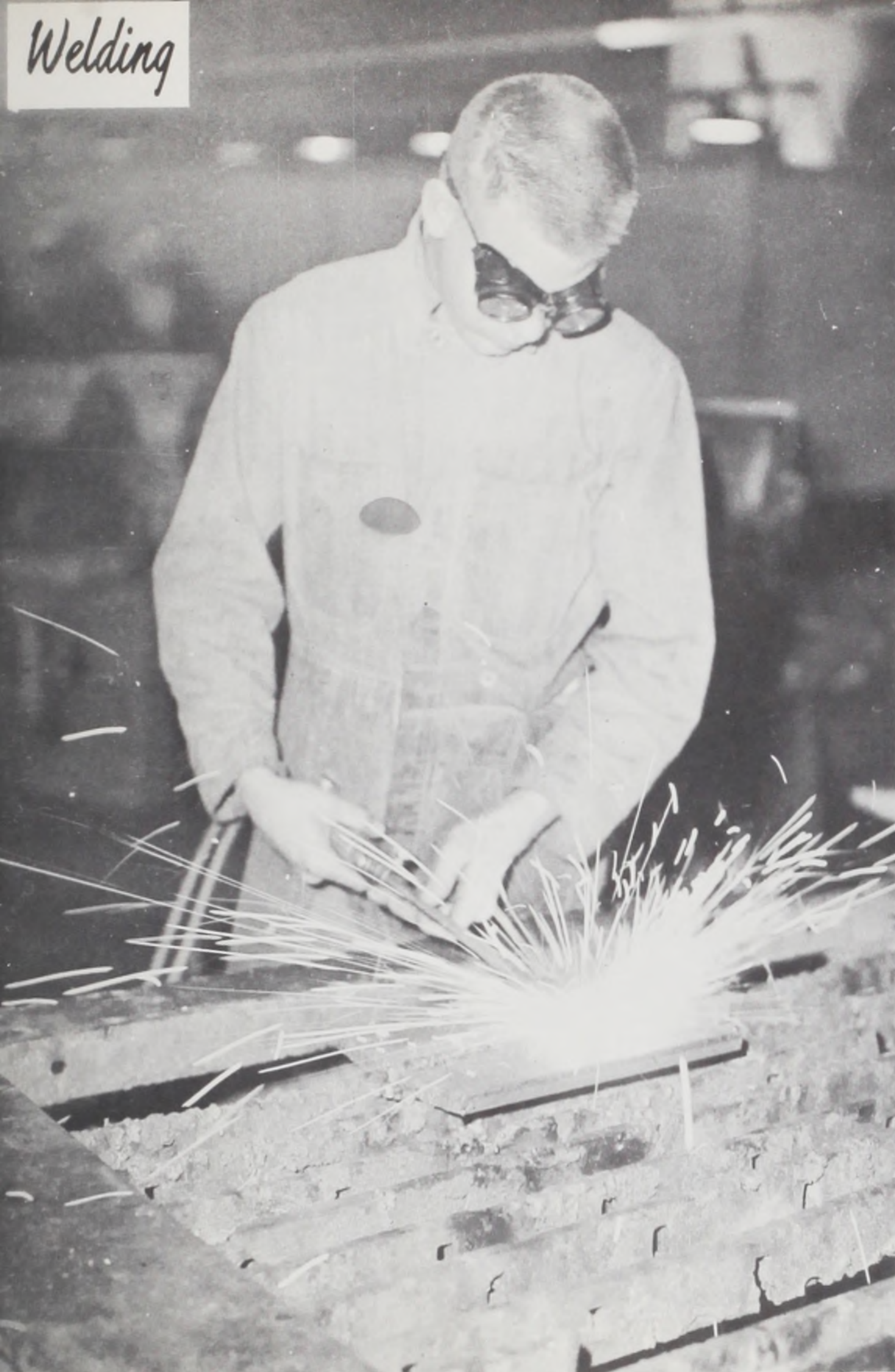


The Heart of The Nation's Finest Technical School

Machine



In Benson's most elaborate shop, prospective machinists receive a very comprehensive training program. From basic skills learned as Freshmen, to working on \$30,000 machines, actual experience is found in Machine Shop.



Students in foundry cast objects from forms made in pattern shop. The sophomores make the molds and the majors pour them because the molten metal is somewhat dangerous. Some of the projects are name plates, book ends, and car club plaques.

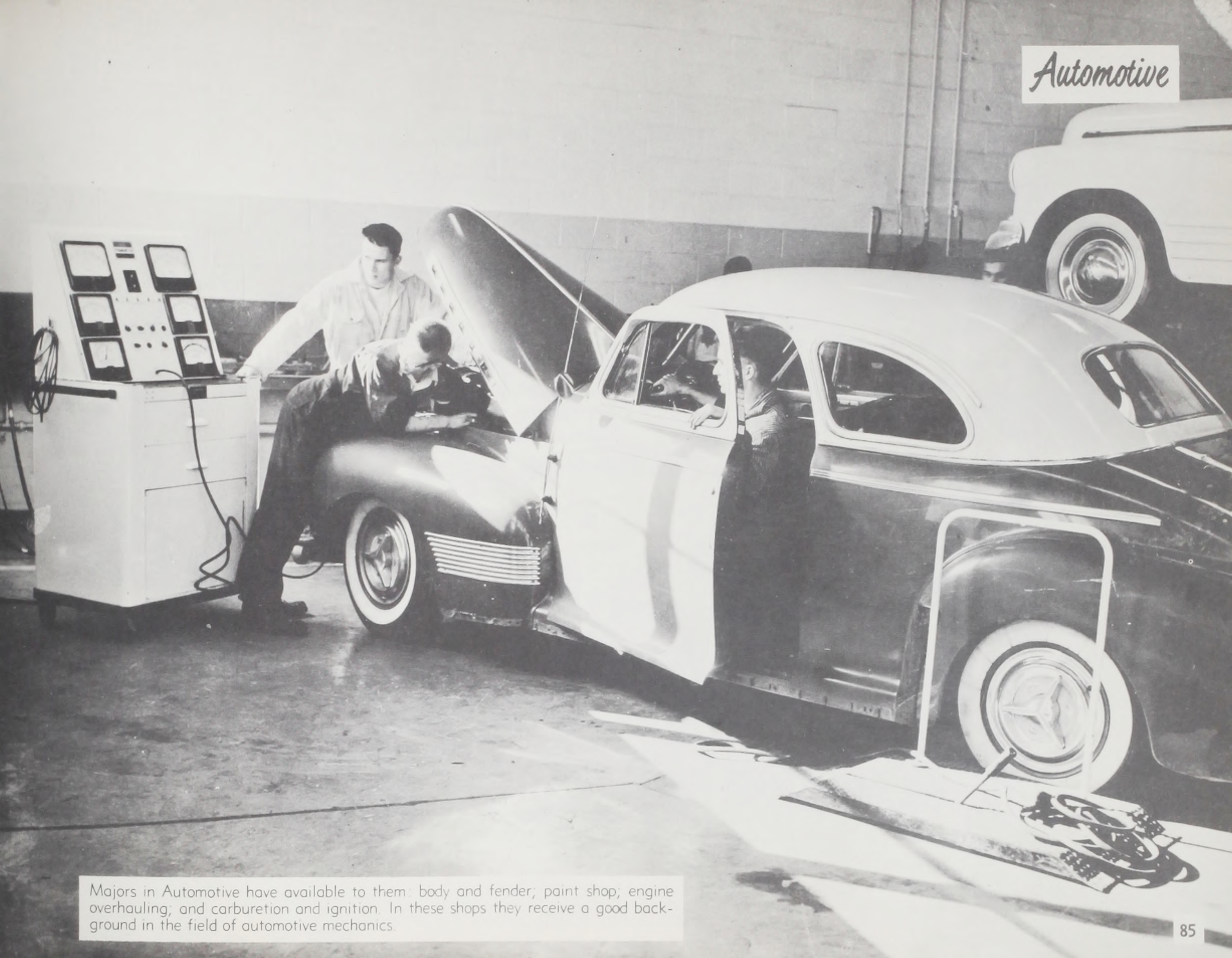

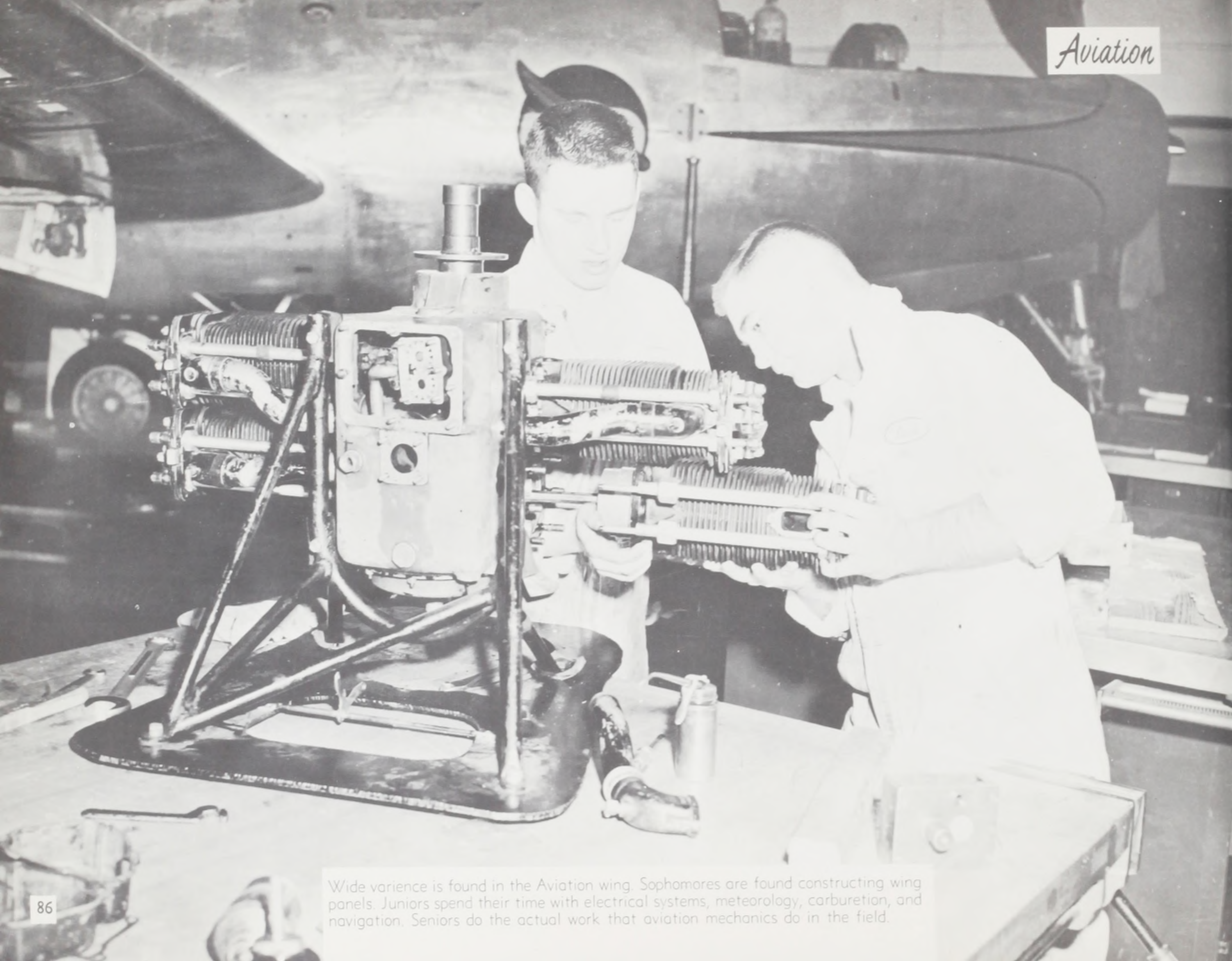
Sheet Metal

Majors in Automotive have available to them: body and fender; paint shop; engine overhauling; and carburetion and ignition. In these shops they receive a good background in the field of automotive mechanics.

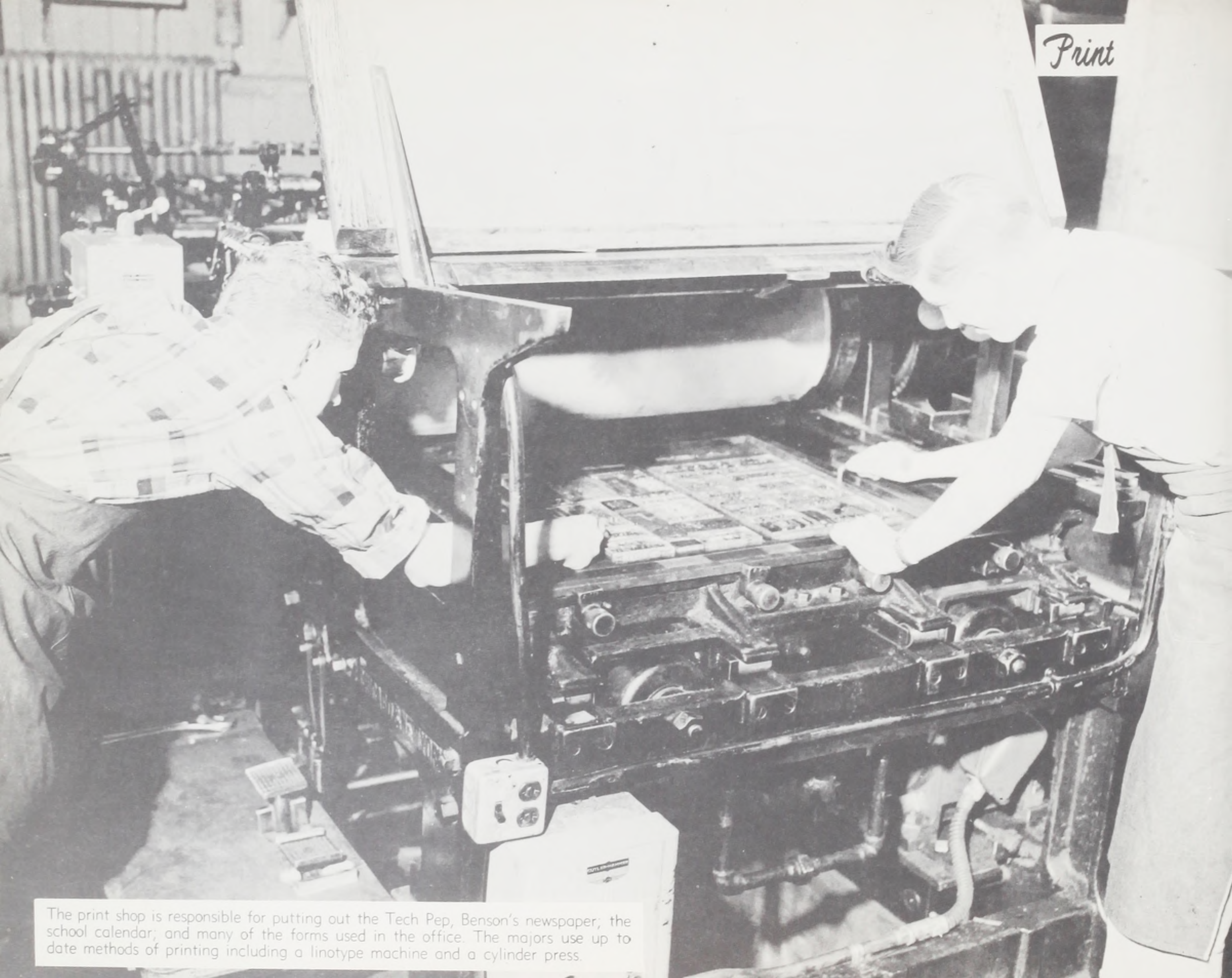

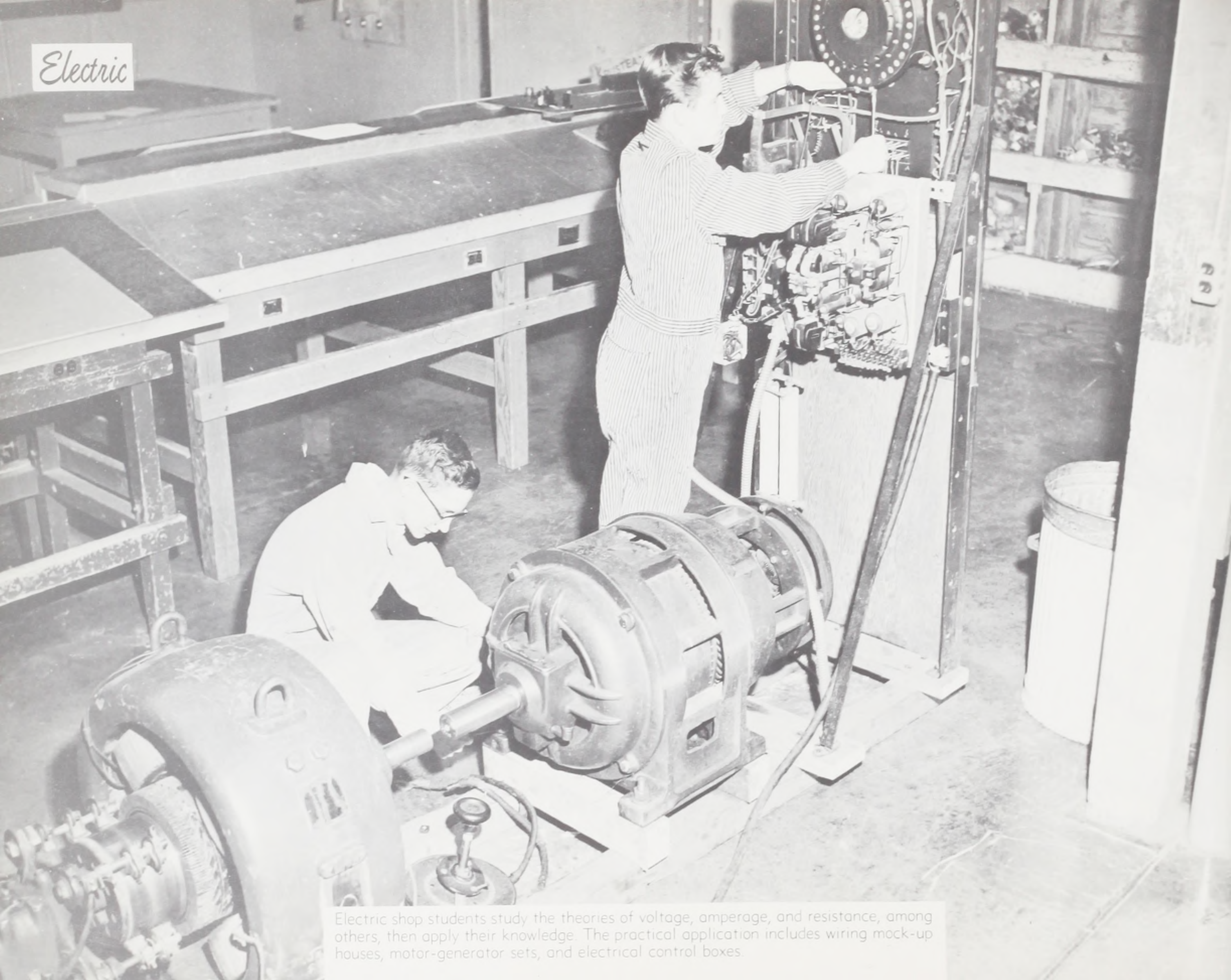


Pattern

Electric shop students study the theories of voltage, amperage, and resistance, among others, then apply their knowledge. The practical application includes wiring mock-up houses, motor-generator sets, and electrical control boxes.

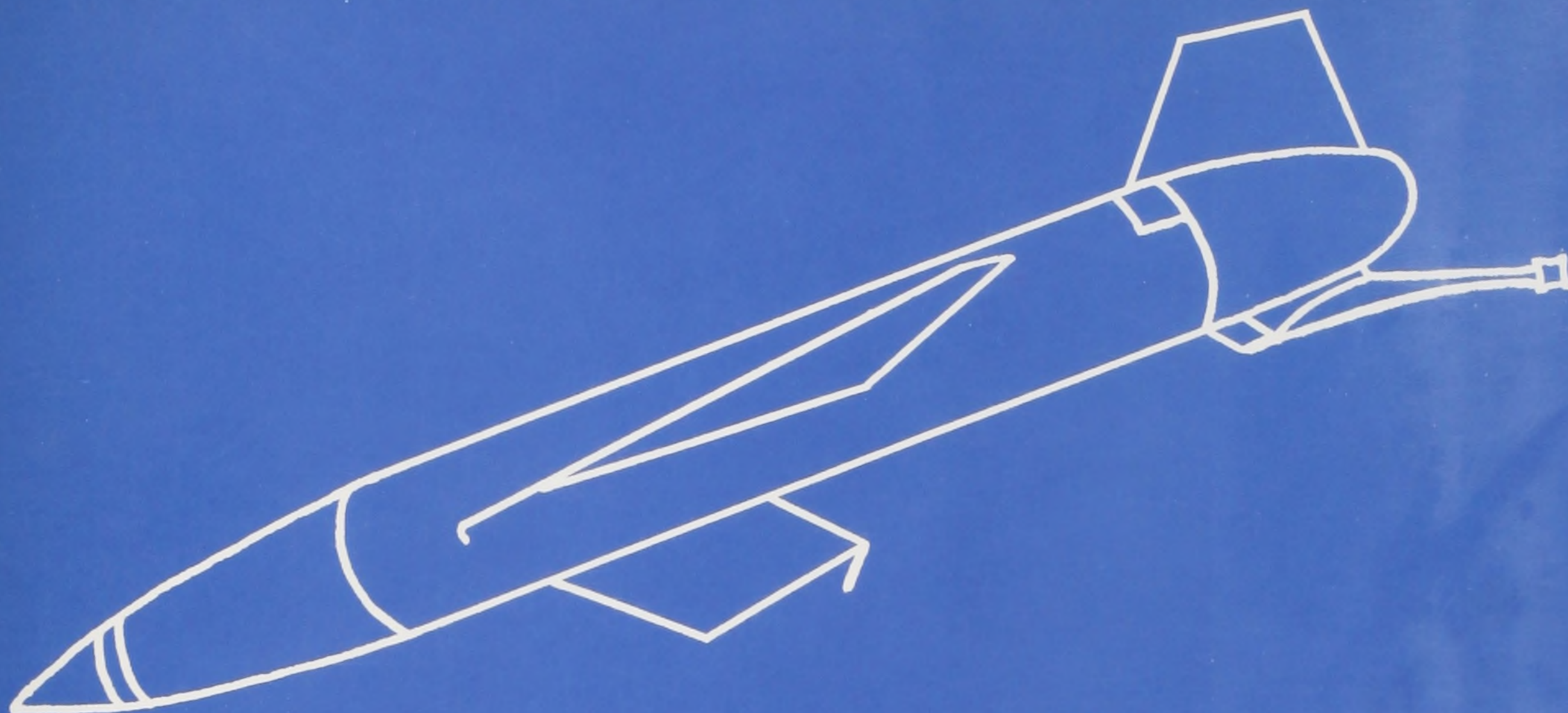


Architecture

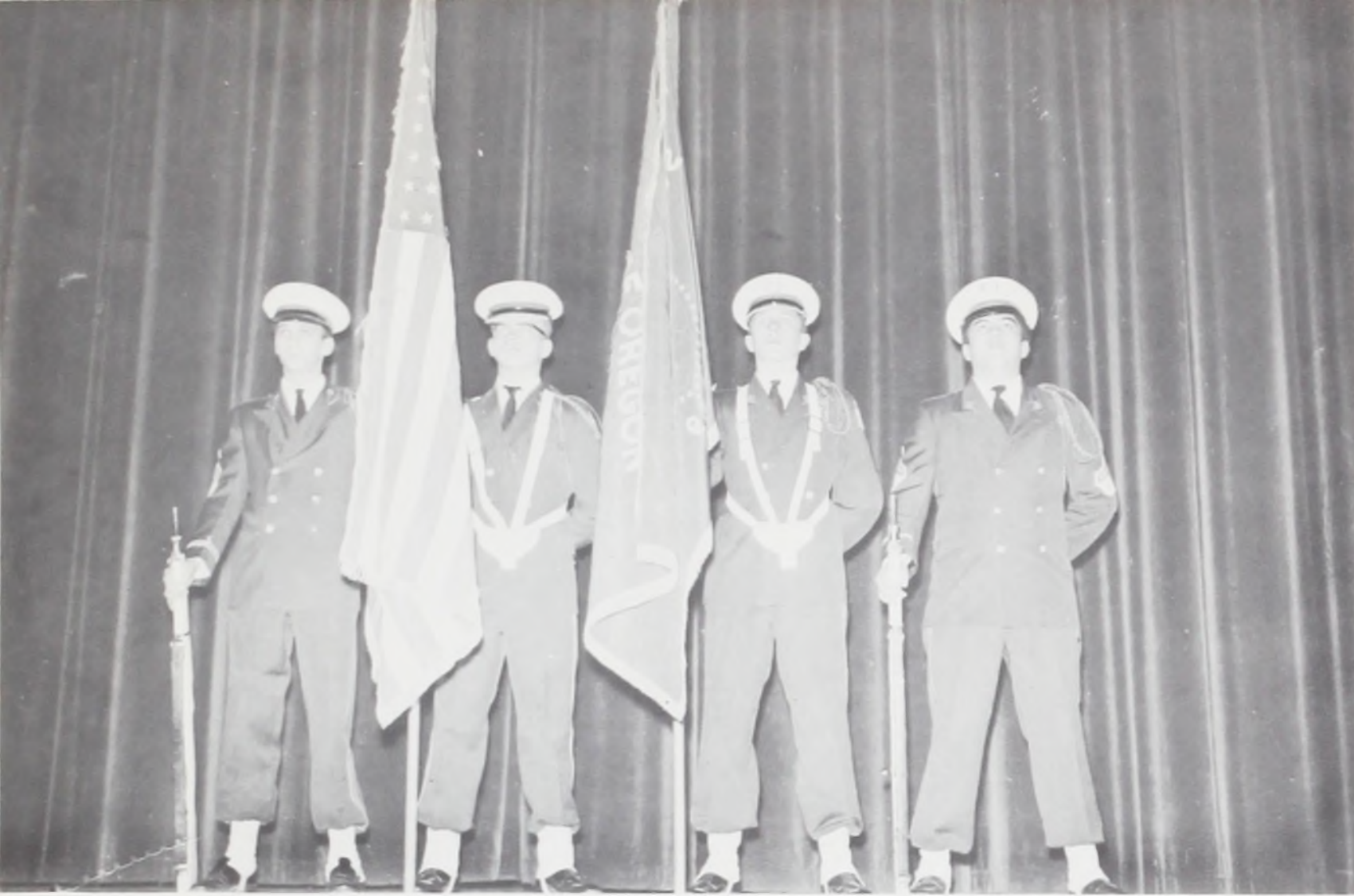
Music Coaches

Mr. Rowe has taught four years at Klamath County High School and at St. Helens High School for ten years. He has done a fine job this first year and we hope he will stay for many more.



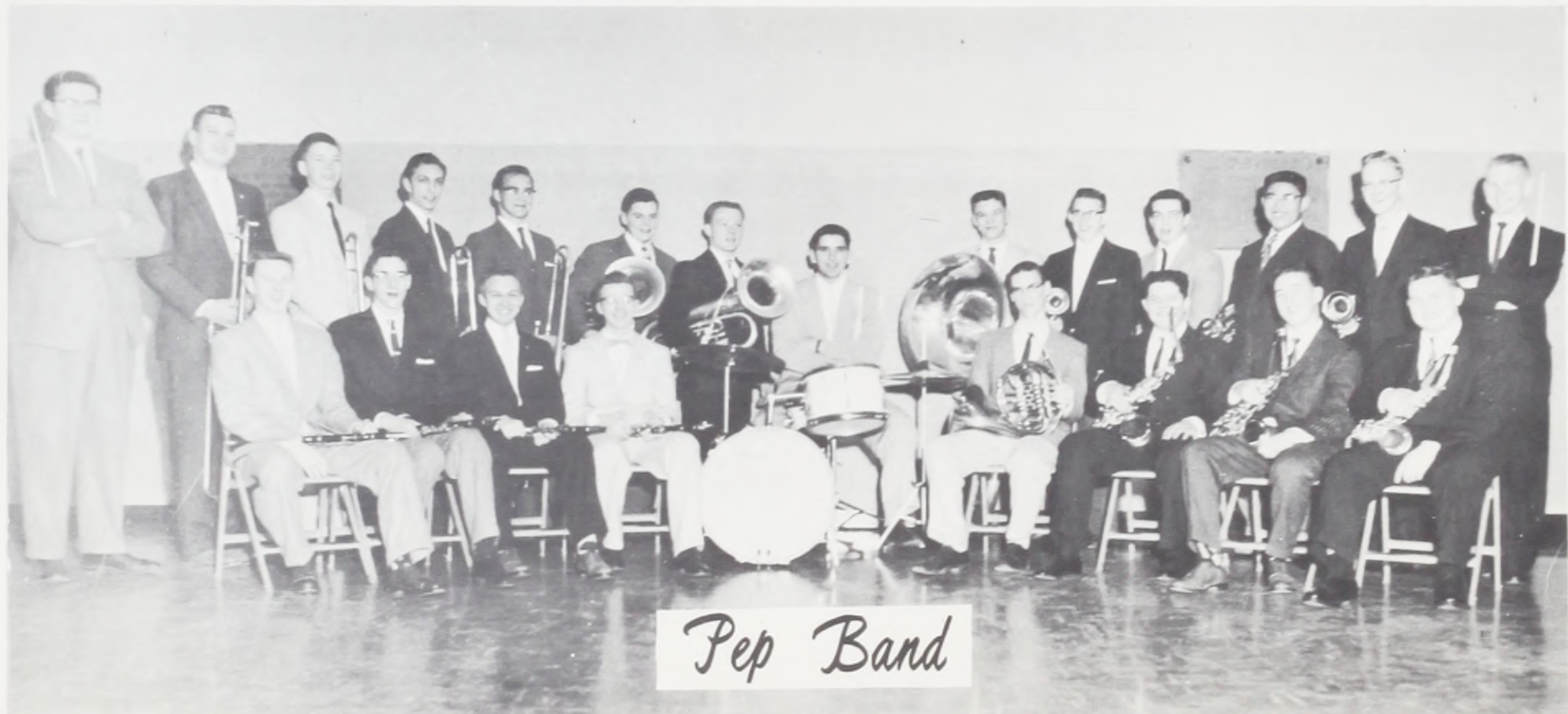

KBPS Staff

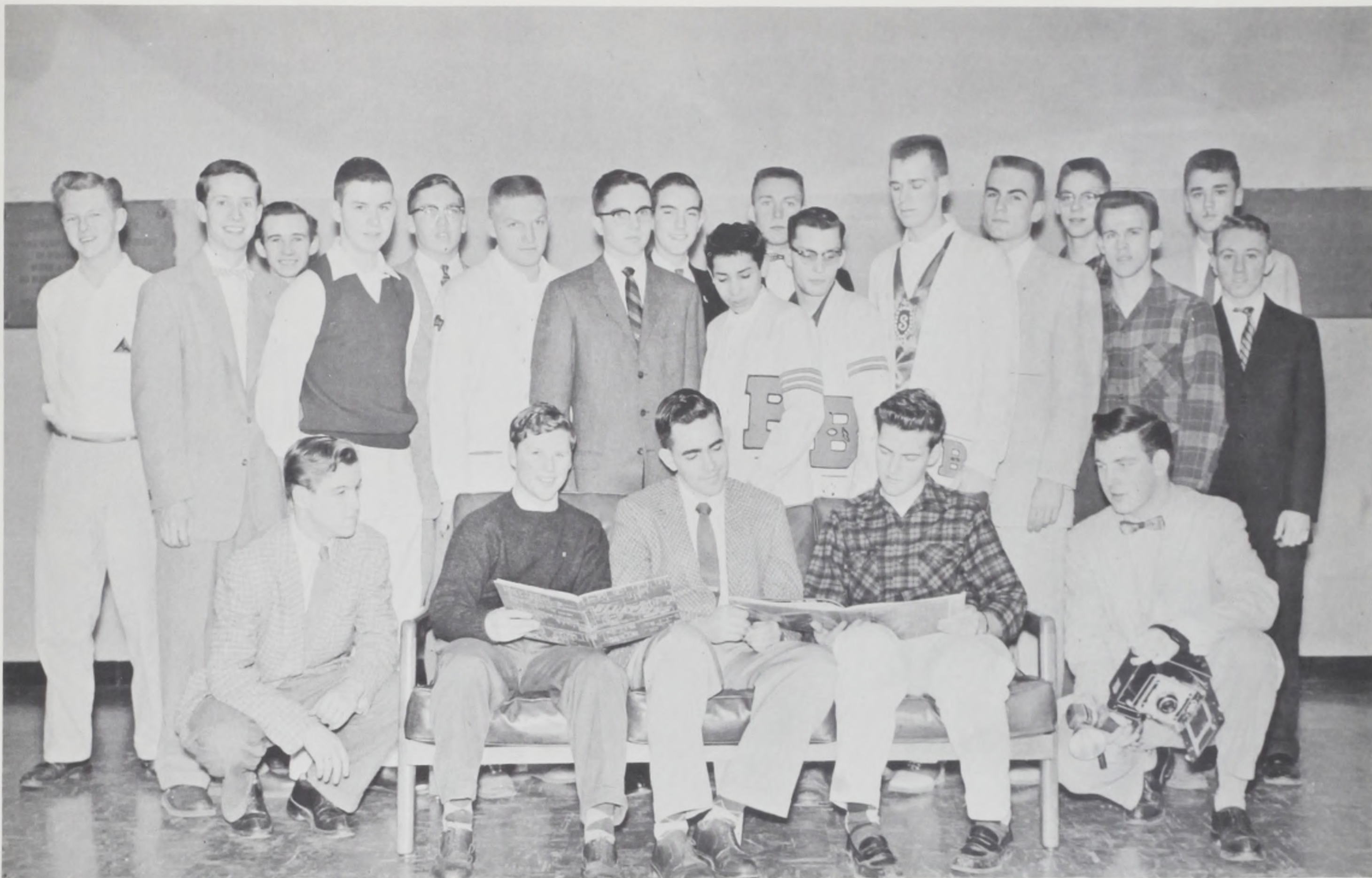

Under the direction of Mr. Fred Warner and Mrs. Pat Swenson, KBPS has come a long way from thirty-five years ago, when the station broadcasted only two hours each night. KBPS now operates ten hours each week day, broadcasting educational programs for the city of Portland and surrounding communities. KBPS operates on an assigned frequency of 1450 kilocycles with a carrying power of 250 watts as authorized by the Federal Communications Commission. The main station and radio transmitter are located at Benson.

The chief of staff for KBPS this year has been Ed Hepp, who now works as a combo man at KGRO in Gresham. Ed hopes to go on in radio work and later into network television.

All the operators of the KBPS technical staff are seniors, except one, a sophomore.

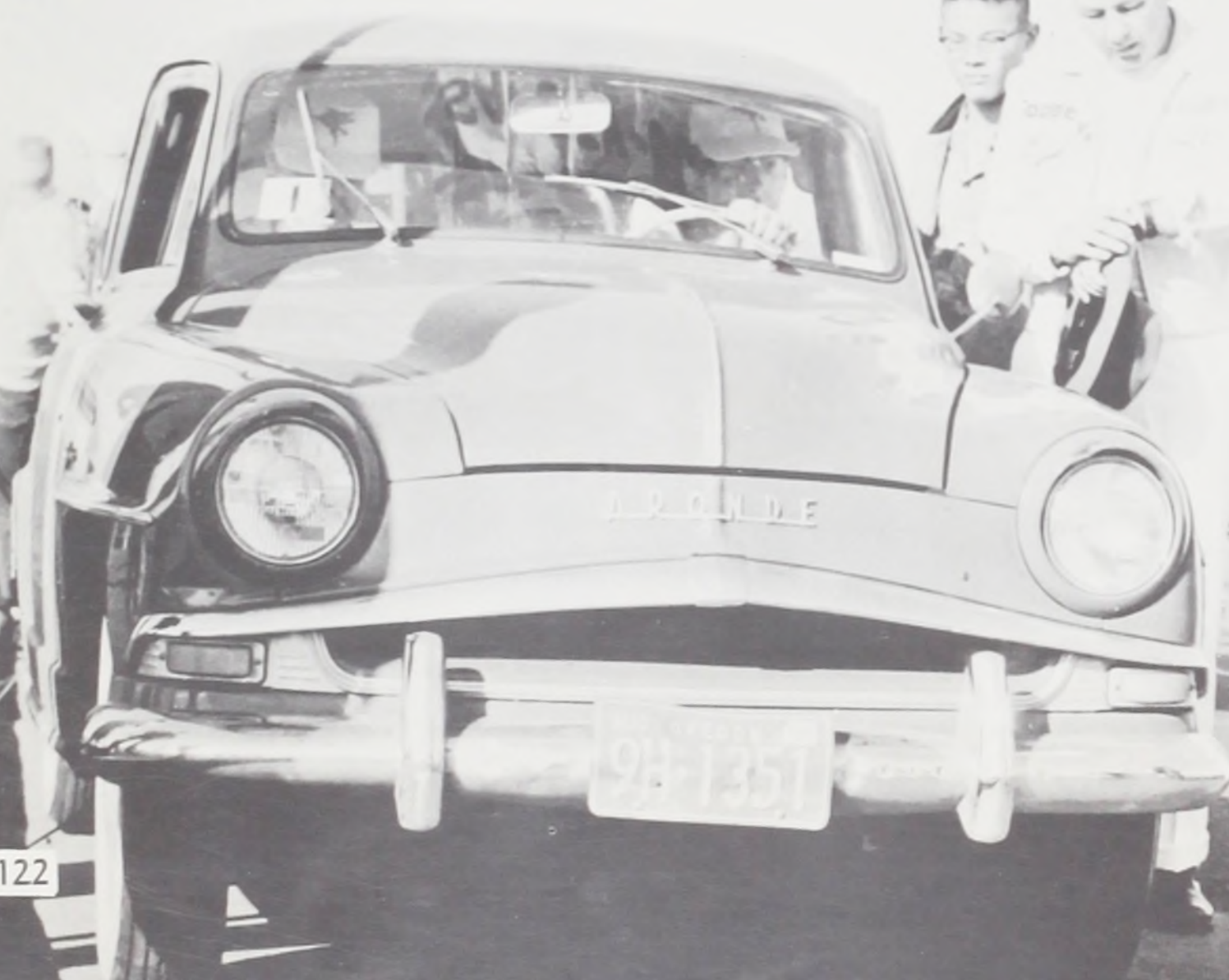


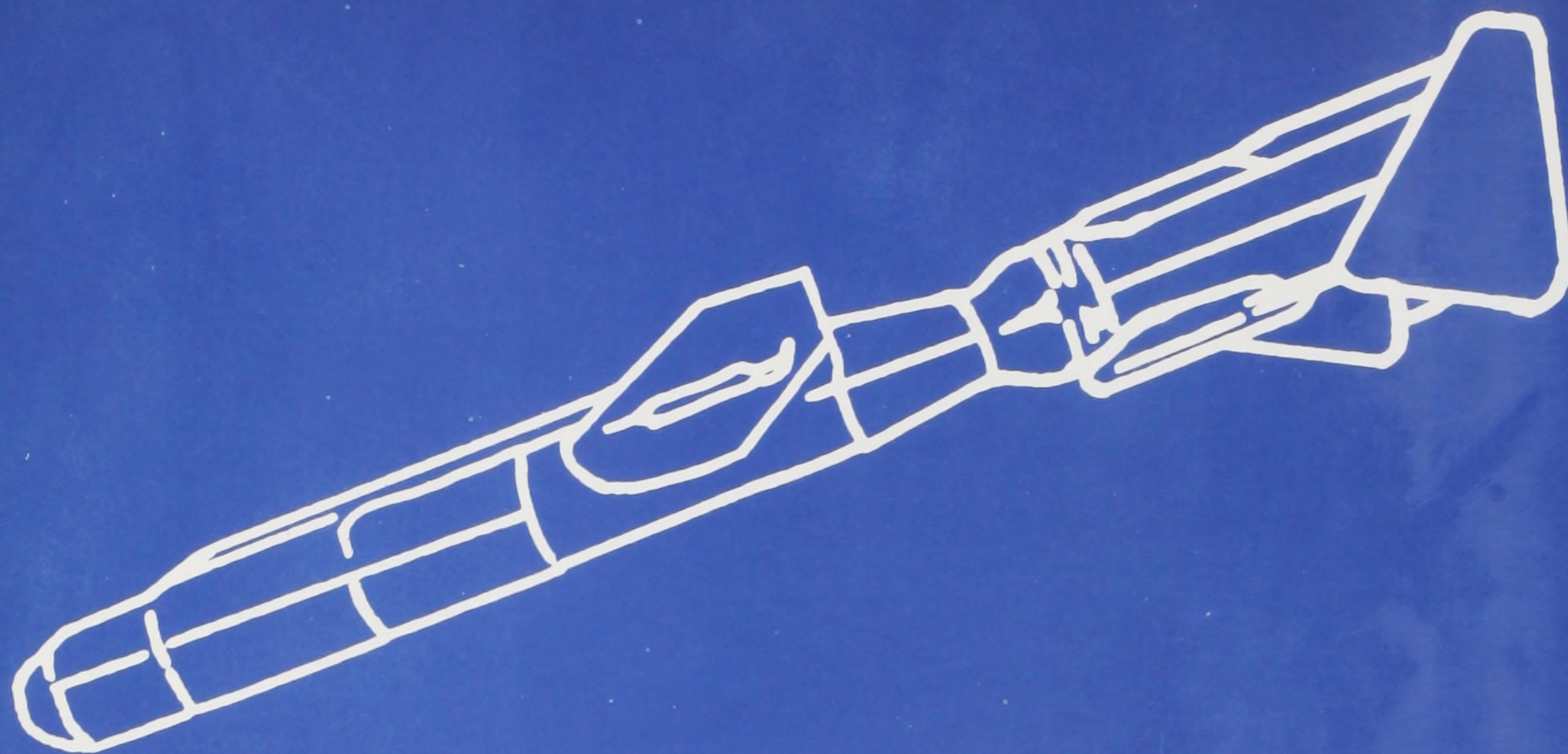

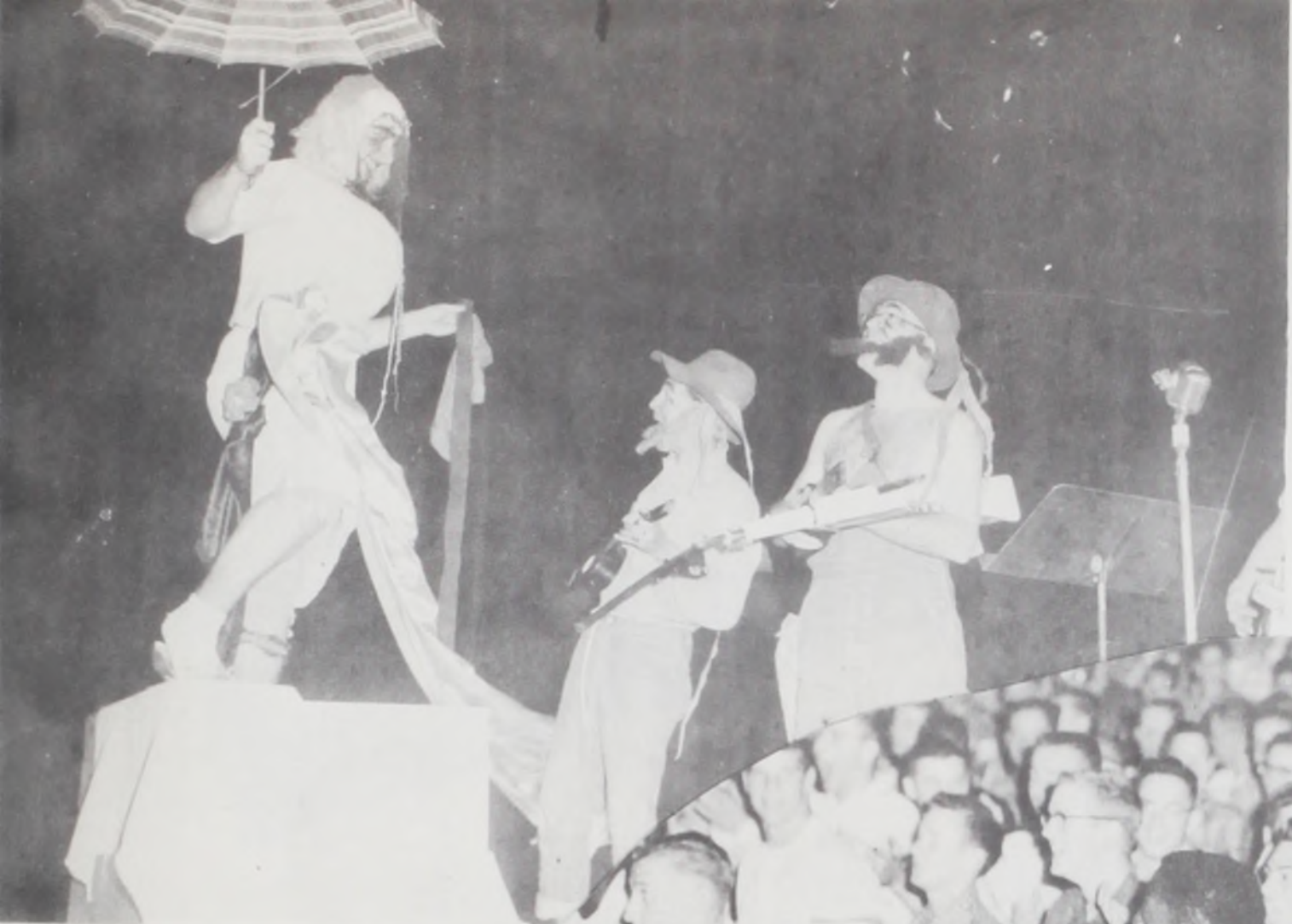
1957 Gamboree

To Benson's most successful football coach, Coach Ralph Harper, we dedicate this page.



Coach Harper, known as the dean of Portland Interscholastic league football, resigned from coaching this year. Although we at Benson are very sorry to lose his talents as a coach, Mr. Harper leaves behind him a very successful career.

In 1949, Coach Harper became head coach at Benson after serving two years as assistant coach. A 4-2-1 win-loss record in 1952 gave the Techmen, guided by Mr. Harper, a birth in the state playoffs. That year Mr. Harper's young men advanced to the finals, only to bow to Central Catholic 7-6. This was the last time a Portland team accomplished this feat until this year. Then in 1953, Mr. Harper guided his gridders to the first of his two undefeated and untied PIL championships. Three years later, in 1956, came his second undefeated-untied seasons.

This season, Coach Harper finished his eight year at Benson with an impressive 6-3 record, giving a total record of 31 wins, 23 losses, and 4 ties.

Mr. Harper attended Franklin High School and lettered in football, basketball, and track. In 1940 he enrolled in Oregon State, but his education was interrupted in 1942 by World War II, where he saw duty in the South Pacific while in the Marine Corps. He then returned to Oregon State in 1946 and lettered in football, as a guard. After graduating in 1947 coach Harper came to Benson as assistant football coach. The Marine Corps recalled him in 1951 to serve in Korea. When he returned he began his successful stay at Benson.

Although we shall miss him as a coach, every young man who ever learned or played football for him will never forget him. Mr. Harper has that unexplainable understanding of youth which will never let us forget him.





Techmen Scalp Indians

The Engineers, under the dean of coaches of the PIL Ralph Harper, were victorious in their initial game of the season, beating Cleveland 28-12.

The Engineers, after a shaky start in the jamboree, got their offense rolling the following night under the lights at Roosevelt. The Indians drove to the Tech one foot line in the Jamboree, before a penalty and a fumble recovered by Randy Hawke halted them. From there, the Engineers advanced to the 24 yard line on a roughing the kicker penalty. On the very next play Bill Newborne raced 76 yards to pay dirt. For the second week in a row, the engineers have participated in a thrilling game. This week, however, we were on the winning side as the Colonials from Washington were downed 19-13.

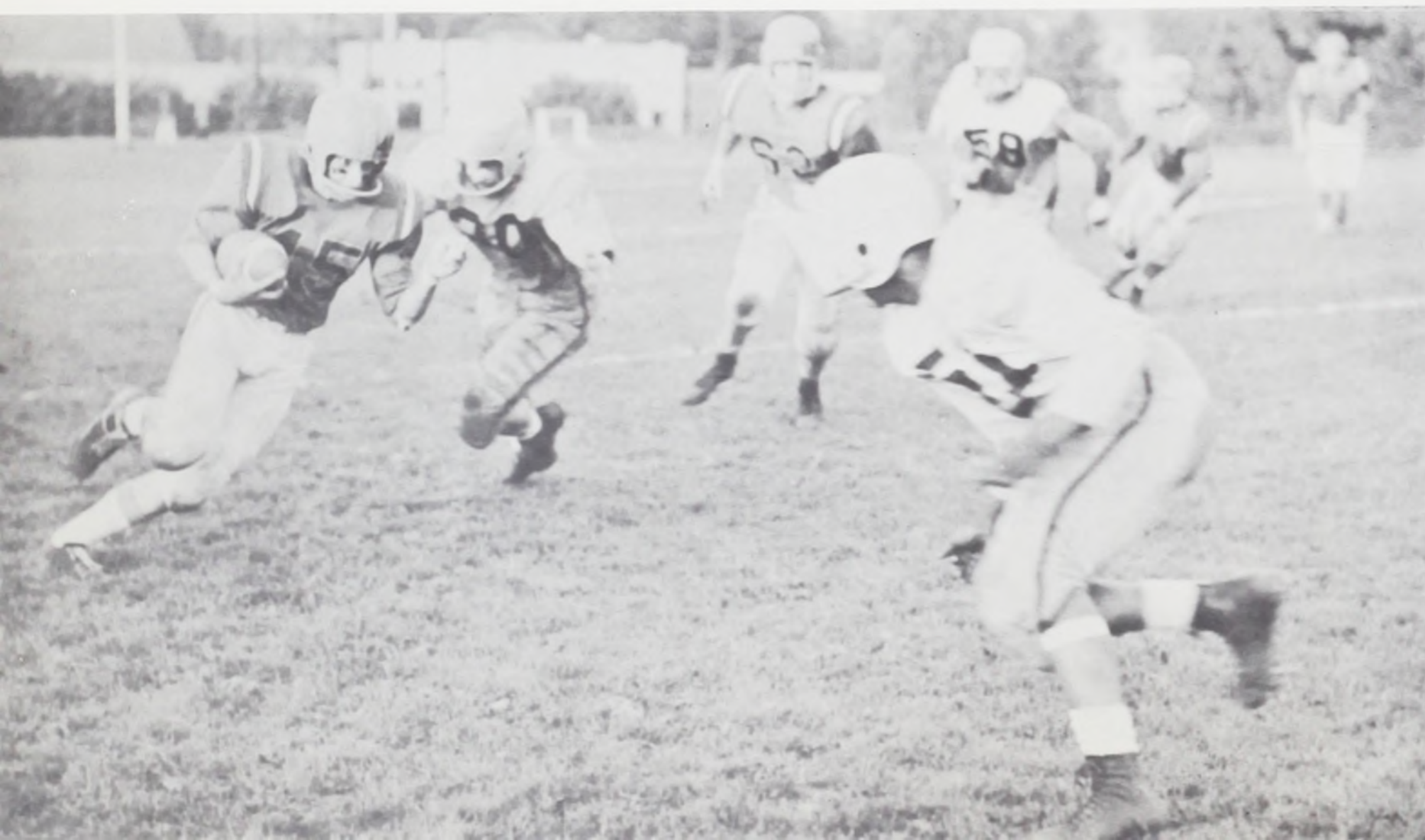

Engineers Drop Dollies

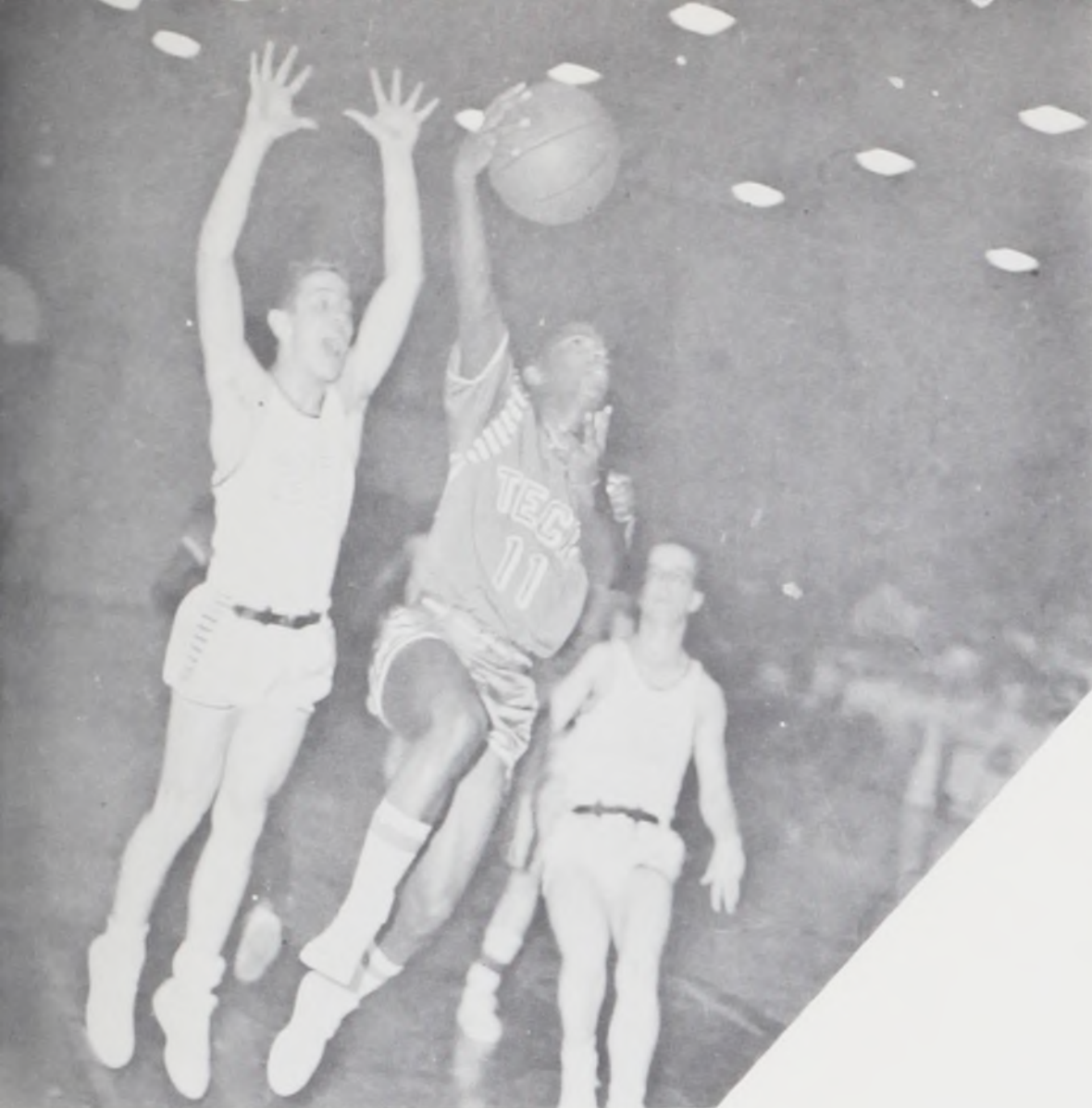

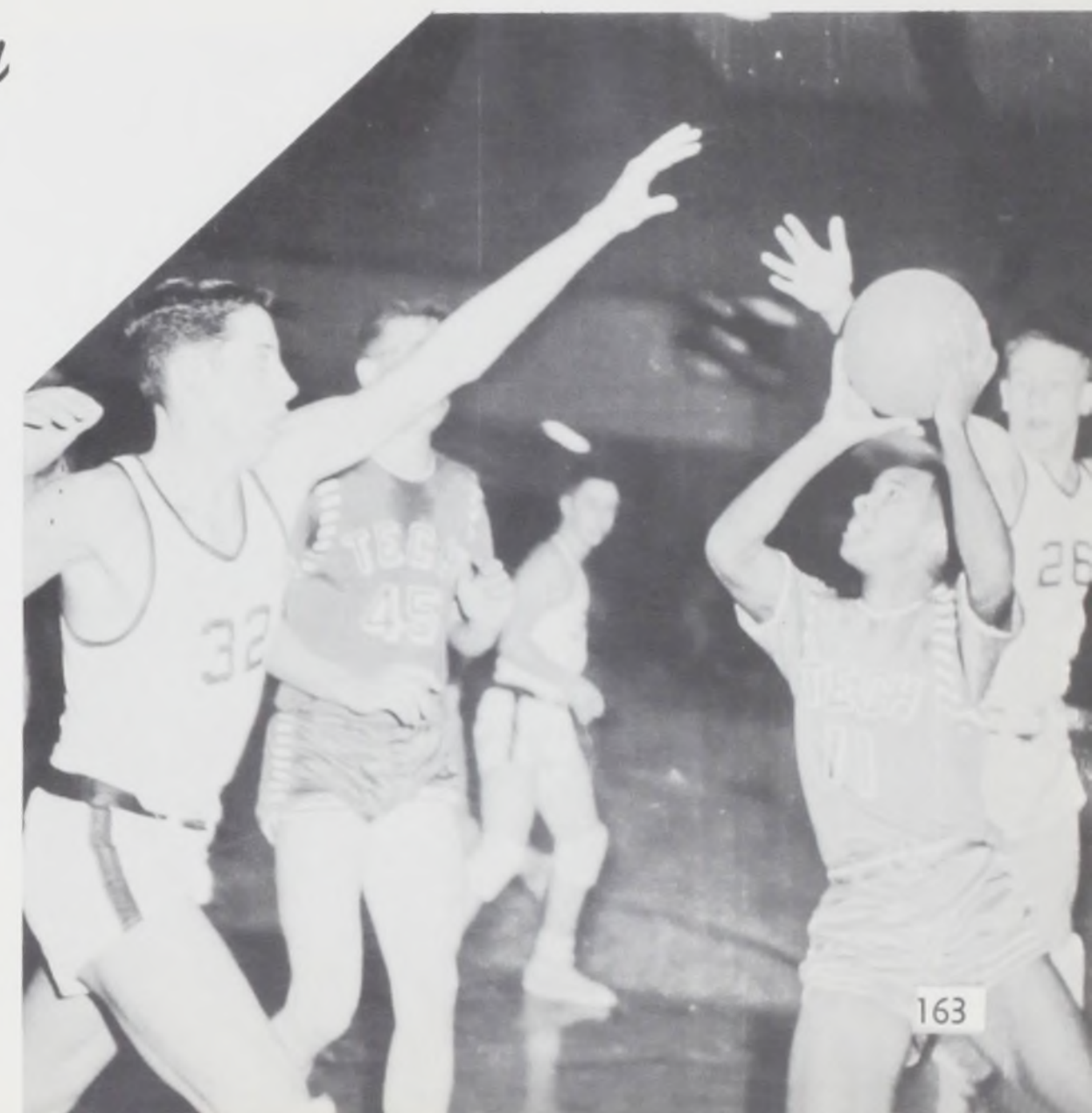
The Engineers won their third ball game of the year by soundly beating the Wilson Trojans 58-42. Benson led at the quarter stops in rolling to victory.

Thus, the Engineers ended the season tied for sixth place with a 6 won 12 loss record. *

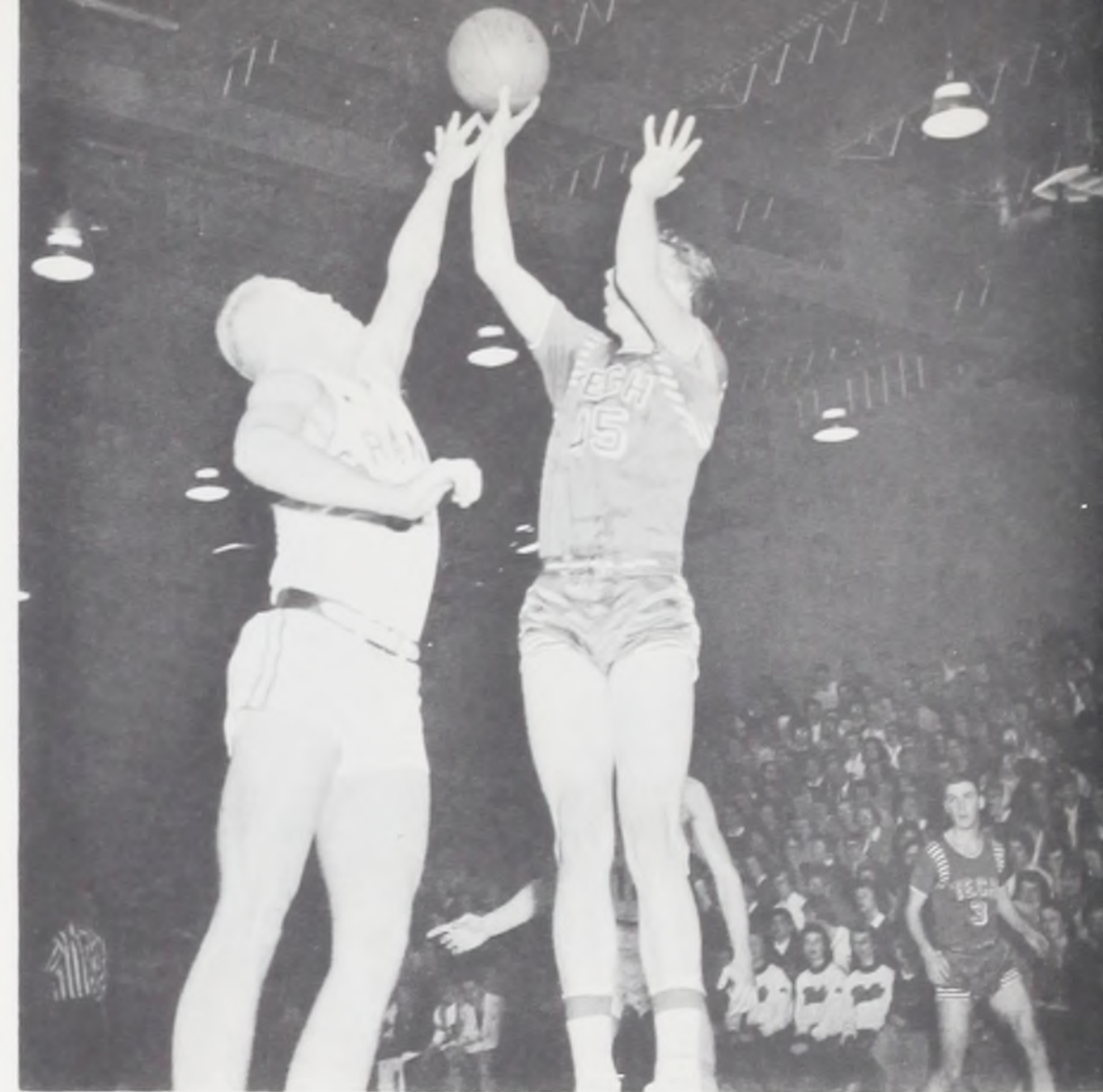

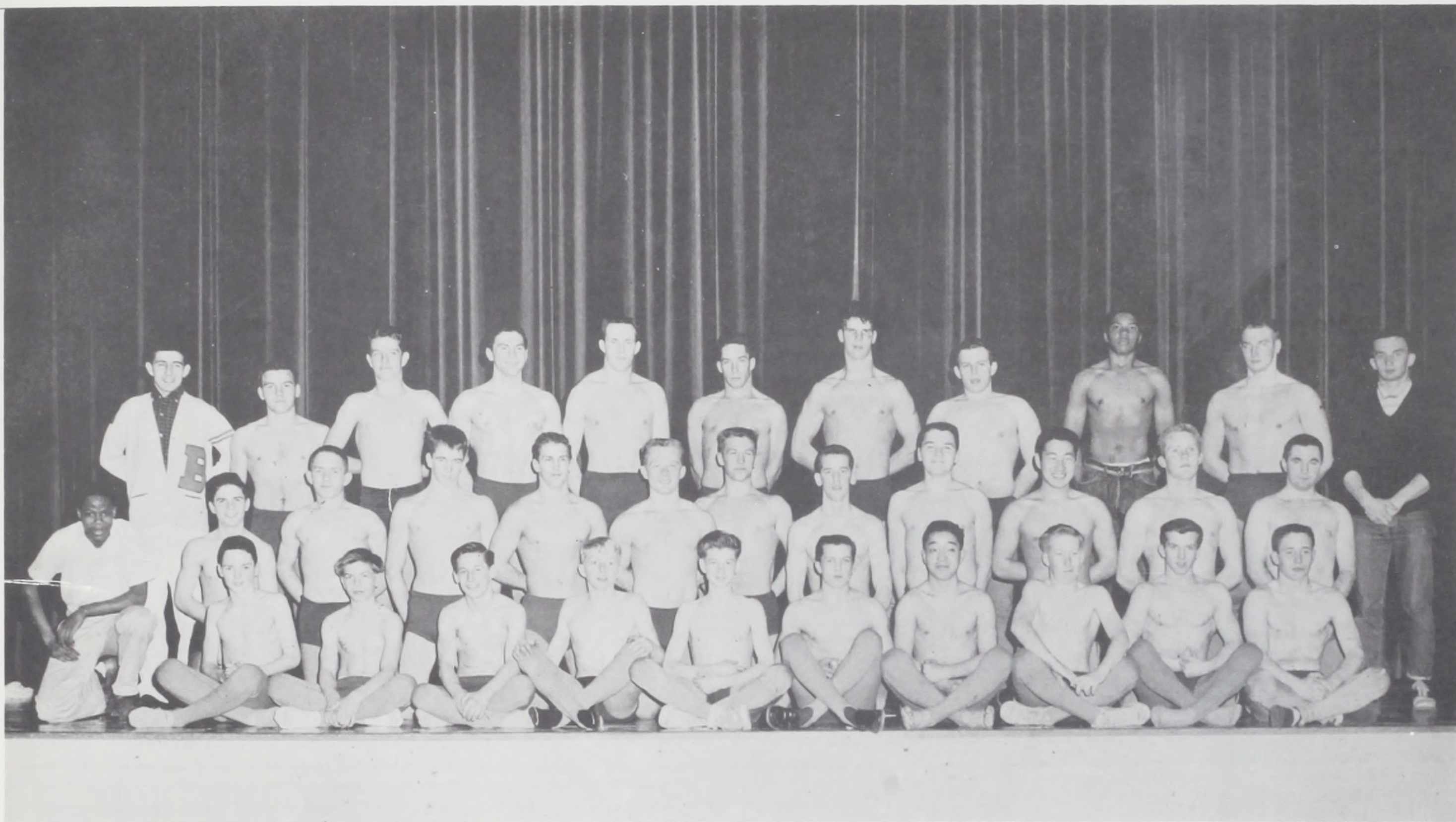

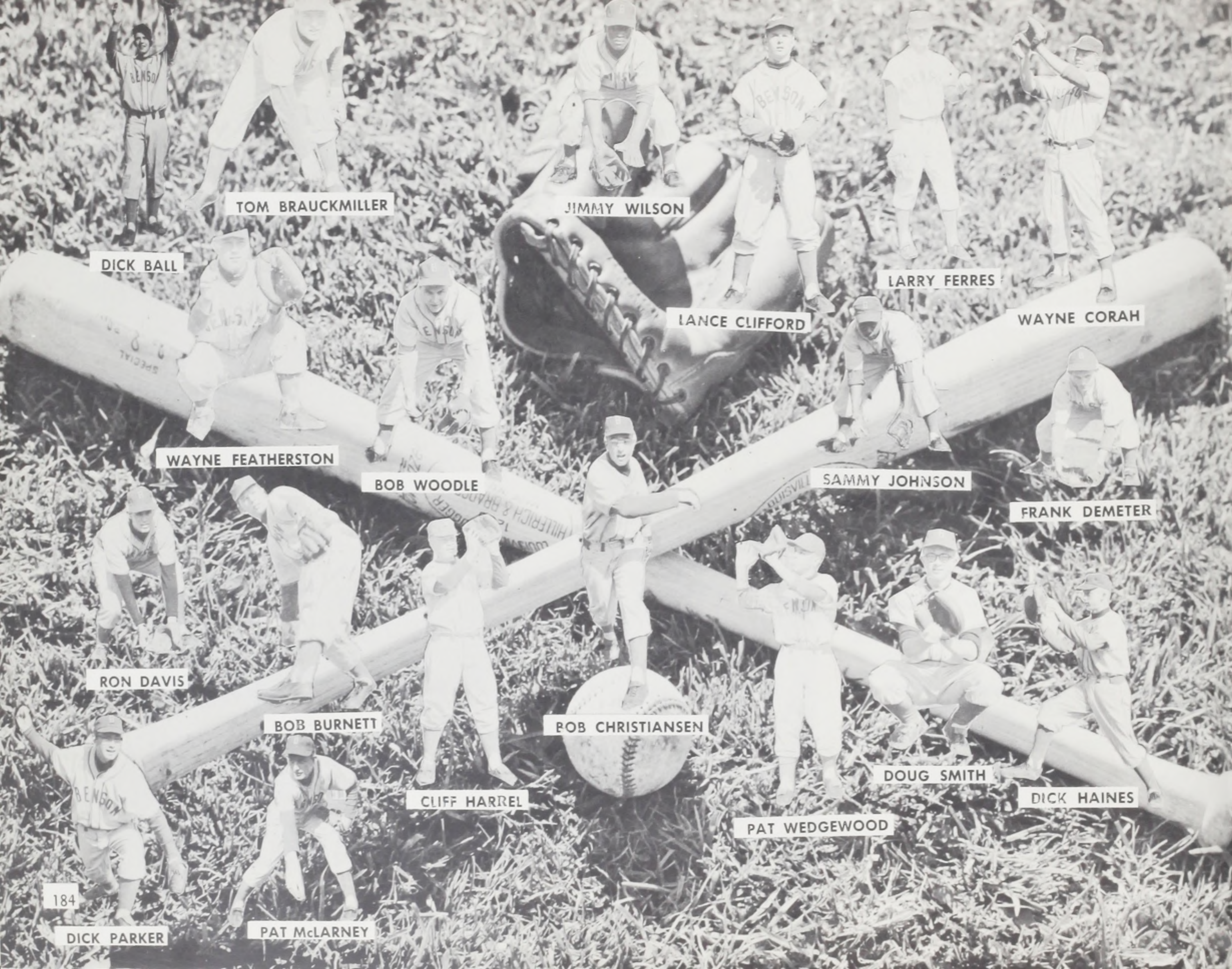


Mr Don Holt
