DR. WILLIAM A. PEARL

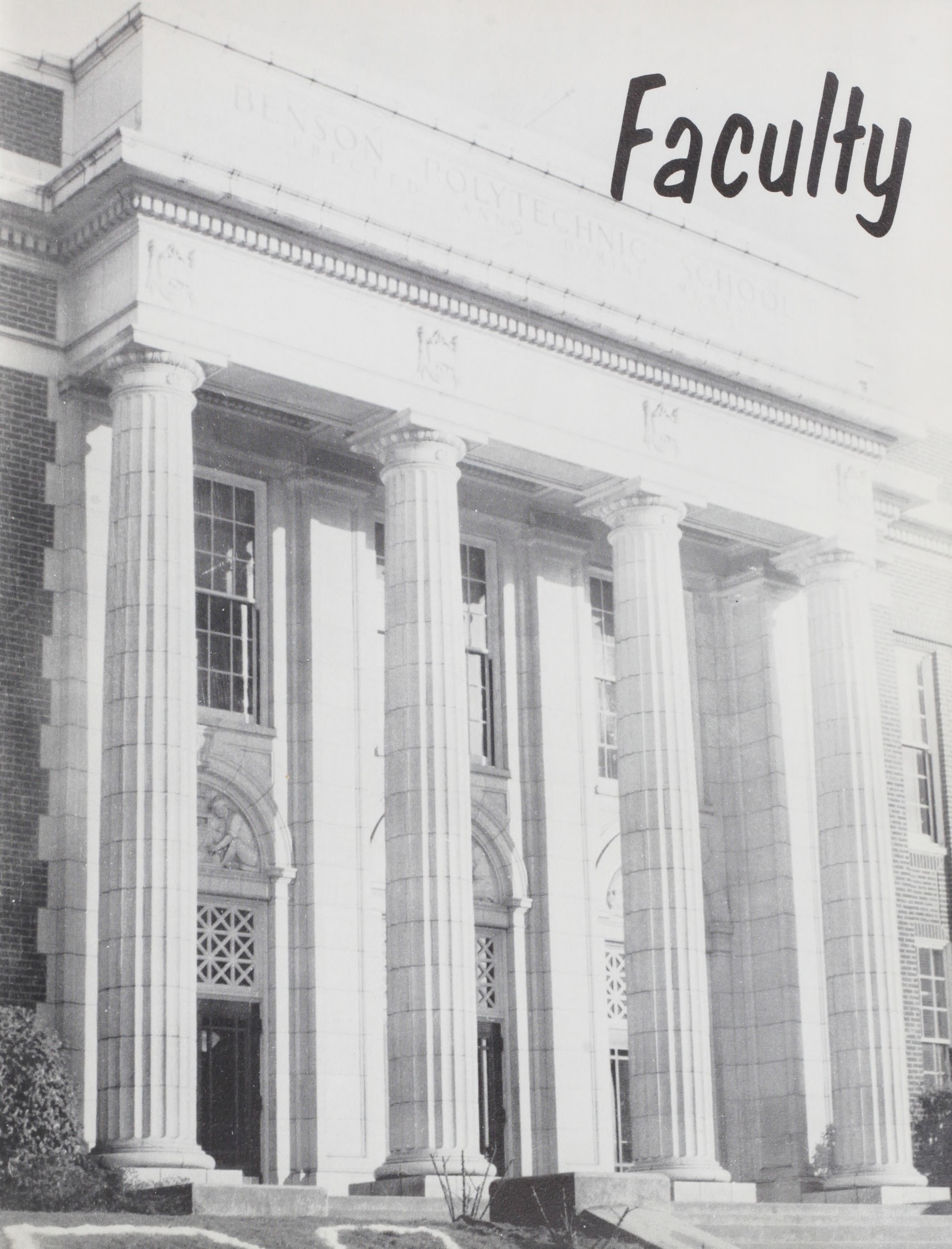
The staff of the 1960 Blueprint joins the students of Benson Polytechnic School in saluting one of the Northwest's most prominent men, Dr. William A. Pearl, Administrator of the Bonneville Power Administration.

Early in his career, Dr. Pearl served as Foreman of the Benson Automotive and Aviation shops. He left Benson to join the teaching staff at the Illinois Institute of Technology. Dr. Pearl was simultaneously Vice President of the Whiting Corporation in Chicago and a staff member of the Armour Research Foundation until 1945. In 1946 he returned to the Northwest to become Director of the Washington State Institute of Technology. Five years later he became acting president of the State College of Washington, his alma mater. Six years ago, in January of 1954, Dr. William A. Pearl was appointed Administrator of the Bonneville Power Administration.

Dr. Pearl is active in the Westminster Presbyterian Church, member of Masonic Lodge, American Society of Mechanical Engineers and holds memberships in seven fraternities. He is also a registered engineer in both Oregon and Illinois.

Our school is honored to have this association with a man of Dr. Pearl's fine reputation and distinction in the engineering field.

He then became a major in physics at the University of Oregon.

Mr. Shotwell has been teaching electrical engineering at Portland State since 1946 and plans to continue after retiring from Benson. He also does free lance work in translation of Russian science material.

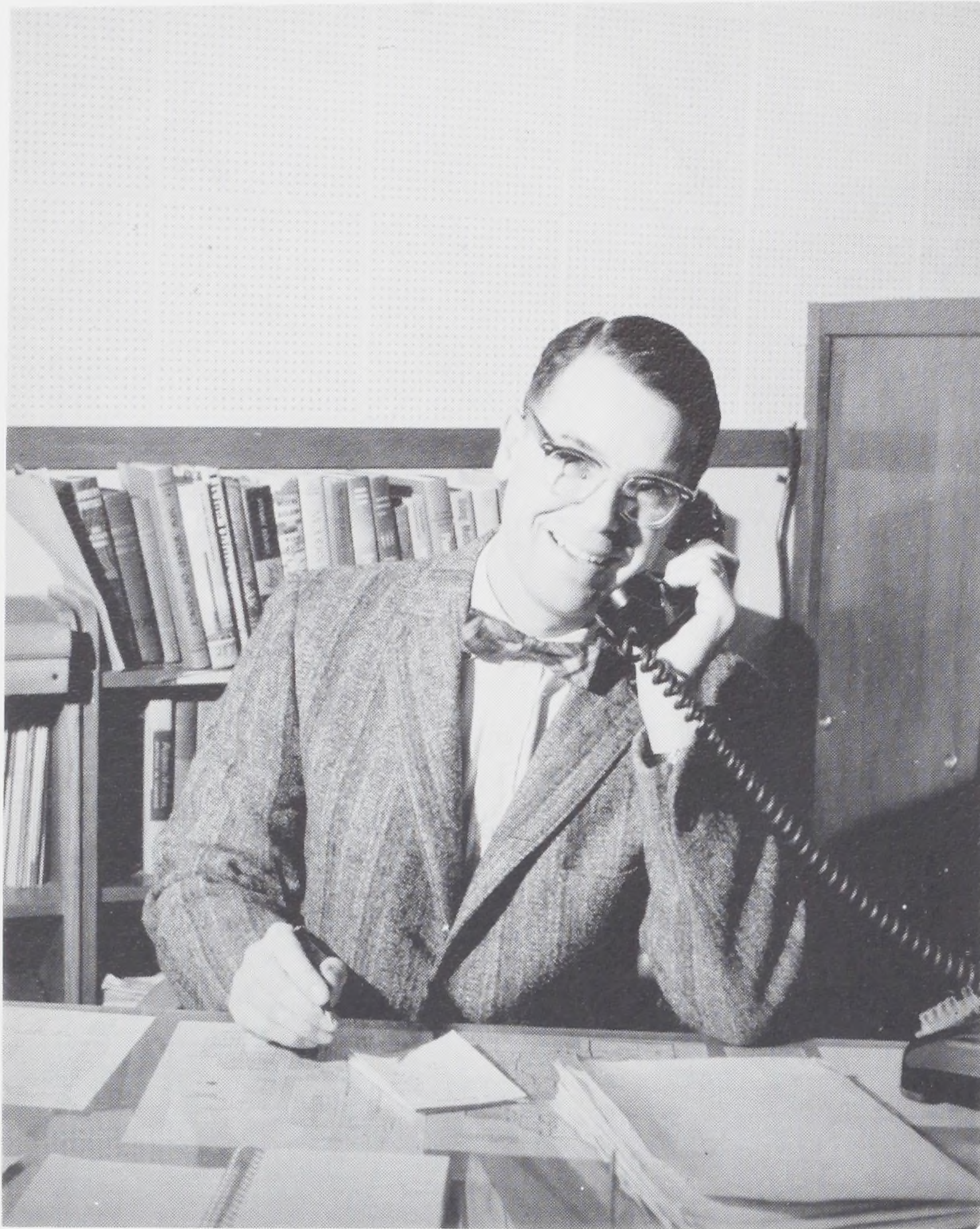
Mr. Chester A. Klink is another retiring teacher this year. He has been on the Benson faculty since September, 1925. Mr. Klink teaches mechanical drawing.

State Math Champs

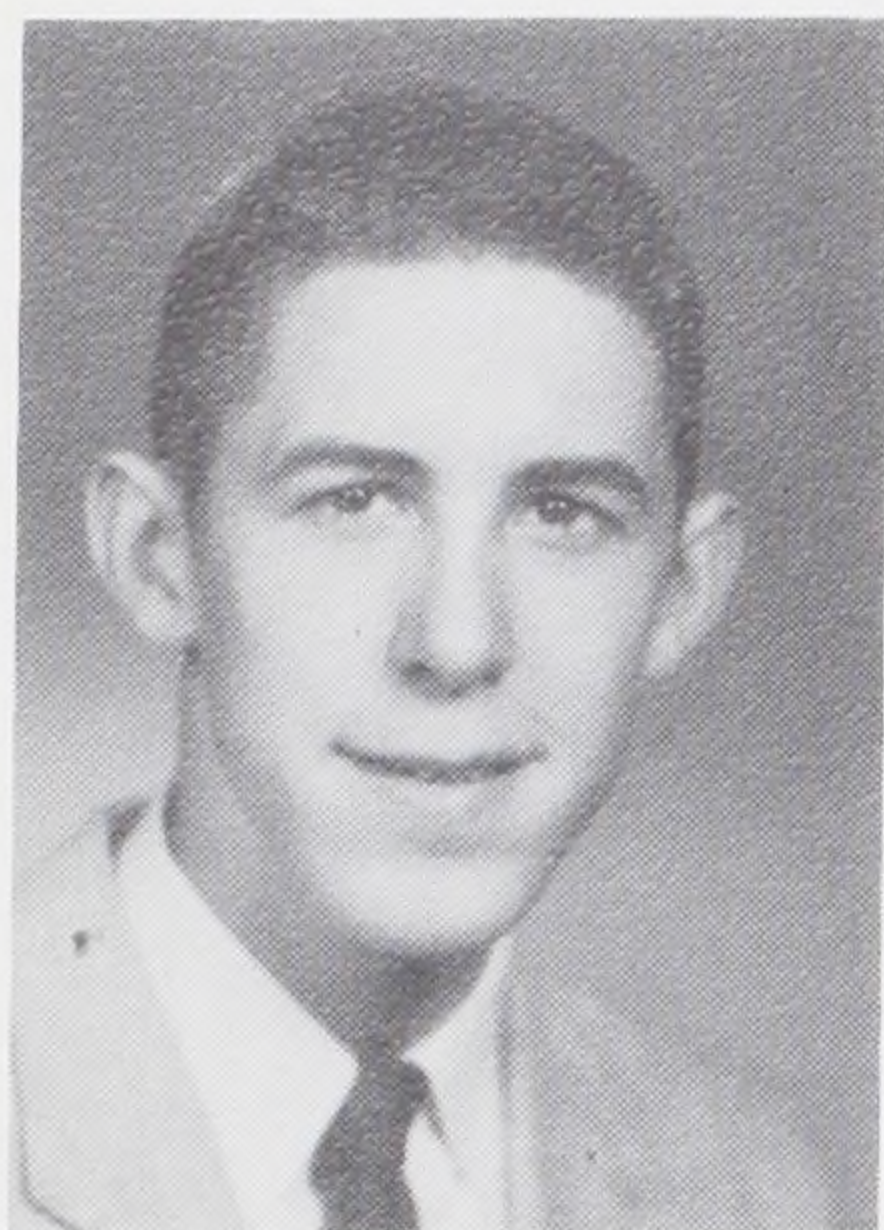

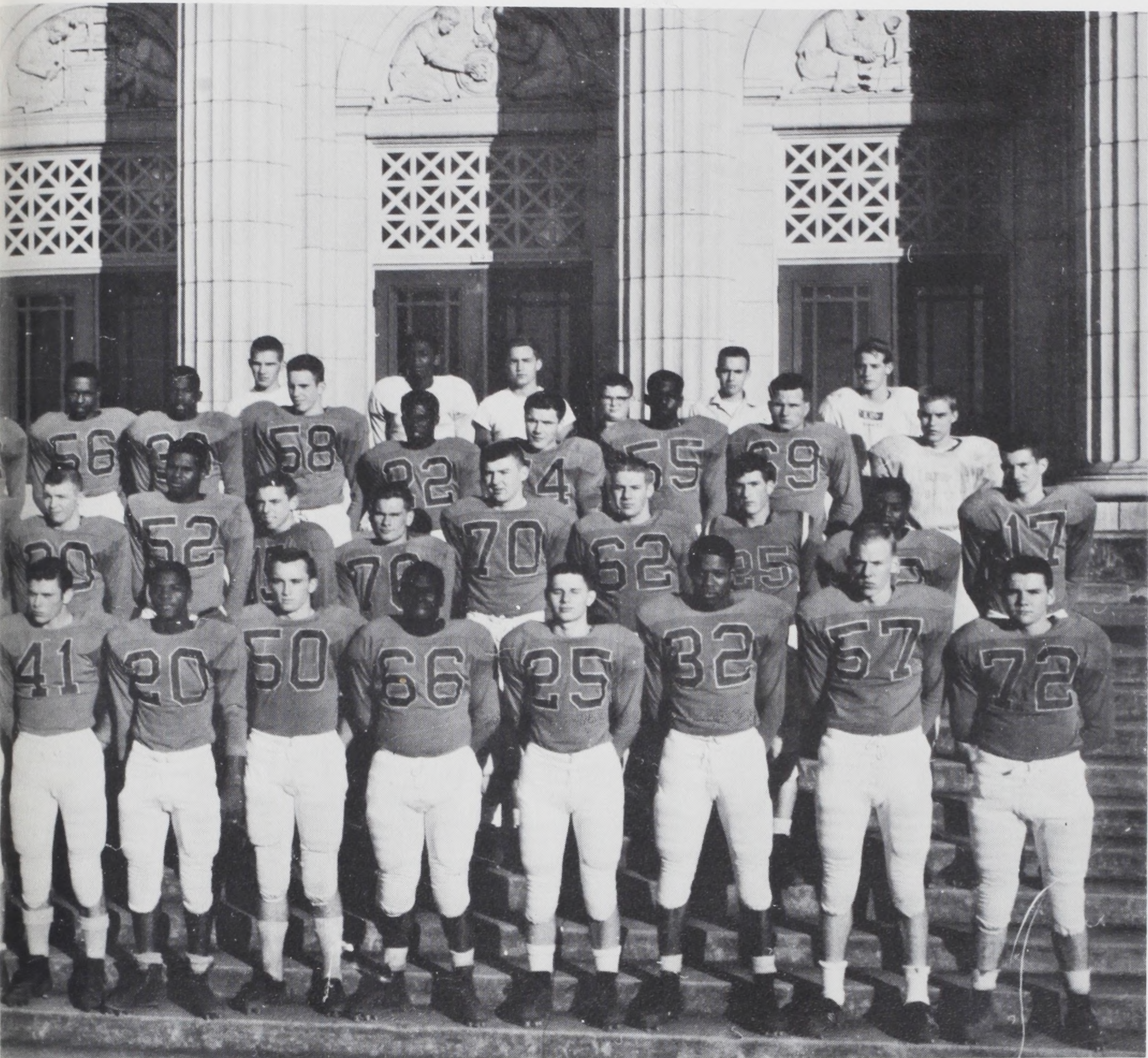
The Benson Engineers had a poor season last fall, winning only two games, tying two, and losing two.

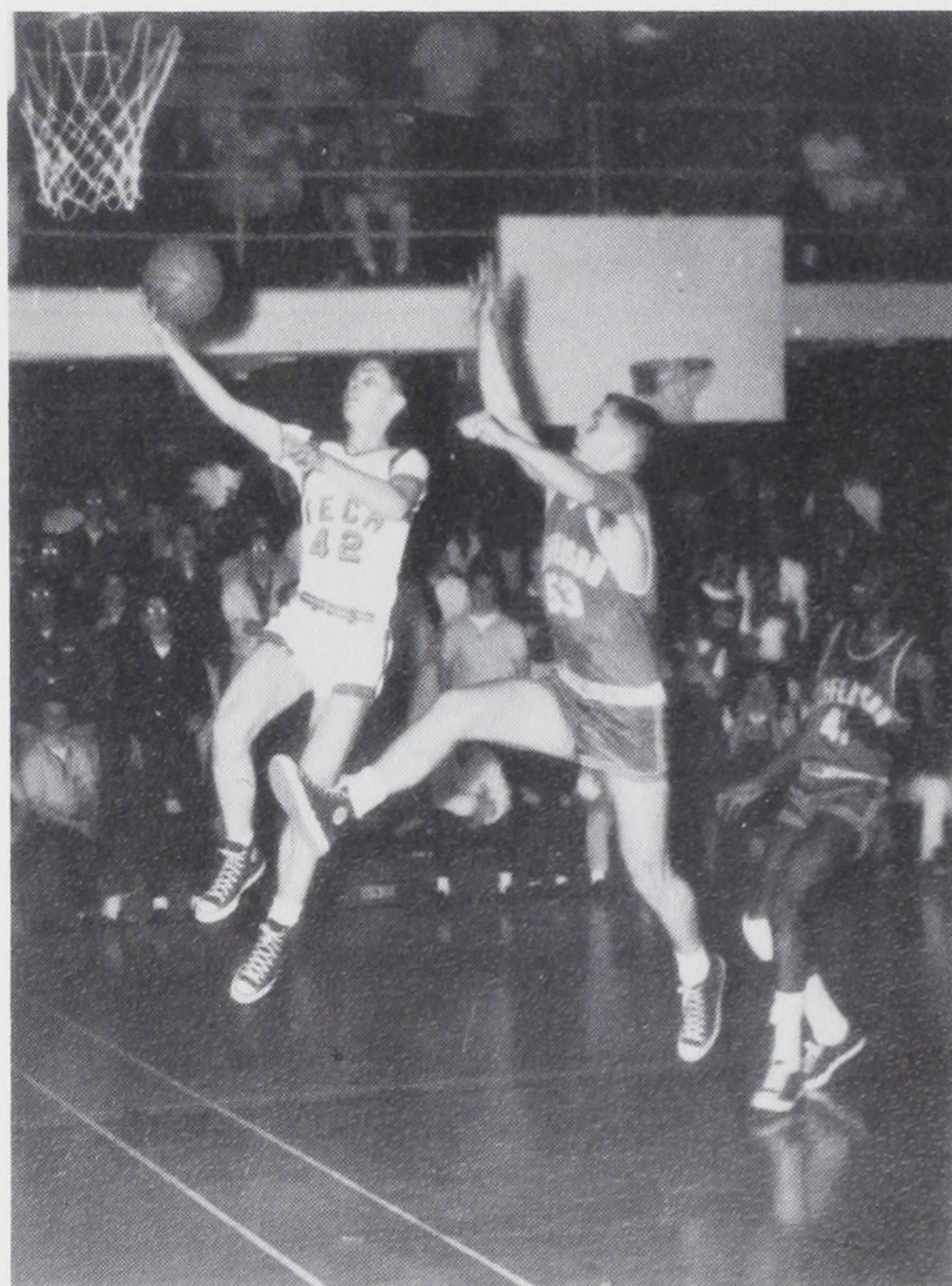

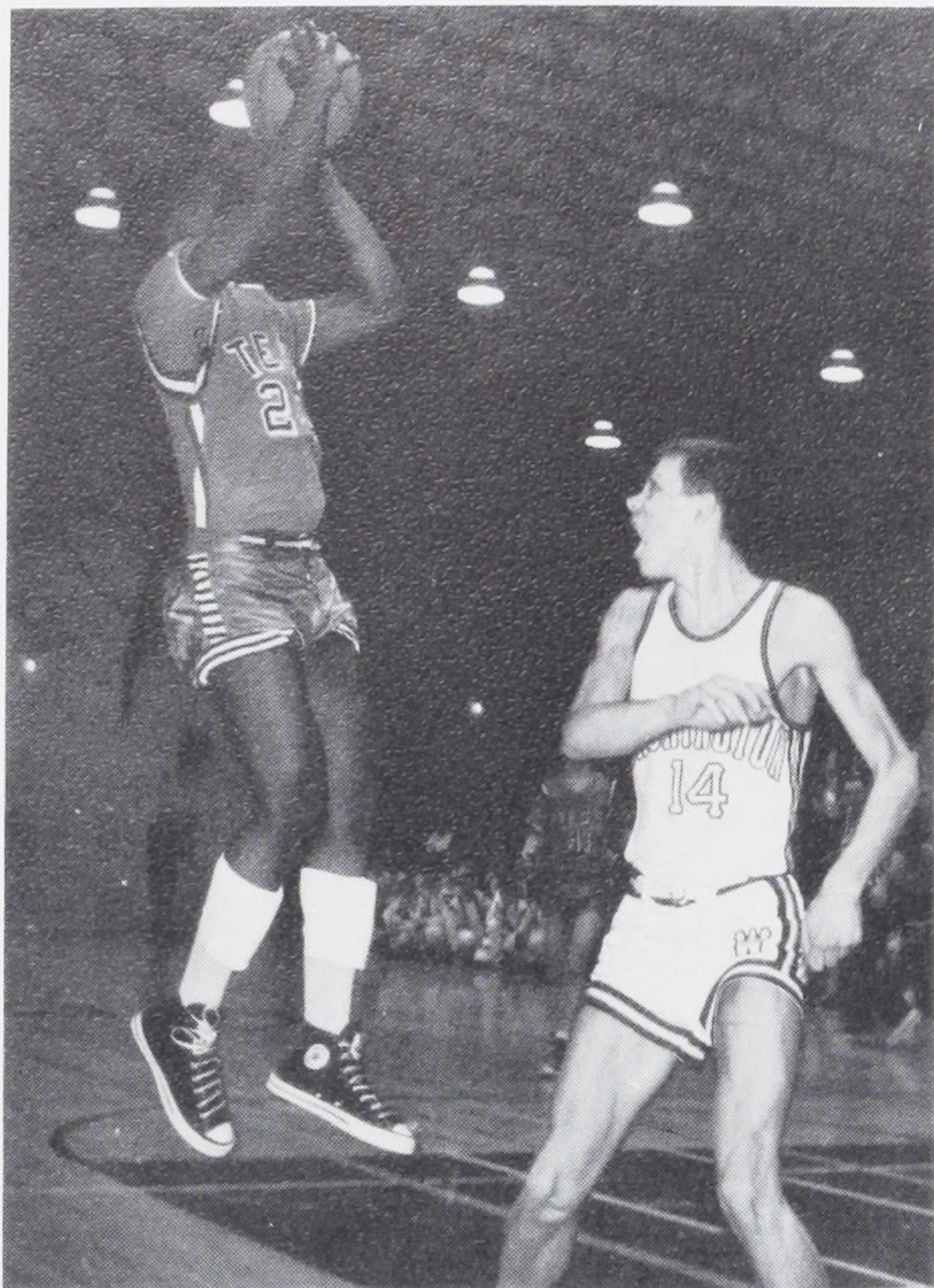

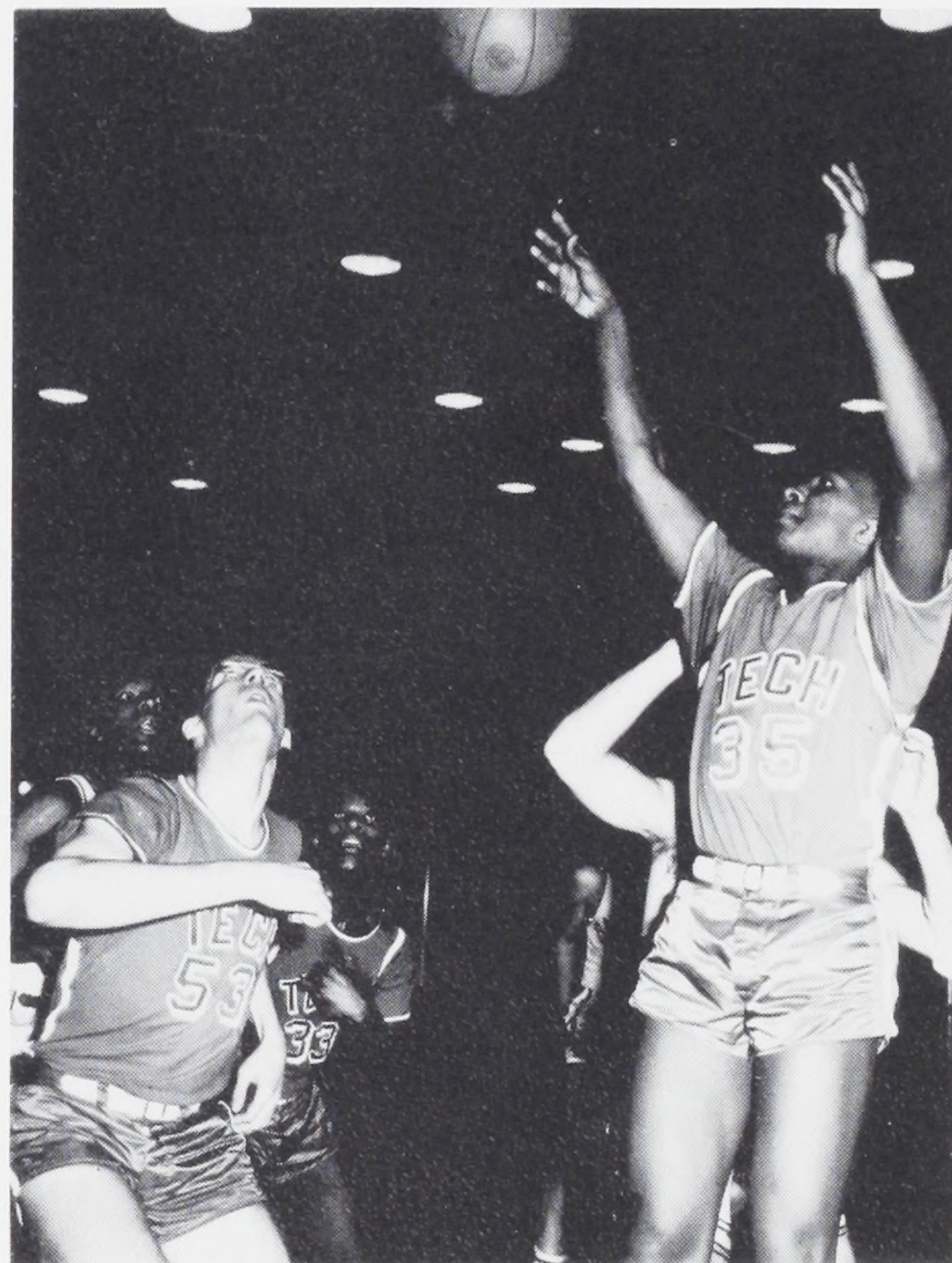

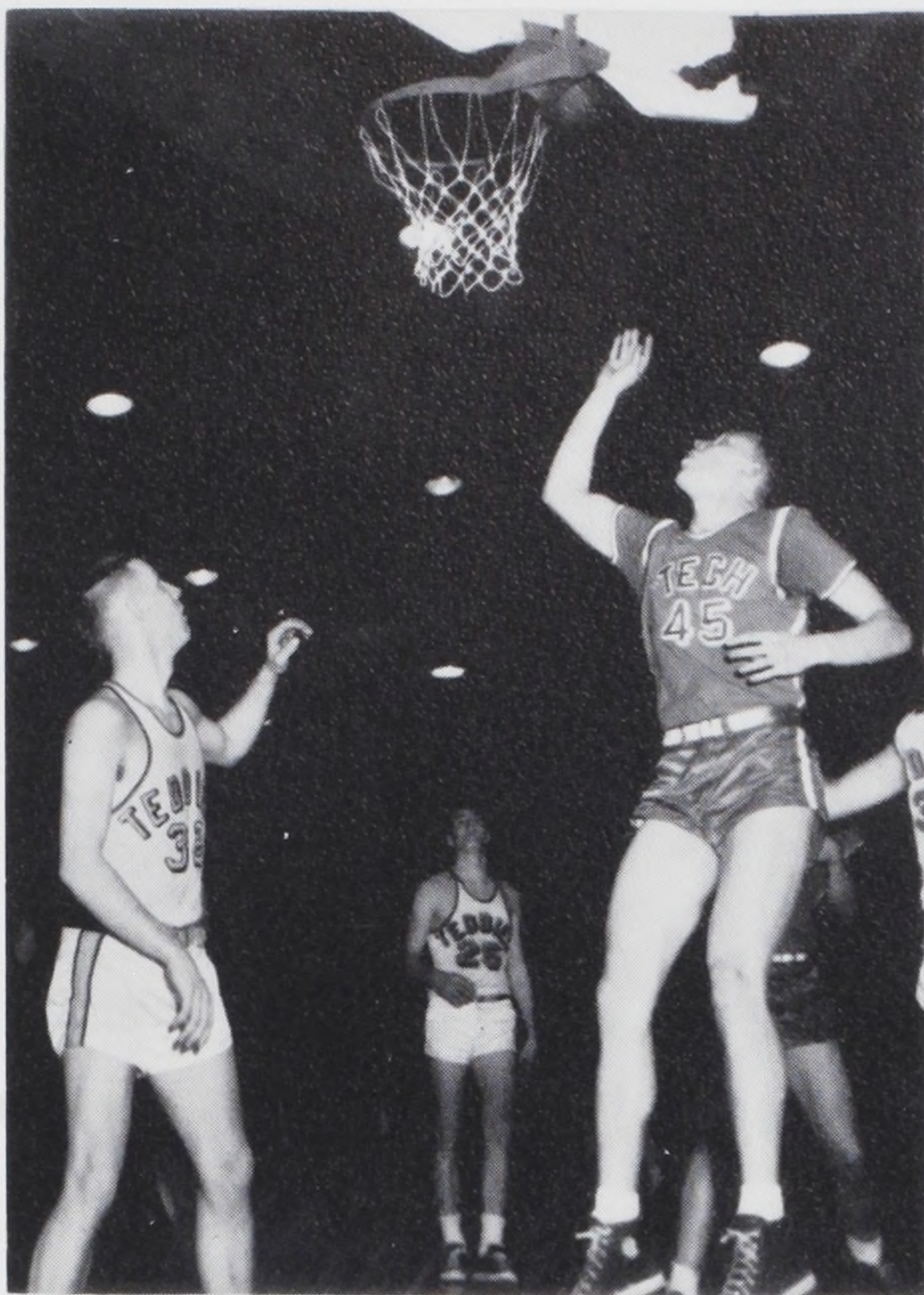

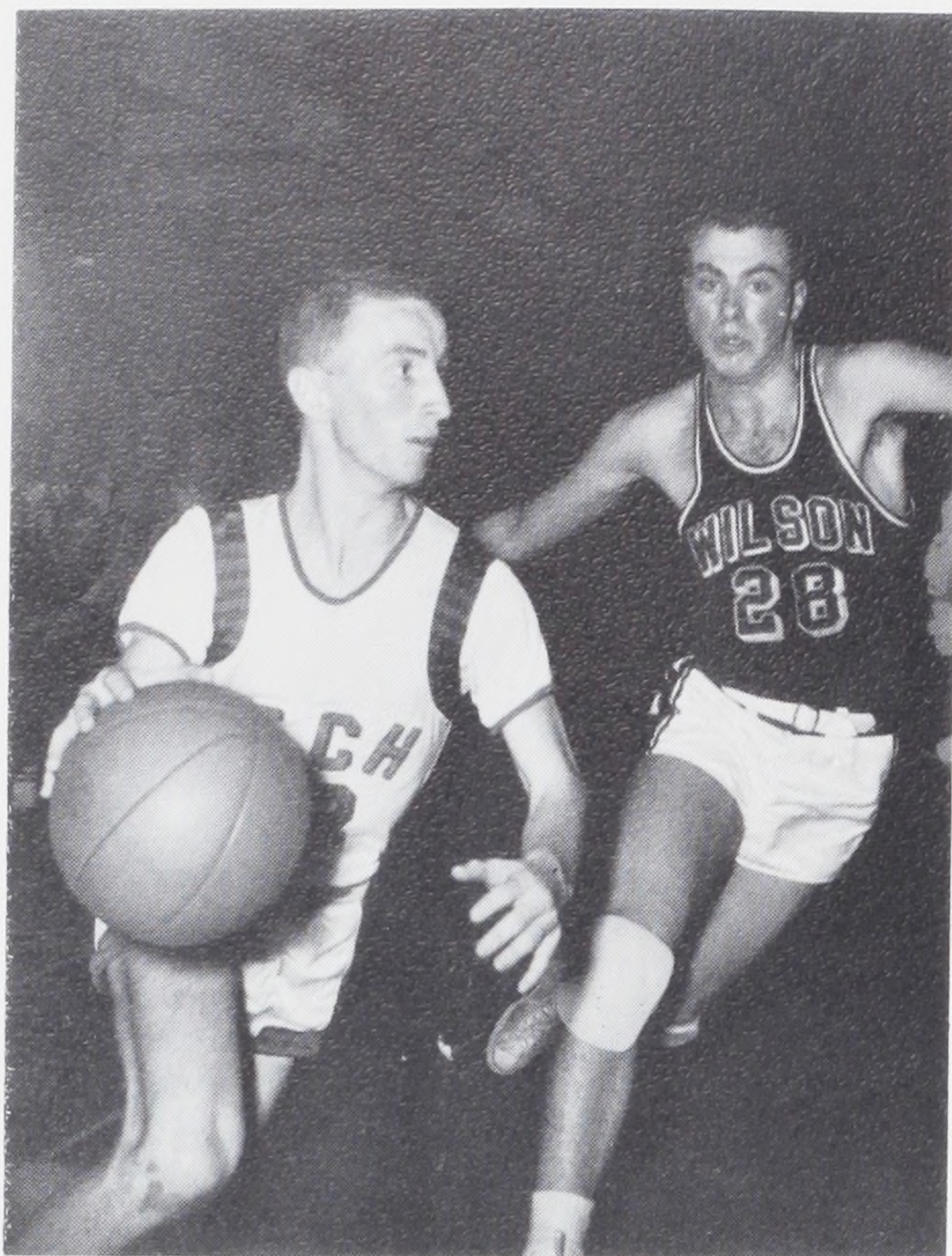

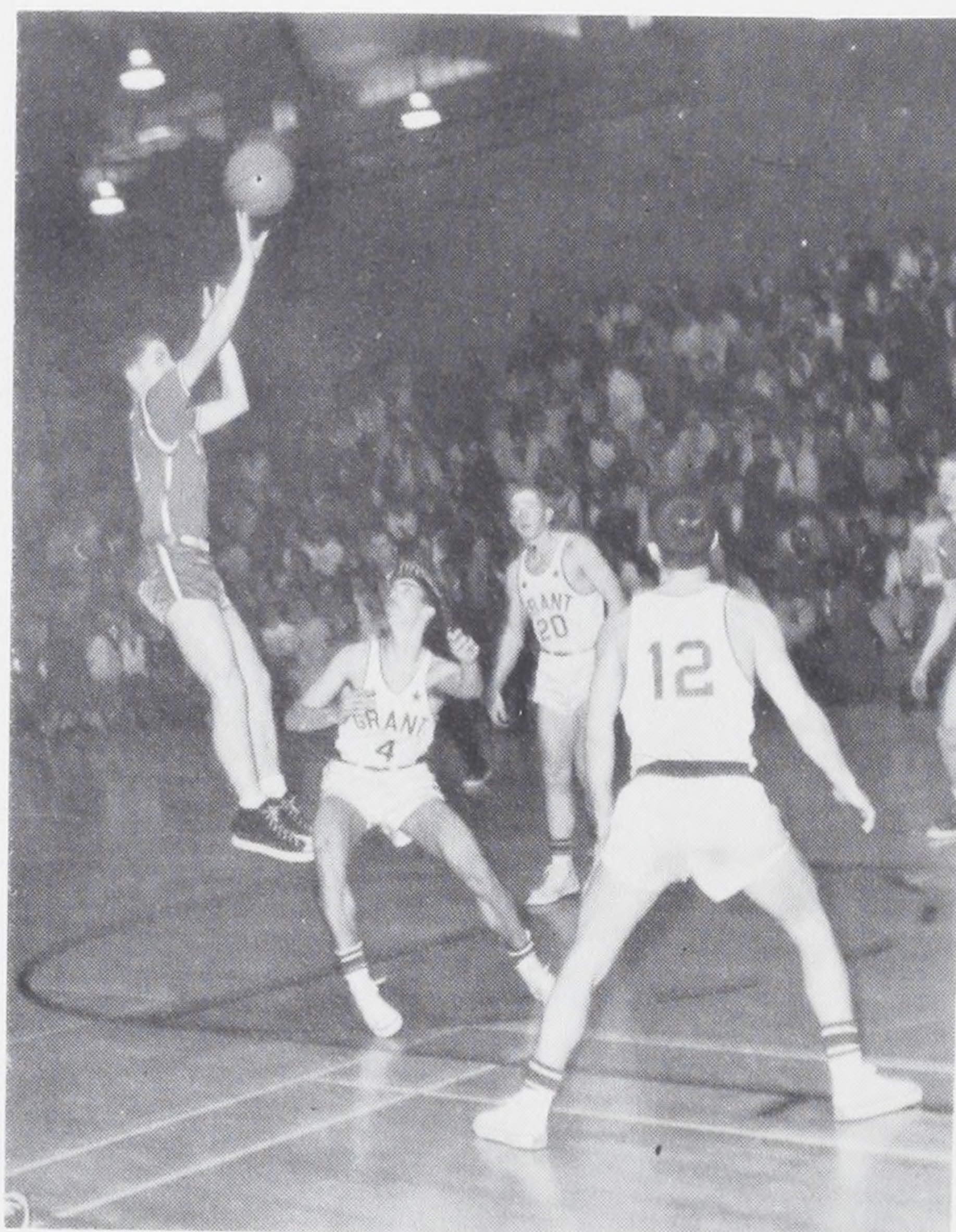
