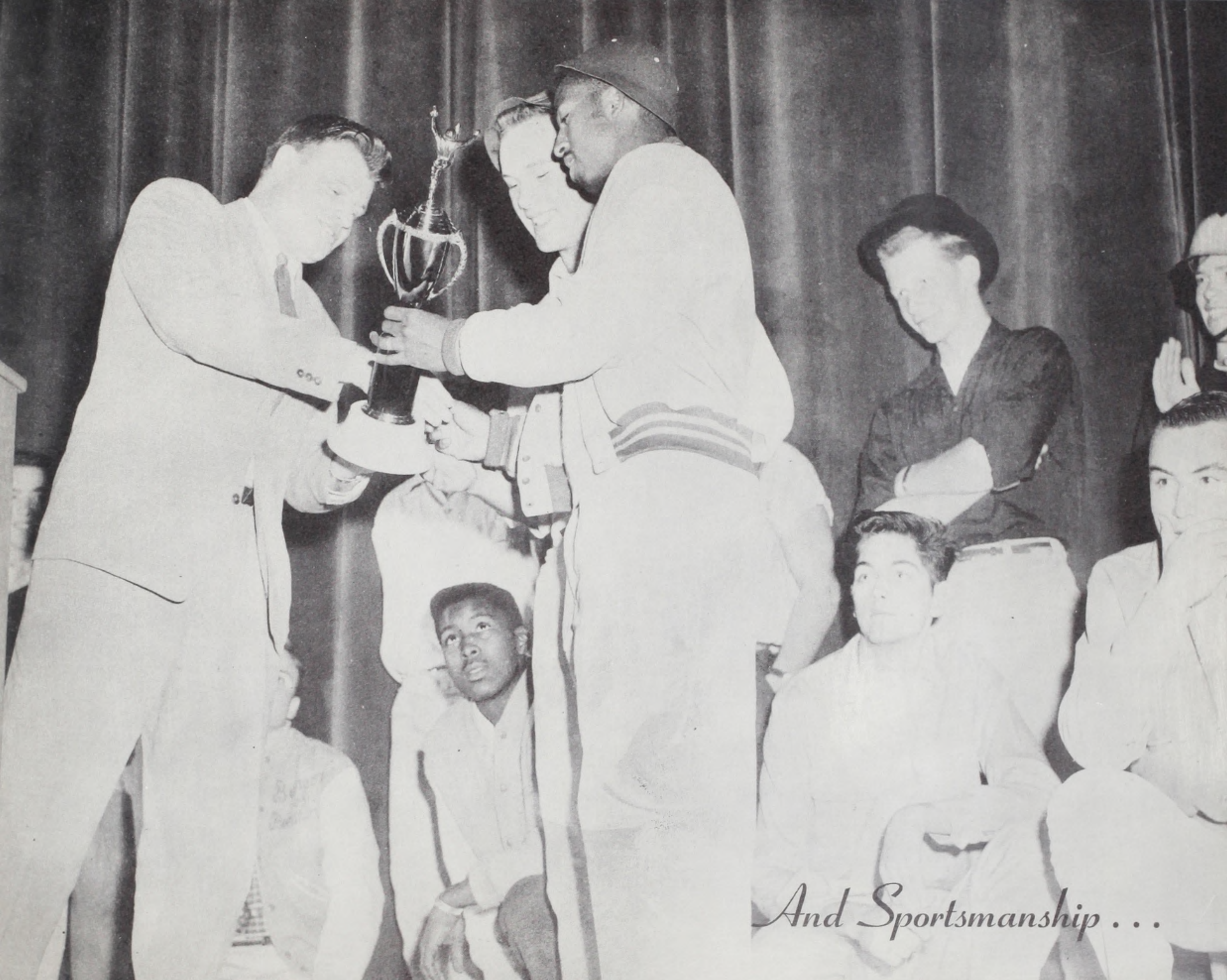

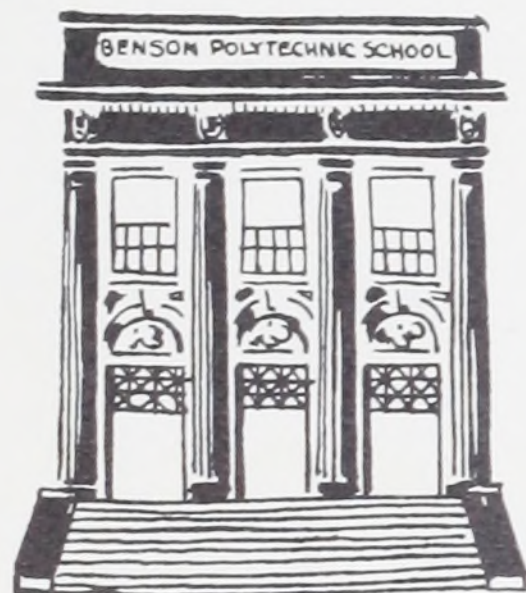

## *Mr. Benjamin J. Kuhns*

Benjamin J. Kuhns was born near Forest Grove, Oregon. After completing his grammar-school education, he moved to Portland with his family in 1907. Here, he enrolled in the old Portland Trade School where he was a member of the Band and Baseball team. In 1911 he was graduated as a cabinet-maker in the first class to receive diplomas from the school.

From early boyhood, Mr. Kuhns had always been interested in working with wood, and summer vacations found him employed in local furniture factories, or building houses with an uncle, a contractor.

The year following graduation, he joined the Portland Trade School faculty as an apprentice teacher. With the exception of a year as a manual-training instruction at Mount Tabor School, he has been a member of the Benson Faculty throughout his entire teaching career.

On June 10, 1918, he enlisted in the Navy where he served about two-and one-half years, being discharged with rating of Carp. Mate 1st. cl.

In his 44 years of teaching, many thousands of students have passed through Mr. Kuhns' classes, and he seldom fails to recognize each one and call him by name.

Mr. Kuhns married a Benson English teacher, Lucille Atchison, in 1922. They have one son, David, who was graduated from Benson in 1945. Two young grandchildren promise to keep life from becoming too boring.

Retirement plans include more time for a gardening hobby as well as frequent visits to "Kuhns' Nest," the summer cottage at Neskowin Beach. (Note: It is only a stone's-throw from a beautiful golf course!)

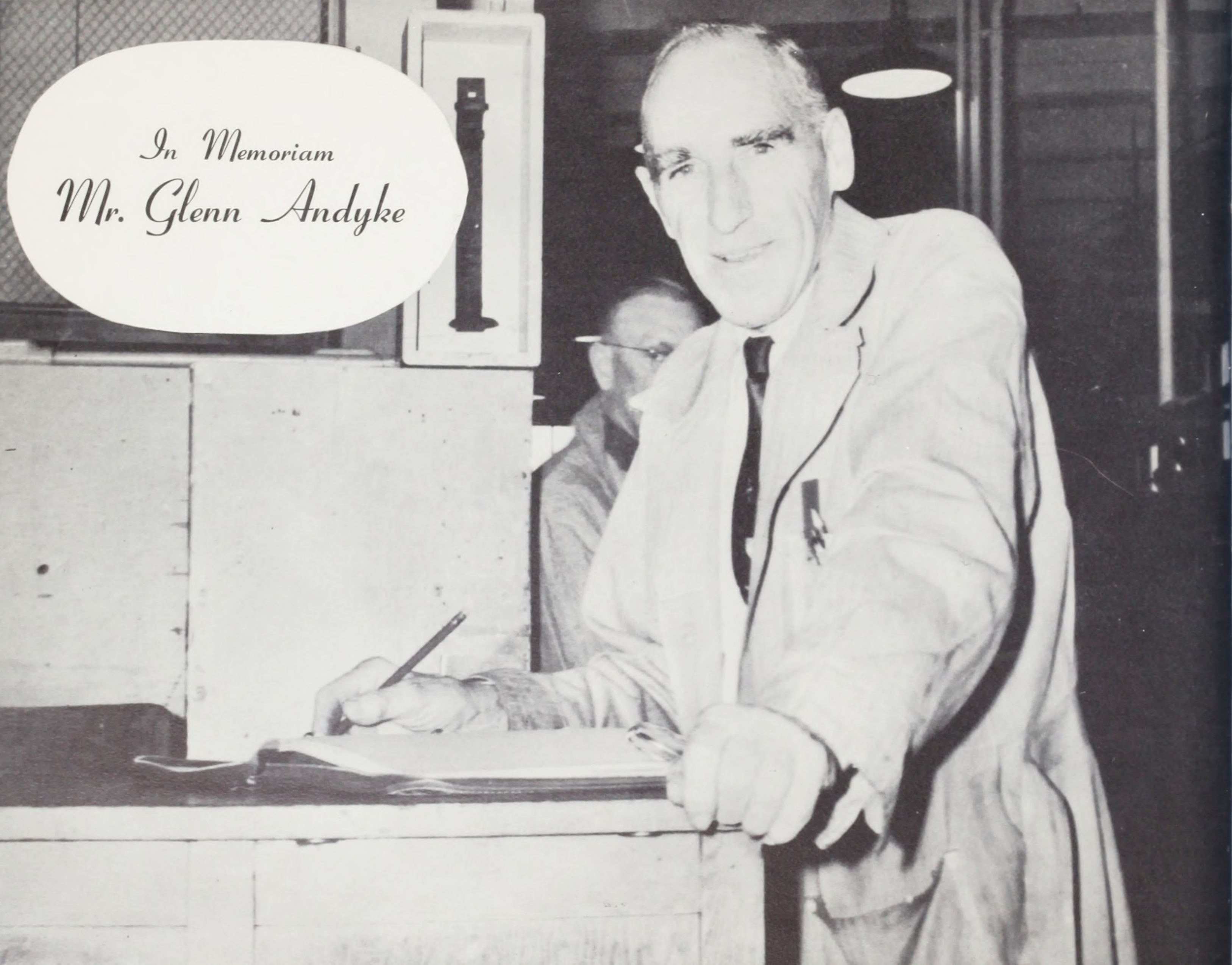

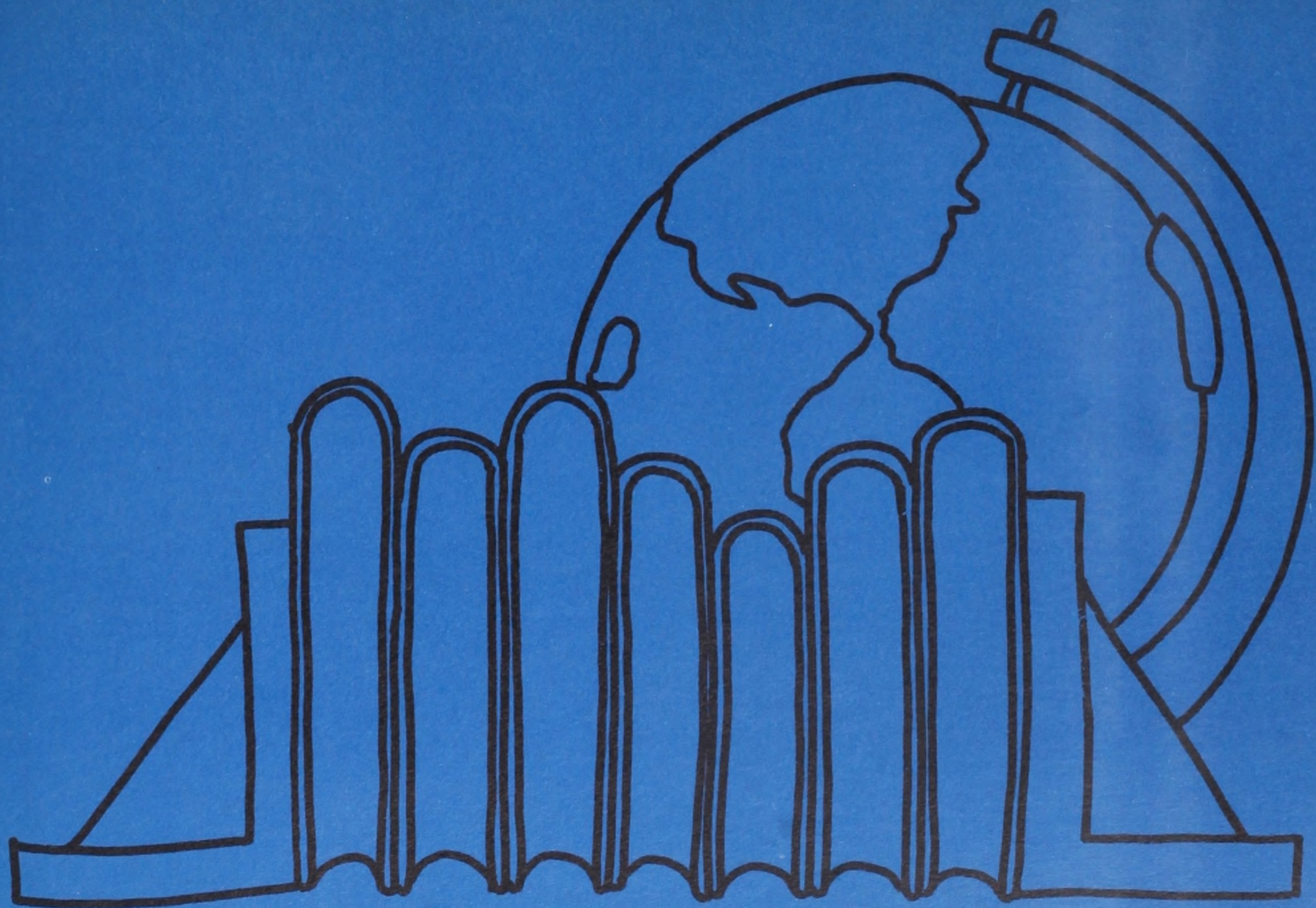

Mr. George Brown, formerly in charge of student discipline, was transferred this year to the shop area where he was christened Shop Superintendent.

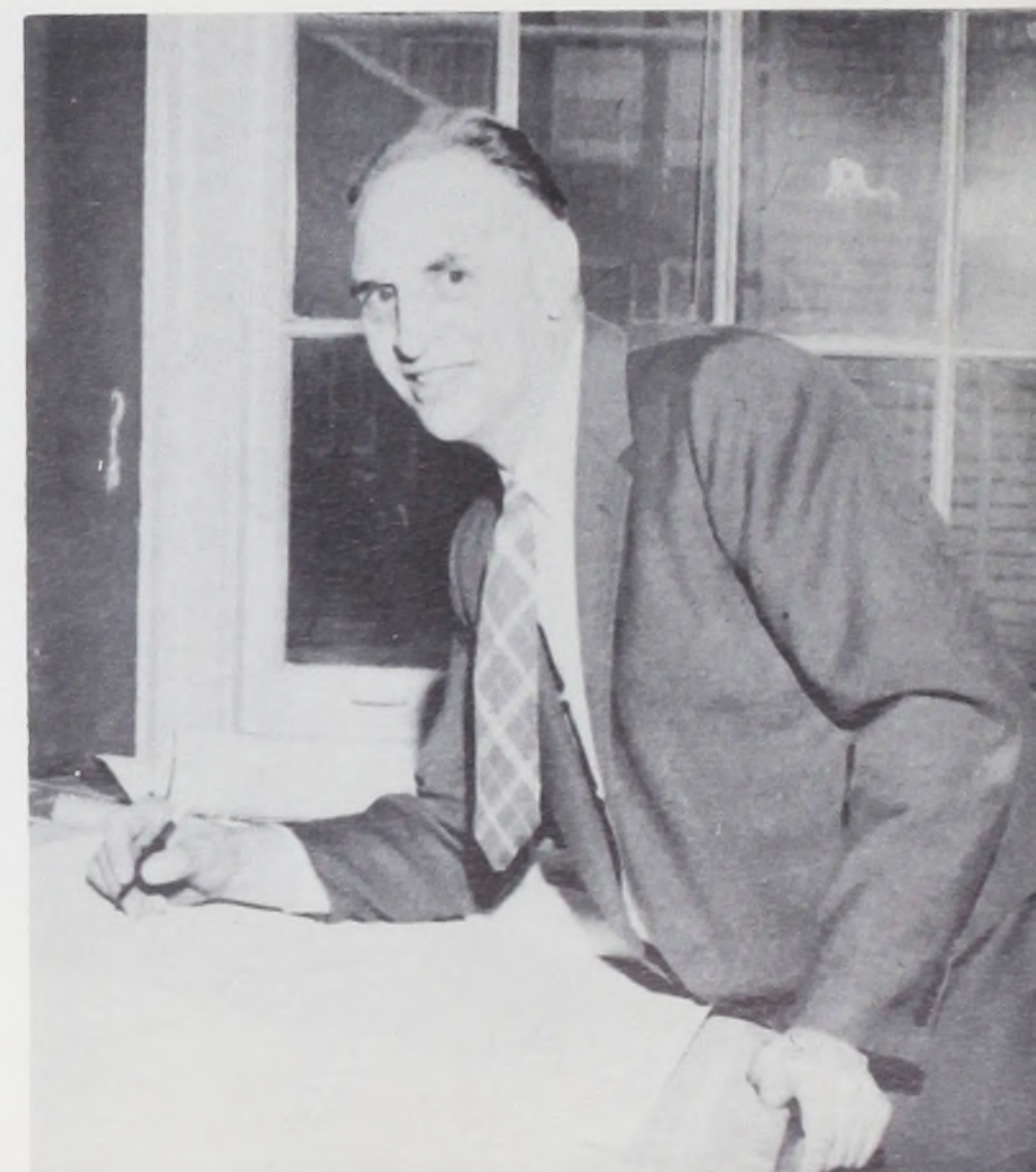

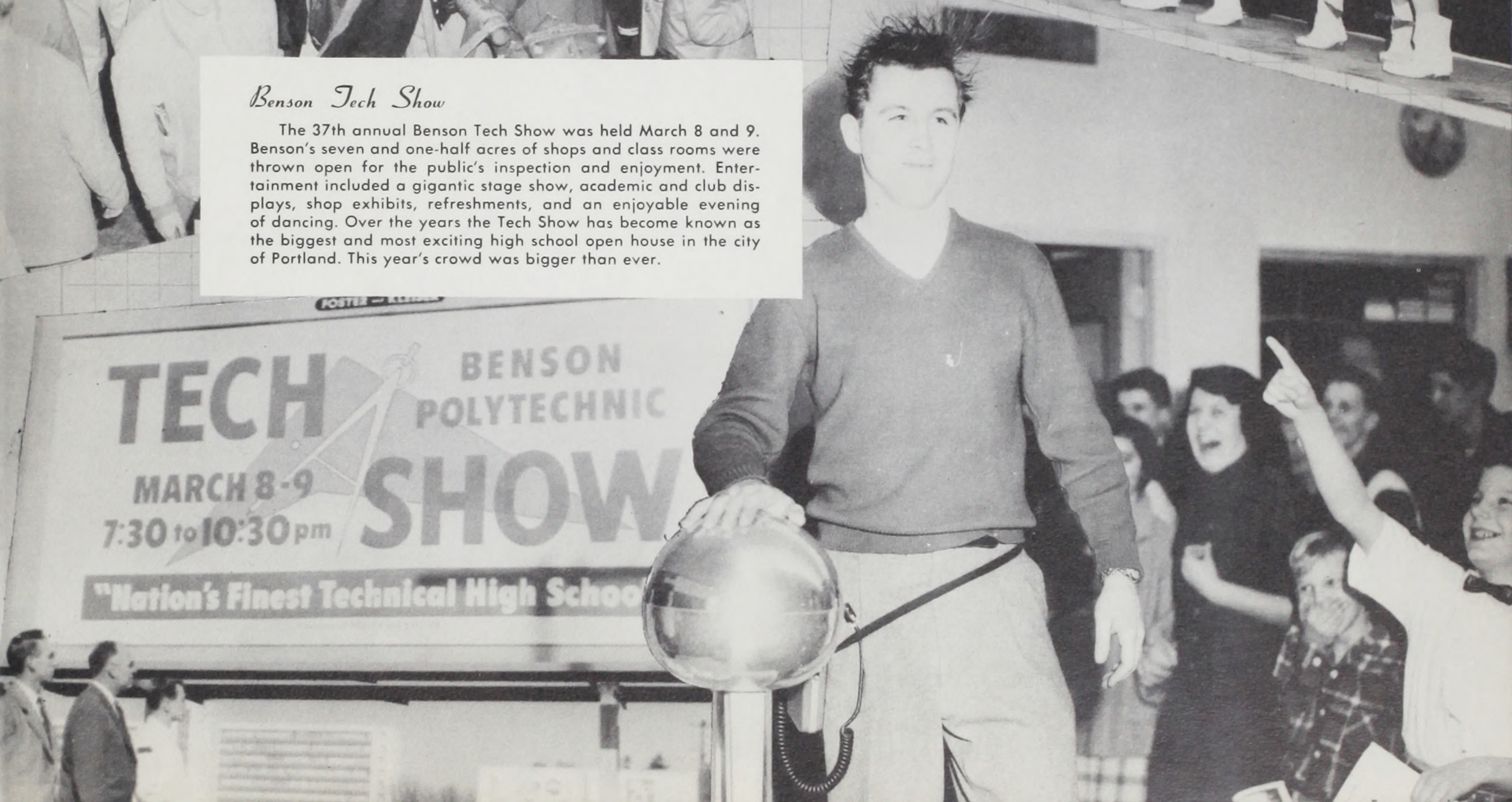






### *Benson Tech Show*

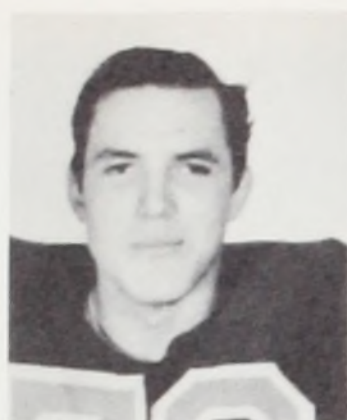
## *Tech Tips Grizzlies in Quarterfinals*

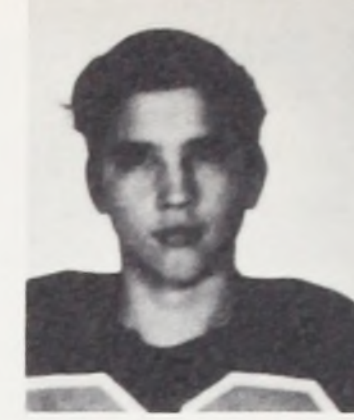

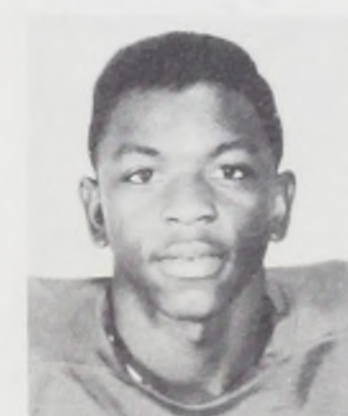

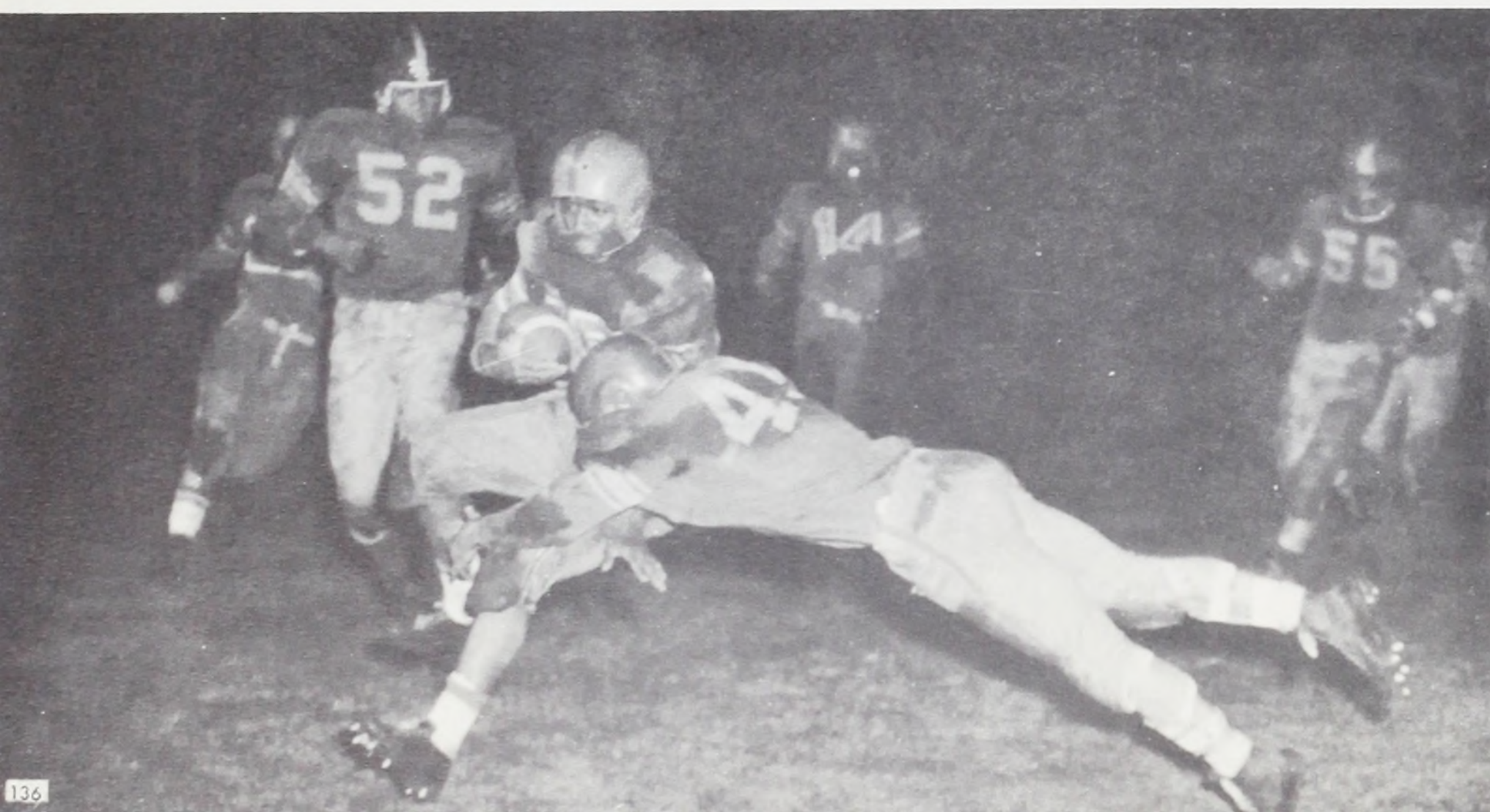


## *Benson Humbles Cleveland 25-14*

## ASST. COACH FLOYD SIMMONS

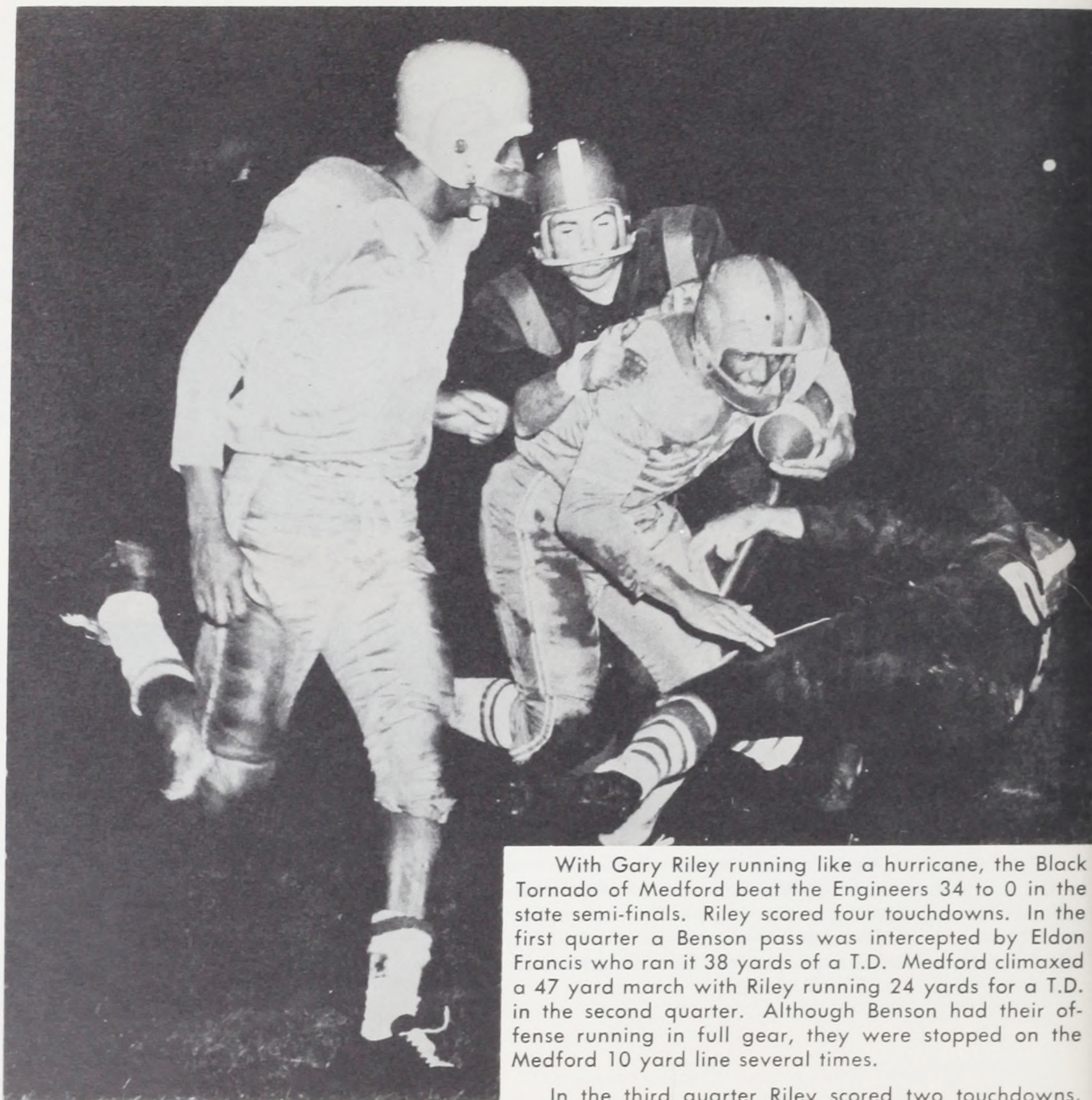

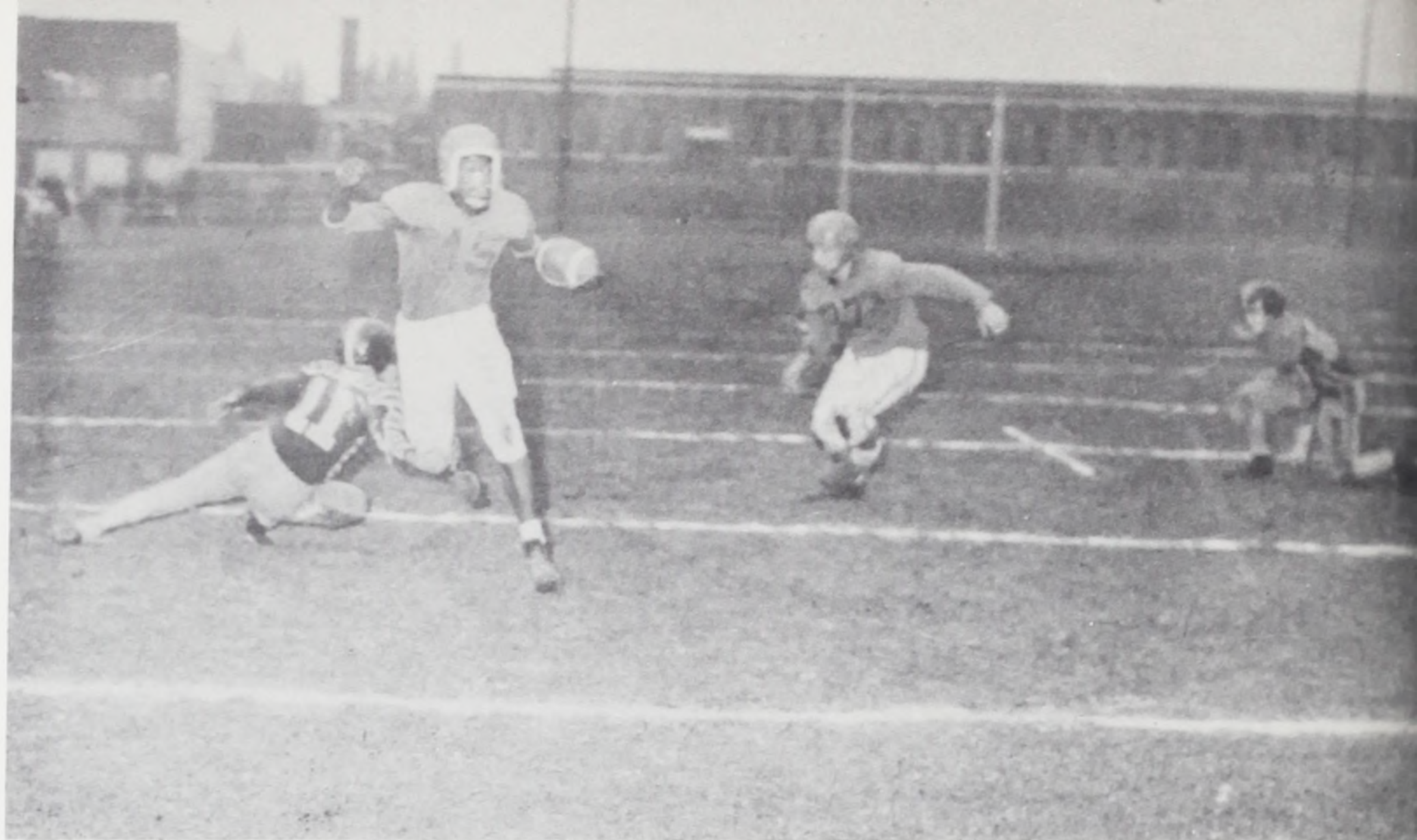




# J. V. Football

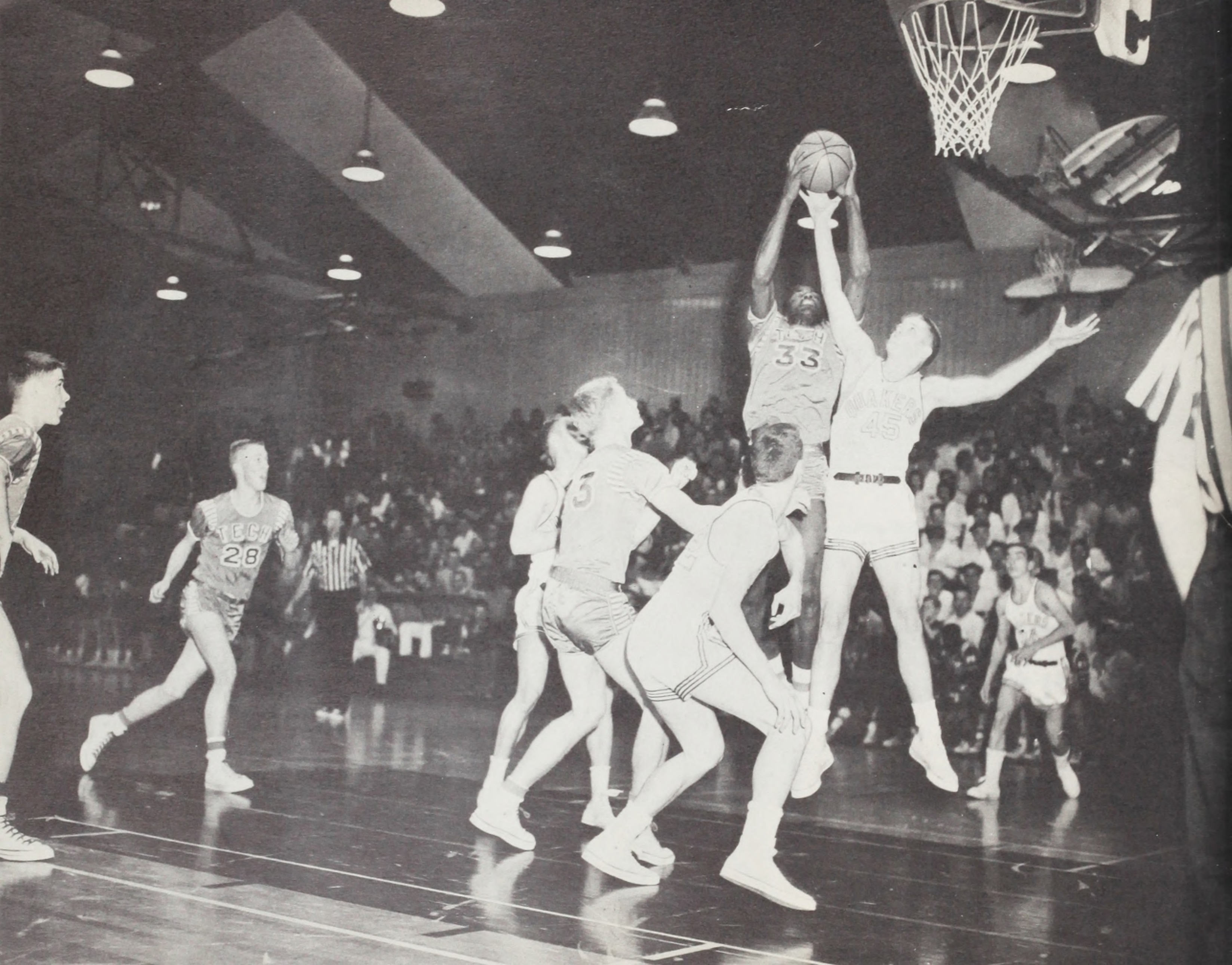

### *Varsity Basketball*

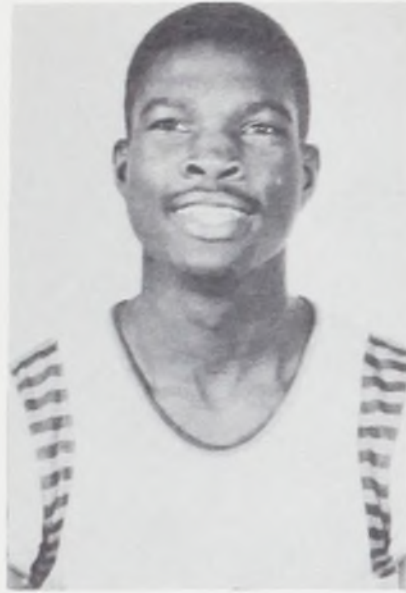

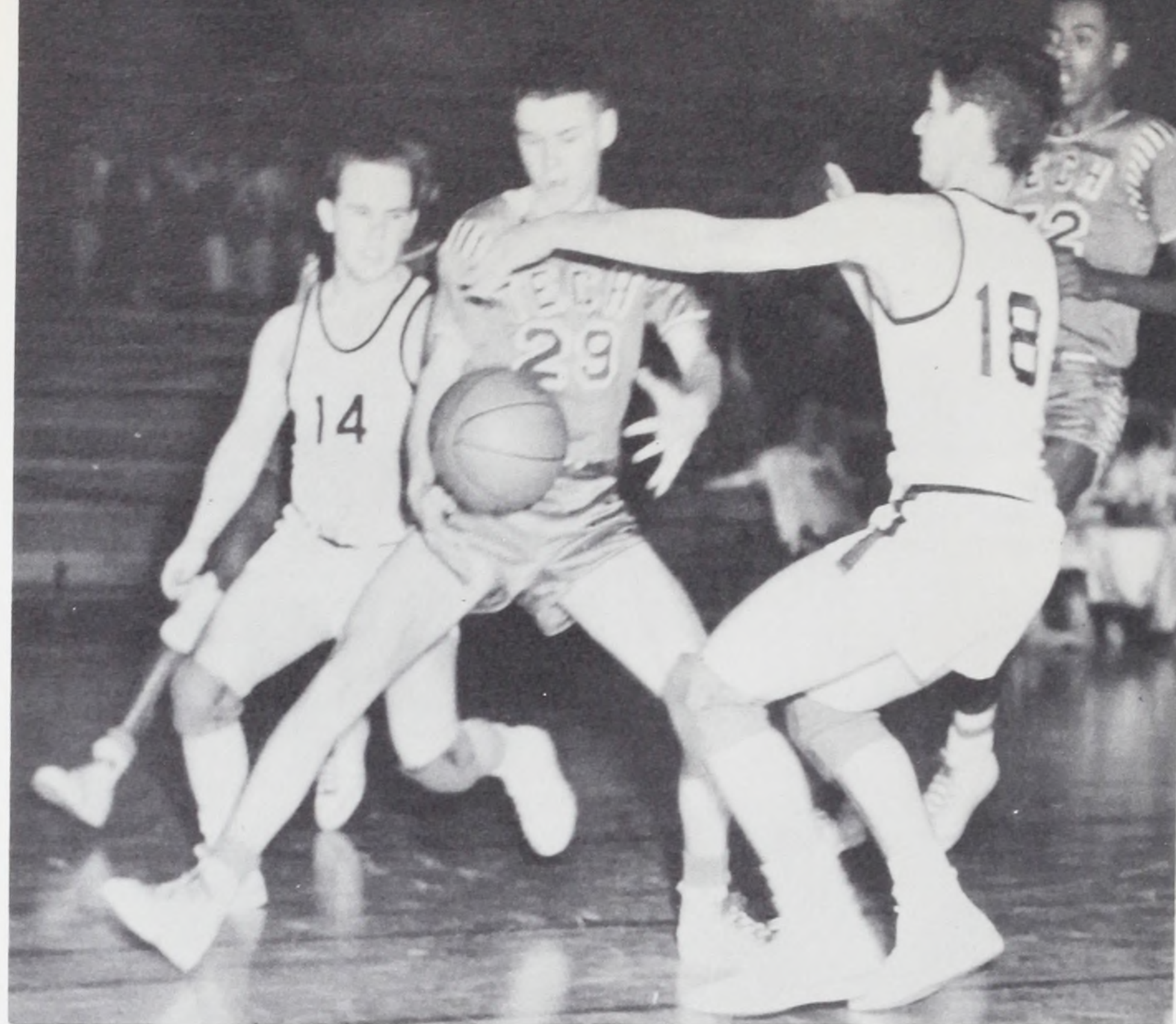

The game was very close through the entire first quarter. Washington jumped to a 3-0 lead, but Benson soon overtook the slim lead and didn't trail again. The first quarter ended with Benson leading 12-11.

The second quarter Coach Dick Gray turned his speedy five loose with a full court press. This press stunned the Washington offense, which resulted in three quick baskets to put the Tech Club further out in front. The second quarter ended with the score board reading 30-18.

Claude Pierce and Don Bridges, both canning 8 points each, were the big scorers in the third quarter. This gave the Engineers even a bigger margin as the final quarter started.

With Benson coasting along, Coach Dick Gray sent in the rest of his bench to see action. Benson with no trouble at all defeated the Colonials 58-41.

### *Triumphant Over Wilson*

Coach Dick Gray gave the entire Benson bench plenty

of action in their second straight league victory, by beating the Trojans of Wilson. Bruce Purdy had the honor of scoring the first three points ever scored in the new Wilson gym, in a P.I.L. game.

The Techmen were in command, 9-6 at the first quarter, 20-14 at halftime, and 35-25 going into the final period. Gray's first unit of Claude Pierce, Don Bridges, Chuck Patterson, Bullet Butler and Jim Warren saw their first action in the third period. ### *Democrats Lose By 20*

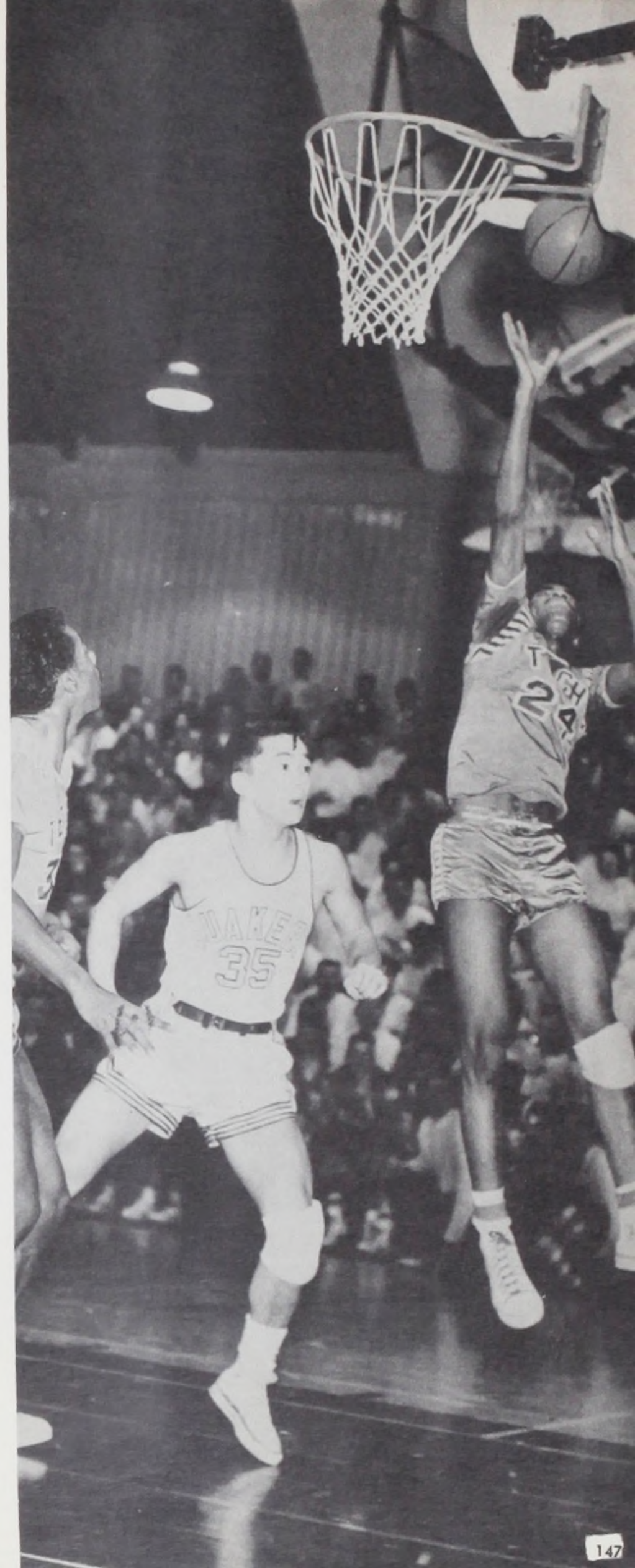
The Techman cagers rolled over the Democrats with ease as they topped them 52-32.

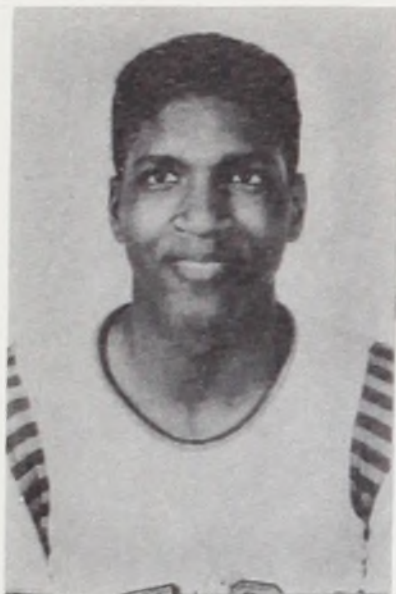
high scorer for the Colonials with 12 points.

### *Tech Wins 8th Game*

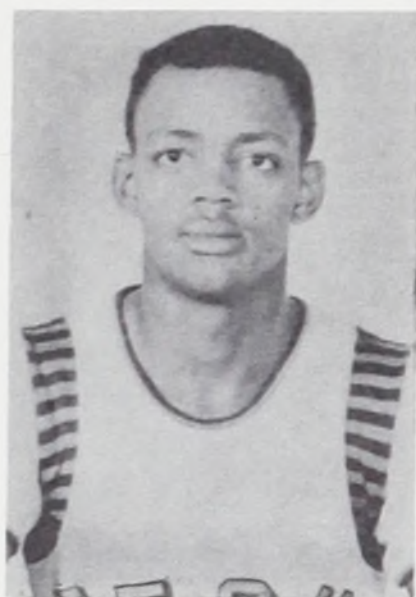

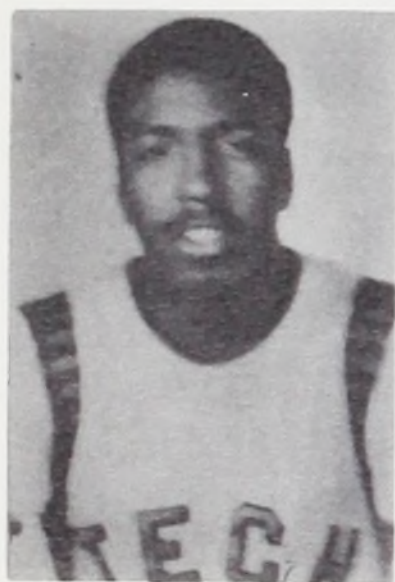

The game was close all the way, with Grant leading all the way. At halftime the Techmen built up a five point lead 24-19. In the third quarter Grant began to make the hemp smolder as swisher after swisher fell in. Grant went ahead 36-35.

In the fourth quarter Benson regained the lead 40-38, only to see it tied 40-40, Grant then went ahead never to fall behind again. High for the game and Benson were Patterson with 14, and Warren with 12.

### *Tech Loses To Cards*

With Lincoln holding the jinx on Benson, the Cardinals downed the Techmen 77-64.

The score was tied fifteen times, as both

teams fought evenly all the way. Lincoln's Pat Doherty broke the game wide open in the third quarter with his dead-eye shooting. The battle was fierce on boards as Lincoln's height was hard to match. The fouls hurt the Engineers as they committed 29 against 14 for Lincoln. Three Bensonites fouled out, with two of them starters. Bob Butler and Cecil Dillard had four fouls each in the first half.

No more than four points separated the two teams until Doherty started to connect. Don Bridges took scoring honors with 25. His fantastic shooting couldn't be stopped as he canned ten field goals. Cecil Dillard and Jim Warren had 15 and 13 points respectively. Ron Anderson was high for Lincoln with 21.

used 13 men for their second victory over the Quakers.

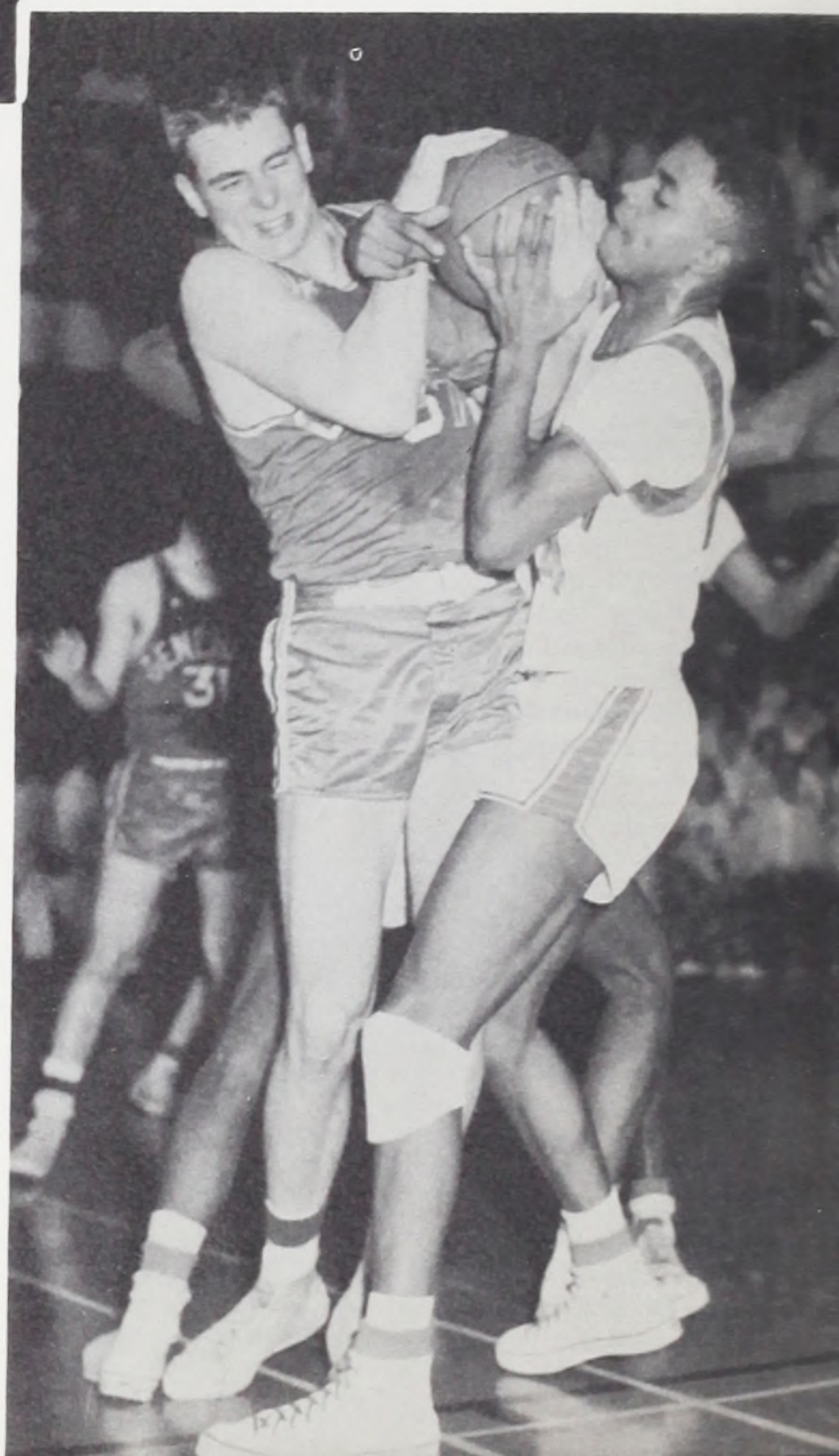
### *Demos Lose By 21*

Roosevelt kept the pressure on the Engineers during

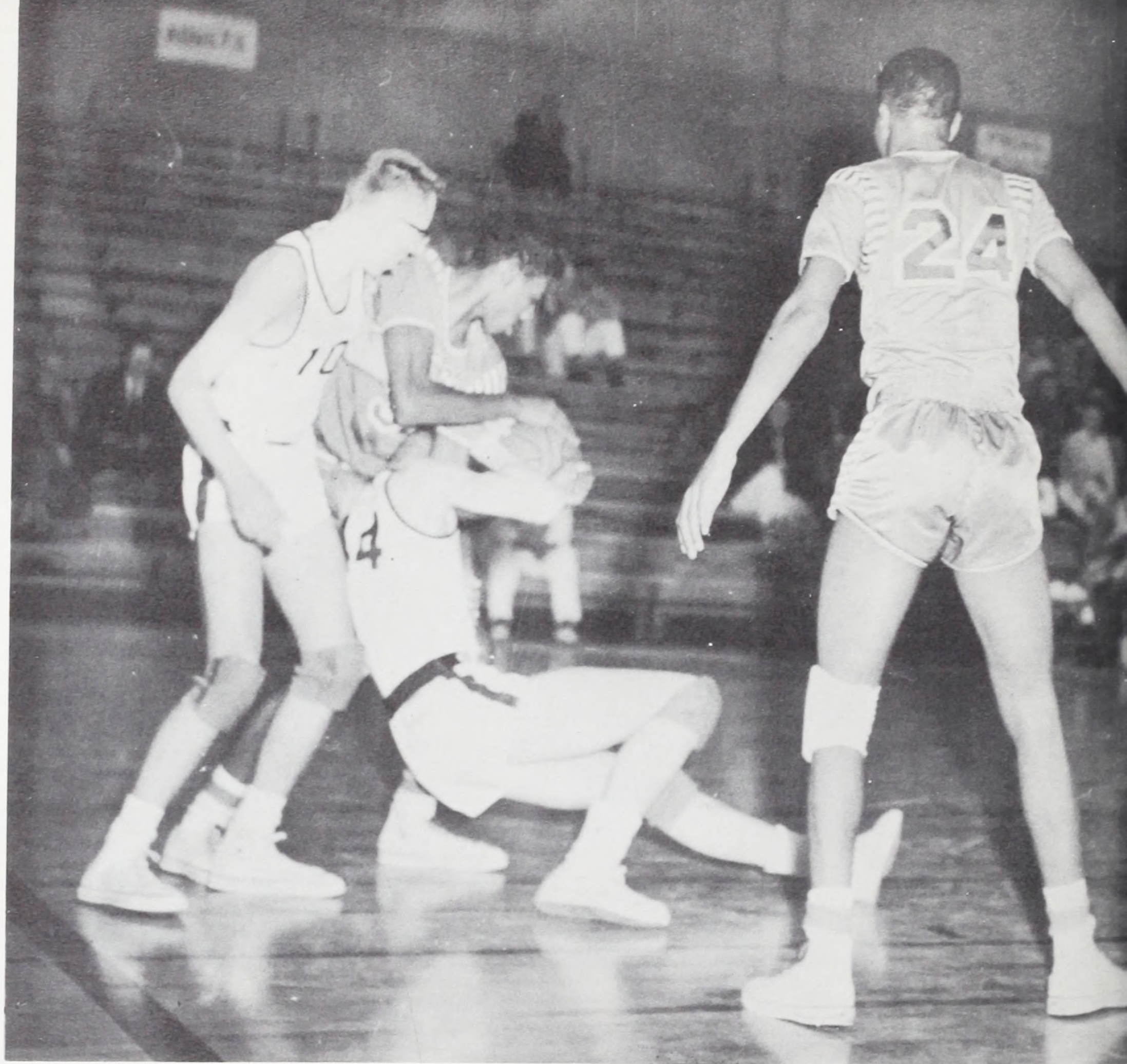
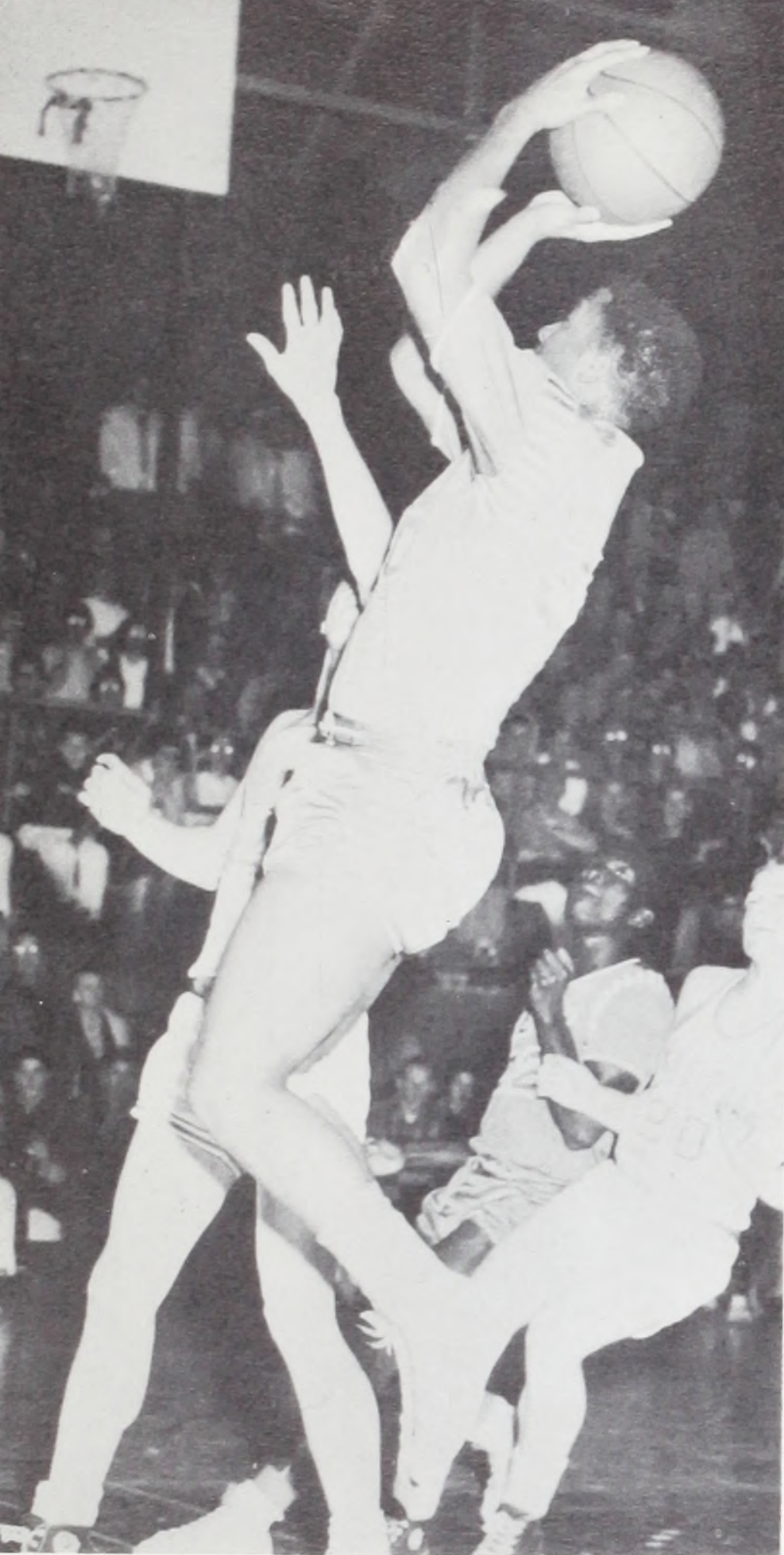

Claude Pierce, Bob Woodle, Don Bridges led Benson to an easy win over Marshfield 73-37.

The Engineers broke through Marshfield's ball control style for a 12-3 lead at the end of the first quarter. It was a matter of how big the final margin would be as the game progressed.

Benson's victory knocked Marshfield out of the tournament, short of a four game stay for the first time in the last ten years. In picking up a final .510 shooting mark from the field, the Engineers started with 11 out of 23 in the first half and closed with 14 out of 26 in the last half. Marshfield finished at .224 mark. They got 13 out of 58 as they suffered one of the worst beatings in its basketball history.

Roger Johnson in his final prep court appearance rolled through 12 points to top Marshfield scoring. Claude Pierce and Bob Woodle each finished with 18 points. Bridges followed close with 14 and was top rebounder for the game with 20. The Techmen easily out rebounded Marshfield 51-28.

Lincoln dominated the boards with its tall front line of Anderson, Laborde and Hindman as they coasted to a 61-46 win over the Engineers.

## *Tech Downs Pendleton*

Benson had it all its own way until the final buzzer. The Engineers were ahead by ten points or more throughout the contest, and at times by as much as 17.

Benson compiled a sizzling .396 (21 out of 53) shooting average from the floor instopping the Pendleton Bucks 57-48.

Pendleton also hit its share of shots as they hit 17 out of 56 for a .304 average.

Pierce and Bridges shared scoring laurels for the Techmen with 14 each. Warren was close with 11.

Gary Tague, Pendleton's one man team, took game honors as he netted five baskets in the final eight minutes and a game high of 25.

Pendleton was the only team in the tournament of the four teams that Benson played that kept up with the Techmen in rebounding, each team finished with 37.

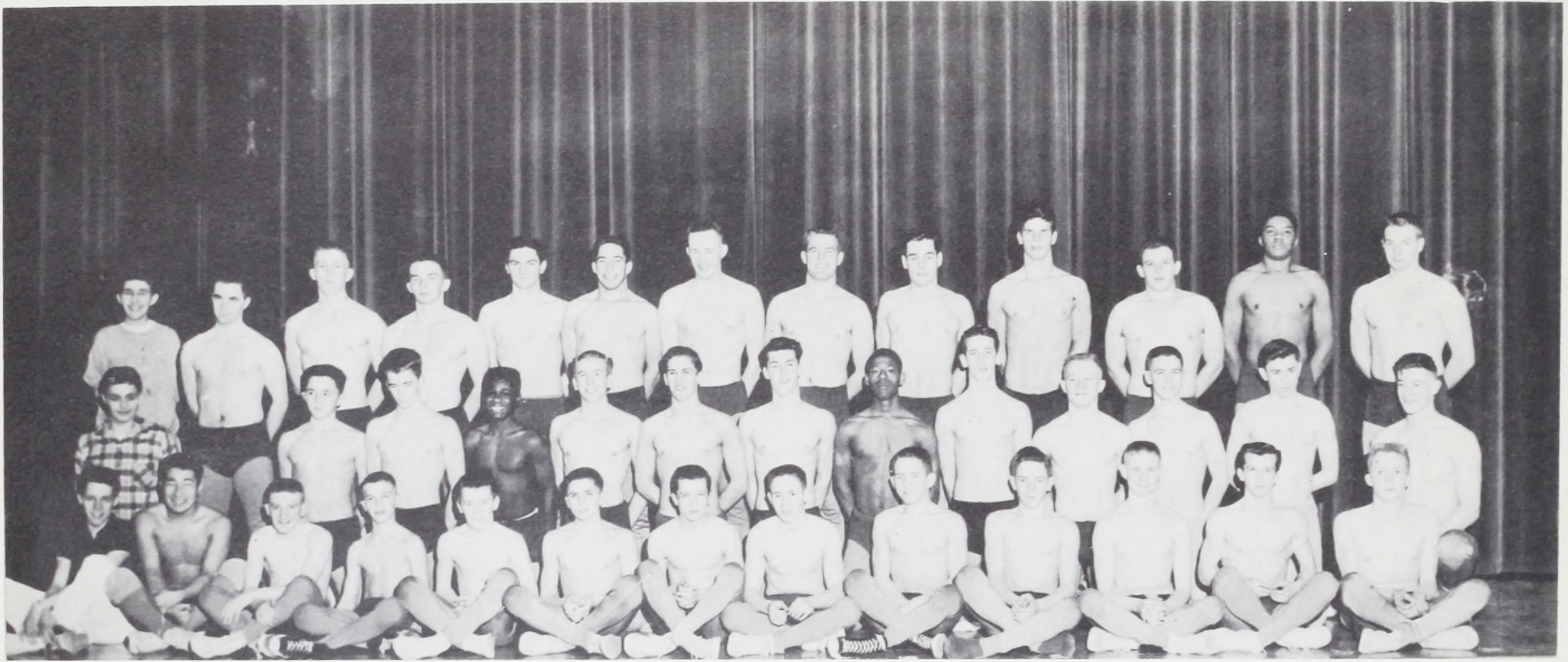

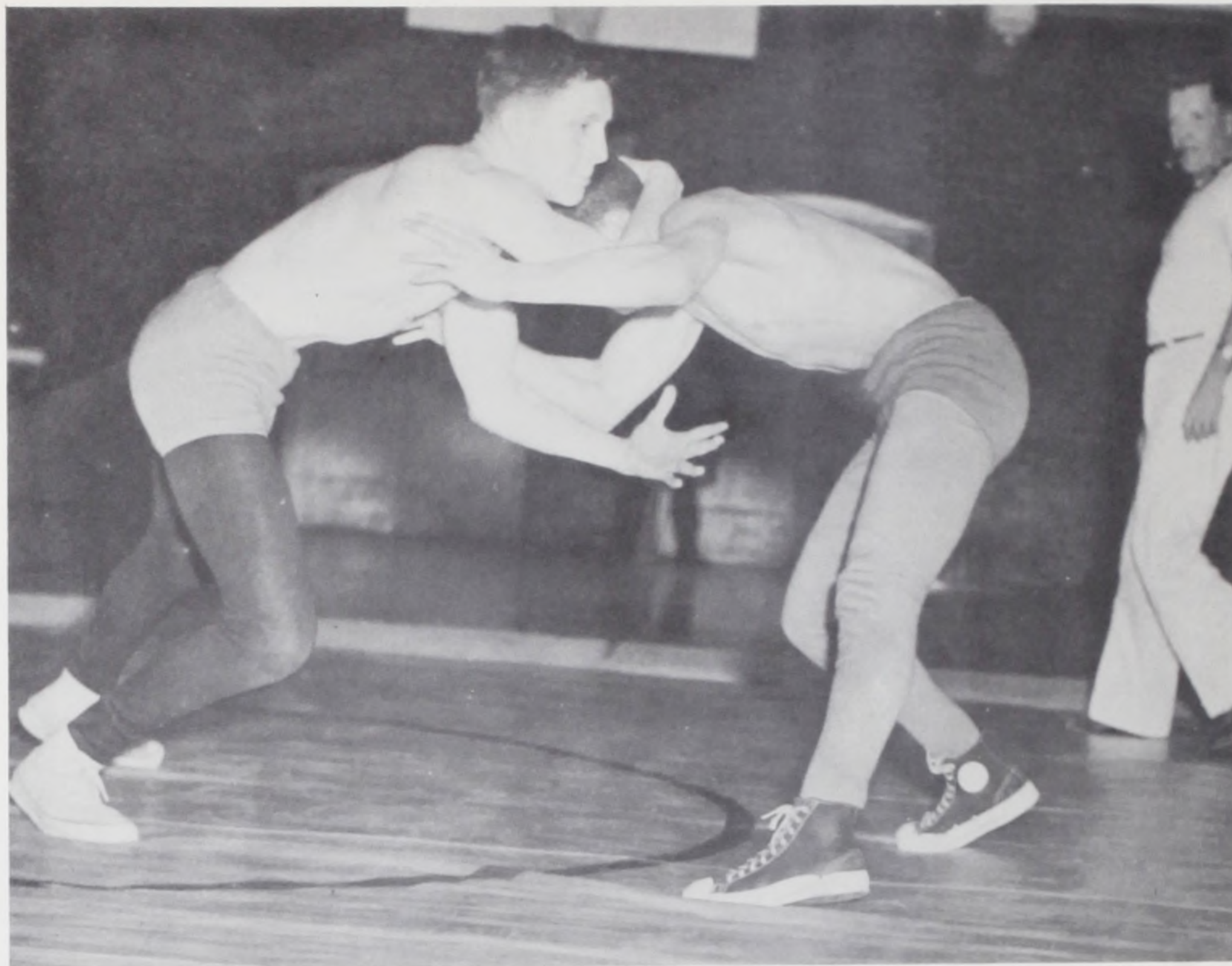


## *Coach Hryciw*

Coach Hryciw deserves a vote of thanks as he is a great asset to our school.



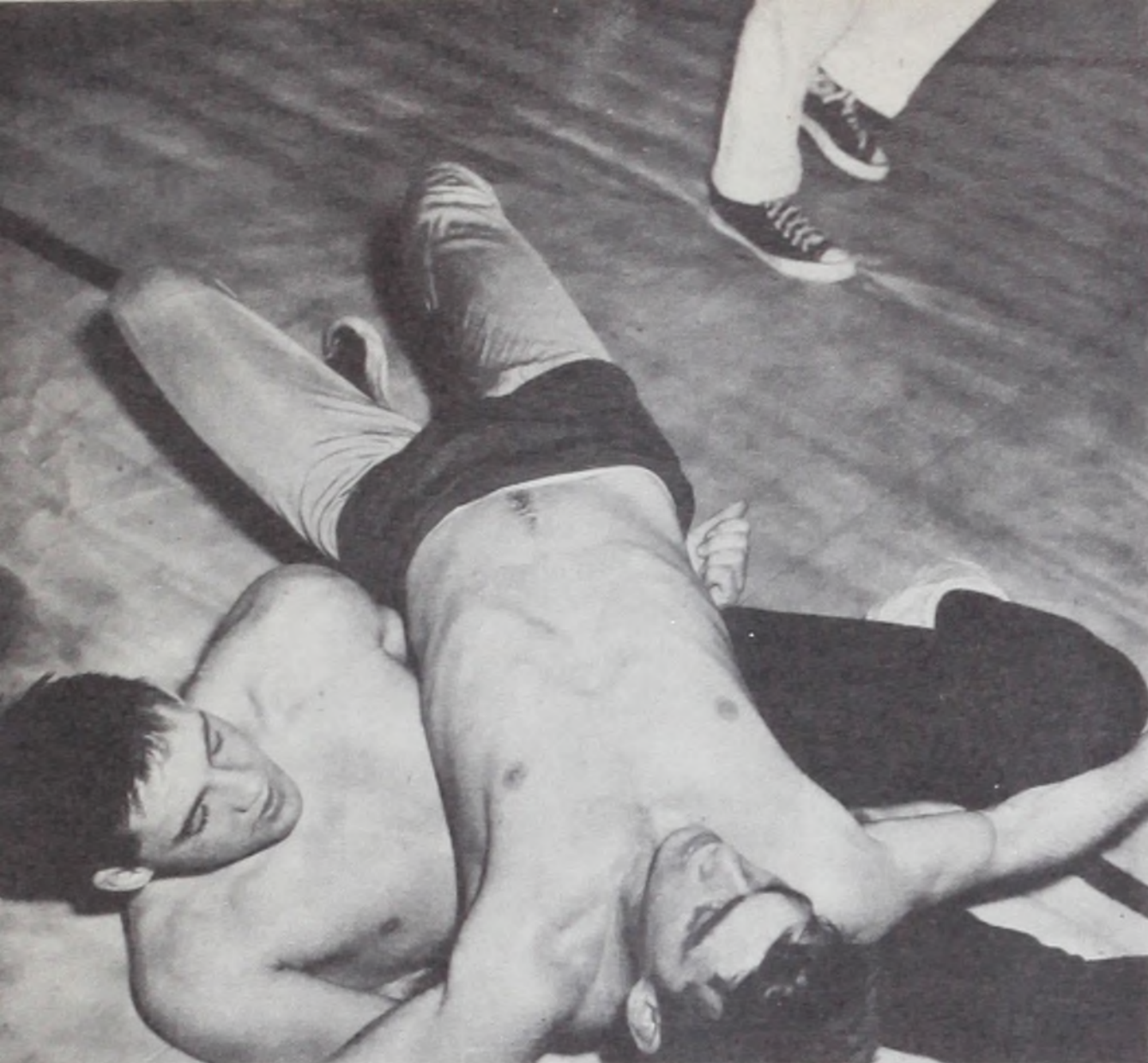
## *1957 Wrestling*

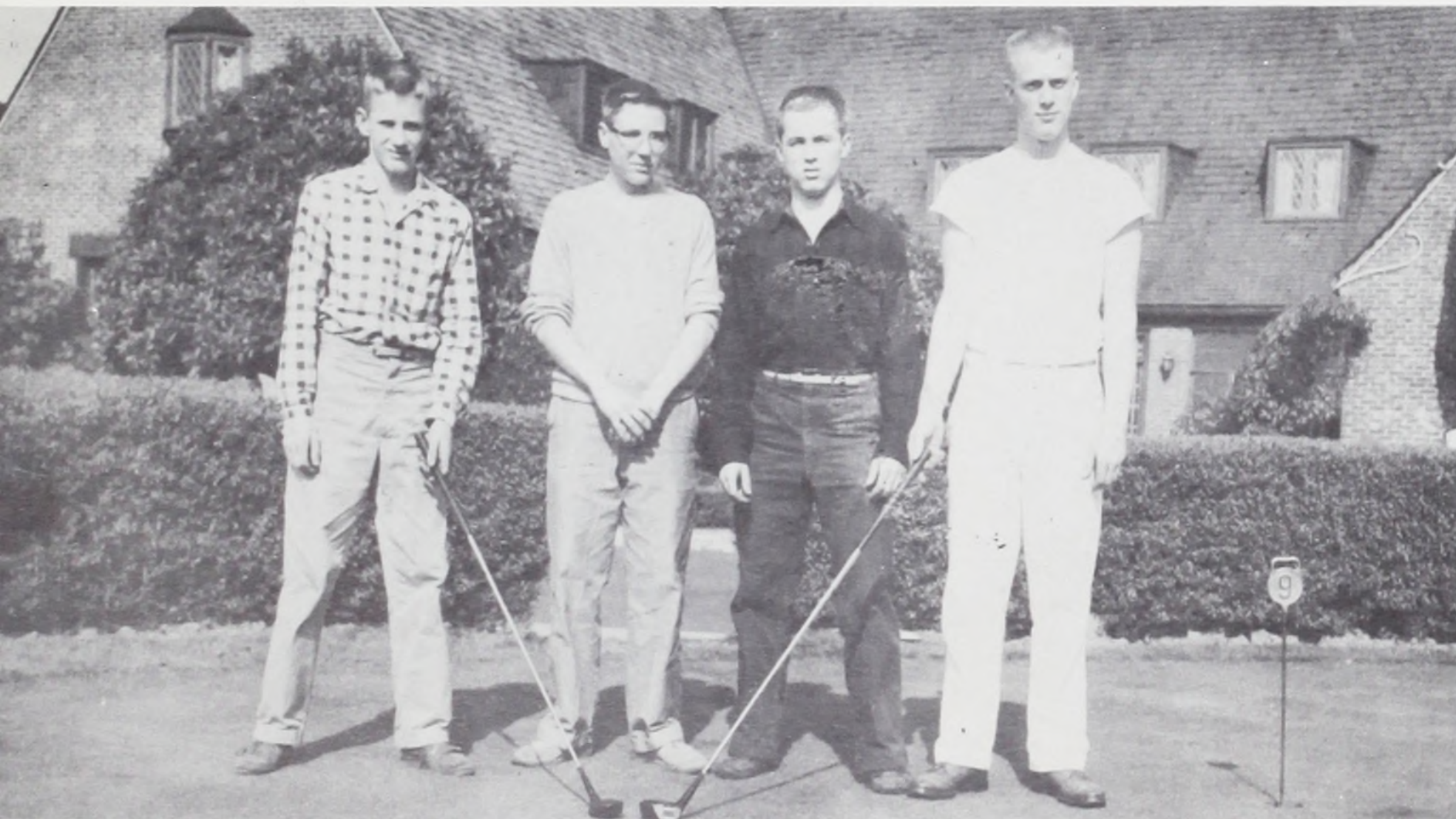


## *Tennis Team*

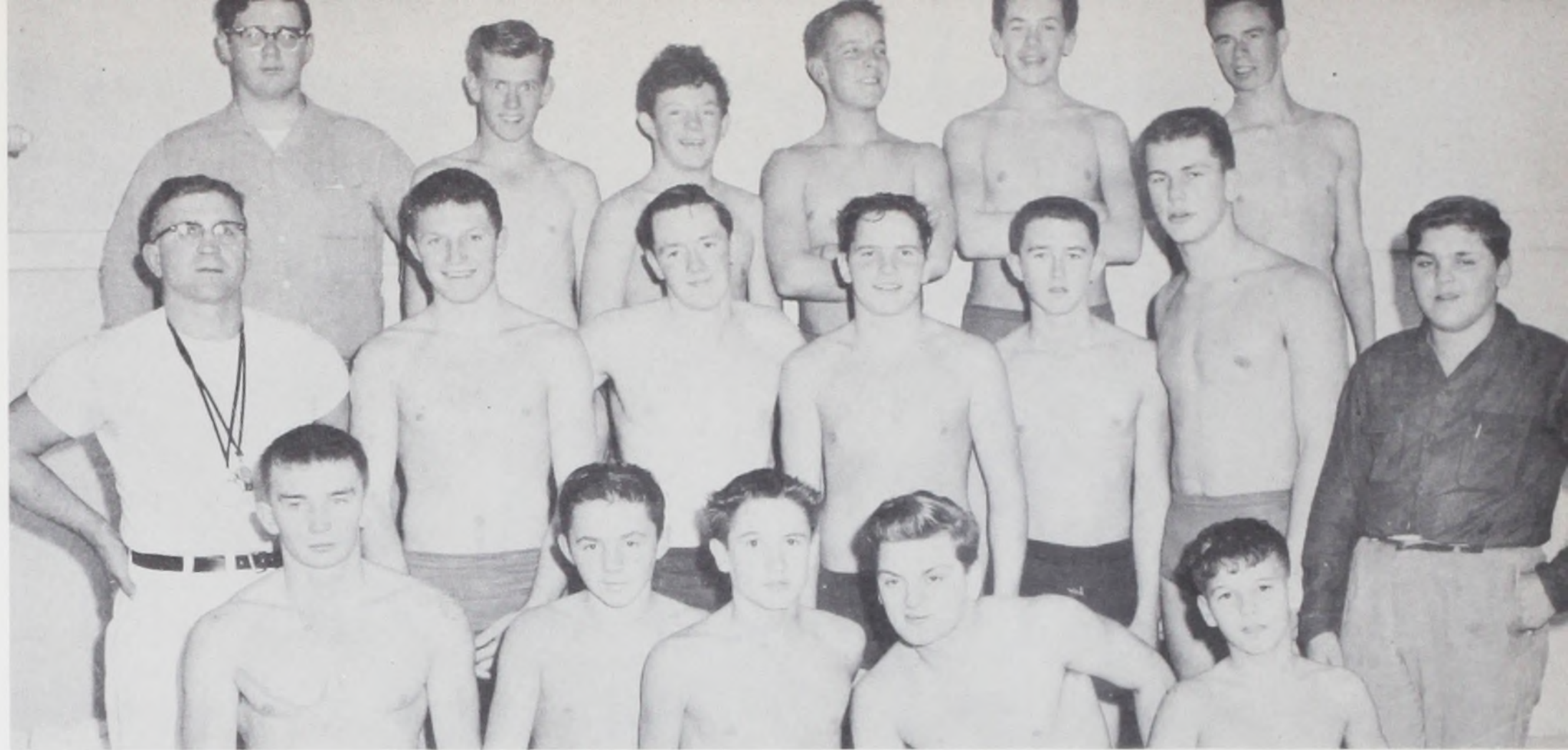

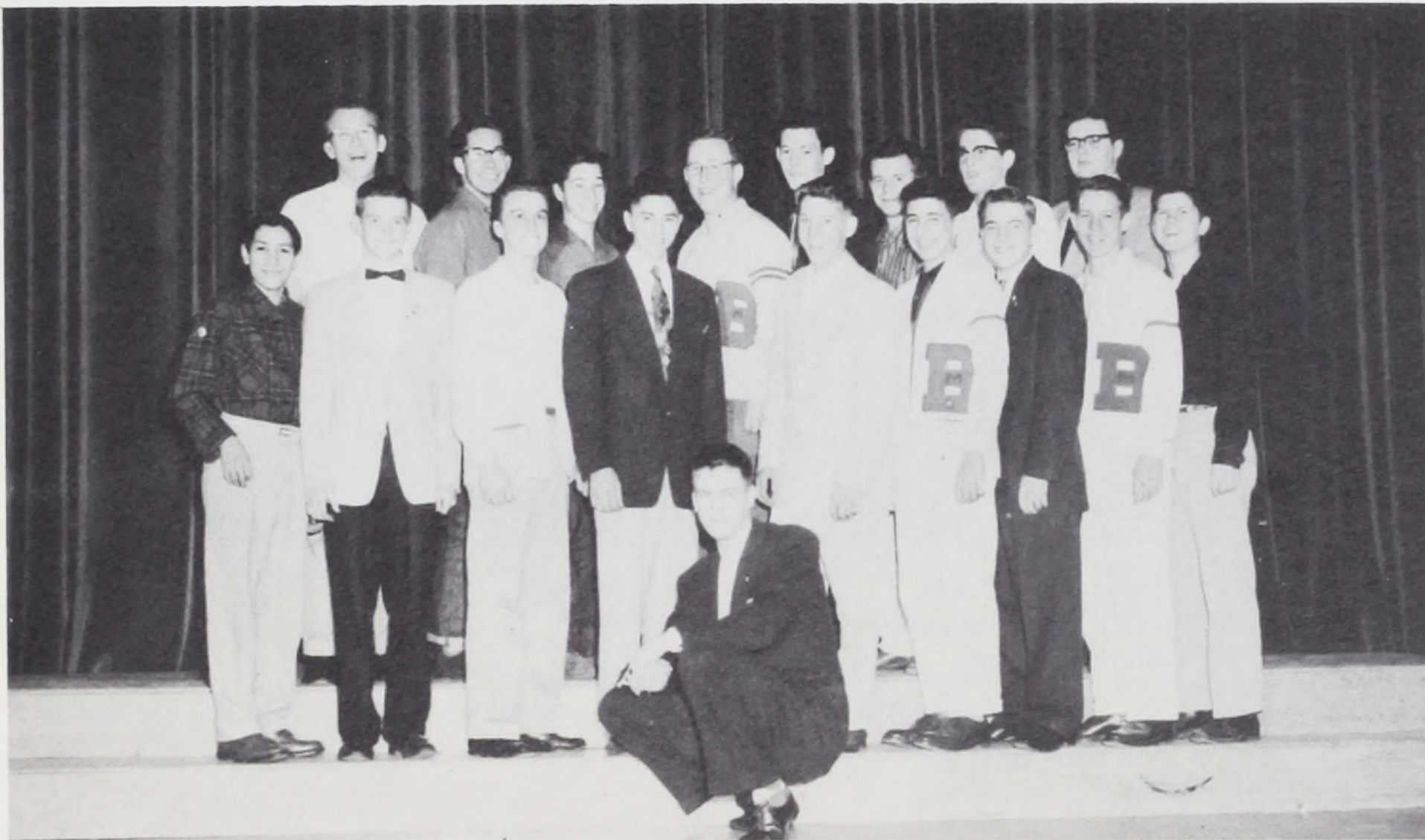

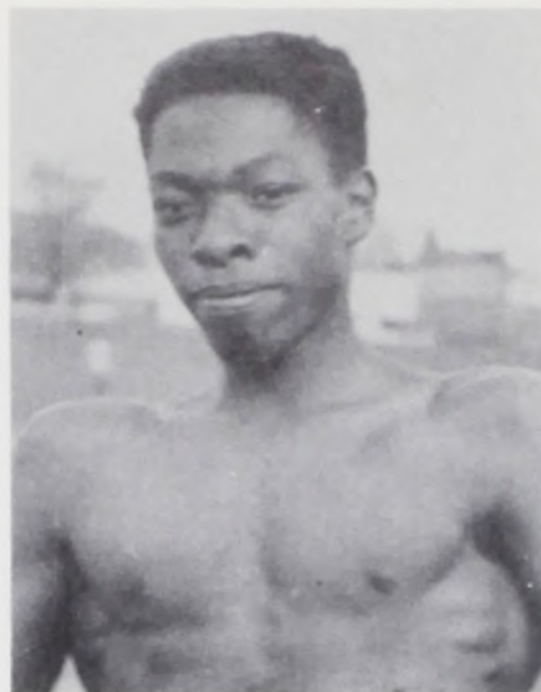


## Coach "Lefty" Marineau

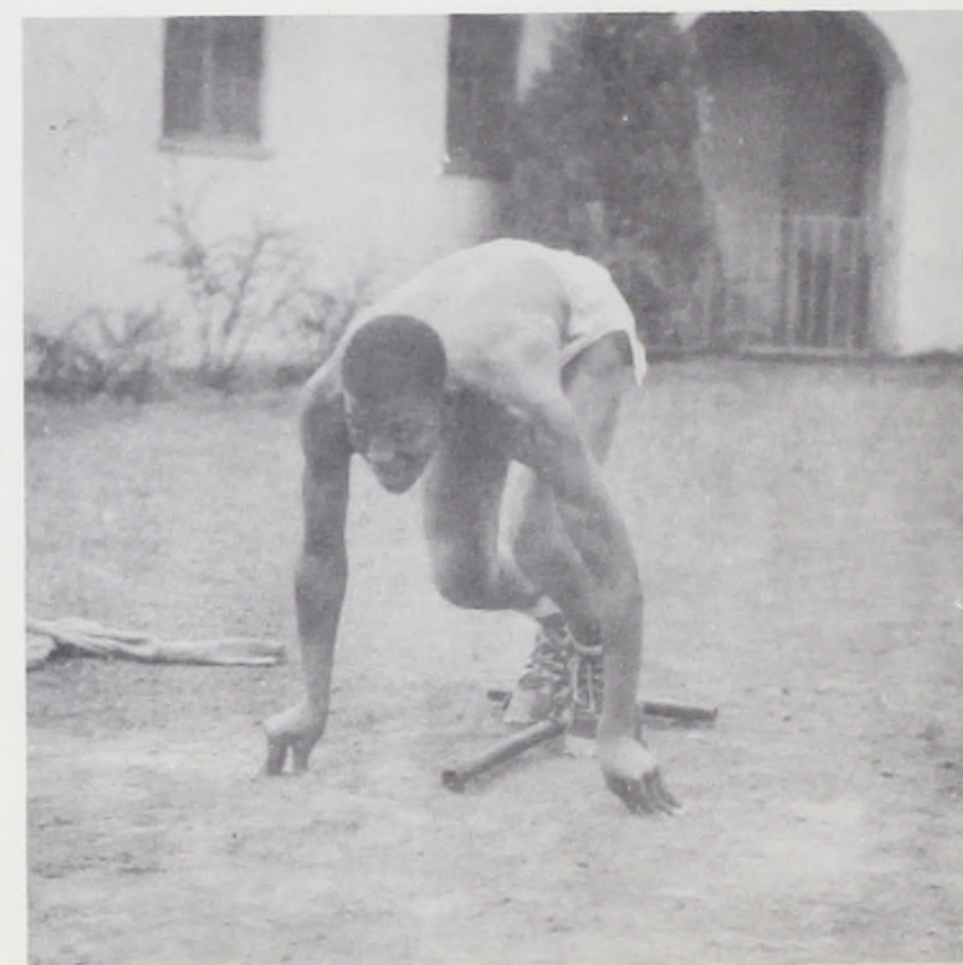
## *J. V. Track Team*

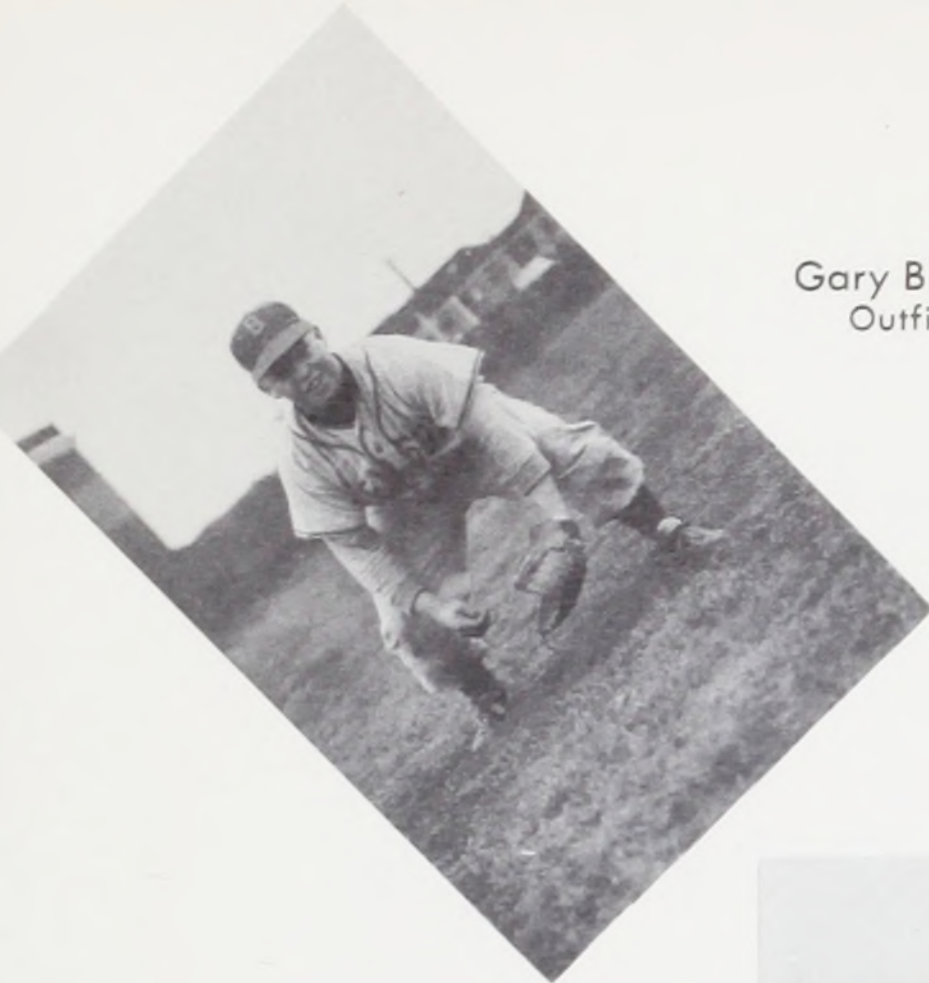


## *Mr. Donald Holt*
