





#### Mr. Benjamin J. Kuhns

Benjamin J. Kuhns was born near Forest Grove, Oregon. After completing his grammar-school education, he moved to Portland with his family in 1907. Here, he enrolled in the old Portland Trade School where he was a member of the Band and Baseball team. In 1911 he was graduated as a cabinet-maker in the first class to receive diplomas from the school.

From early boyhood, Mr. Kuhns had always been interested in working with wood, and summer vacations found him employed in local furniture factories, or building houses with an uncle, a contractor.

The year following graduation, he joined the Portland Trade School faculty as an apprentice teacher. With the exception of a year as a manual-training instruction at Mount Tabor School, he has been a member of the Benson Faculty throughout his entire teaching career.

On June 10, 1918, he enlisted in the Navy where he served about two-and one-half years, being discharged with rating of Carp. Mate 1st. cl.


In his 44 years of teaching, many thousands of students have passed through Mr. Kuhns' classes, and he seldom fails to recognize each one and call him by name.

Mr. Kuhns married a Benson English teacher, Lucille Atchison, in 1922. They have one son, David, who was graduated from Benson in 1945. Two young grandchildren promise to keep life from becoming too boring.

Retirement plans include more time for a gardening hobby as well as frequent visits to "Kuhns' Nest," the summer cottage at Neskowin Beach. (Note: It is only a stone's-throw from a beautiful golf course!)


# KBPS Staff


















#### Sweetheart's Ball




#### Jech Jips Grizzles in Quarterfinals






#### Benson Victoreous in Jamboree 13-7




In 1946 he won a football scholarship to Notre Dame. After three years of varsity football and track he graduated with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Physical Education.

Jornadoes Blow Jechmen Over









Varsity Basketball



With Benson coasting along, Coach Dick Gray sent in the rest of his bench to see action. Benson with no trouble at all defeated the Colonials 58-41.

#### Triumphant Over Wilson

Coach Dick Gray gave the entire Benson bench plenty

of action in their second straight league victory, by beating the Trojans of Wilson. Bruce Purdy had the honor of scoring the first three points ever scored in the new Wilson gym, in a P.I.L. game.

The Techmen were in command, 9-6 at the first quarter, 20-14 at halftime, and 35-25 going into the final period. Gray's first unit of Claude Pierce, Don Bridges, Chuck Patterson, Bullet Butler and Jim Warren saw their first action in the third period. After the Trojans had come within three points, 26-23, the Engineers pulled away to their 35-25 third period spread. #### Grant Loses

Benson, showing improvement in every game played, scored a 56-48 victory over the Generals from Grant. Grant was only able to stay with Benson through the first quarter. Coach Dick Gray's defense stiffened as the Techmen pulled away to a 30-21 halftime lead.

On a 2½ minute stretch during the first half Grant couldn't get the ball over the center line because of Benson's tight defense. The Engineers, trailing by 6-5, soon reversed the

In the first quarter the Engineers pushed up a 24-14 lead and the rest of the way was easy. The Quakers, missing their center Jensen and guard Hutton, were not much of a battle for the Techmen.

The Techman cagers rolled over the Democrats with ease as they topped them 52-32.







#### Jech Downs Cleveland

In the Cleveland game, Benson's Coach Dick Gray used his first and second strings in alternate quarters. His first five sent the Engineers into a 26-13 lead in the opening quarter, but in the second period the Indians managed to trim the margin and trailed, 39-32, at halftime.

With the first five back in action the third quarter the Techmen left little doubt about the outcome as they rolled up a 59-37 advantage.

Chuck Patterson and Jim Warren were the major cogs for the Benson cagers, as the Techmen hit the 78 point mark, high of the season for the second time in the campaign. Patterson, working the boards, was "Mr. Inside," and Warren was "Mr. Outside." Patterson was the game's high scorer with 17 and Warren of Benson and Jones of Cleveland were tied with 16 each as the Techmen won 78-51.

#### Colonials Lose By 31








Benson 15-6 and the score to 51-32.

With Lincoln holding the jinx on Benson, the Cardinals downed the Techmen 77-64.

The score was tied fifteen times, as both





Benson took over third place undisputed, and shoved the Democrats to fourth by beating them 63-44.

Roosevelt kept the pressure on the Engineers during



The Engineers broke through Marshfield's ball control style for a 12-3 lead at the end of the first quarter. It was a matter of how big the final margin would be as the game progressed.

Benson's victory knocked Marshfield out of the tournament, short of a four game stay for the first time in the last ten years. In picking up a final .510 shooting mark from the field, the Engineers started with 11 out of 23 in the first half and closed with 14 out of 26 in the last half. Marshfield finished at .224 mark. They got 13 out of 58 as they suffered one of the worst beatings in its basketball history.

Benson had it all its own way until the final buzzer. The Engineers were ahead by ten points or more throughout the contest, and at times by as much as 17.


Benson compiled a sizzling .396 (21 out of 53) shooting average from the floor instopping the Pendleton Bucks 57-48.




## Coach Hryciw

Coach Hryciw deserves a vote of thanks as he is a great asset to our school.




## 1957 Wrestling






## Coach "Lefty" Marineau
