## 1928 - - - 1964

Mr. George Brown will retire this spring after 36 years of service at Benson during which time he has become one of the most respected men on the Benson faculty.

After graduation from Union, Oregon, High School in 1919, he entered Oregon State University. While attending Oregon State he was on the Varsity basketball team of 1924-25. This team won the northwest basketball championship during Mr. Brown's Senior year. Mr. Brown graduated from Oregon State in 1925 with a degree in mechanical engineering and went to Centralia, Washington, where he was assistant football coach, basketball coach, and baseball coach. In 1928 he left his post there and came to Benson.

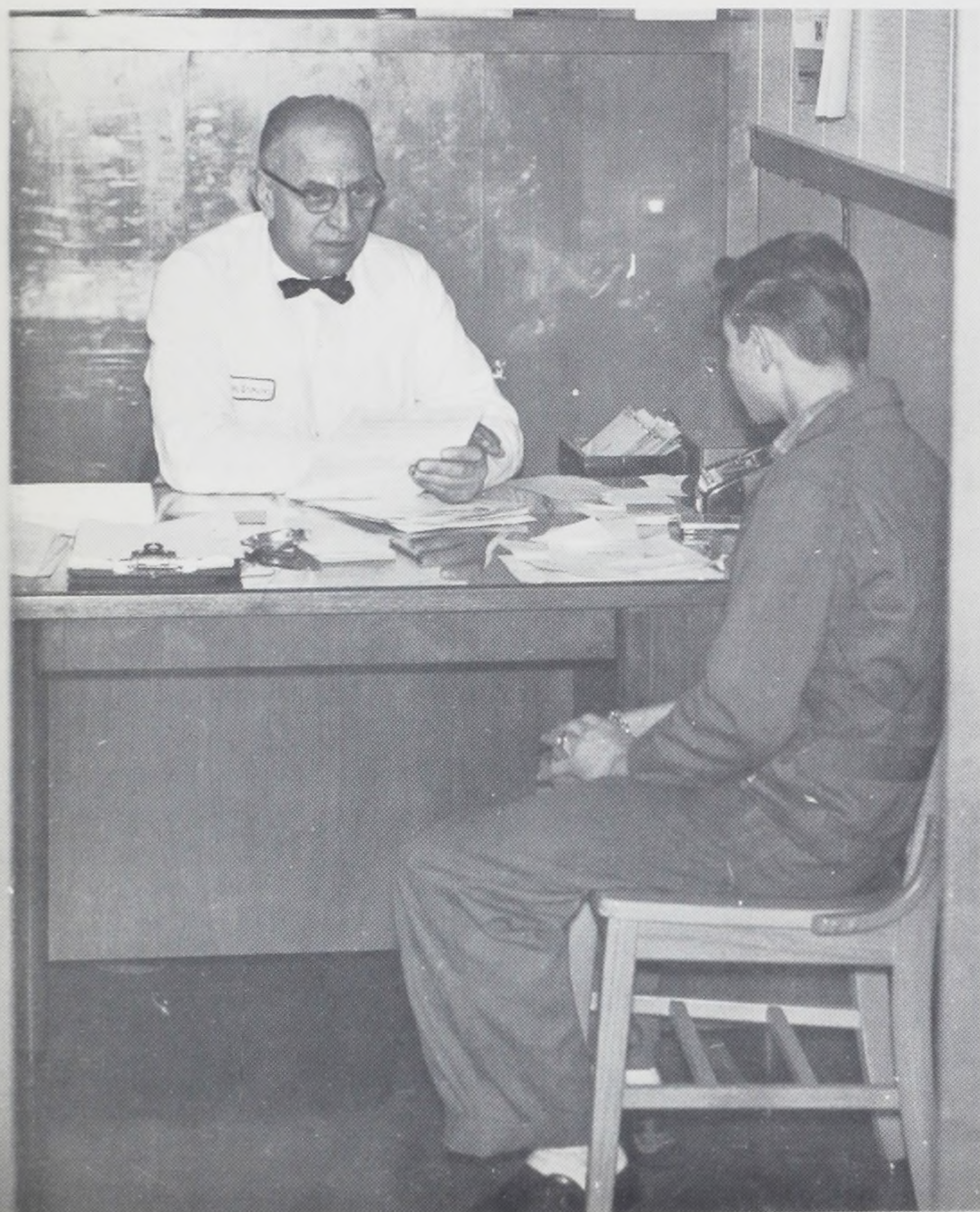
In his first years at Benson, Mr. Brown was head basketball coach as well as J.V. baseball coach. He also taught Science and Mathematics. He coached the soccer team in 1932 and retired from coaching in 1933.

During World War II Mr. Brown was made an acting vice principal. During this period of Benson's history, there was only one vice principal. His main duties were counseling, discipline and the School program. In 1946 another vice principal was added and Mr. Brown became the first vice principal. This was the year that he first took over management of the Tech Show, a duty he still has.

In 1952 Dr. Minear was appointed principal. He started the rebuilding and modernization of Benson Tech. In 1953 the second vice principal was put in charge of counselling and the school program and Mr. Brown started the shop curriculum-improvement program. He also helped with discipline.

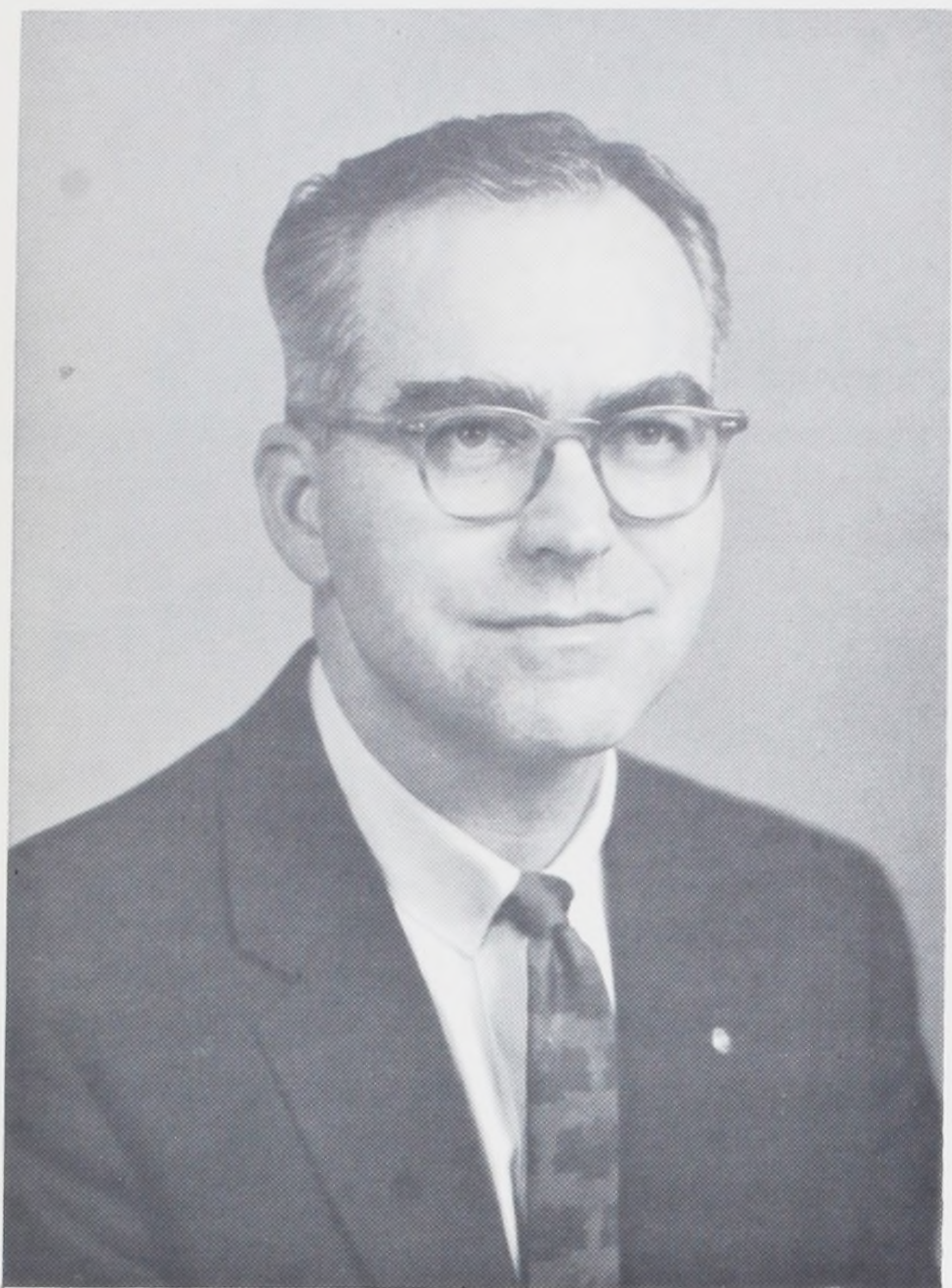
In the fall of 1956 a third vice principal was added, and Mr. Brown's supervisory duties changed again to include the entire shop program as well as the handling of all student body finances.

Mr. Brown's influence will live at Benson for many years to come. He will be sorely missed by every administrator, teacher and student who has known him here and we wish for him many happy years of retirement.

In 1961 Mr. Harold Andersen took over the duties of vice-principal at Benson. His new responsibilities included being head of the counseling department and vice-principal in charge of all attendance and academic disciplinary problems.

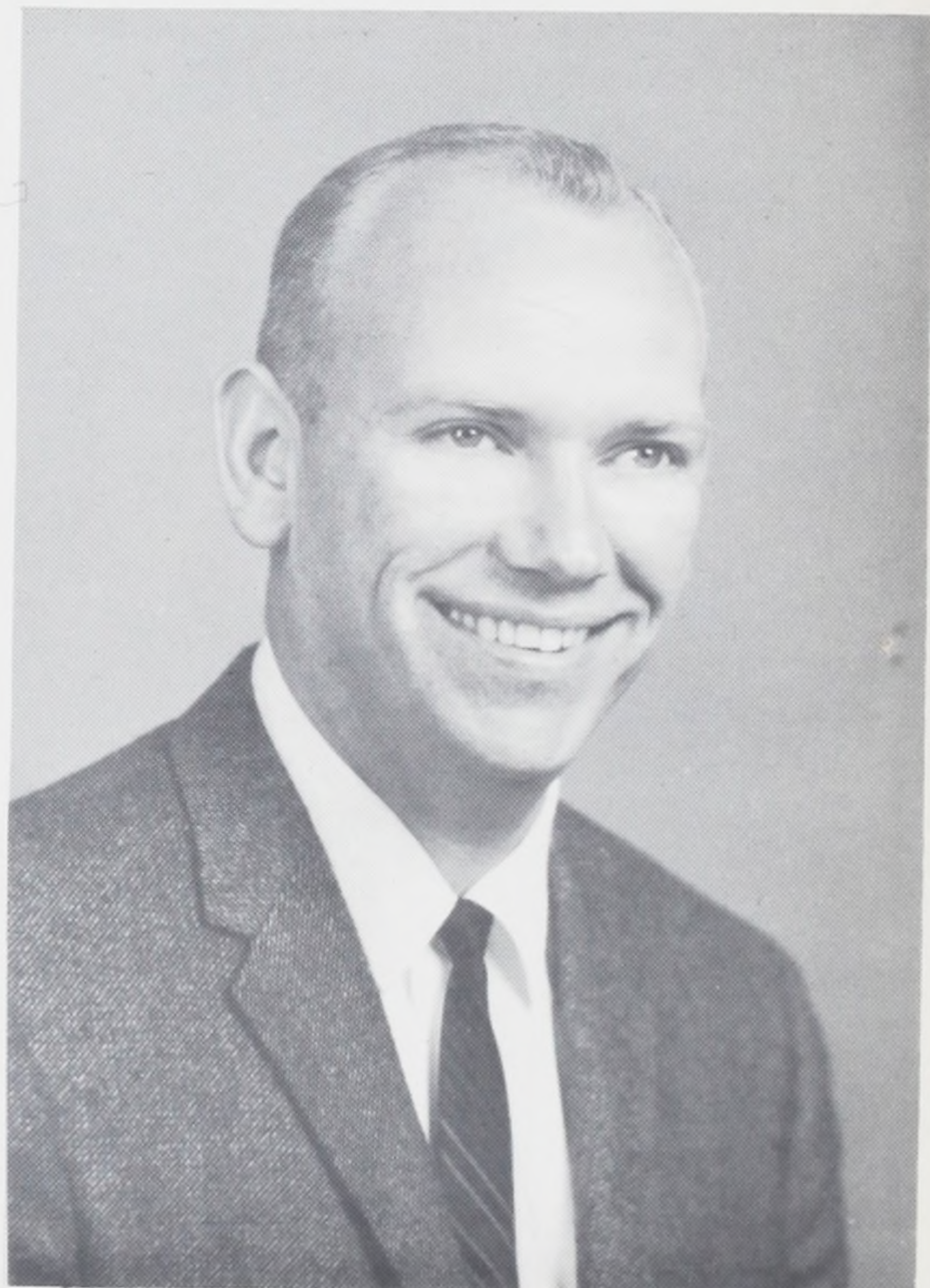
Mr. Andersen holds a Bachelor of Arts degree in Music and a Master of Education degree.

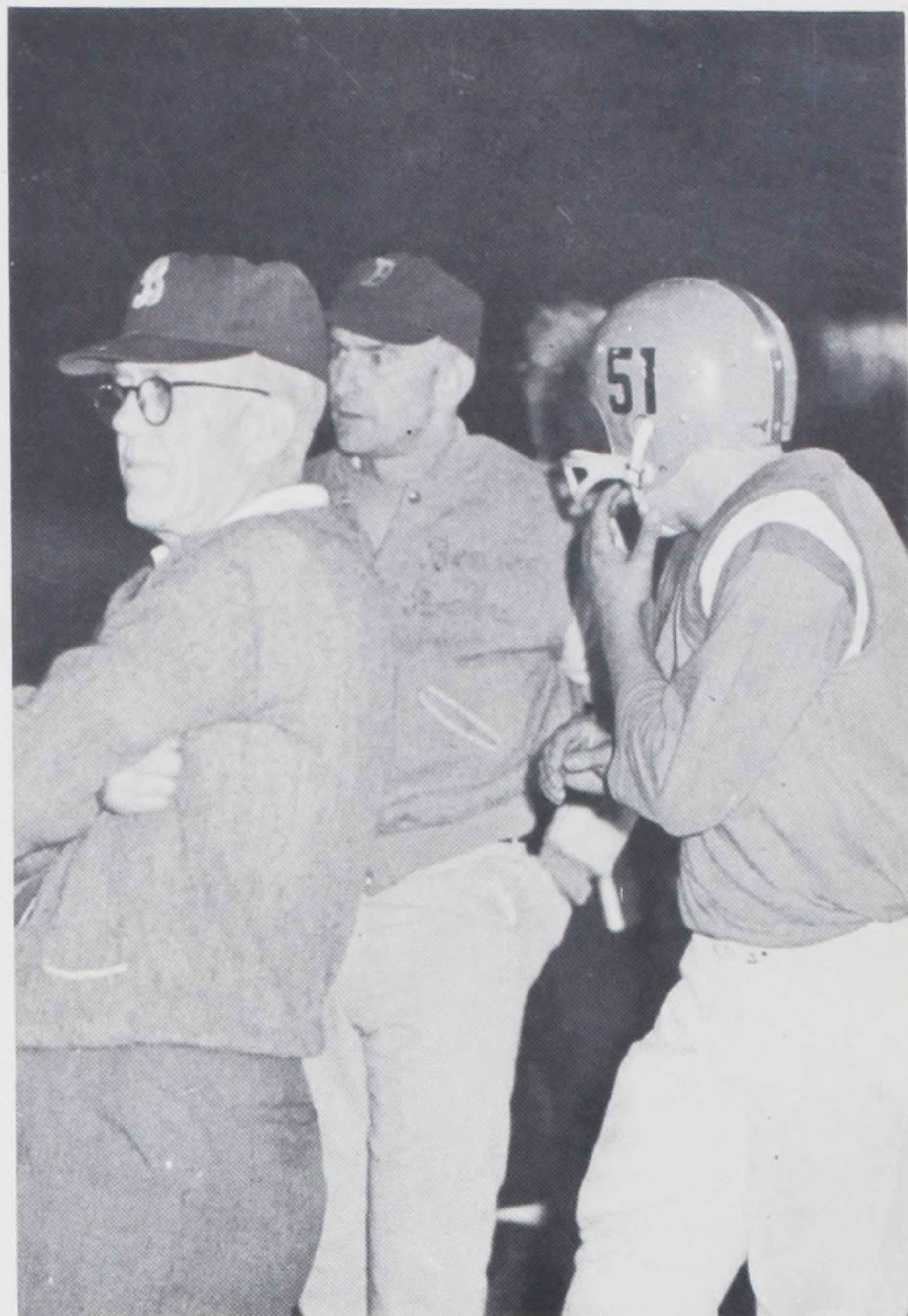
Jefferson's only score came on a pass from Pete to Coleman. The final score of the game was 19-6.

Tech's first score came on a 40 yard pass from Larry Kaiel to Louie Lewis. Kaiel scored the second tally on a 21 yard run.

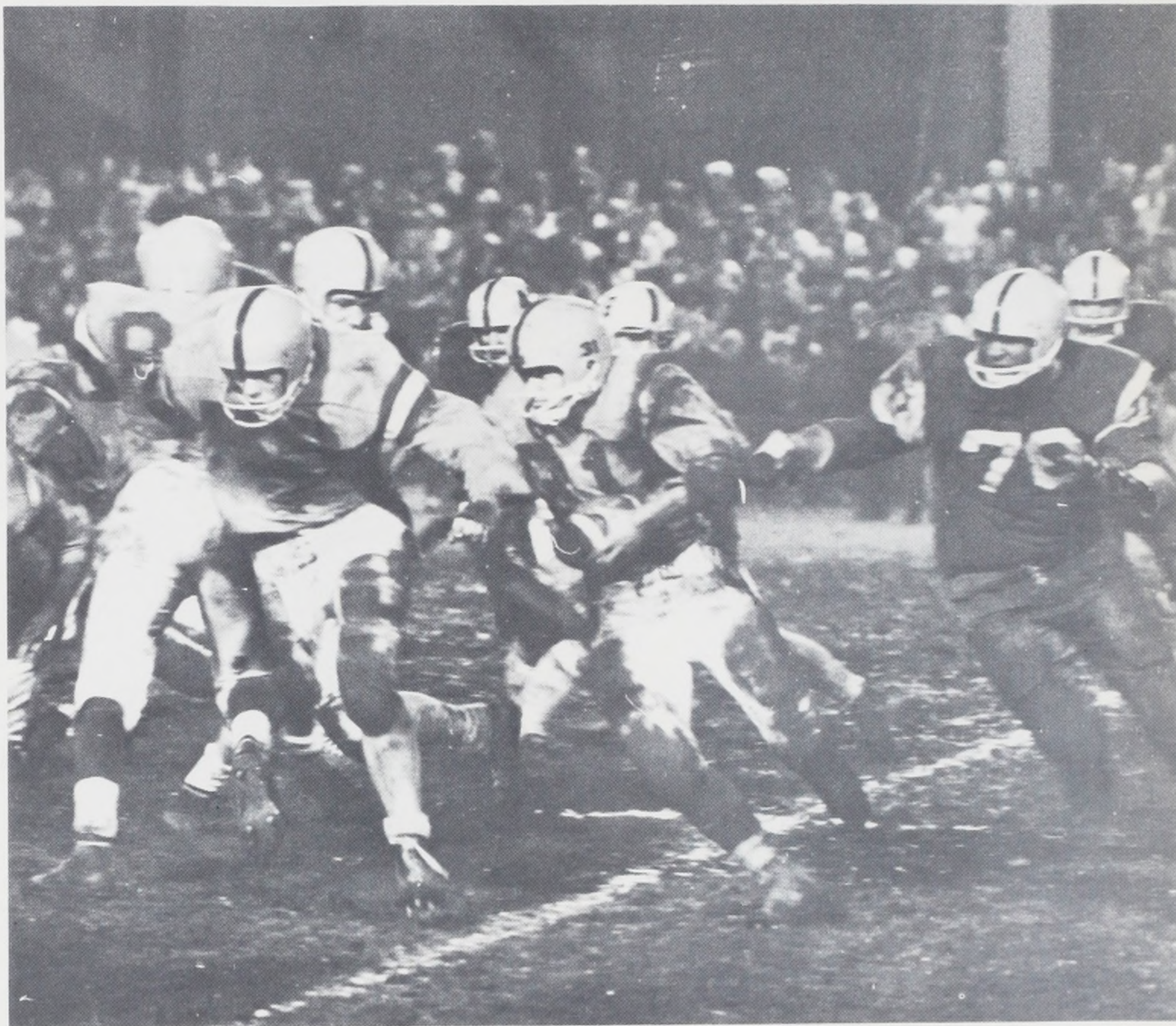

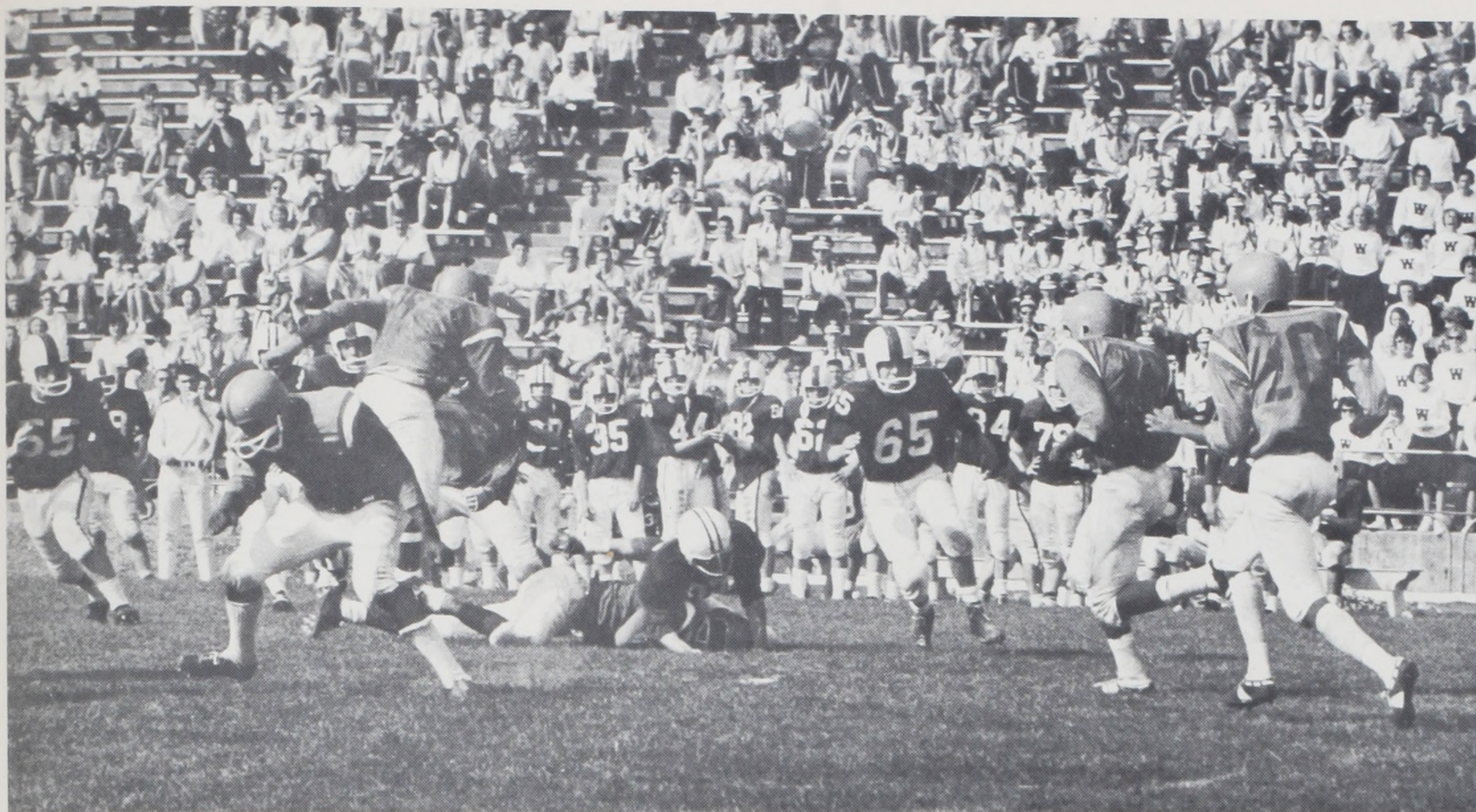

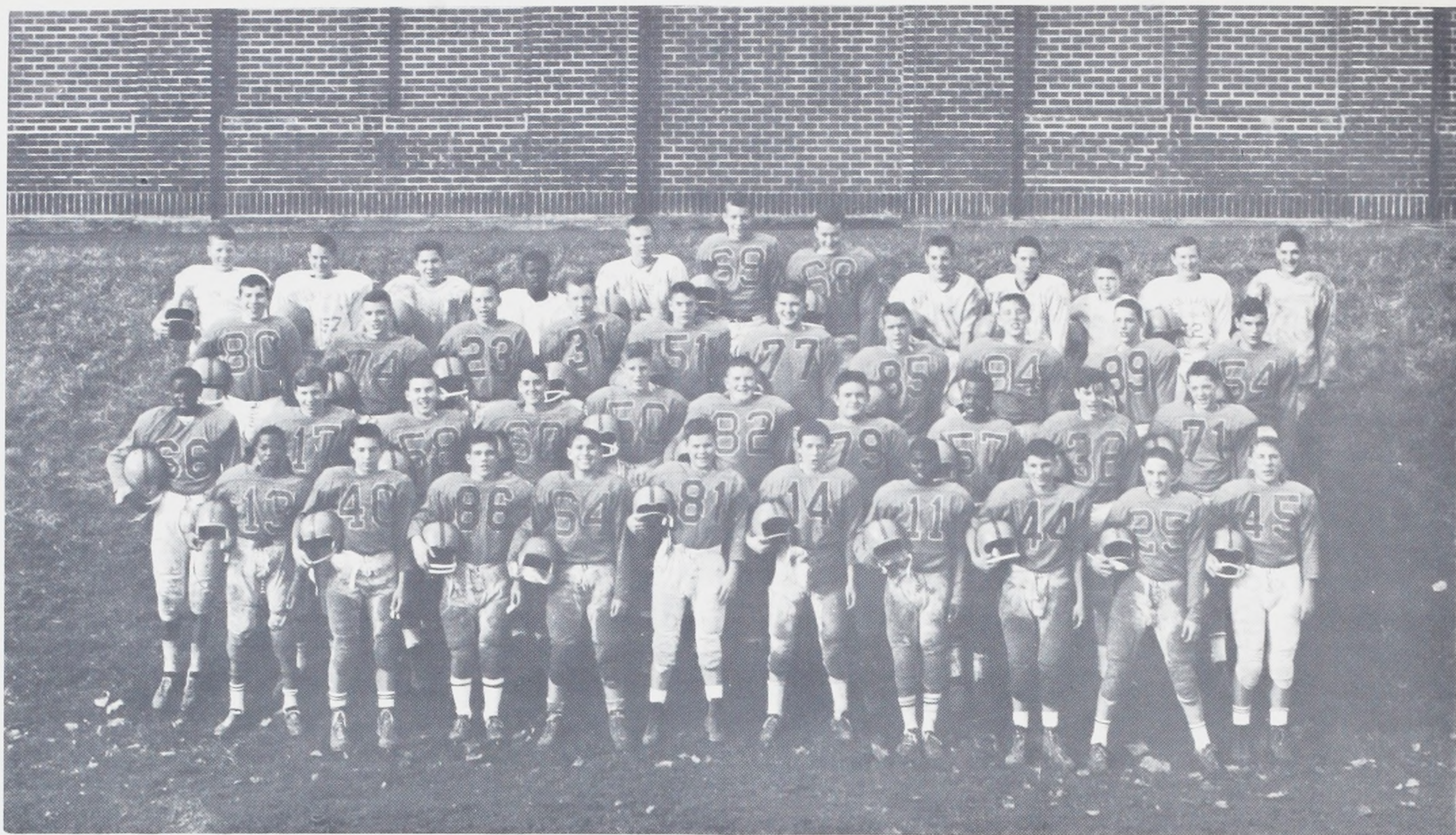

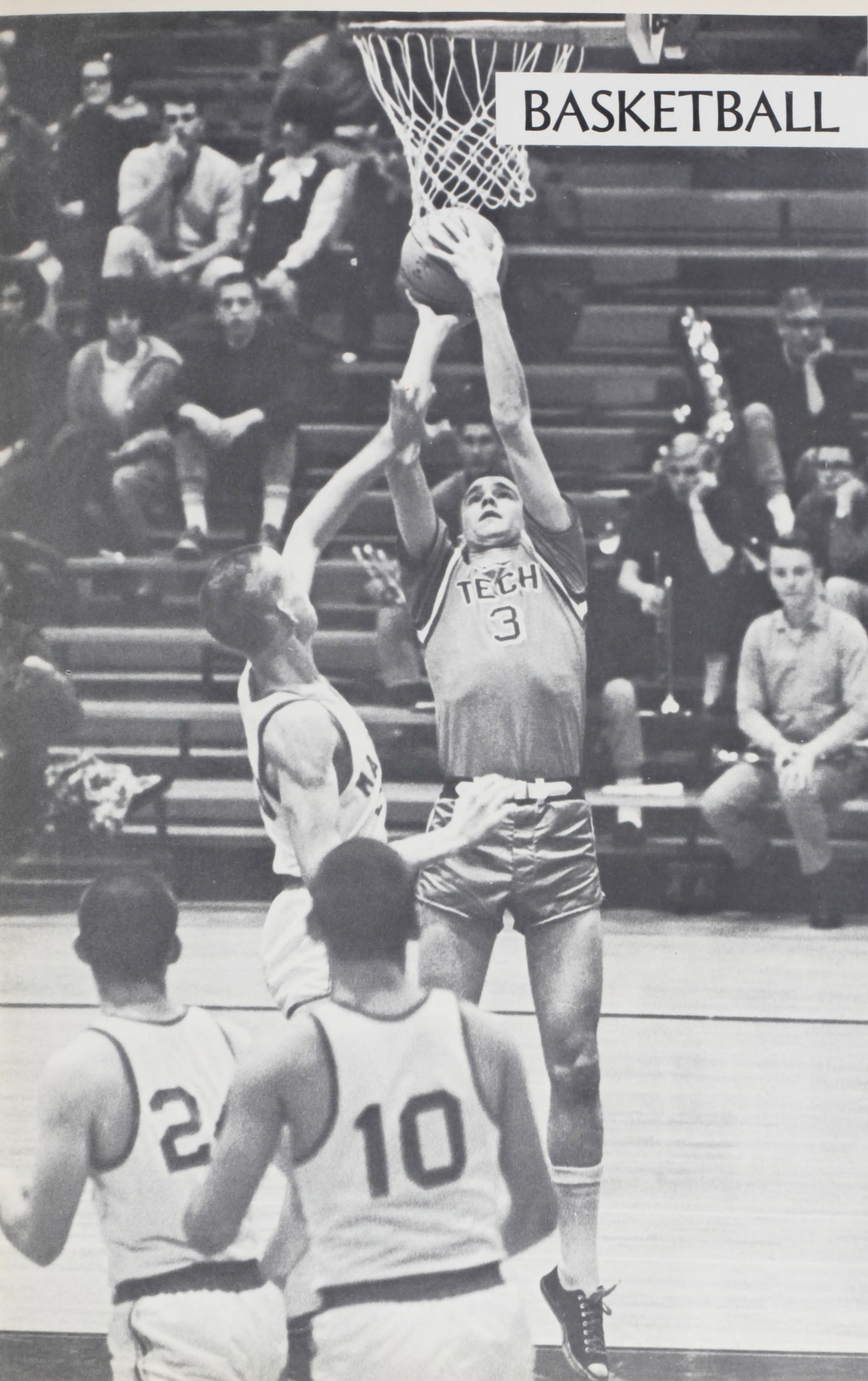

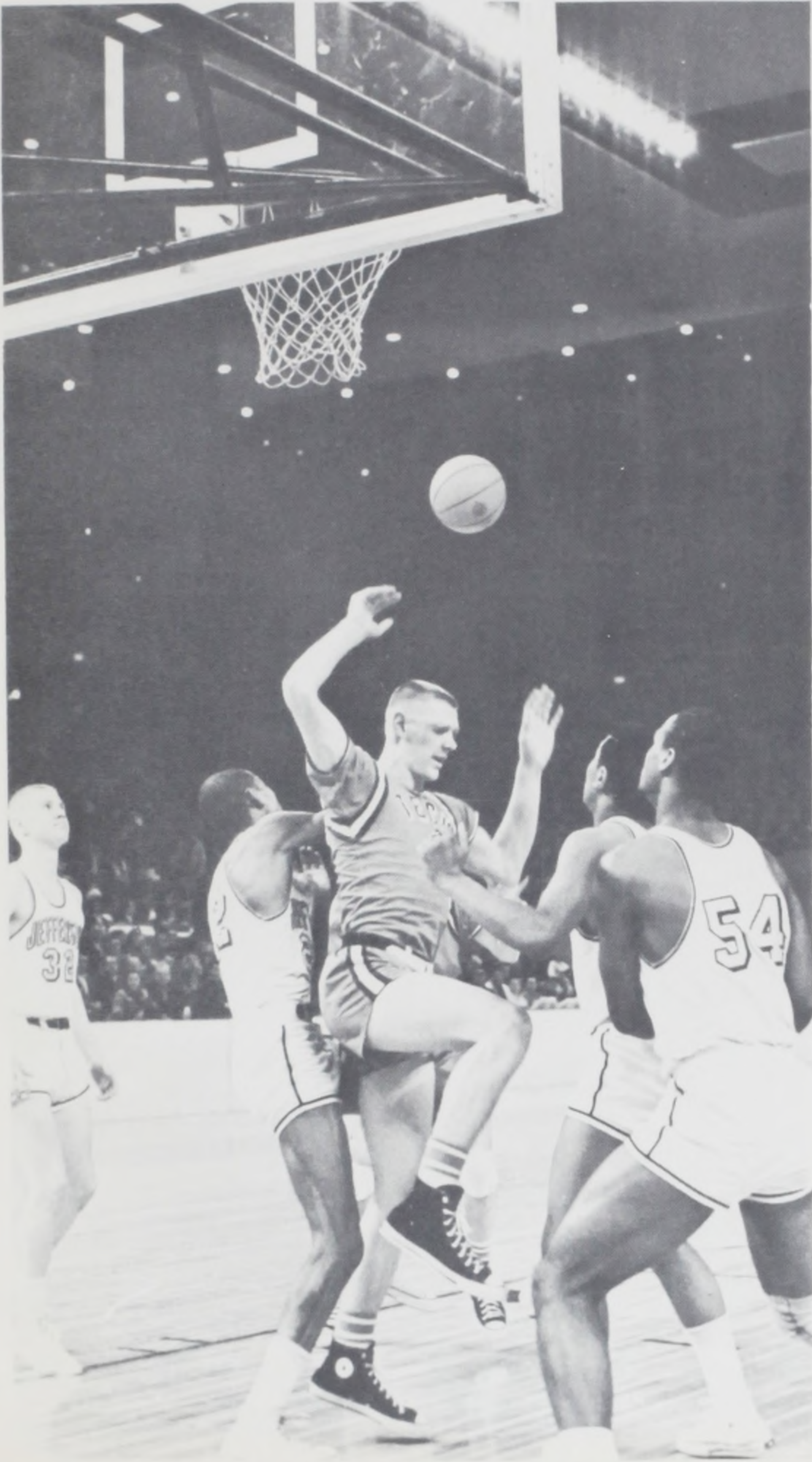

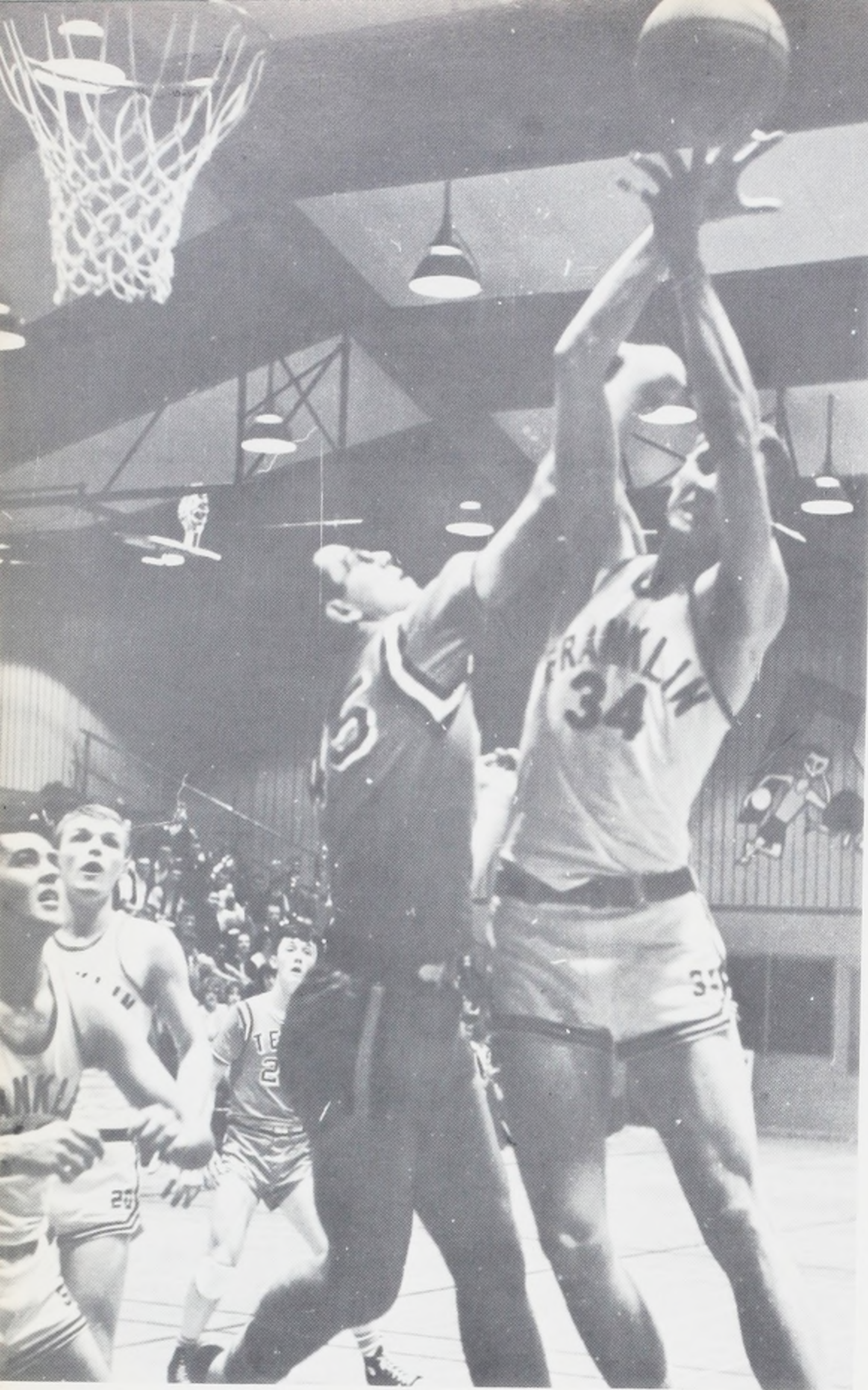

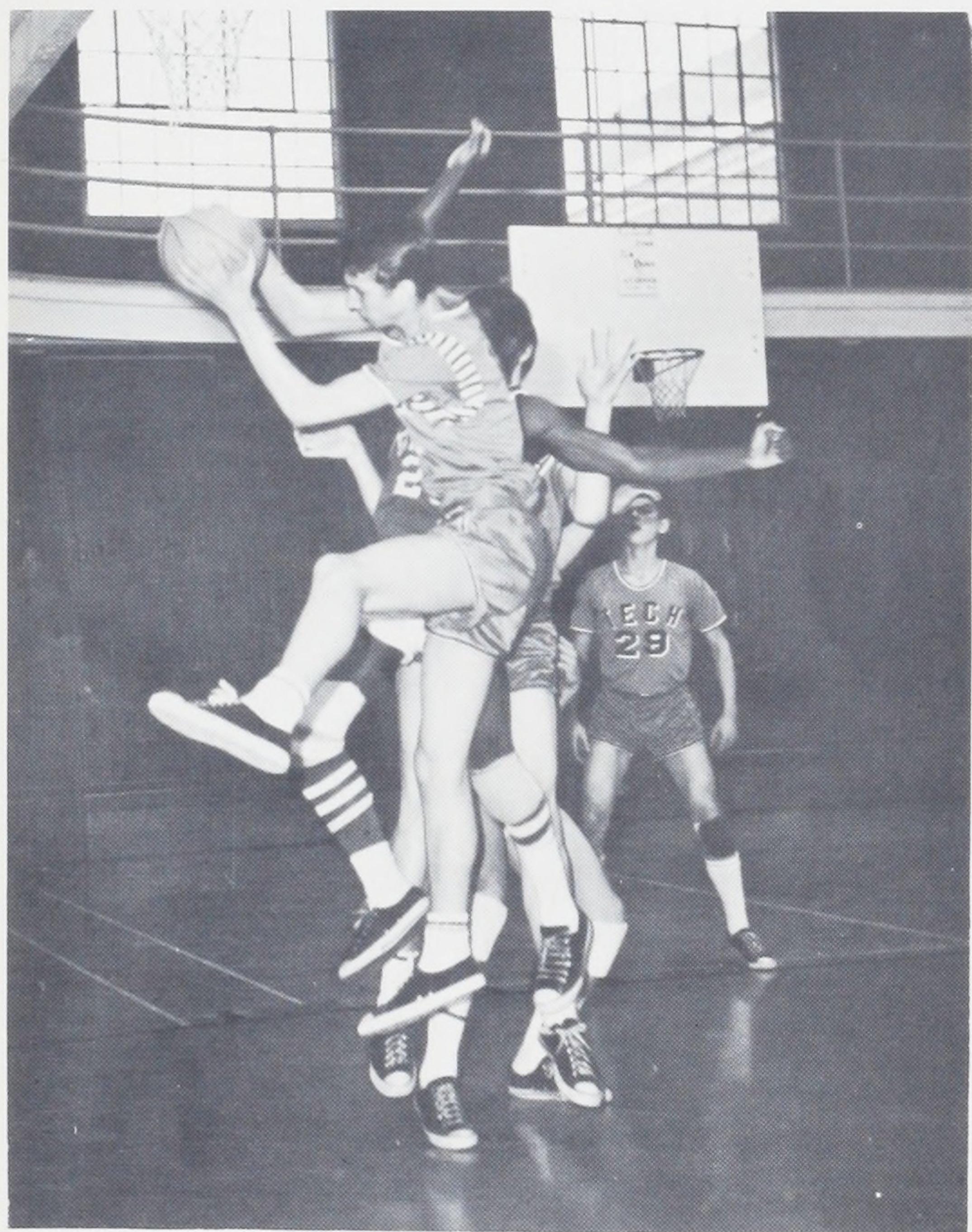

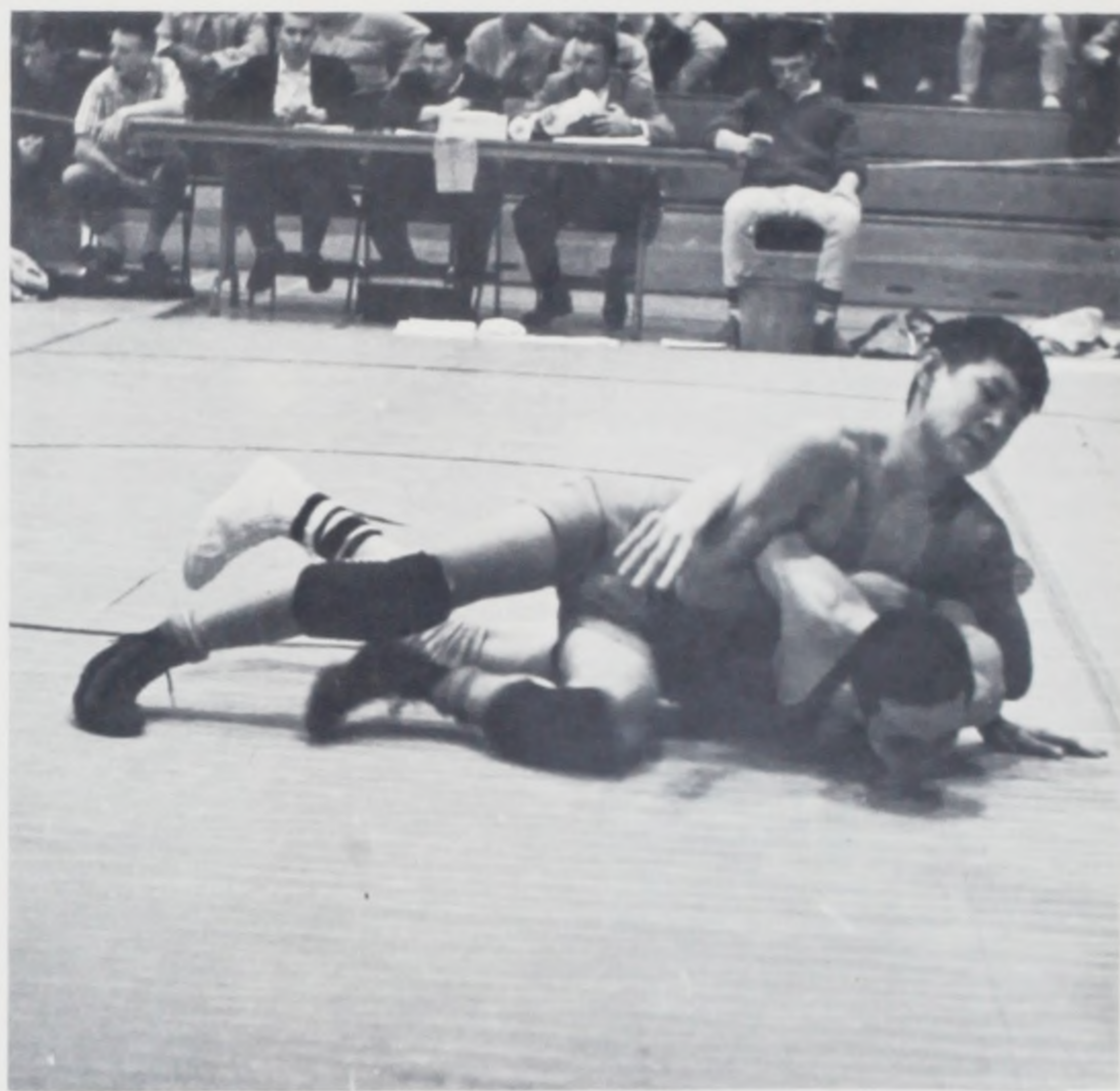

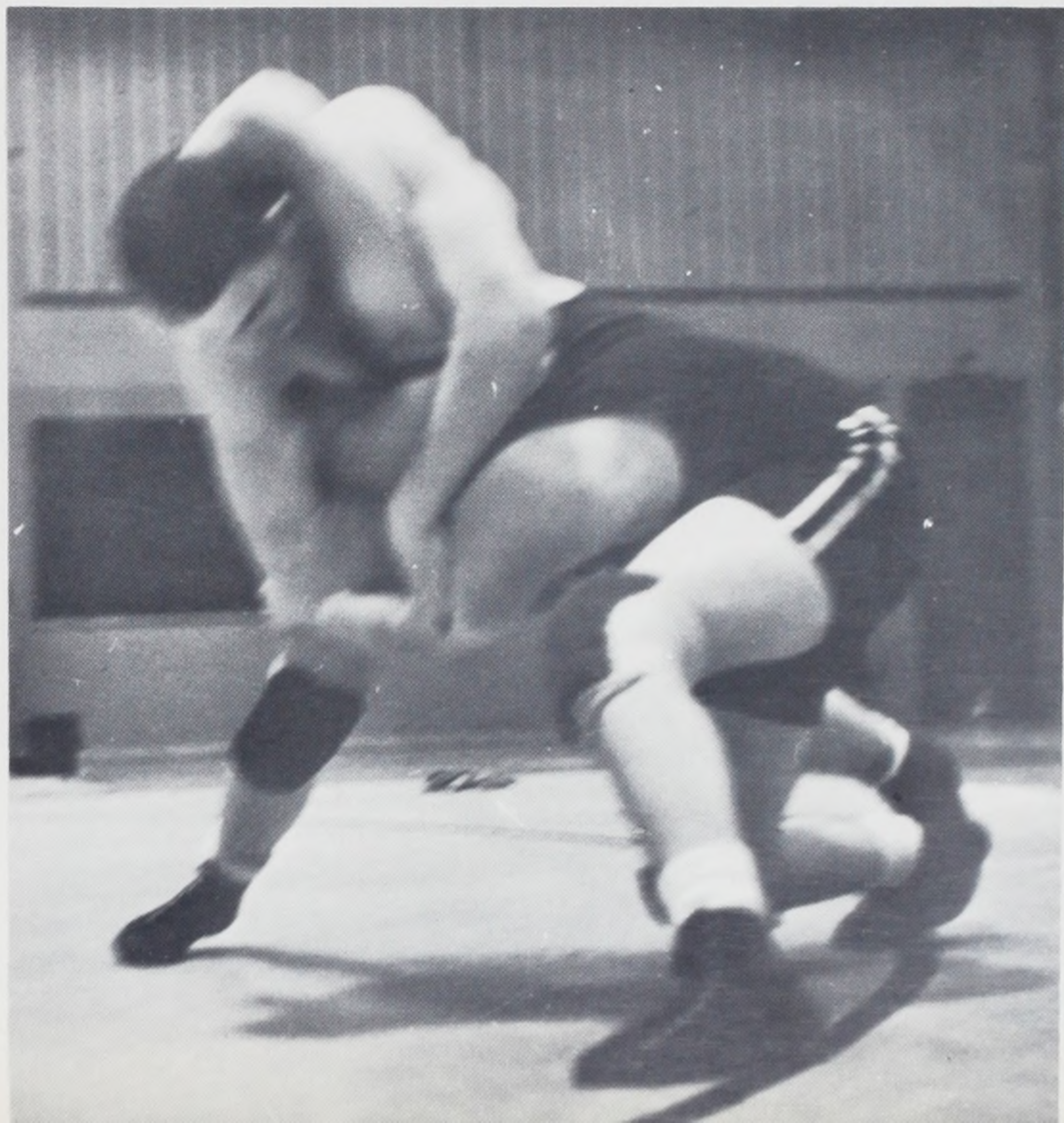
## Lofstedt Voted Most Valuable Wrestler

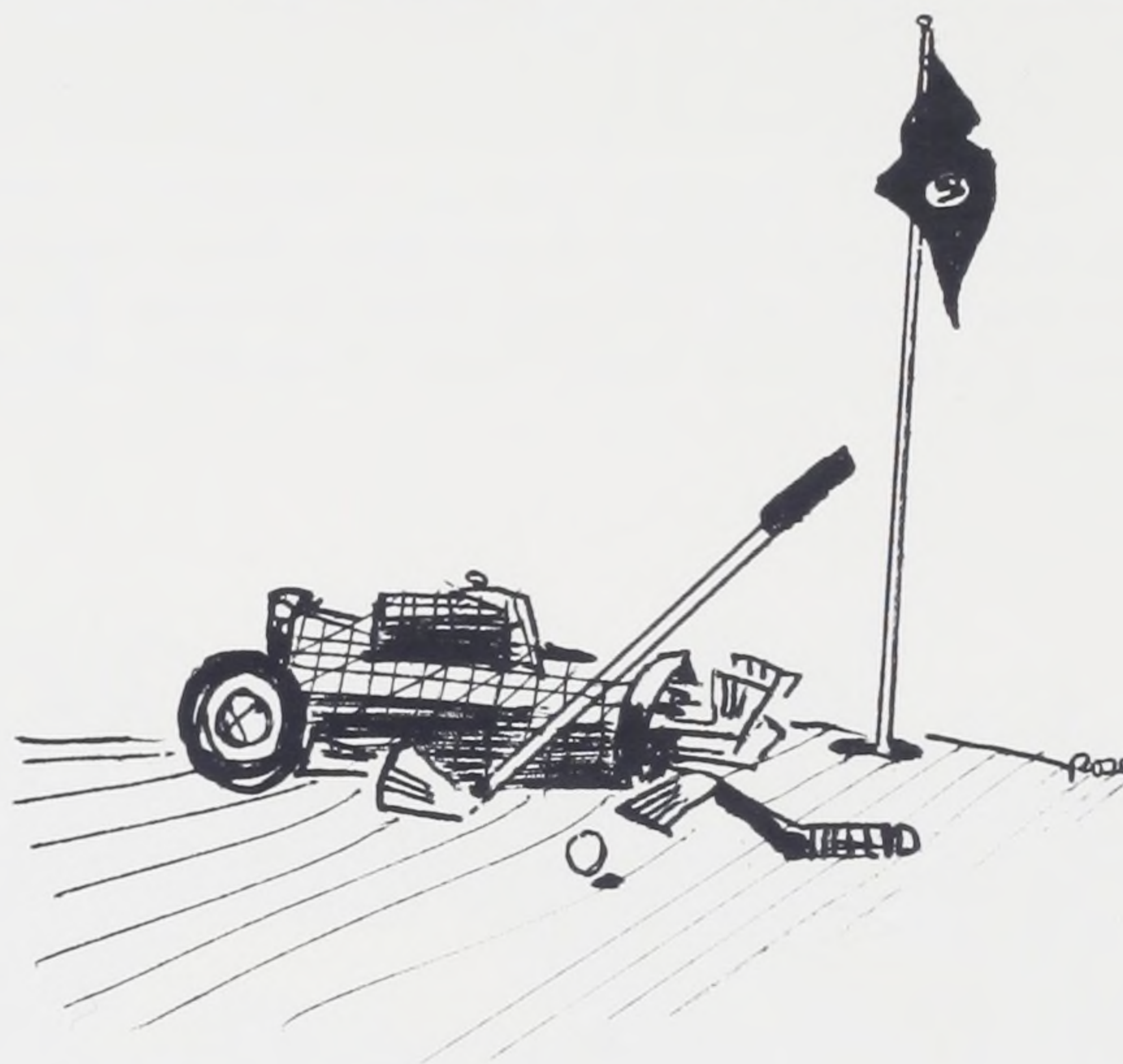

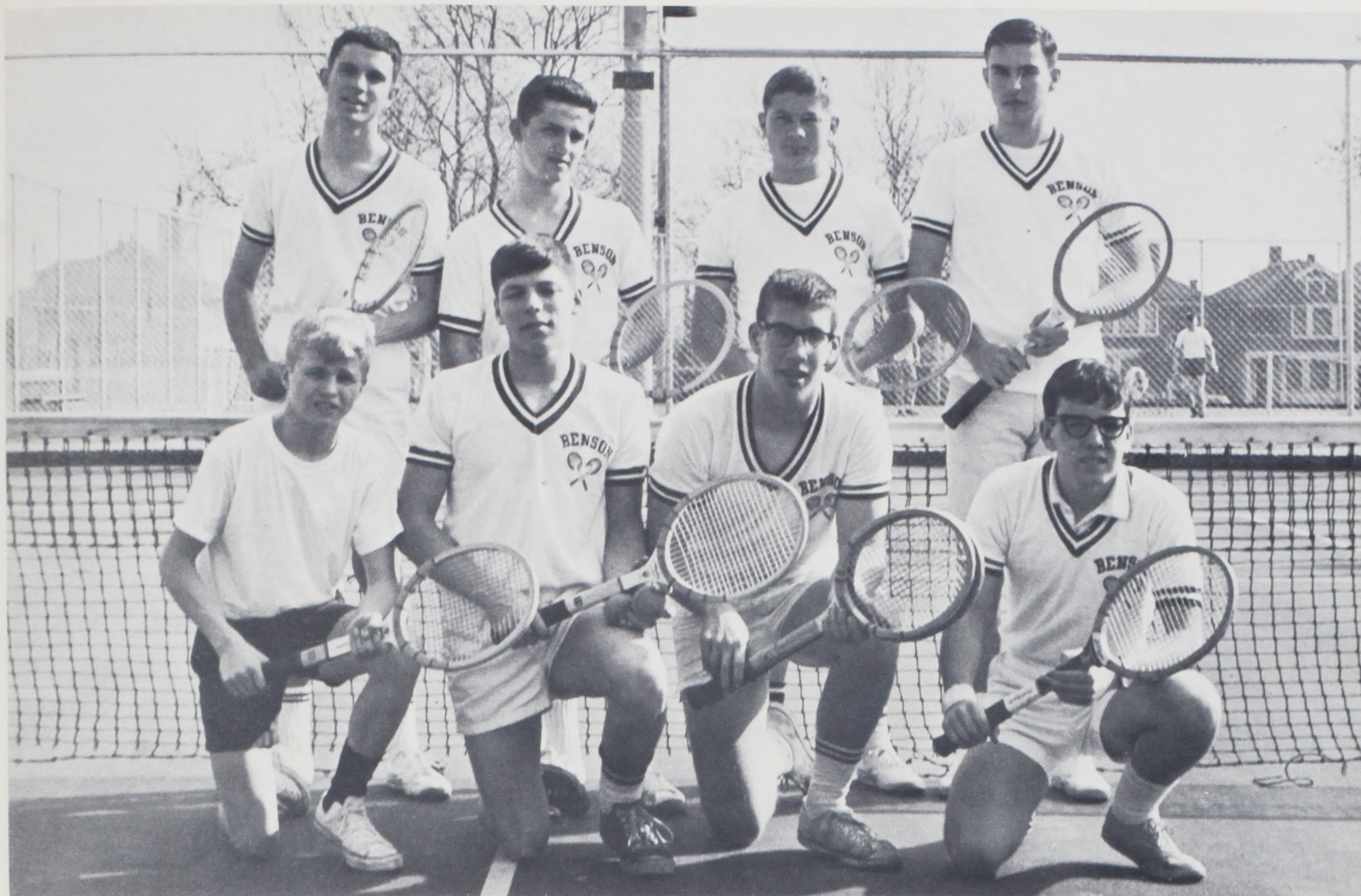

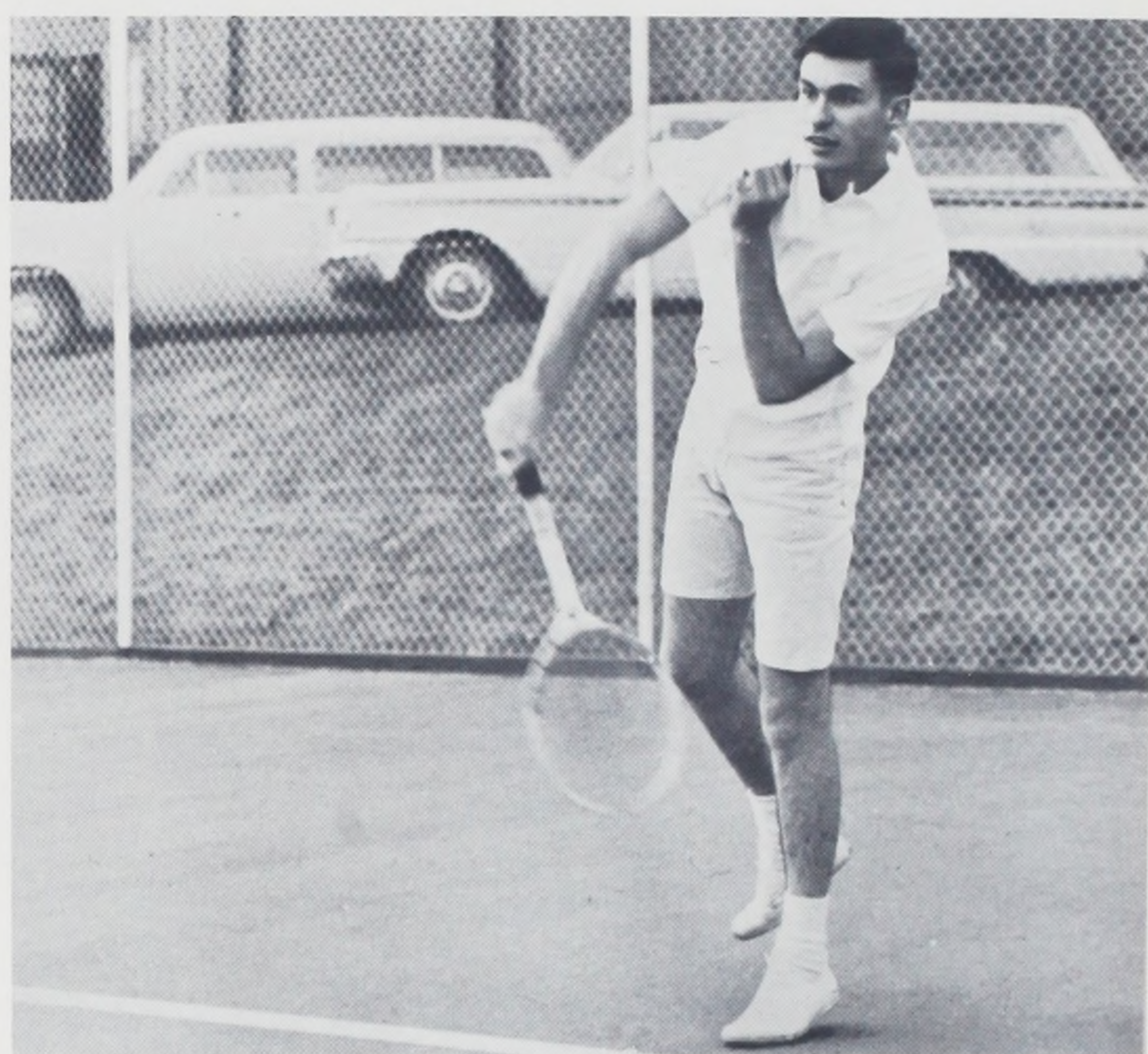

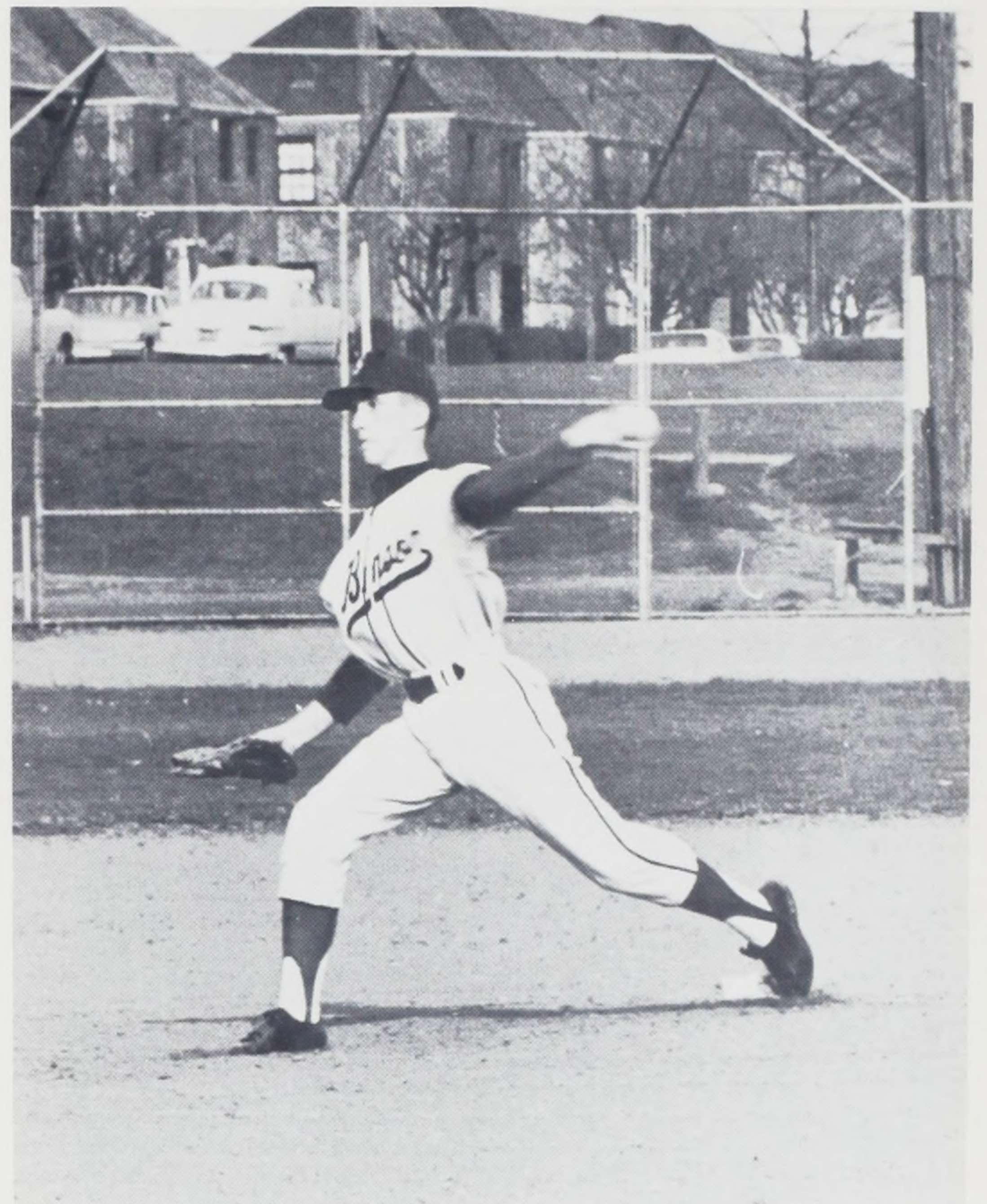

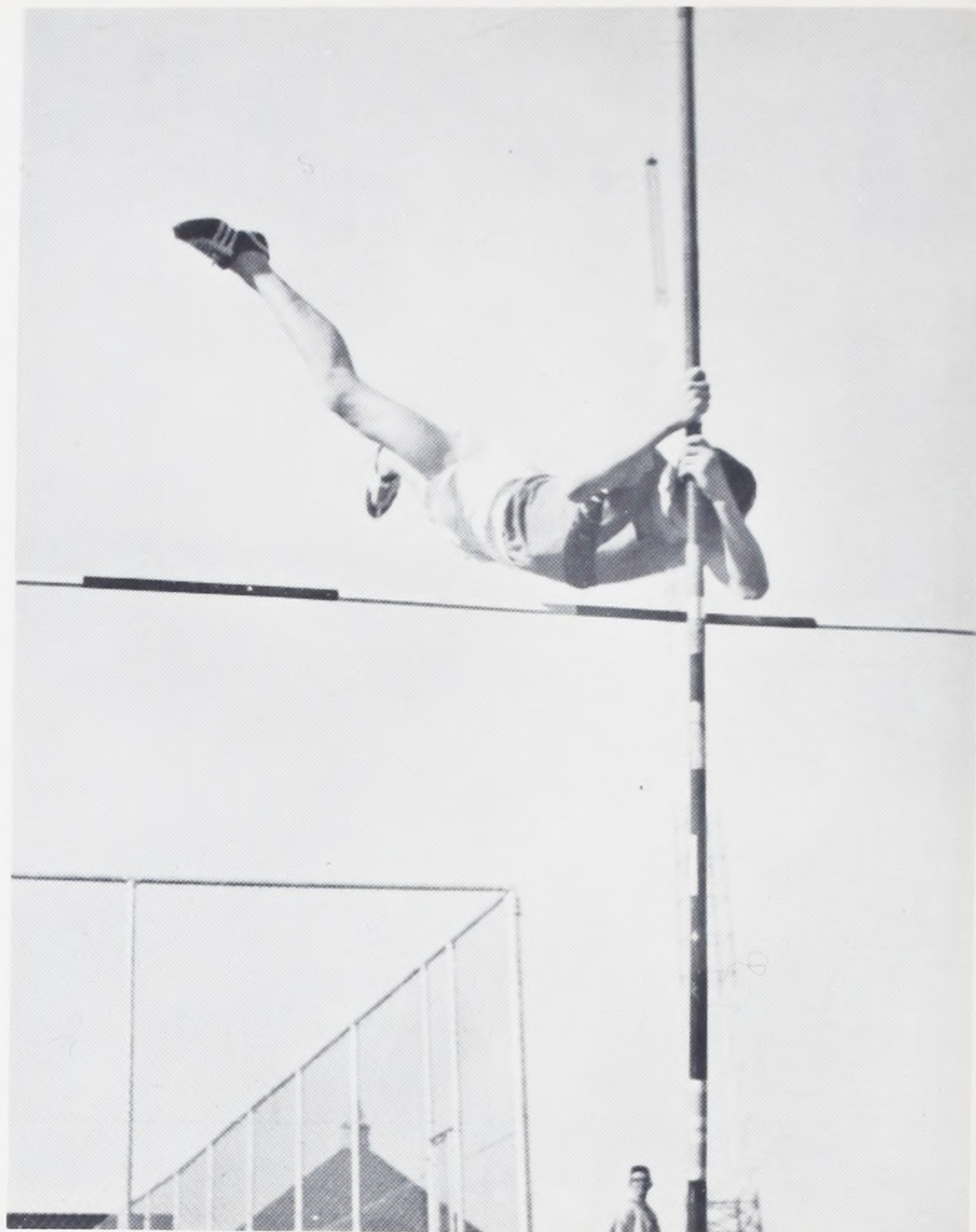

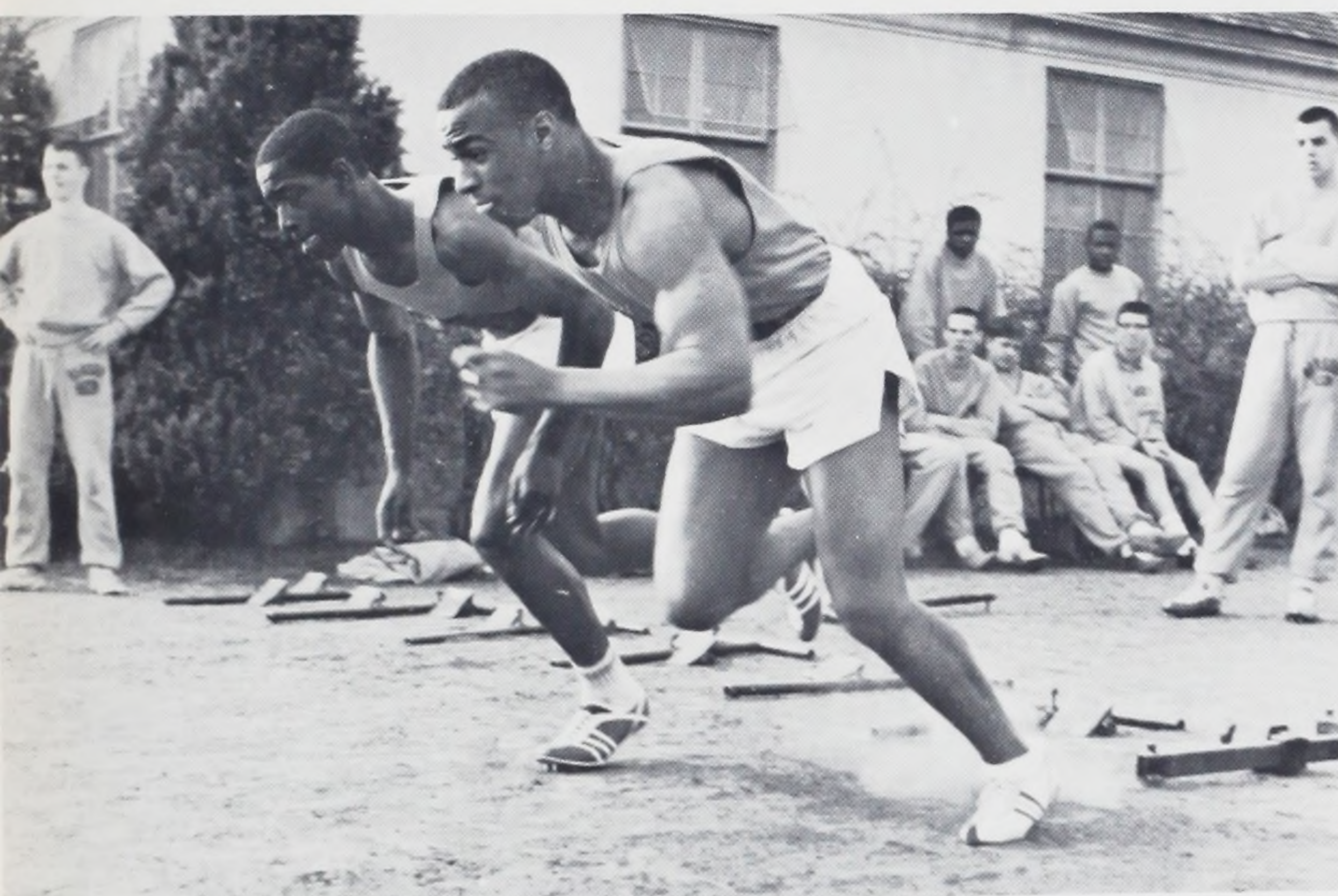

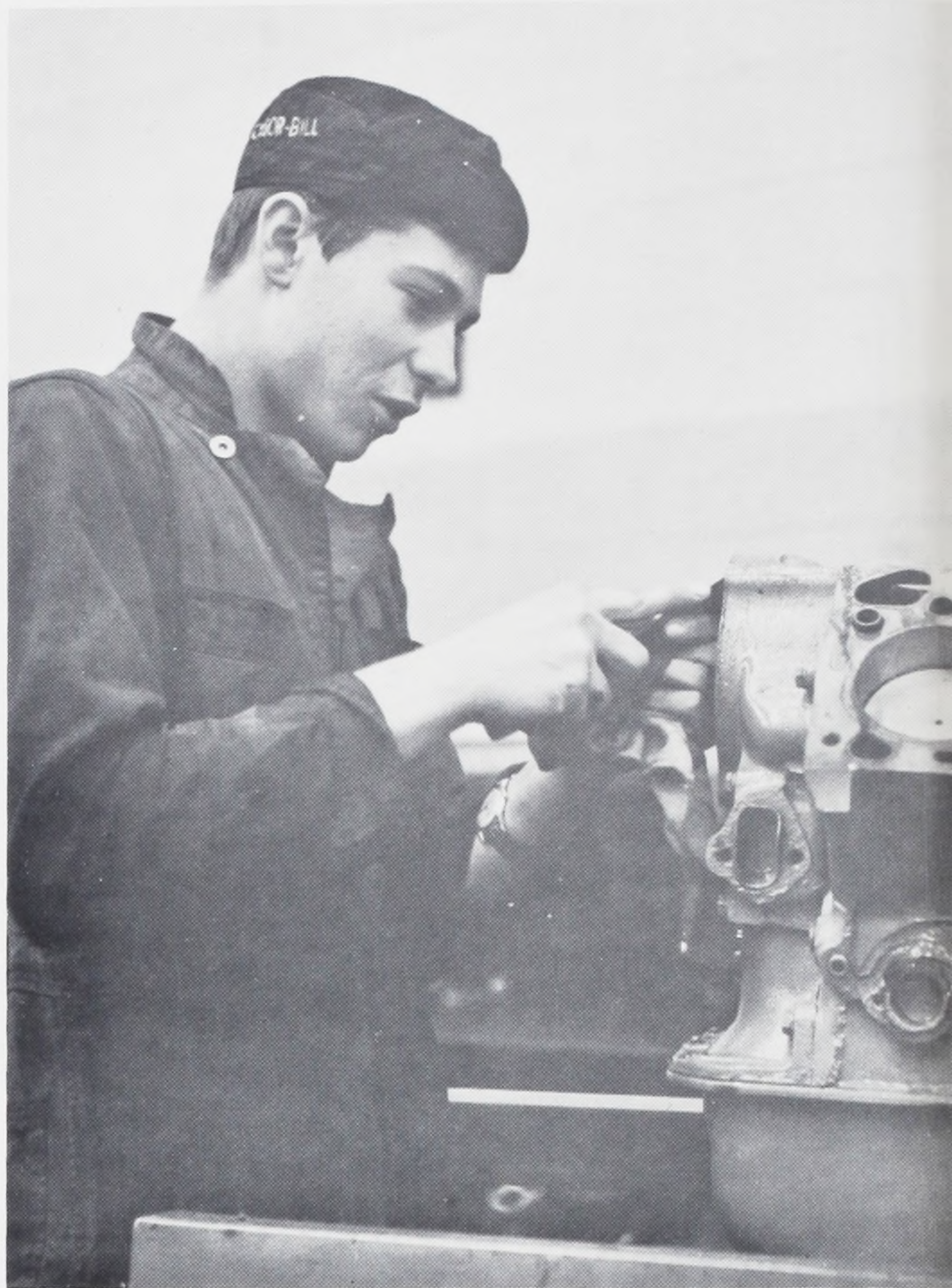

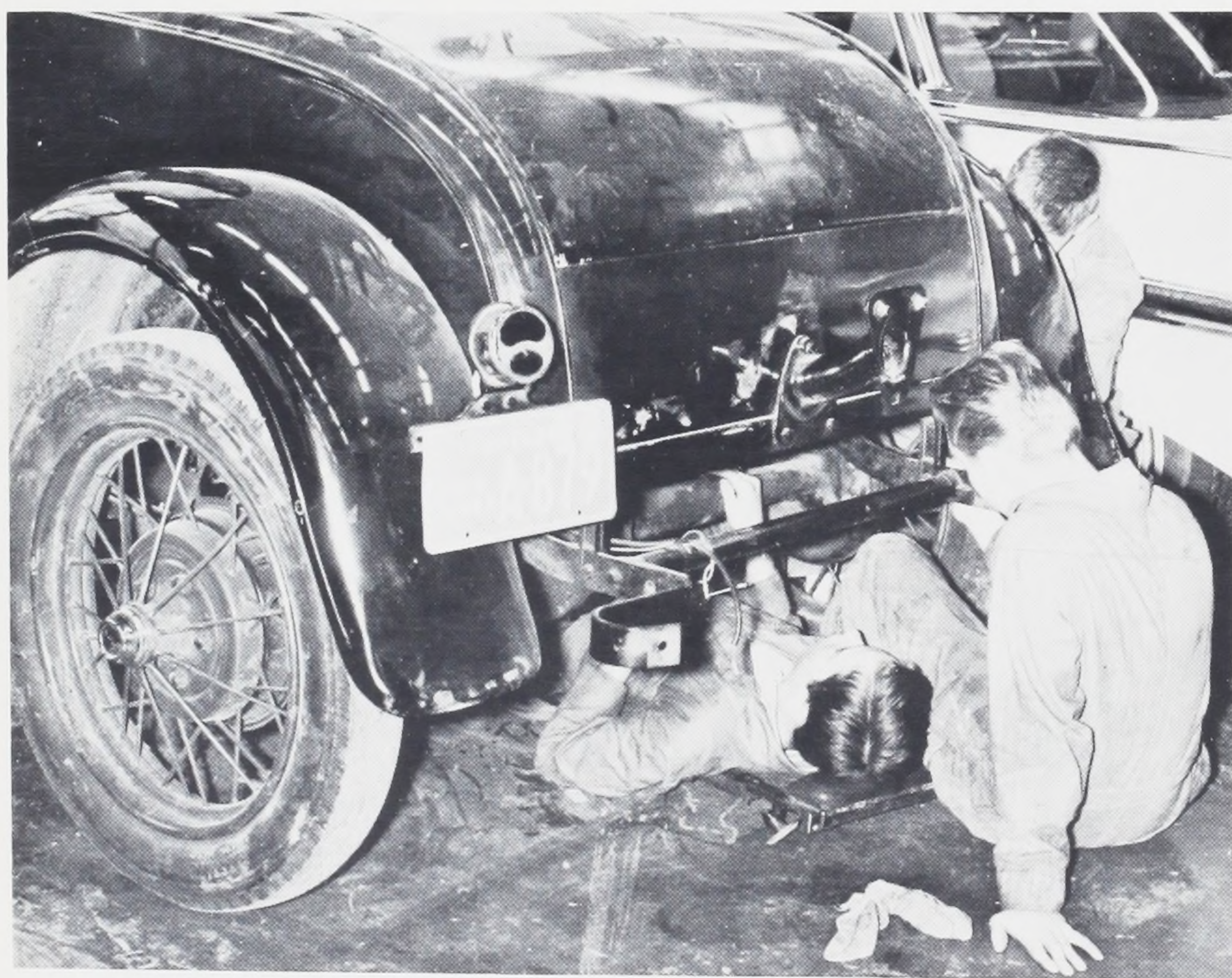

## AUTOMOTIVE



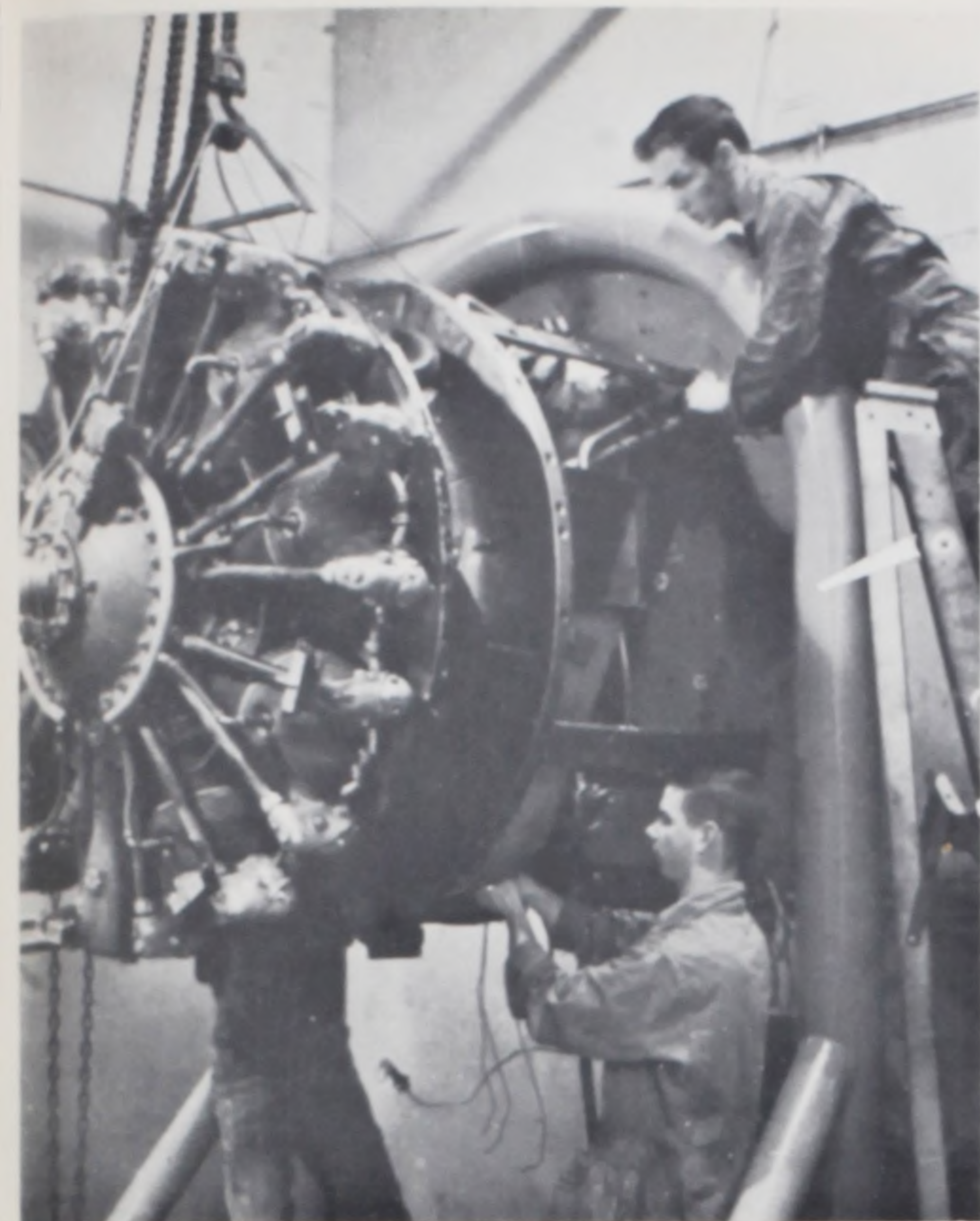

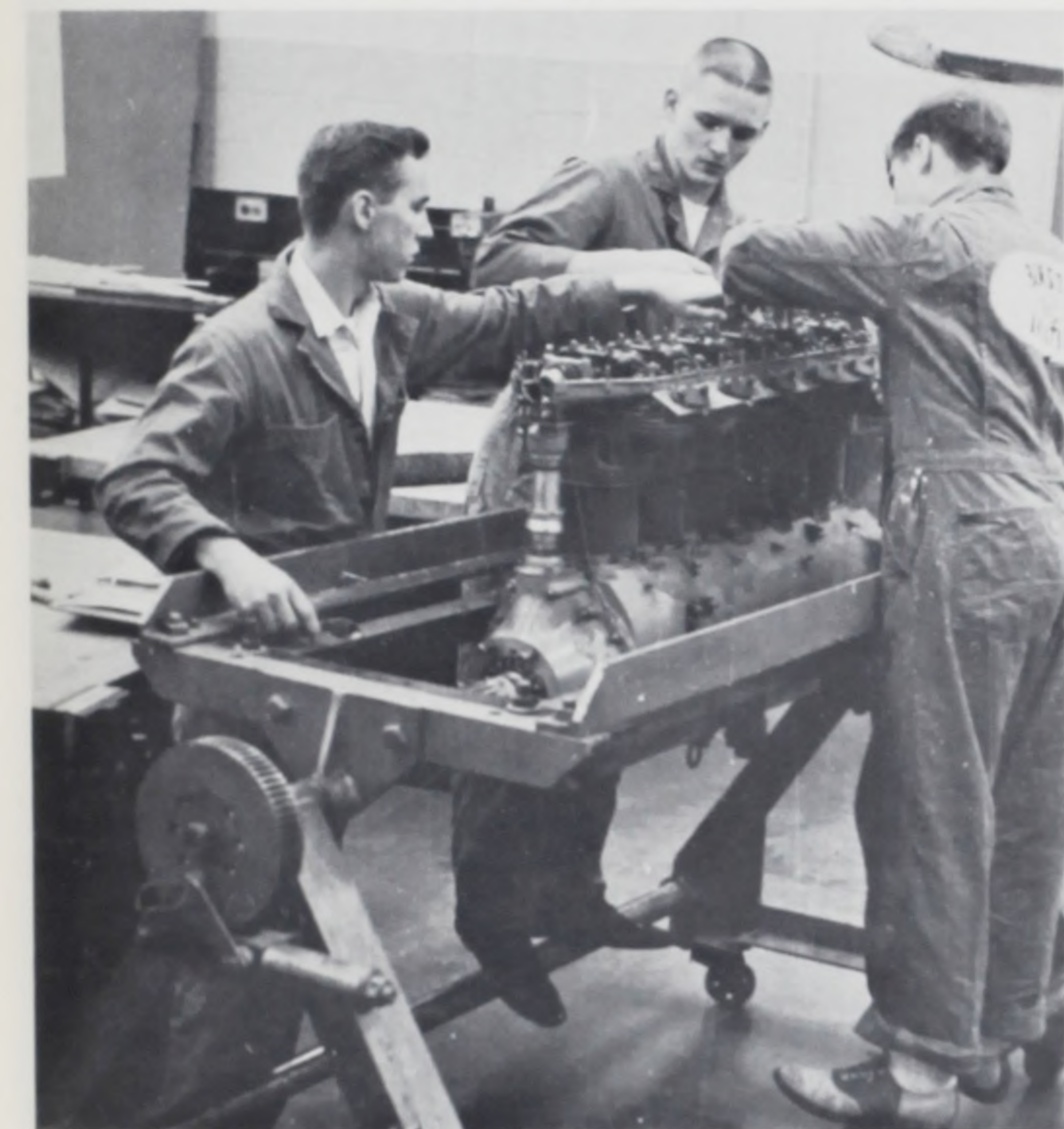


## AVIATION

## DRAWING

The drawing classes at Benson consist of architectural drawing taught by Mr. Wild and Mr. Allen, and mechanical drawing taught by Mr. Kibler and Mr. Cebriak. Students majoring in either of the two drawing classes are given the best instruction possible anywhere in the Northwest.

All students attending Benson are required to take two semesters of drawing during their sophomore year; no other is required. Those students wishing to further develop their interests in the field are permitted to take classes which will later prepare them for industry or an engineering field.

Architectural drawing consists of and applies itself to the designing of structures, whereas mechanical drawing applies itself to the mechanical or industrial portion of the drawing industry.

With the knowledge obtained from their training at Benson, these students are able to enter directly into industry, however a great number of them will enroll in colleges in an effort to obtain their degree and, consequently, a more prospective job later on.

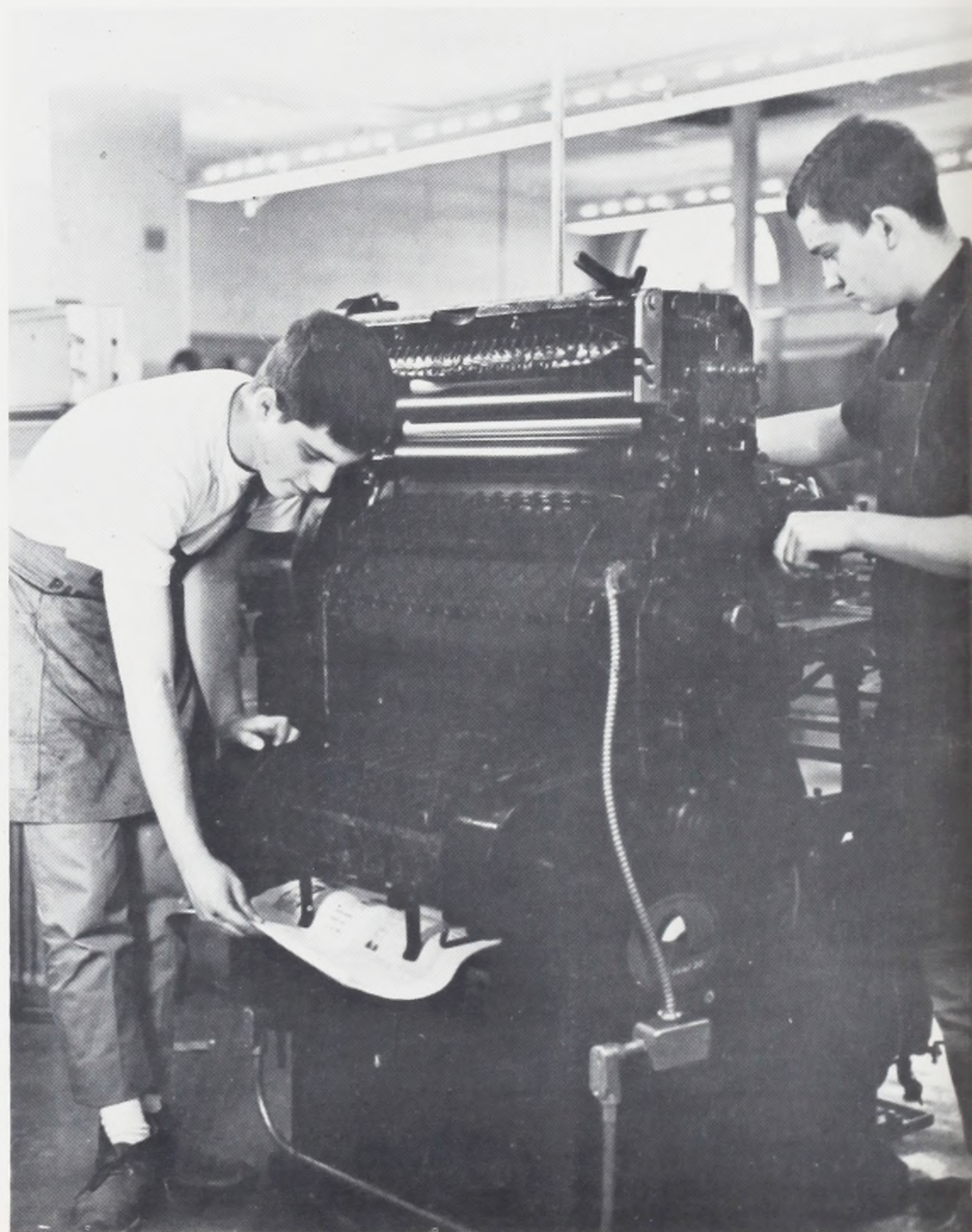

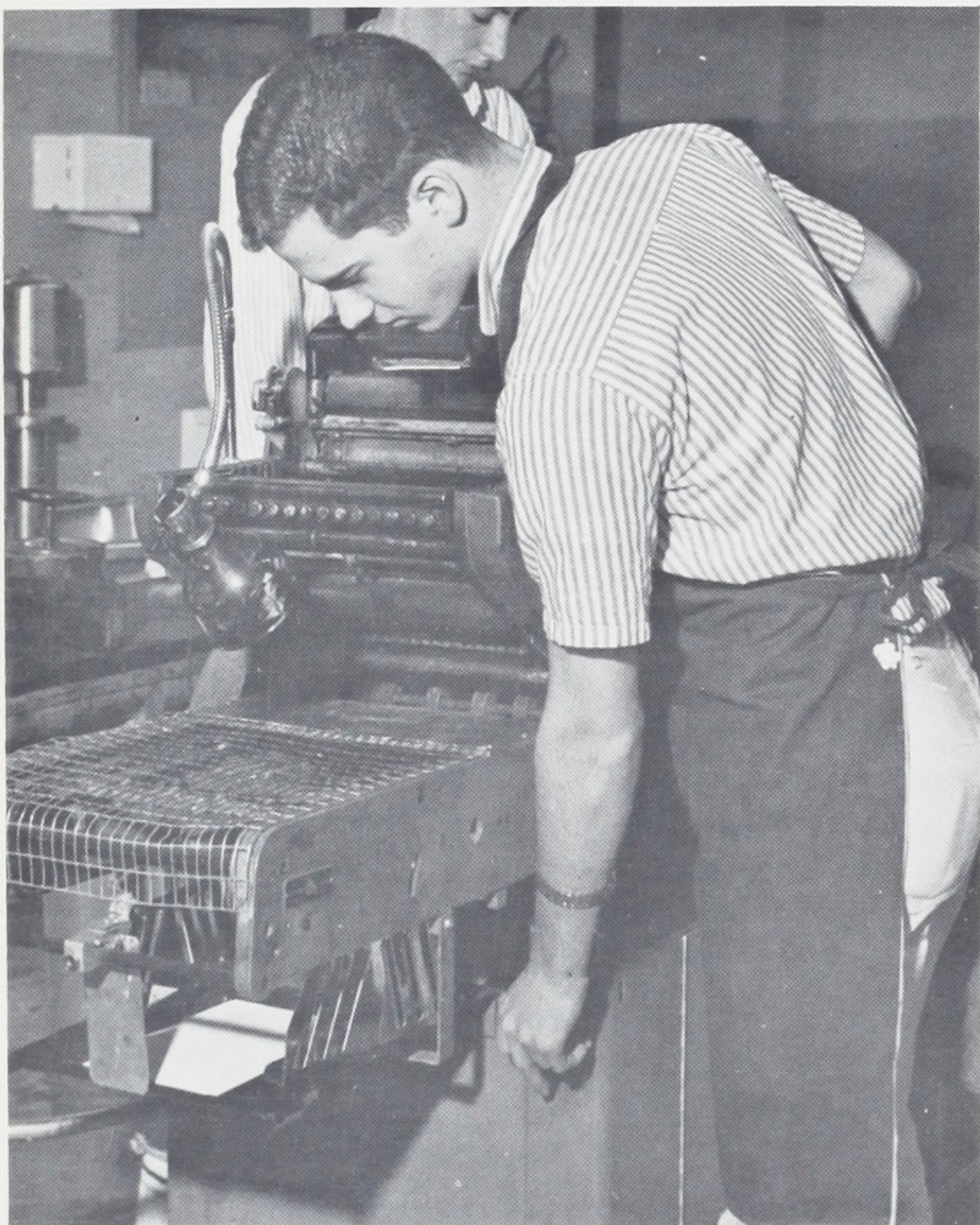

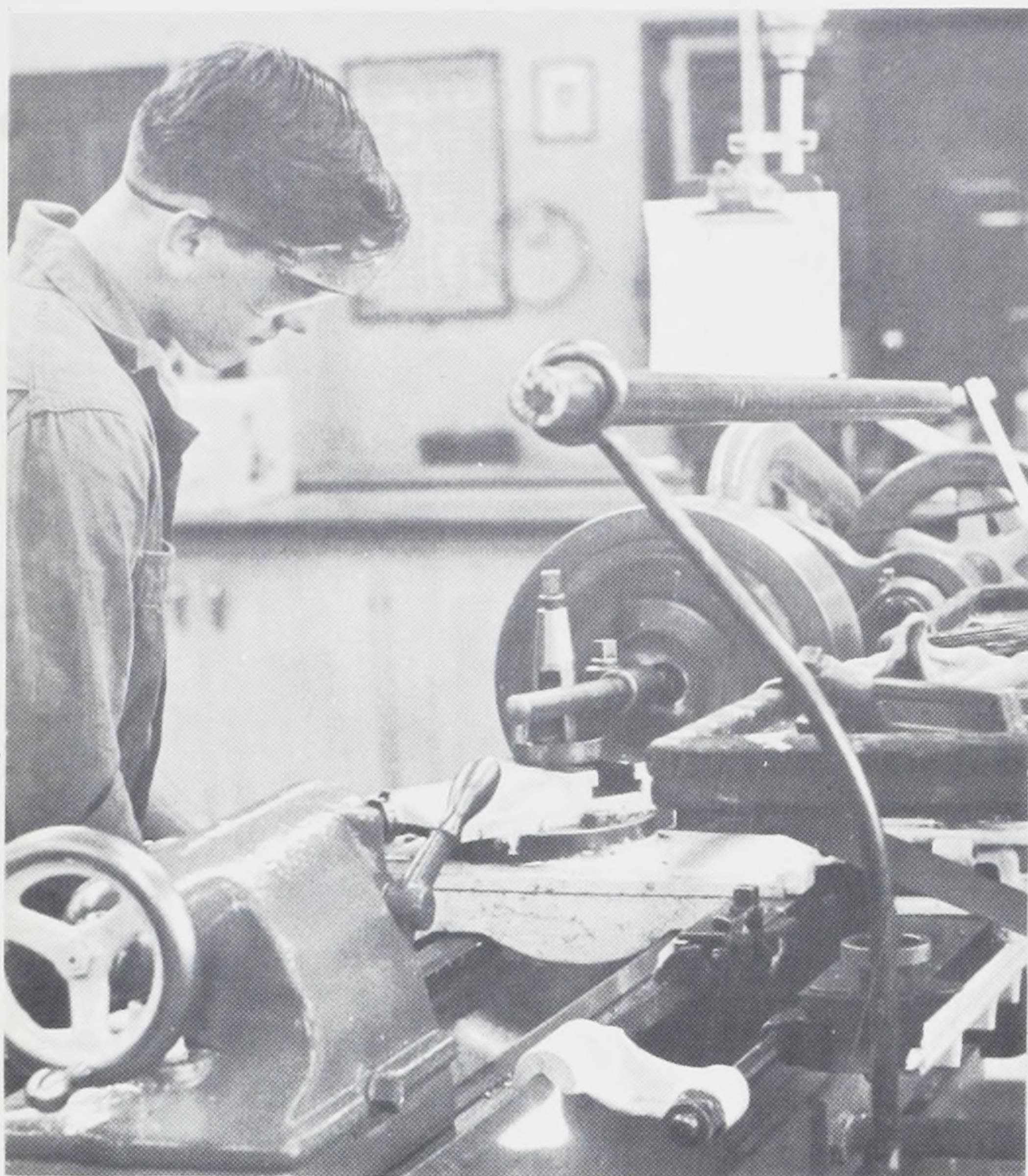

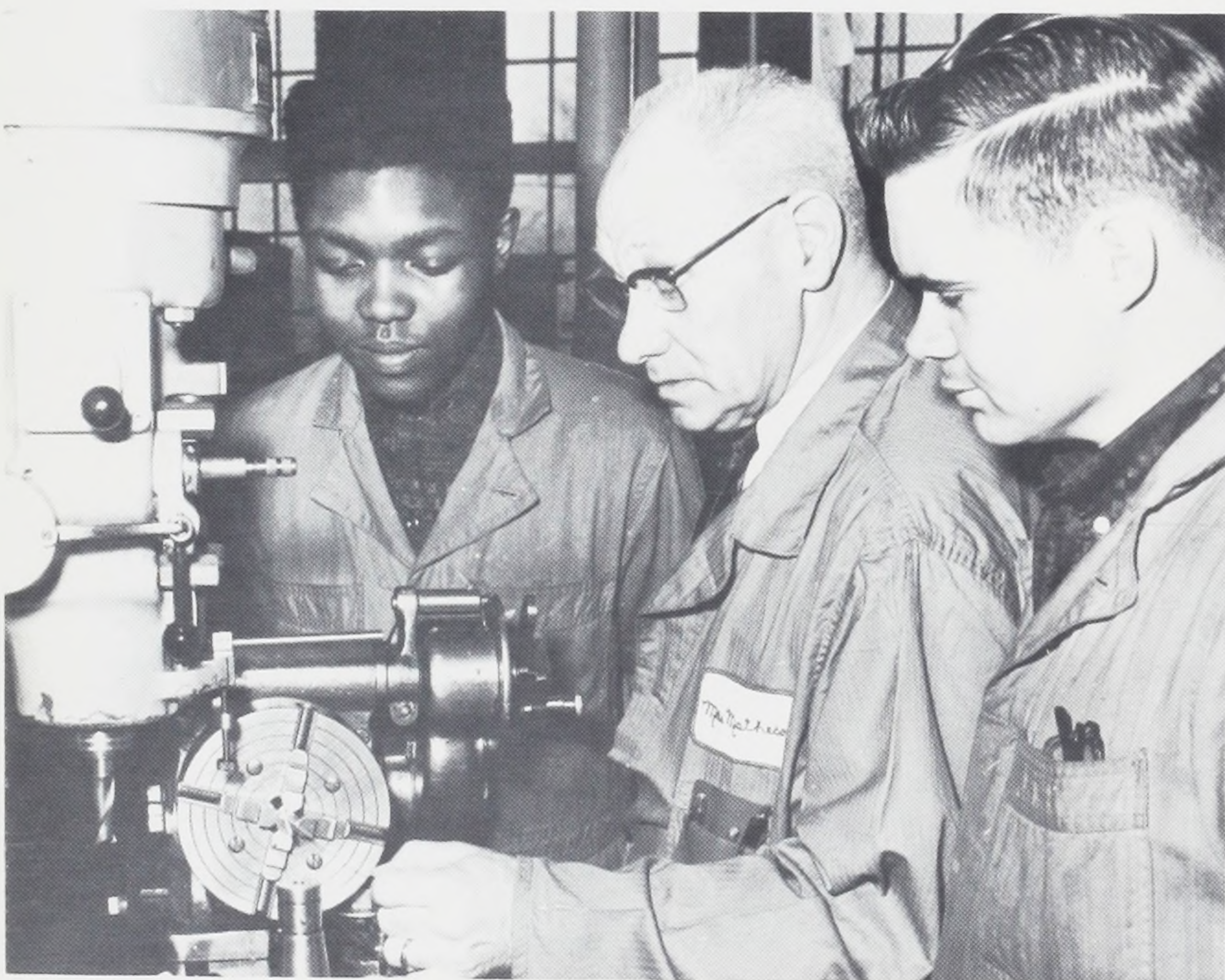

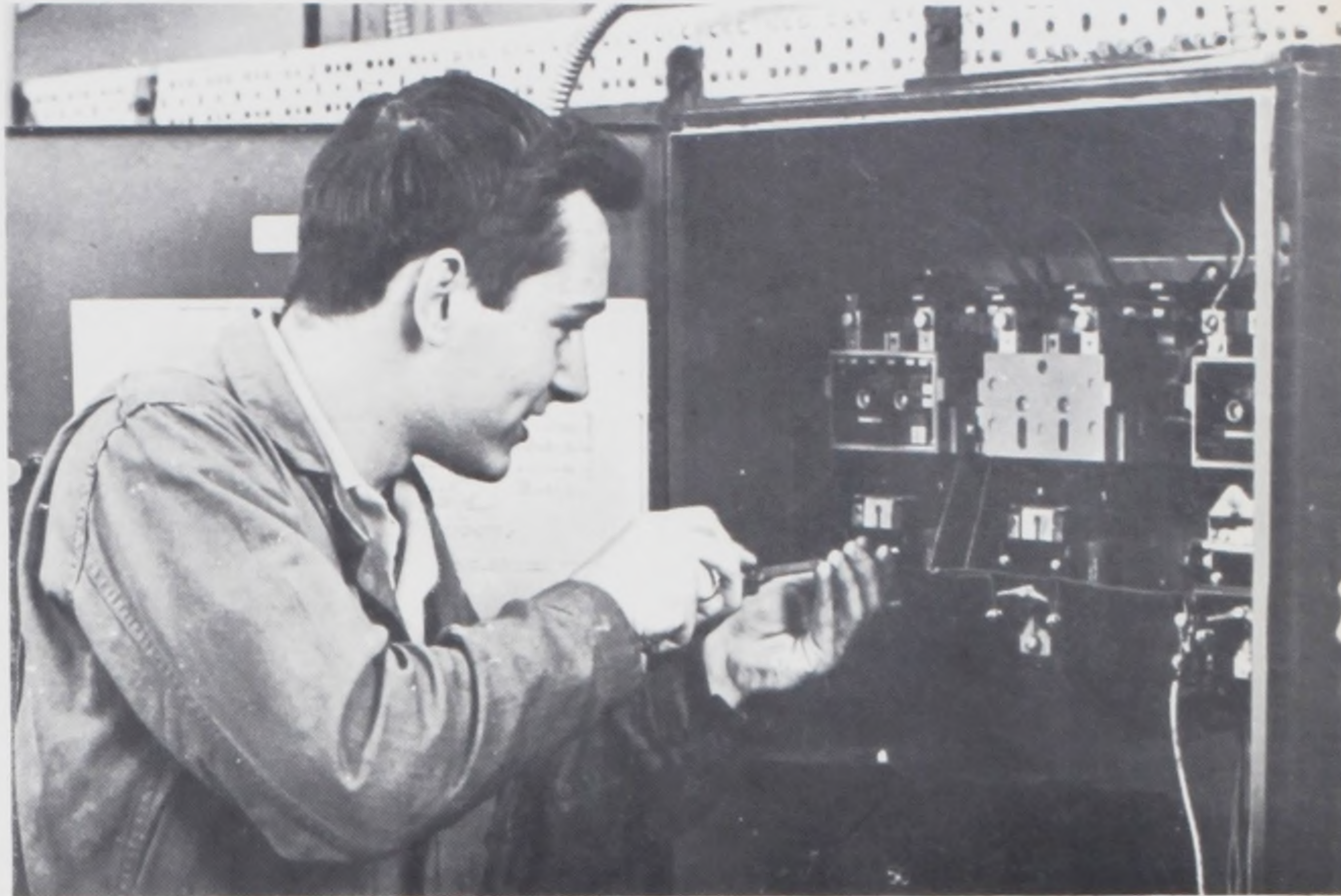
Upon graduation, the Benson machine major possesses a high degree of training and is capable of entering directly into the machine industry.

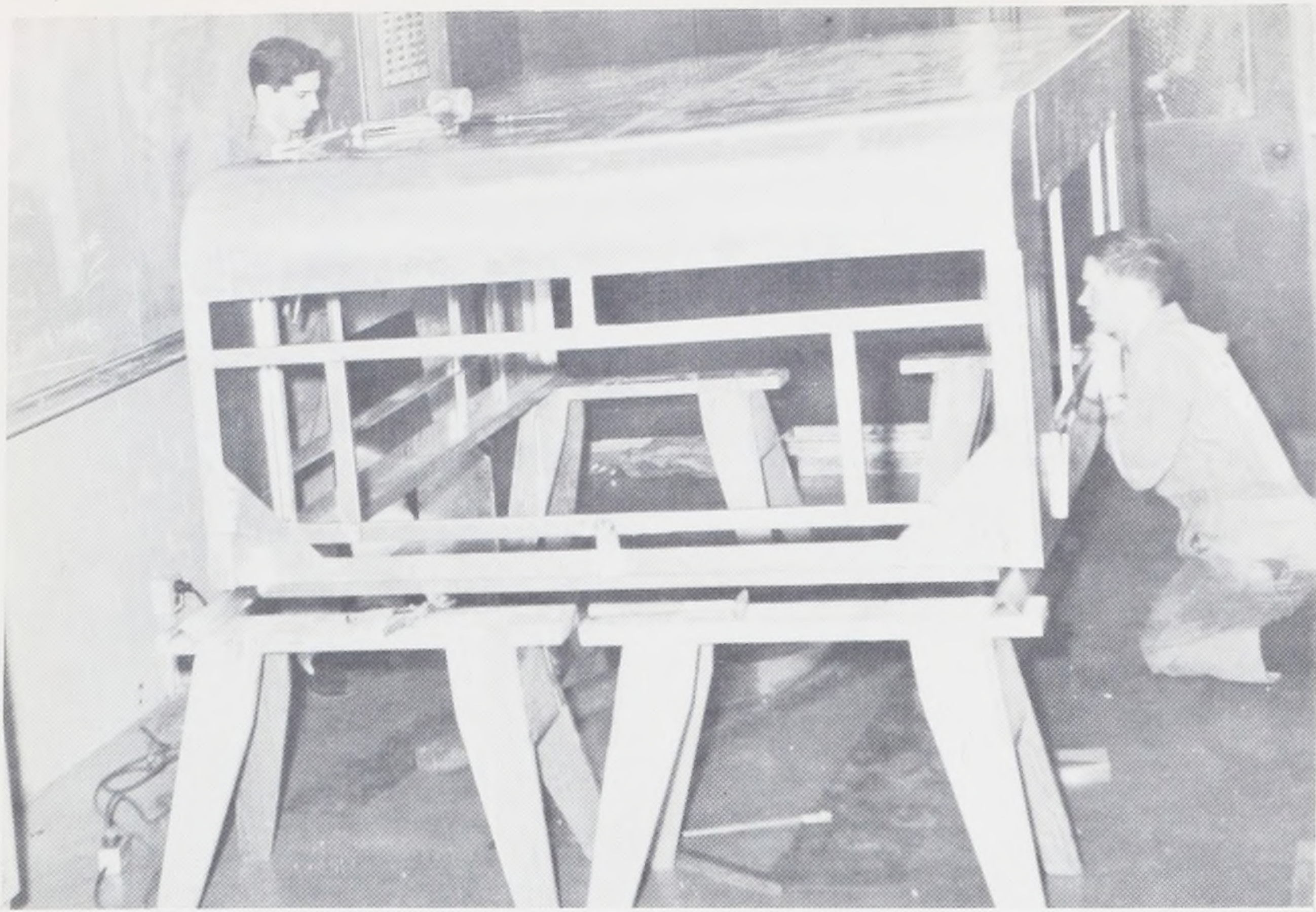

Students start as sophomores with elementary, but necessary and interesting projects. Majors go on to the junior and senior shops where they make more useful products, such as duct work, wrought-iron furniture, pickup campers and boat trailers which will give them a definite advantage when entering the sheet metal industry.

When their regular projects are finished, the majors work on tandem bikes. The parts are donated and the bikes are given to schools for the blind where the children learn to ride them. When Tech Show rolls around, the students display their projects and demonstrate their skills as good sheet metal workers.

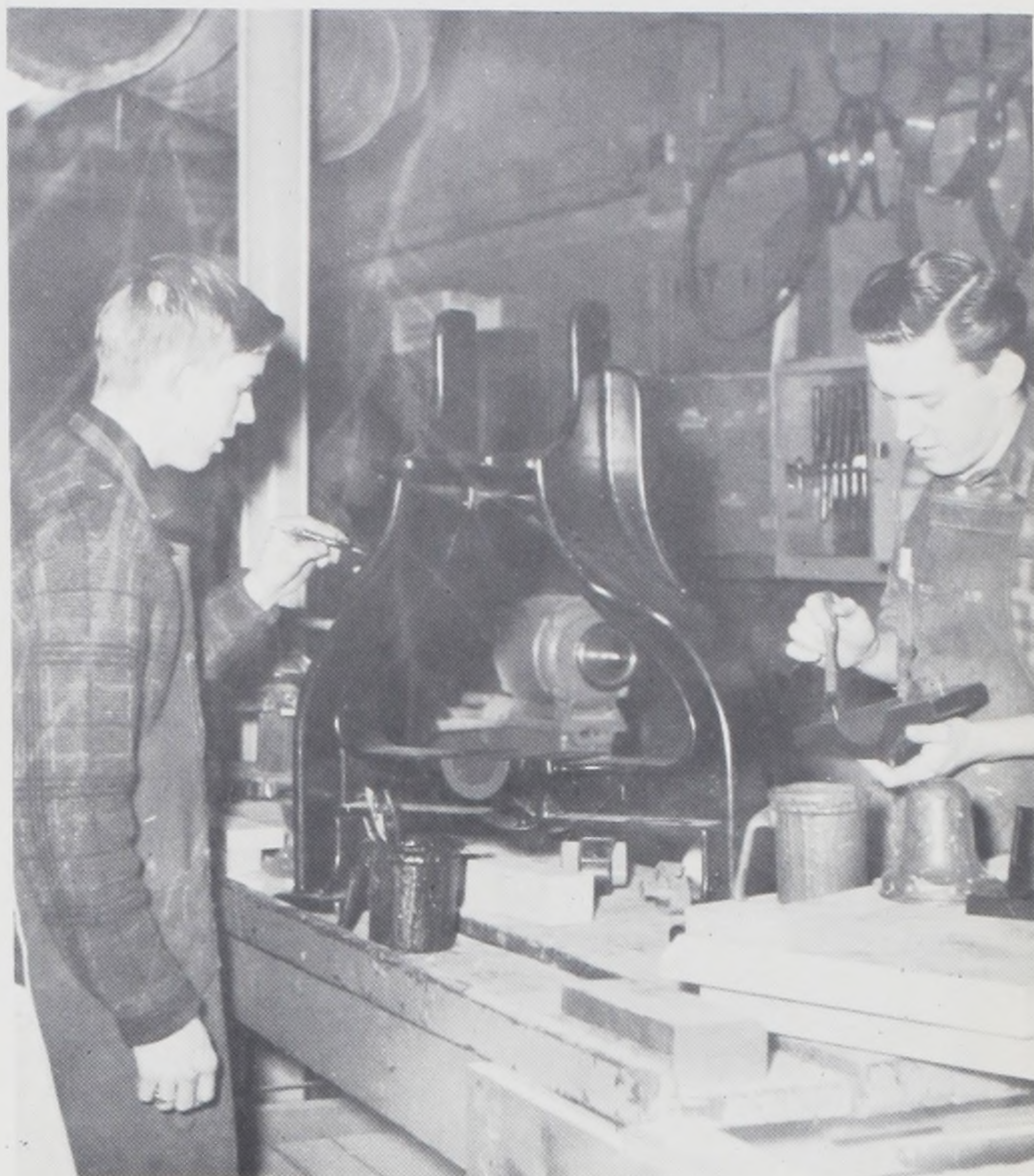

The welding department offers training in one of the most important and constructive skills. After the students have completed this program, they are well qualified to enter the welding trade.

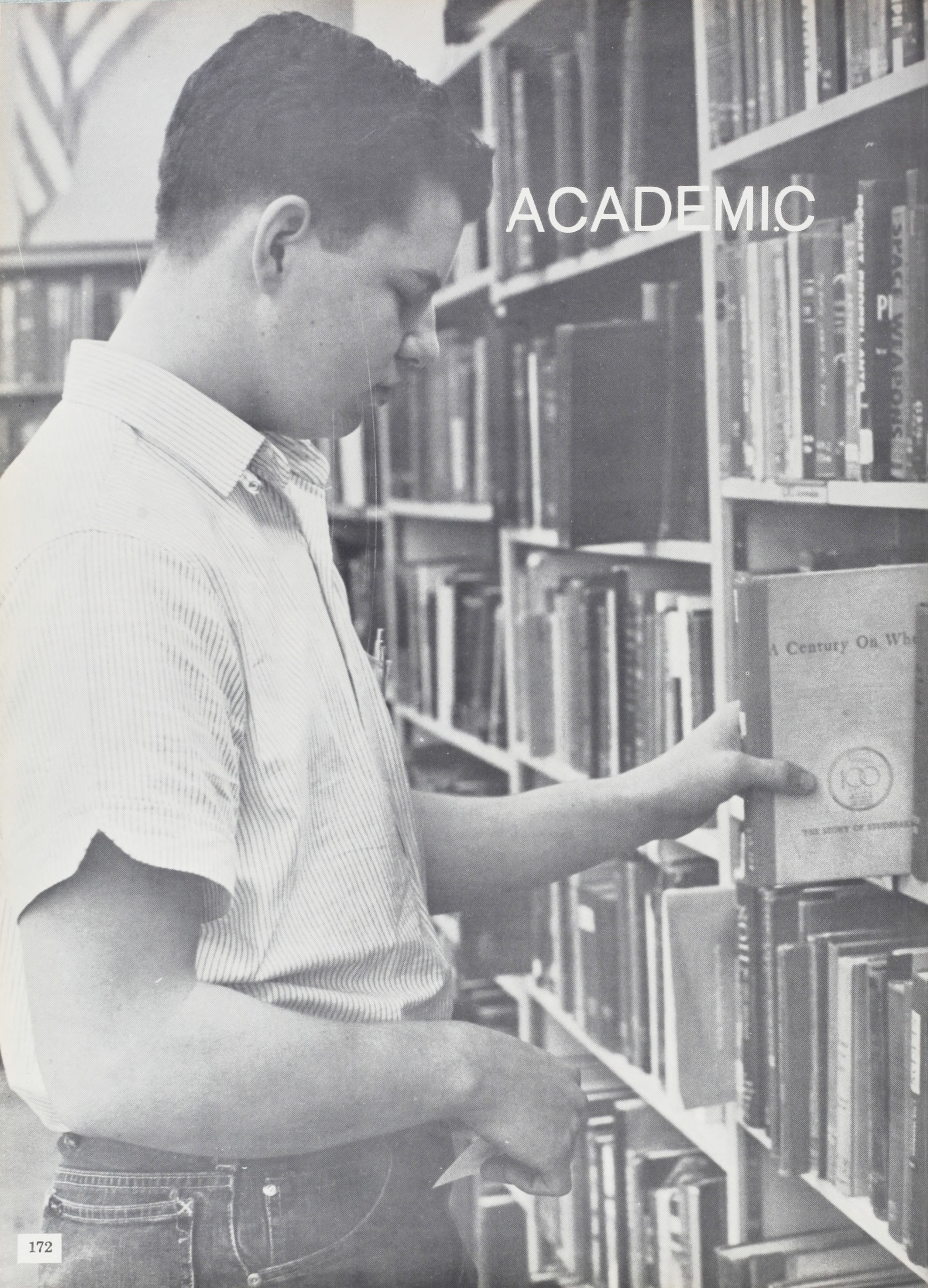

The rapid increase of labor saving devices is undermining the health of our nation. With this fact in mind, Benson emphasizes exercise and general physical fitness. The first year of physical education is devoted entirely to body conditioning. This varied program consists of track, tumbling, football, basketball, volley ball, softball, apparatus work, and special testing drills.

The second year of P.E. and health instruction includes eighteen months of tennis, football, bowling, track, and tumbling, and eighteen months of classroom activities. Second year students learn personal and community health, driver training, first aid, and safety.

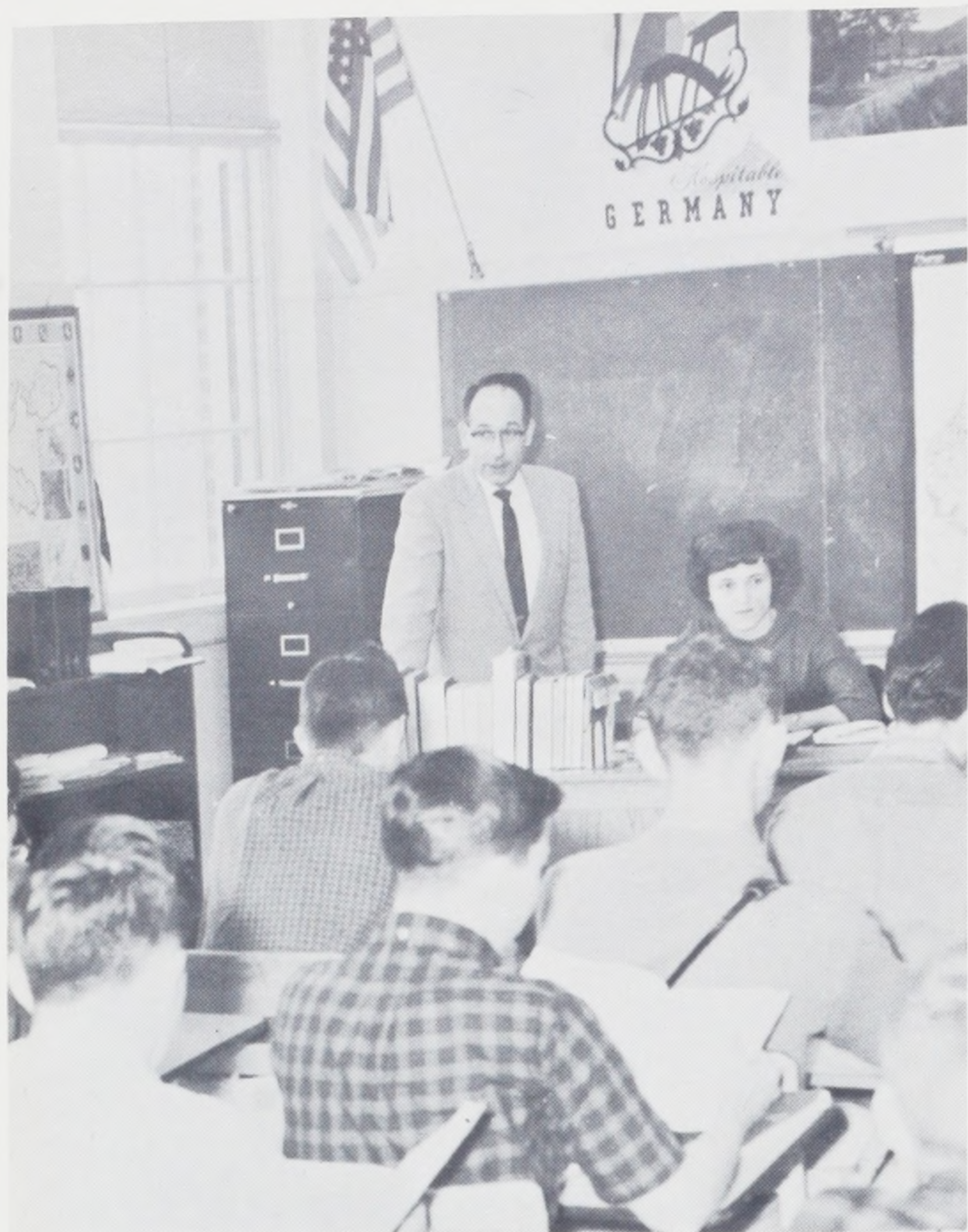

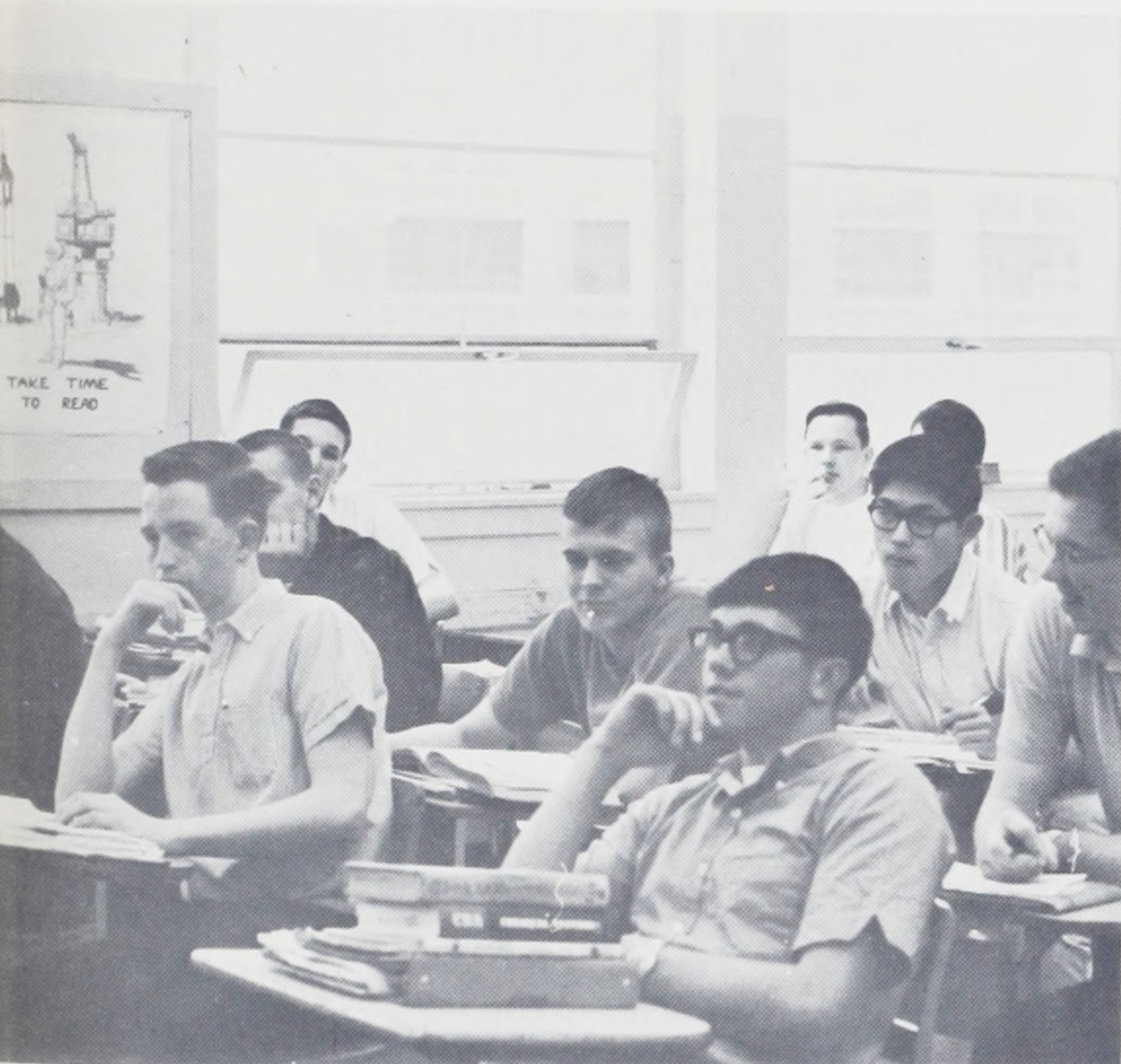
